Graham and John speak to Wade...

G'day

everyone, day before Australia Day, Thursday the 25th of January, and uh, it's a quick club grubbery tonight to get some information out. And uh, we've got our mate Wade Northhousen, did I get your name right? Yeah, yeah, no worries Woody, I think we've done this enough times now, you've got a down pat mate.

I've got a down pat. I just think it's the house in the north and of course my old mate Johnny Larder. Johnny, good to see you back on, mate. Thanks, mate. Yeah, it's, uh, good to be here on, uh. The day before Australia Day, if that's what you can call it now. Well, are we allowed to call it Australia Day? You betcha we are, and they're not going to stop us.

We don't care, we just call it Australia Day, that's it, game over, that's all there is to it. That's all there is to it. Now, I've just got a whisper, uh, from, uh, Daniel Cinzio and his crew, that a big crowd of, uh, people who are camping in car parks and that have been Uh, serviced by him with his food deliveries and all that sort of stuff for some time.

The intel is that the council is arriving tomorrow on Australia Day to move them all along. Well, look, this is the kind of thing that we have, uh, become to expect from councils who, as we know, they're not working for us anymore, mate. Anything they can do to help us. Unbelievable. So, uh, our thoughts and prayers are with Daniel and, um, uh, I only just got the message now.

I've been, I've been unavailable most of the day, but I mean, it's just a shocker. If that's what they're going to do, they, they really need to, this whole housing crisis has been brought about by, by poor government. No, there's no, um, No cross pollinization of information and ideas. We've talked about this before.

One department doesn't know what the other department's doing. And in the middle of all these people, and a lot of them are homeless because they lost their jobs through the pandemic. It's just bull dust. And the other one, uh, gentlemen, and Johnny, this, you're going to love this. Australia's most trusted news source.

I've got it on their website. Heat waves and cyclones are affecting the health of unborn babies in Australia, experts say. Heat waves and cyclones. Now we've had two cyclones. I think we're about to have our second one in Queensland. But heat waves and cyclones. Uh, our changing climate may be, um, may compromise the health of our babies before they've exited the womb.

As growing evidence, extreme temperatures and natural disasters are linked to premature births, premature births, stillbirths, and even abnormal gestational weight. And size in many parts of the world, including Australia. Nothing to do with the fact that mum might have been shot with the, uh, clot shot.

For goodness sake, for what, a 1.5 degree temperature rise? Now how do they quantify that? That is absolute garbage. Well, I tell you, Woody, anyone that writes that, anyone that believes that crap should have their, uh, should have a psychiatric assessment.

What else could you say? I mean, that's just absolute mad, madness. And they think we're cooks. Exactly right. I mean, I don't know. We've come to expect it. They've gotten rid of Ida Buttrell. Good riddance, Ida. You are useless. You know what's on a ball. But I tell you what, this new bloke's got a lot of work to do because the ABC is nothing anymore.

Look, we are fed up with corporations doing their virtue signaling and, and, and doing their, um, social engineering that they're doing, you know, we're sick and tired of Woolworths and Coles and the banks and the airlines telling us how we should behave and what we should think we're sick and tired of everyone being thin skin for goodness sake, we should be allowed to, we should be allowed to say what we want and take it on the chin what's happened to this country.

Gone mad hoodie. I mean, look at this. Look at this woke bloke in charge of Cricket Australia. He doesn't even, he doesn't even speak Australian. I don't know where he's from. It's like this bloke in charge of Woolworths. He sounds like he's from South Africa. What is going on? I mean, I, I heard this Cricket Australia CEO on Ben Fordham's program a couple of days ago.

It was an embarrassment. Absolute embarrassment. Oh, you know. We haven't really changed anything in the last few years. You know, we don't mention Australia day. Oh, come on, Wade, fair dinkum, mate. If any Australian cricket, it goes along with that. They don't deserve to wear the baggy green. Well, they're, they're clearly not Australian.

I mean, at the end of the day, uh, you look at, at the Woolworths and those sort of people who are, uh, refusing to do anything to recognize Australia day, then, you know, they're Australia haters. They've got to, this is, there's no gray area here. There's no gray area. You are either Australian and you're fighting for our country, you support our country, or you are against it.

It's just that simple. I mean, I just want to touch base on something you said, um, about the council wanting to move people on, on Australian Day. So, um, a few years ago in the water fights here, the farmer water fights here in Victoria, um, we, uh, a group of us put in to become part of an organization, which was selling us out to the government.

And this is how scared they were and how much advice they got from the government. And if you can believe this, this organization held an AGM on Australia Day. Now, if you can believe that, you think about that for a second, that's how corrupt this whole organization was and their government advisors.

They held an annual general meeting on Australia Day. So just go figure that that's the sort of, you know, the sort of paper they get up to. Bye. Uh, I think that we are really seeing, with a lot of the stuff that's going on, Hoody, and John, um, we're seeing a lot of people now, this is starting to galvanize people into becoming more patriotic and realizing the threat to our country, and they are starting to now come together, and where people may have not been so passionate about it in the past, This is now starting to push people together and you're starting, uh, to see people take sides and stand up and defend our country exactly the same as what we're seeing with ANZAC Day.

Now that's a really good point you raised because we've been saying for a long time Johnny that, uh, a lot of the people who've slept through the COVID madness, uh, brought on by the government and the corporations and it is clearly now absolute madness. This country has been ripped to shreds by the most appalling government.

Um, that we've ever seen, I think there's no doubt about that and, and governments who are under the influence of, of corporate CEOs and, uh, big pharma, the whole thing, it just goes on and on. But, um, what we're saying, we said earlier that a lot of people who slept through COVID are going to wake up when other things happen.

And that's what we're starting to say now, because happening in Canberra on the 6th. Is, uh, coming together of a whole bunch of Australians who probably weren't in that picture behind you, John, they were probably doing

their own thing through the COVID thing and missed most of this, but now they're waking up because they're fed up with the reckless renewable energy policies of this, uh, Albanese government.

They are fed up with it and the farmers are in revolt and a lot of the farmers are going to be turning up. And the people who are against, um, reckless renewable policies that the government's putting out, they're going to be turning up and we're going to be turning up. Now, um, you and I, we're not going there to speak.

We're not going there to do anything other than, than to be in the crowd. As, as a couple of patriotic Australians who believe that the government needs to start listening to our voices. Now we've got Wade on tonight because Wade, Wade is the, um, He's the head of the billboard battalion, the head of a great team of people who put in a lot of work.

He's a farmer from Northern Victoria. He's a really great bloke. He and I have shared a stage a few times. I've even hugged him, John. I'll tell you what, it was like hugging a telegraph pole, but I did it. There's not too many you haven't hugged. No, that's right. That's true. Look at all those people behind you.

But here's the thing. Um, Wade has been finding out what's going on with, uh, this proposed rally on the 6th through the farmers. And I believe he's liaising with them and Wade, we want you to give us the insight of what you know is happening in Canberra on the 6th of February. So, um, uh, Billboard Battalion will be going to Canberra on the 5th, so that's where they are a day in advance so we can sort of catch up with people and do some networking and make contacts.

So, I've spoken to one of the organisers, uh, of the, the farmer protest on the 6th in Canberra. And I've put forward, uh, as you know, my views, Hoodie, they're pretty out there, uh, they're sort of leading the charge kind of thing. What we're going to do is, we'll be there on the 6th, Billboard Battalion, and we'll be running our race alongside, um, what they're saying.

They've got all their official speakers, they've got all their official lines. He's I mean, I'll say from the outset, you know, we're going to support the rally 100%. Um, we're pushing it through billboard battalion and all our social media. Um, so, you know, we want as many people to turn up because we have to be in the fight together.

But, you know, I would like to see them go a lot harder. On the things that are happening with the WEF and the, and the UN and so on, but I fully support the fact of anybody that does anything to fight for the farmers and for our, our country, in fact, because this is our food production we're talking about.

Um, and we will certainly be there and we will push it a lot harder. We will go, you know, we'll go full hundred percent, uh, with our messaging and what we do and say. And hopefully we can get some extra people to realise the situation, because we'll have literature there as well. Um, I'm just so glad that there are other people now waking up.

And, uh, as you say, they're not going hard enough, but a lot of people just waking up realise just how bad it is. So I want to go there to encourage them. Um, no matter what their messaging is, I want them to see that the people of Australia are behind them, because our farmers have not been supported by the people of Australia.

They have been neglected for a long, long time. And I'll tell you what, when, uh, when, uh, when the stuff's hard to get off the shelves in the supermarkets, everyone's going to say, Oh, what happened, what's Woolworths doing? A lot of people don't even know where their food comes from. Why do they? Oh, well, look, uh, dead right.

And like I had a discussion only today, uh, with a bloke over in WA and, you know, Uh, these, these people are just not switching on until, you know, like I said, it doesn't appear to be a problem at the minute because, you know, instead of telling you how we grow that much food, we'd have to export it. But what they're doing is they are planting the explosives under the foundations of our agricultural sector and our farming and our food production.

And I get to a certain point, uh, they're going to push down on the detonator and the whole thing is going to blow up in our face. And people are going to be in, uh, in an enormous trouble, massive trouble. So that's the problems that we've got. And I think that one of our biggest, and I'd say possibly, uh, saboteurs or traders, if you like, uh, many of our farmer representative lobby groups, who are the people who should be ringing the bell, they know what's going on and they're covering this up and they're hiding it.

And all they're doing is pushing a government agenda. Like take for example, the National Farmers Federation, you know, all they're doing, David Johanky, I know David well, I've known him for a long time, who's just taken over as the president. Um, and, and their whole garbage is about climate change. It's got, that's got, mate, that's, that's, that's dead in the water.

That's old, old news. The biggest threat to our agriculture is the world economic forum, period. Yep. A million times more than anything else. That is the one. That is our biggest threat, that is our primary focus, and if we don't fix that, then the rest of it is over. Game over. You're wasting your time.

That's what the German farmers are doing, Johnny. They've recognised the enemy, they're going for the WEF, and, um, and they've been, they've been hitting it hard over there. They really have been. Um, any thoughts or comments, John? Yeah, look, I, I, I'm not too perturbed about the, uh, speaking side of it, Hoody, you know, I, I personally think it's numbers on the ground.

That, that's what's going to really, uh, sway the government. Um, there's, there's multiple messages out there. Everyone's, uh, got, got a gripe with the government and fair enough. It doesn't matter whether you're paying too much for your power, whether you can't afford your groceries, whether you. Can't afford Christmas presents for your kid, you can't afford medicines, uh, whether you're getting second, second rate healthcare in this country, you, you, you can't, uh, register your car.

Uh, I mean, this country's in absolute turmoil for a thousand reasons. And that's why we need to get boots on the ground in front of parliament house and, uh, send Albanese and these grubs down there a message that we've had enough, uh, whether we speak or not. Is really neither here nor there. I mean, half the people, uh, know why we're there anyway.

Uh, I think it's only the media that would, would obviously take interest. The politicians really will only be interested in the numbers out the front. And the media won't report on whatever you talk about anyway, Wade, unfortunately, uh, but you're right, it, it's the World Economic Forum and, uh, wherever we get an opportunity, we, we need to, uh, make sure we reiterate that and, you know, keep the messaging very succinct, um, so if you get an opportunity to speak to the, the, uh, the media, well, you need to say to them, you know, we're concerned about what's going on, uh, at the upper echelon and where, where we're being taken as a country by these elites.

We have to get the Australian population to realize that what's coming for them and what they've already had so far, but what's coming for them. The single group of people who are 100 percent responsible for that are the people who sit in the parliaments around our country, whether it's a local government, state or federal, and they enact the laws and the legislation that the World Economic Forum wants.

The people of Australia need to, uh, turn on, uh, the government. Not, not, not a physically violent way, but they need to turn on the politicians who are setting them up for an absolute catastrophic disaster and start putting pressure on them so they get the message. You don't just kiss the backsides of these scumbags who are in the government and the World Economic Forum.

You don't do that anymore because this is our country and you people are giving out enemies. The legislative powers to kill us. I can't do anything if the politicians don't give them the legislative power to do it. And that's our, that's our, where we need to be. Yeah. No one can argue with that for sure.

The thing is getting the people of Australia to wake up to the information that you want to give them is difficult because they're not going to see it in the media. That's that's the hardest part. That's I mean, that crowd behind John in Canberra, I'm amazed, Wade, how many people we spoke to in the community of unity tour.

And we, we asked people out loud, anyone here know what happened in Canberra on the 12th of February, 2022, a lot of people didn't know a lot of people had no idea, and yet they were turning up at our meetings because they knew what we were about, but a lot of people didn't know about Canberra. And so it's, it's kind of.

It's a fine line, isn't it? Between giving, giving the media the cannon fodder to say, Oh, look, they're all radicals, they're all rent a crowd and all that sort of stuff and having a really credible message that can get out to the people that you need to wake up and I think there's a whole bunch of stuff coming now with, with the climate change agenda, agenda 2030, um, and, um, um, digital, uh, central bank, digital currency, 15 minute cities, all these things are going to bring more and more people out who slept through COVID.

And, um, and I think. With, I don't know how much press the German farmers are getting at the moment in the mainstream. I don't watch mainstream, but, um, if they're getting any press at all and our farmers can man up and I gotta be honest, I don't, I don't think we're going to see the numbers because I don't, I don't, I don't think they're awake enough.

We've still got to encourage them. Come along to this thing. Have your say. That's what they call that. They call that ground in front of Parliament House the people's paddock. It's where the people go to have a say. So, um, anyhow, I'll be there. John will be there. I'm going to drive 15 hours to get there. I believe there's a convoy leaving the Gold Coast on the fifth, on the, uh, fifth to go down.

Um, yeah. There is one common enemy. And for me, it's the WEF. I think for you, it's the WEF. Now they may not be the top of the pyramid. They're probably not, but they have a visible sign of what we need to be aiming at because their agenda is out there clear for everyone to see. You don't have to dig deep to see what they're up to.

You just go to their own website and have a look at it. So if we are, if we identify a common enemy, the big thing that was really hard in the Vietnam war was that the soldiers in uniform didn't know who the enemy was because the enemy wasn't identified. You know, they were, they were, um, they were dressed like farmers.

They were guerrilla fighters. They weren't identified and it made the, it made that whole conflict even more difficult for the men on the ground. It's clear to me that the government and the corporations that run them are not doing anything in our best interest. And the people of Australia have to wake up to that.

And, and, and ultimately that's, that's where the main game is. And it does need leadership because I know I'm in this fight for my, my kids and grandkids. Exactly right. I'm 71 years of age and I'm in this fight for my kids and grandkids. And I. If anyone said three years ago, I'd even be thinking like that.

I would have said they're crazy. We've lost so much so quickly. And, um, and it's not slackening off anytime soon, but it's not just Australia, this is global and we've got to look at the way the Canadians revolted against that, and it seems like a Trudeau's had a slap in the face in this last few days with a, um, with a court ruling that he's, uh, his actions against the truckies was unlawful and, uh, and unreasonable.

Illegal and unreasonable. And we've also got, uh, so much going on in Europe now. There is a global uprising and the WEF talk about this. They say there's going to be a lot of pushback, but you know, you've got to look at positives too. And there were, there were police officers in Cambridge on who said to us, you're fighting for us too.

And whatever you do, keep going. There were several who said that to us when we were standing in the front line, out the front of the press club. And, um, and we've also got, uh, you know, you've only got to look at all the things that have been happening recently to say, for example, uh, police dropping their shields and helmets in

France in, in a lot of the demonstrations over there and joining the crowd, there are a lot of people who are waking up and our, our, our purpose should be to get them to wake up, to recognize the common enemy and stop seeing each other as a common enemy.

You know, if you disagree with J blogs, you're a controlled opposition that that garbage has got to stop just because people disagree. It doesn't mean that they're controlled opposition or they're a Freemason. It's just garbage. That stuff's got to stop because it just doesn't serve any purpose. So let's get back to the six.

What do you know? Where's it happening? When's it happening? And how's it happening? So, um, so on the sixth, uh, they're setting up in front of Parliament house at 10 a. m. Um, apparently, they've got, uh, a few convoys coming from different areas, particularly up north. Uh, so that'll be good to see that turn up.

Um, Bilbo, the team will be there on the 5th, so as I said earlier, we can sort of set up and get to see who's who in the zoo and, and build some networks and, and some contacts and, uh, and so on. So, that's, that's what it's scheduled to do. We will probably head back home on the 7th, I'd say, after, after it's over.

Uh, so, you know, once again, I can only say, Everybody needs to be there. Um, everybody who's anyone needs to be there show support for our agricultural sector. And, and even though, you know, I think they should be going harder. We need to show support for people who take initiative and do actually put themselves on the line and, and organize these things.

And I mean, this is not a, this is not a small thing. You know, like I've had a bit of a go at them about the content and how far they go. As people who have been involved with, you know, Billboard Battalion and myself over the years, we've organized a huge amount of, of enormous protest rallies and so on.

And it takes, in some cases, months of organizing. It consumes your life to put it all together. So, hats off to the people who have organized it because it's a gutsy move. It's time consuming. It's enormous. And people do that out of desperation. So, you know, the, all, all the best of luck to them. And I hope we can make it bigger than what they think.

So I really encourage everybody get behind it from all over Australia and just push it, spread it, share it. And hopefully we can build something that we can build on even further, but at least get behind this in the first instance, because we will, we are, and we do. So let's see what we can do from there on.

I agree and uh, Grant Piper is the uh, Chair of the National Rational Energy Network. Now they've been, they're a pretty strong lobby group. We wanted to get them on tonight but they're having a rally organizing meeting. Now they're going to be there as well, um, and they're all fighting for the same things.

The agenda I see on the poster that the farmers are putting up are very similar. So they're concerned about a whole bunch of stuff. Their agenda's clear and Australians need to support the grassroots people. If they're there, we should be there. Um, John and I will be there. I think Michael Gray Griffith will be there.

I think there's going to be a whole bunch of people there. And, uh, as I said, for me. I want him to be looking at this, uh, looking at getting anywhere near the stage. I don't want to, I want to be in amongst the people and cheer the people who are doing the things that we need them to do. And, um, and we're going there.

I'll be there. I'll be in Canberra for two nights and then I've got to head home and that's it. And, uh, if there's a convoy heading from the Gold Coast, I'll probably join that along the route somewhere. And, um, and it'll be good to get down there and see. Hopefully a whole bunch of people turn up and fill that people's paddock because nothing puts the wind up the politicians more than to see that the, the electorate's unhappy.

And, uh, at the moment they're having a field day because the electorate's asleep. That's it. Everyone in the electorate is asleep. They're fat, dumb, and happy, and they don't wanna know. Yeah, no, I mean. So many of

them have been bumped from pillar to post, you know, their, their strategy has been to demoralize people and to put people under stress and distress.

That's what they've been doing. So the easiest point of least resistance is for people to go now, well, COVID's over, the restrictions are off. Um, there's no more mandates, uh, life is good, happy days, you know, there's nothing going on and we're, we're back to the footy or we're back to going and seeing our friends or we're back to just living life.

Uh, in the meantime, through the parliament right now, they're putting legislation in place, the digital identification, the digital currency, um, the misinformation and disinformation act. Uh, these are the explosives that I talk about that they're placing under the foundations of our life, our lives right now.

They're putting those explosives in there and our politicians are giving them those explosives. So this has to play out. So let's see where it goes. Um, so we'll be there and, uh, let's hope that we see a crowd like the one behind John's photo there because that, that, uh, that was unbelievable. That was just incredible.

The people of Australia have had enough. The people of the world have had enough. And, uh, and the, the thing is that they just seem to be acting with impunity because they've got the mainstream media on their side. Um, they don't care if we know the truth anymore because they've already worked out that we're, we're going to be compliant.

In general, they've already worked that out. So they don't have to hide the agenda anymore. WF don't have to hide their agenda, you know, cause most people are saying, nah, they wouldn't do that. Well, they're doing it. They're doing it right under our noses in that building, in the background behind John's head.

You can look, you can say it. You look at what's being canceled in this country, Australia day, Anzac day. Um, faith has been canceled. Gender's been canceled. Everything's been cancelled for this vanilla homogenised society that we're all going to be living in like lemmings. It's just unbelievable. I never thought I'd see it happen in my lifetime, but it is, and, uh, we either stand up and do something or we just let it happen.

I mean, there is no choice. If you know it's happening, you can't unlearn it. Well, that's right, and I mean, at the end of the day, the things that are happening now have been documented from, you know, all sorts of different dictators and people who hate Uh, our country, they've been saying this for a hundred years that this is what they're going to do.

So people need to understand that it's all part of the, uh, the plan and the strategy and you just need to switch on now and start having a red hot crack. It's as simple as that. All right. Well, we better get this out. I want to get this out tonight to give people a bit of time to get organized because I know a lot of people are wondering what's going on.

And that's been a bit sad too, because it doesn't seem to be getting much promotion anywhere. But, um, there it is now. And, uh, another 15 hour drive to Canberra for me. Well, I mean, at the end of the day, Hoodie, you know, you talked about, uh, people saying about controlling opposition and whatever. Um, Who are the people who are promoting things and who are the people who are not and they're just this dumb backbiting and snapping and carrying on, you know, let's, let's get, let's, let's get us all Australians on the one page.

Let's get us all in the fight and going in the same direction and supporting each other. And I think it would be amazing how much we can achieve and how much that we can win and we can take your country back. If we can just all fight together as one shoulder to shoulder, one country, one unit, one fighting force in the defense of our country and our families.

Well on that note we need to bring it to a close and I'm going to do that as I customarily do with a prayer. Lord, Father in heaven, we just want to thank you that we're able to speak across a vast distance about issues that are troubling, issues that are really clearly indicative of a battle between good and evil.

And Lord, you want us to stand in the light. And we need to stand in the light. So give us the strength and courage and wisdom to make the choices that have a stand in the light. So ultimately we can see victory one way or another. We pray this in Jesus. Holy name. Amen. Amen. All right, Johnny, you've often been heard to say, you just couldn't make this stuff up.

You couldn't make this stuff up. Why, um, seeing Canberra. Absolutely. Hoodie. We'll be there, mate. Thank you. I'll be there. Thanks for coming on. And, uh, don't forget the, uh, reckless renewables guys as well, doing a, a mountain of work. They're meeting with strategies at the moment and strategies are good.

Because, um, we can do an awful lot if we get organized. So stay out of the trees, everyone. Don't forget what you did yesterday. I got you to today and, um, just keep thinking that way. It's a day by day proposition, but for goodness sake, don't say, why don't they do something? Because the they is you. So now is our time.

Let's do it and see where we go from there. God bless you all. Thanks for watching Club Grubbery. Uh, thanks for coming on Wade and we'll see you in Canberra and everyone else we'll see you in Canberra too. Bye for now.
