

Raw transcript of interview:

Graham and John have a service announcement for NSW...

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G'day Johnny Lardy, you big grub. How are you buddy? I'm just as grubby as you are, what do you know? Oh, what do I know? New South Wales Health has struck again, hoodie. They have, mate, and before we get into that, let's put out a reminder straight up. We've got a fantastic interview screening tonight at seven o'clock Eastern time with John Larrow, the president who is defending, sorry, the lawyer who is defending the president of United States, Donald Trump.

You're all dopes. Now, you know, a lot of people are going to say, what are you guys on about talking about mulch? This isn't about the mulch. It isn't about the ambulance allocation. It's about the ineptitude of the bureaucracy that has run everything that we've had to put up with for the last few years with this pandemic.

That's exactly right. Same mentality, the same kind of guiding principles drive everything that has put us all through the ringer for the last three years, John. I mean, you're a prime example of that. Still unemployed from the perspective of your, of your, uh, fully qualified profession after 25 years experience.

That's why we're mentioning this. It's got nothing to do with asbestos in the park. It's got nothing to do with two wheel drive ambulances. It's got to do with the inept. And let's face it, downright incompetent bureaucracies that are running our country at the moment. Yeah, it's a, it's a lack of, uh, accountability.

It's a lack of foresight. It's a lack of common sense. I mean, would you allow an ambulance station in the snowy mountains to not have a four wheel drive ambulance? Would you not have a spare one that you'd park in there in case one of these vehicles was at the panel beater? I mean, this is the sort of show he's running.

Am I wrong in assuming that not too long ago, uh, crews of the ambulance station at Tumut decided to embark on a journey, a very junior cruise, I might add. Uh, without too much experience, embarked on a journey to Canberra where they took the two wheel drive ambulance across the Brindabella Ranges because the GPS took them on the shortest route.

When if they'd gone via the Hume Highway, it would have all been over and done in no time and they dragged a patient, I believe with very painful injuries, over a very rough terrain in a two wheel drive ambulance. Well, look, let's face it, mate, if, if this, if this past three years hadn't had such dire tragic consequences on so many people, this would be the greatest comedy show since Laurel and Hardy.
