

Raw transcript of interview:

# Graham gives and update on the Queensland judgement and other matters...

Well, good day, everyone. And Hoody here, 27th of February on my own tonight with a Club Grubbery update, uh, because our mate Johnny Larder and his beautiful wife, Caitlin, are on their way back from a couple of days break. Uh, which they desperately needed and, uh, there's been some really good stuff happening and we need to quickly touch on that, uh, to keep up to date with what's happening.

First, a massive announcement today that, uh, the, the, uh, Queensland Police Service and Queensland Health have been told by a federal, uh, a Supreme Court judge in Queensland that they acted unlawfully with the mandates. Now this is huge, there's a 115 page judgment that's being reviewed at the moment by Senator Ralph Babbitt and Senator Malcolm Roberts, um, we're hoping to interview both of those gentlemen in the coming days about this issue and hopefully Ralph Babbitt will come onto the program.

But I've spoken to a paramedic in Queensland today, they're all guarded, uh, nobody's sort of counting the chickens before they hatch. But this is a major, major victory and it could be the wedge in the damn wall that we've been hoping for. At last, we're seeing a small victory and this could ricochet all around all the states.

The mandates, uh, I know in Qantas, Alan Joyce said that the mandates were lawful and reasonable. Well, they definitely weren't and they didn't pass the pub test. And now we're seeing that borne out and I think we're going to see a lot of employers, given that they're, they've been ordered to compensate some people who are mandated to be vaccinated and, um, and now this case has gone through and vindicated all those, uh, people who, uh, brought the action to the Queensland government.

Katrina Carroll, the police commissioner has Resigned only a few days ago. Uh, we've seen Palaszczuk gone. Yvette Darf has gone. Uh, they're all jumping off the ship. They're all rats fleeing the sinking ship. We're just seeing lots of resignations around the place and people are starting to see that maybe the truth is starting to bear fruit.

So, we all need to keep praying about that and keep backing that and keep the pressure on. Remember, John and I have always been about ending the mandates, getting everyone their jobs back, protecting the kids from compulsory vaccination. And, uh, and, and, uh, and we want a Royal Commission at least, and to that end, we're hoping to see some results too on the 14th, as Tony Nikolic and AFL solicitors go and appear before the Senate in relation to the terms of reference, and, uh, who knows who else will be there.

Perhaps John and I will be there as well. We don't know just yet, but we're, we're looking at all of that as we speak. Uh, the other, uh, big wins, of course, has been the, um, The Australian Senate doing an about face on Ralph Babbitt's motion, uh, Senator Babbitt's motion to have an investigation into the, um, the high death rates in Australia.

And, uh, this has been, this has been the third attempt to get this through. Now, it's worthy of note that Pocock, Lambie and, uh, Thorpe were the ones who, uh, who sided with the Greens and Labor to have this motion defeated. Well, they've switched camp. And I think that's largely because of the pressure that we and you guys have put on them.

It's time that they woke up to the fact that Australians are dying at an alarming rate. The excess death rate is going through the roof. And that should trigger some kind of investigation. Now, it's early days yet. There's no, uh, There's no Senate hearings being called yet, but this has been the first step.

So, uh, congratulations to Senator Ralph Babbitt and his team and those Freedom Senators, excuse me, who have been, who voted for it and, um, I'm glad some common sense is prevailing with the other independents who've come out and, uh, now joined. The right side to get this thing investigated. Great news there.

Also, I've been talking to Kim Staten, the producer of The Trustful, Julian Assange. Um, that movie is going gangbusters in Europe. He's in Spain at the moment. It went fantastically well in the UK. It was like people were queuing up for hours to get in. And I think it's going to do very well in Australia.

It looks like event cinemas. Village Roadshow, Hoyts are all going to run it in all their cinemas. And the other good news is that the pressure has finally gotten to Albanese, who is now lobbying very hard to get Julian Assange brought home and he's pulling out all stops. We hope you are. Alba, because you need to.

This has gone on long enough. The world can't rest while, um, while Julian Assange is locked up. We can't. We have no moral authority and, um, and he needs to be free. This has gone on long enough. It's ridiculous. And we look at other things that are going on around the world. The death of Alexei Navalny in Russia, um, a fit young man who opposed Vladimir Putin, now dead.

Um, we're not surprised. We're probably the only surprise is that it didn't happen earlier. It's just incredible the way the world's going. So all these, all these things bode well for us. It's looking good. There is hope. We must keep our spirits up. We must keep loving each other. Keep being compassionate.

And keep the pressure on, write to the politicians and write to the media and tell them you're not happy and tell them why, because it's starting to mount up. I know that in Qantas, uh, a lot of people that I worked with, um, were pretty cruel when I, when I left the organization under the circumstances I left in.

I, uh, I witnessed their comments on a anonymous, uh, chat room site used by aircrew. I won't mention the name of it, but, uh, there were pages and pages of threads that were disparaging about me, um, because I did the things that I did back in, um, in 2021, and they were very hurtful to see. But the, uh, the coin has turned, and, uh, some of those have apologized to me.

Some have told me they wish they'd listened. Some of them told me they wish that they'd stood their ground and didn't cave in, and, uh, things are changing dramatically. Now, I made statements back in those days that, uh, the, the pilots who so quickly caved into these mandates did themselves no favor in industrial terms because they showed the company that they didn't have the backbone to stand up for their EBAs and their future contract negotiations.

And they sure have done that. But the time for retribution is over. What we've got to do now is start pulling together as a nation. So let's do that. Let's stop the name calling. Let's stop the, um, the trolling and let's just get on with it because we may just see a victory. It's long overdue. So keep your powder dry and let's pray for an outcome.

Lord, father in heaven, we just thank you, Lord, that we, we see glimpses of justice and we see glimpses of truth, but ultimately Lord, we know that you have an ending for this and justice is mine, sayeth the Lord. So we just thank you for your constant vigilance over us, for your grace, mercy, and wisdom. And we ask you to be with those who are perplexed at this stage as a result of the things that have happened.

We pray that lawmakers and, and survivors of these situations are like. We'll grow together and these things will get sorted. It's time. We thank you in Jesus name. Amen. If you love somebody and you haven't told them for goodness sake, call them and do it. Don't do anything unless you're going to do it with compassion.

God bless you all and we'll be back with more clubbery, club grubbery programs in the next couple of days. We've just given Johnny a couple of days off and we're tidying a few things up and we'll be back with some more interviews in the next day or two. So keep tuned and keep your fingers crossed.

We're there. We're getting there. God bless you all and bye for now.
