2024-03-28 Graham and John speak to the introduction to the digital I.D. into the Federal Parliament...

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G'day

everyone, Thursday the 28th of March and, uh, Johnny, we've just got to come on and talk about this. Yeah, look, it broke last night, Hoody, but disgraceful scenes in the Federal Parliament and we need to be very strong on what we're about to talk about. Exactly right. Look, and for those of you who aren't aware, the Federal Government pushed through the Digital ID Identification Bill last night and no debate, no nothing.

Now, we've said a lot, John, that the definition of fascism is when governments and corporations work together for the common good. That's fascism. Now we've had fascism in Australia for a long time under that, under that guise. Our government has been fascist, but it hasn't been a fascist dictatorship because it still maintains the principles of democracy.

But that died last night. Anthony Albanese heading the Liberal, uh, sorry, the Labor and Greens, uh, coalition, let's call it for what it is, Became, uh, a fascist dictator last night, uh, when legislation was put, push through without debate, without debate, digital ID legislation. Johnny, you put up a tweet this morning.

Just tell us what you said on your tweet. Yeah, look, basically, I, I, uh, shared a, uh, a screenshot of Pauline Hanson when she broke this last night, uh, advising who'd voted for and against this and, uh, said, uh, we need to, uh, take note of the grubs that voted for this, uh, and I said, uh, that our, our need to take Service men and women that died and fought for our freedoms.

Um, they, they would, uh, they they've just disgrace them. And I said, we, we will remember them lest we forget, referring to these senators, uh, that have voted to disgrace the, uh, the, uh, memory, uh, and the futures of, of, of, uh, all Australians. Now for people. We're gonna show the list very shortly, and it's important to note the list.

I'm going to show you. It's people who voted for and against having, having the government debate this before it was put through for, to be passed as a bill, which it now has been. So we're not, you know, when we see, when we see a list of ayes or those who voted yes, um, they are voting yes to have a debate about it and not have it go through undebated, which is totally undemocratic.

Now, a lot of people are going to say, You know, Johnny, it's been pushed as it's going to be so easy for you to access government services. It's going to be so simple, um, for you to sign in at various places and and obtain services that you need to obtain. Let's go back to when 5G was brought in. 5G was brought in because This will be the mechanism to allow you to enjoy Netflix and live stream much faster.

It's going to be so good. Online shopping will be so good for you. But most people don't realize, apart from the negative effects of 5G on the environment, let's put that aside, most people don't realize that 5G is a mechanism for facial identification, digital passports, A central bank digital currency and digital ID.

They're all meshed together. And what does digital ID mean? Well, it's all right. It might make you getting access to government benefits a bit easier. But it's also going to be linked to central bank digital currency. And that means that the government will decide Whether you've been good enough to access funds and use your money, cash will be gone.

And all these rules and ar arbitrary, uh, arrangements that are being made without proper consultation are being done in the night behind your back. And who is, A lot of people will say, some of you will say, well, look, I'm a good person. I'm, I'm not ashamed of being seen doing anything. I don't do anything illegal.

But who's the arbiter of what's illegal and what isn't? Mm-Hmm., who is it that's gonna say that your speech was. was, uh, was fair and reasonable and lawful or that it was hate speech or whatever. Who's the arbiter of that in, in the, uh, in the realms of what we're discussing, John, with, um, with, uh, misinformation bills, ACMA, the Australian council, uh, Australian, whatever it is, media authority, they're the ones who are going to be the arbiters of what's, what's they deem to be free speech and what is hate speech.

And people need to realize that this is a thin end of the wedge. Yeah, scary stuff, Woody. I mean, you think of the rallies that we've been to over the past couple of years. I mean, they could identify, uh, under this legislation, anyone that attended those rallies and lock them up. That's it. Or limit your ability to buy and sell.

Limit your ability to work. Limit your ability to access transport or medical treatments. That's what this is ultimately all about. Now, if we've got governments who are voting this stuff in, they are either corrupted. Or they're, they have no intellect. They cannot reason. They cannot think things through.

It's the foundation of a social credit system. No doubt about it. This gives them the framework to do what they want to do. I mean, it's not so much what they're doing now. It's what they're going to do with this that should alarm people. Exactly right. So, you know, folks, you can, you can let this happen. Uh, you can sit back and do nothing, but One Nation is mounting a full on offensive about this.

Uh, they're putting up that petition has gone out already. We've signed it. We urge everybody to sign it. I know there's been a lot of petitions, but this one is crucial. If you don't sign this one, you're not in the game. Um, so it's out there. We're putting it out there. So let's have a look at who the people are who, who have, who have literally destroyed democracy in this country.

I'll share screen and we'll bring up a list because it's absolutely disgraceful. This is a list, uh, published by Senator Malcolm Roberts. Now this is the list of senators who voted for and against having a proper debate on the digital ID bill. Now the digital ID will be rammed through the Senate tonight without a word of debate.

Thanks to Labor, Greens and David Vann. David Vann was the vote that got it through. without a debate, right? Not getting the bill through, but denying the Senate the opportunity to have a debate. Now let's look at those who said we want a debate and they're the usual players with a few, a few exceptions.

Antic, Babbitt, Canavan, Cash is sort of leaning this way a bit lately, uh, who also are Pauline Hanson. We expected her to come out. Jackie Lambie. Good on you, Jackie. Um, McKenzie, McLaughlin, Patterson, David Pocock, Jared Rennick, of course, Malcolm Roberts, of course, Paul Scarr, um, that's a good one, John, because he was the chair of the committee hearing that you and I spoke at.

Uh, and Lydia Thorpe. Good on you, Lydia Thorpe. Now, these are the people, and others there, 33 of them said we want a debate before this gets pushed through. Now, let's look at the, let's call them for what they are. Let's look at the, um, the dummies. I'll be, I'll be really generous here, John. Let's look at the dummies.

Um, and my internet's going unstable, it's telling me. But, uh, we'll see how we go. We'll work through it. Look at the no's. They're all Labor and the Greens. Look at the standouts. Look at them. Penny Wong. Penny Wong. Hanson Young. Sheldon. Shoebridge. Shoebridge. Look at these. Look at these. Now, I'm not gonna say they're stupid because a lot of those people have intellect.

You can't say Penny Wong doesn't have intellect. You could probably not say that about Sarah Hanson Young. I don't know but but other than the only qualification she's got is that she's a graduate of a World Economic Forum Young Leaders. Now, Um, Penny Wong is no deal. Penny Wong is quite smart. So, Penny Wong's pushing this stuff through and she's a foreign affairs minister.

Why is she pushing it through without debate? Where's the democracy? Ladies and gentlemen, looking at that list, that's a clear list of who murdered democracy in Australia yesterday. That's it, pure and simple. Thoughts, Johnny? Well, Huddy, it's, uh, it's an absolute disgrace. Um, why? I dunno how any bill, uh, can't, uh, be debated.

I mean, it shouldn't even have to have a vote. I mean, it's absolutely ridiculous that something can just be put through without the absence of debate or the ability to, to debate. Uh, it's, it is, it is something that obviously needs to be rectified in, in the parliament. Uh, you should have the opportunity to speak and, uh, to, to not allow That is a blatant disregard for our democracy.

So Johnny, just to remind us all, you're all over politics. My understanding is the Senate is the chamber where the lawmakers pass the bills. Yeah, that's correct. But I think in some instances they can. Uh, pass. They, they can, uh, create legislation as well. Um, I'm just not 100 percent certain on the, um, on how all that works.

Uh, normally, normally what happens is in, in usual circumstances is you would have legislation, uh, pass the lower house and then it comes to the upper house. Uh, for, for, um, a passage through and that's where you end up with your checks and balances, obviously, because if, if something, uh, is passed in the lower house where the, where the government usually has a majority, then you, you more than likely don't have that majority in the upper house and there's, there's scrutiny of the, of the, uh, of the legislation, uh, and we can end up with, uh, sensible changes, um, And, and, you know, you can quite often end up with very good outcomes, um, and, and sensible legislation.

But, um, here we've got a situation where I'm not exactly sure what's, what's transpired here, but, uh, I mean, it should worry people that these things are being done in the dead of night, uh, without any fanfare from, uh, Anyone, I mean the media were caught unaware of this, obviously, uh, it was obviously just pushed through, uh, and, uh, it's, it's absolutely ridiculous.

Well, it shows how dumb they are in lots of ways too, John, because what they've done is woken more sleeping tigers. A lot of people are going to wake up now as a result of this. Um, I reiterate fascism is when corporations and government combine together for the common good. Now, how are the corporations involved in this?

Well, it's simple. Who's providing all the technology? Who's managing all the data? And who is the corporations? Well, the Australian government's a corporation. So, uh, I have this morning approached, uh, Pauline Hanson, Malcolm Robertson, Craig Kelly from One Nation to come onto a panel with us. Um, I'm also going to contact, uh, Professor Augusto Zimmerman, uh, who is, um, a rule of law expert in Australia and a constitutional law expert.

And he is ashamed of what this government has done to our constitution. So we're getting, we're going to get him on. And we need to discuss this because this is the thin end of the wedge. I mean, we can talk about all these other things, uh, you know, that people are concerned about, but if we don't focus on the thin end of the wedge and break that off at the tip, um, all this other stuff is irrelevant.

This, this is where the battle is at the moment. This is, this is the part of the wall that's being breached and we've got to stand in the hole. So, um, we've got to get that out there. So please sign the petition. We've got it up on our sites, sign the petition and get your friends to sign it. Don't just sit there and sign it and, and think you've done your thing.

You've got to tell people what this is all about. And look at the timing, Hoody, uh, Easter, you know, they, they, they. You know, like, it, it just reeks, doesn't it, you know, they think we're fools, but, uh, as you say, uh, people are now taking a very keen interest in what's going on in these places, uh, and, and they are going to be held to account, rest assured, uh, because there are now, um, people, uh, that, that are keen for, um, for, for people like us to hold them to account.

Uh, you know, that's, that's what the people watching us on a daily basis now want. They're sick of it. And they haven't had a voice. Now they've got one. And, yeah, and a few others as well. I mean, Maria Z's been hitting this pretty hard, I tell you what, and, um, and she does her research. Look, this, this is just, um, we're living in times of, you know, that are unprecedented in world history.

There's no doubt about it. Everyone can see there's something going on. And I think it's, you know, the, the potential for what's going on is so scary to a lot of people that they're sticking their heads in the sand because they don't want to look at it, but it's okay because there are solutions if we, if we did the right thing and we band together, there are solutions.

And all you've got to do is not comply. All you've got to do is say, no, I'm not going along with that. Sorry. I don't agree with that. And I'm going to fight against that. Uh, I'm going to vote against you. Now, when a government gets voted in, they say the people gave us a mandate. Did you see anywhere where digital ID was part of the mandate that the Labour Party pushed?

Did you see anywhere where, uh, signing the international health regulation amendment was part of that, uh, mandate that they were given? What did they come in on? Lower electricity prices, 250 cheaper. Well, what happened to that? Lower cost of living, reducing cost of living pressures. What happened to that?

So there's a couple of mandates that they dropped. They came in on, on, uh, on the, uh, referendum. Made that a big issue as well. And the Australian people voted no. And still. They push on knowing that the people have had enough of them. Um, look, this ID stuff's a complete scam. I mean, you've only got to look at births, deaths and marriages.

Uh, now how many, how many parents would have ordered a birth certificate with one of those really pretty commemorative. Pictures on it with the fauna and fauna or, or whatever, or you can get your football team or whatever the case may be. Now, wouldn't you think, uh, that rather than put it in the fine print, that that document cannot be used as an official document?

I mean, I don't know why. Why not make it so that it can be. So all these parents are being called out. They're going to, you know, you know, get, uh, allowances from Centrelink or whatever the case may be, uh, to register their child for even vaccinations or whatever. They can't use these documents. And so then they've got to go back to Births, Deaths and Marriages and order another document.

Uh, one at 60 or 70. I mean, the whole system is just completely broken. Uh, we've got all this mad bureaucracy and here it comes again. Here's another level of it. This, this will not be simplifying anything. It'll be another, um, complete mess. A complete stuff up. You know that if Labor's in control of it, it'll be an absolute disaster.

Yep, and I'll tell you what, the Liberal Party need to, uh, need to be standing up and jumping up and kicking about this in a big way. They, uh, if they don't, they're, look, they are showing themselves as no better than Labor. Well, they started it, Hooty. They were the ones that kicked off this legislation, these dopes.

Yep. Um, they should hang their heads in shame. Menzies would be turning in his grave at this nonsense. Yeah, and so would some of the old Labor blokes too, Billy Hughes, Kurt, and all those guys.
