2024-04-14 Graham and John discuss recent and today's current affairs...

Well, G'day everyone and welcome to Club Grubbery. We're doing one on a Sunday, Johnny, because there's a whole bunch of stuff going on around the world and it's been a hectic week. And, um, You've been off doing some things you needed to get done and we've missed you, but we've got to cover off on a few items, mate.

Yeah, been driving all around the countryside, uh, doing a few errands, so, uh, back with it now, though, have we? Yeah, like the Leyland brothers, mate, traveling all over the countryside. That's it. So, uh, I've got a substantial list of stuff we need to talk about here tonight. Um, uh, of course, Tony Abbott's interview, uh, with us has made the mainstream, um, Samantha Landy, the, uh, reporter from the Herald Sun with an, uh, an item the other day saying that more defibs are needed as cardiac arrests are up 20 percent in Victoria.

Um, Dr. Boz, who is, uh, A physician in America who's well known. She's a YouTuber and she does a lot of podcasting, uh, coming out and apologizing to her patients for vaccinating them and telling her that she regrets her role in, uh, in that. And, uh, of course, we've had two tragic deaths. Which nobody seems to be looking at.

Of course, we're talking about the reporter from Sunrise. Uh, what, in his early 40s, dropped dead while walking his dog. And a very popular Sydney surfer, who was also a leading hand with Qantas. Just dropping dead. A young man, fit and, uh, gone, but nobody joins the dots. We've got a Japanese, uh, emeritus professor from Osaka University.

Uh, Professor Inouye, who's saying ban the jabs and, and, uh, criticizing the Japanese government for their role in, uh, vaccinating people. South Australian government have come out this week and talked about mandates. And, uh, you're going to talk about something going on in Canada, which is bizarre. And then of course we have the horrible events in Bondi and, uh, what looks like a World War Three about to erupt in Iran.

But other than that, it's a really lovely day and it's good to see you all. Yeah. Well, that's, that's, that's the state of the state of affairs, isn't it? Uh, and, and on top of that, we've also got, uh, Karen Webb, um, still at it, still, uh, refusing to accept the police back. And, uh, from what I, uh, can establish, uh, she's paid out 700, 000.

Uh, or her department has in redundancy, uh, payments to two spin doctors hoodie that she got rid of. 700, 000 of taxpayer money just gone. And one of them I believe didn't even turn a sod, did he? I don't think so. I think he was, wasn't even there. He hadn't even turned up. Wow. I mean, it's just bizarre, mate.

It's just bizarre. But let's get to Tony Abbott because um, that was a real boost. A lot of people were, uh, were obviously voicing their concerns about our former prime minister when he appeared on our program. Uh, I thought it was a great interview. Uh, there were a lot of things we, uh, we wanted to discuss, but ran out of time.

But anyhow, look, he was very magnanimous with his time. He was generous. He was very, Um, he copped a bit of a caning from some of our viewers, but, uh, the Guardian picked up the article, or picked up the interview, and, uh, we got a bit of a run in the mainstream media on the Guardian and also with, um, Sky News, John.

Yeah, well, look, I think, uh, I think people are right to be, to be critical, uh, of people. I mean, we don't, uh, we don't get better. We don't improve things unless we, we, we critique what's going on and, and everyone's had a part to play. Uh, in it, um, at some point, but I think, you know, we, we've been trying to get people back to work.

Uh, that, that was, you know, we, we've had a couple of key themes and the advice that we received very early on was that we, we have to, uh, keep it as, you know, as normal as possible so that we can appeal to, to the mums and dads that are at home that are watching, uh, Sunrise every morning and ABC News at night.

And, uh, watching us, um, that, that they don't necessarily understand what's going on. And, and, and part of that battle has been to get people, uh, like Tony Abbott to come on to Club Grubbery to speak, uh, freely about what's, what's going on. And, uh, I think that's where some people probably have, uh, you know, not understood our intentions and, and, and it was a real coup to get, uh, Tony Abbott to, to come on to Club Grubbery because, Uh, you know, we're not seen necessarily, uh, by the media as being rational.

Uh, majority of people would think this is a cooker program. Yeah. And so I think it demonstrated, uh, that, that somebody of, of Tony Abbott's, uh, um, you know, former, former prime minister, uh, of this country was happy to come onto Club Grubbery and discuss it. I think that that should be applauded. Um, and he should be, uh, he should be, uh, uh, given a green tick for doing that.

And The fact that mainstream media has picked up on it and reported on it has been, uh, excellent in, in getting the message out. It has, John. And, and, uh, I can understand people being upset. They're saying, oh, what did you interview him for? Uh, but would they be upset if we got, say, Kerry Chant or Brad Hazard on the program?

I mean, and we'd love to have them on, uh, by all means, because we want to hear their side of the story and we want to get them into a position where we can tell them our side of the story. So we're going to go for whoever we can get that gets us into the living rooms of people at home who are just yawning to, to, uh, to become awake.

And, uh, and, and I think the interview with, with Tony Abbott was very good for club grubbery and therefore good for the cause because we've got to get these messages out to people. So a lot of people who've read the Guardian or watch Sky News have, I've known now that Tony Abbott was interviewed by Club Grubbery and they're looking at our website.

So this is how we get things changed. It's brilliant. So, you know, I think it was a real coup and all kudos to you, mate. You worked hard to get that interview. And we've got some more really good ones in the, in the mix as well. But um, yeah, so thanks to everybody for you for sharing that interview. And most people weren't, most people would, were annoyed with Tony Abbott.

But they weren't annoyed with us. And nor should they be because we're trying to bring you as many points of view as we can so we can all make rational decisions and choices. Well, what people have got to understand is that John Larder and Graham Hood, uh, and some of the other people that we have on the program, like Dr.

Philip Altman, may not necessarily change the, uh, the viewpoint of people like Dr. Kerry Chan. But having a former prime minister say that things were grotesque. certainly will, um, grab their attention. And I think that's, that's where you've got to focus on. Indeed. And look, you know, there's this mentality too out there, John, that says you should have spoken up earlier.

Uh, hindsight's a great thing and we're not making excuses for anybody, but would, would we rather that they didn't say anything at all? I mean, wouldn't we love Dr. Nick Coatsworth to come out now and tell us what he really believes, because we know that he's not happy. You can tell he's not happy with the way things have been going.

Wouldn't we love that to happen? Um, and you know, we've all got to accept that when these people come out, it's better late than never. Um, so I think, uh, you know, the more come out, the more it looks like it's crumbling. And John, with all these other items that I've got in front of me, this narrative is crumbling.

There's no doubt about it. Well, it really is only a matter of time. But you know, we have to keep the pressure on and that's, that's what we're doing. Exactly right. So let's go to the second item on my list. The Herald Sun in

Melbourne, uh, Samantha Landy reporting on, uh, 10 postcodes in the Melbourne area that have seen massive 20 percent increases in deadly cardiac arrests.

Um, and they're looking for more defibrillators to put around. Now, this is really fascinating stuff because it goes hand in hand with the, uh, with the Australian College of General Practitioners, who issued a warning to all GPs in the last seven days, John, about, uh, about heart issues and issues pertaining to long COVID and maybe vaccination injury.

Uh, and, and Dr. John Campbell covered up that. Covered off on that beautifully in a program, which we rebroadcast, uh, while you're away just a few days ago, John. So these are significant pieces of information that are coming out into the public arena, aren't they? Certainly, Hooty. Uh, you know, if that document from the Australian College of General Practitioners, uh, was Two years ago, you know, we're certainly, uh, not having this discussion now.

Uh, you know, I think the fact that they've sent this to all the practitioners, all the doctors, uh, is, is a good sign. Uh, it's certainly, uh, when you look at it, I mean, it, it, it certainly opens up the doctor's minds to what's going on there. They're, they're, they're, they're saying in this document that Uh, it's not, uh, an unreasonable conclusion to say that, uh, that long COVID is, is in fact a vaccine injury.

Uh, so I think it's a very important, uh, step and, uh, you know, health officials around around the place should be taking absolute note of, uh, of, of what that document says and, and what very, very senior clinicians around the world are saying, including in Australia about the jabs. I mean, our own Dr.

Phillip Altman, uh, has said that these things don't work. Uh, should be ceased immediately due to the, uh, the, um, the dangers of it. So I don't know what more you can, you can say in terms of that, but certainly a peak body coming up with that journal article and sending it to every, uh, practitioner is, is a good step.

And in fact, APRA, APRA now, uh, should be, should be jumping in. And they should be saying, well, we got this wrong. Uh, we should never have sent that, uh, um, notification out to the health practitioners, uh, demanding that they don't speak up because the problem is. We're now in this situation because of, of that, of that document.

Uh, in, in my opinion, that, that is a very key element to, to us being here. Uh, that they essentially made sure that anyone with a contrary view to the government, uh, and those pushing this jab were silenced. Yeah, look, that's true. And I mean, uh, you know, we've talked about this reporter from the Sunrise program, a lovely guy who, um, Your father of two, two kids.

I mean, it's just tragic. Uh, we're not saying it's jab related. The same with this, with the, uh, with the guy, the surfer guy from, uh, that worked at Qantas. Um, we're not saying it's jab related, but what we are saying is that there is sufficient doubt that should cause a thorough investigation involving people from both sides of the spectrum.

Dr. Peter McCullough, for example, would be here in Australia in a heartbeat if the Health Minister said he wanted a conference between the Health Department and people like Dr. Peter McCullough. They would be here in a heartbeat. Now, I personally believe it's vaccine related, and I know you do too, and I know most of our viewers do.

But let's put all that aside, John. In the interest of public safety, a desperate need now for health officials is to shut down the jab, put a stop to it straight away, bring out all the doctors from censorship, put them in a big hall somewhere and lock them up with the health department for as long as it takes to nut out what's really going on.

Because as it stands at the moment, health officials who've been pushing, uh, the narrative for the last four years, are starting to look like they backed the wrong horse and they're putting their own prestige ahead of the lives of Australians and other people around the world. And that, that's reprehensible.

That cannot be tolerated. Now is not the time to, to bolster yourself. Now is the time to say, hang on, because let's, John, let's face it, there's really only two possibilities that's causing all these excess deaths and cardiac arrest. It's either COVID. Or it's the vaccine, because they're the only two common denominators the mix for the last four years.

Well, you know, and that's why we need to, to have urgent, uh, studies, uh, into what's going on. I mean, it, it strikes me as absolutely ridiculous, Woody, that, that not one autopsy that I'm aware of has, has ever been conducted to ascertain whether the jab was the cause. Yeah, there are techniques that can be used to see whether the spike protein, et cetera, uh, but my, to the best of my knowledge, and look, I stand to be corrected.

Uh, that hasn't been deployed in Australia. In fact, uh, from what I understand, the majority, uh, of, uh, of autopsies in Australia now are very benign, you know, it's, it's a case of maybe a CT scan, uh, very little invasive stuff, uh, goes on because they say to the family, oh, do you really want your family, you know, Remember torn apart, you know, operated on to find out what's going on, you know, the whole thing is just, you know, well, it's sinister, I tell you that, that, that smells a box ticking now, doesn't it?

Of course it does. We did an autopsy. Yeah. They haven't done an autopsy ever though. I mean, from what I understand, the health department assisted the coroner in writing the guidelines for autopsies during, during the, uh, during the pandemic. Now. So called pandemic. Uh, so, you know, it's ridiculous. Uh, and, and as Steve Kelly is.

Uh, quite rightly, uh, pointed out, uh, on numerous occasions, there is significant flaws that have gone on with the, the investigation of deaths, uh, relating to, uh, vaccine, uh, and in fact, overall, uh, there has been significant What he, what he was concerned about early on, uh, as being a lack of, uh, uh, due diligence in regard to these, uh, autopsies.

In fact, he wrote to the coroner, uh, very early on and, and, uh, suggested that there needed to be, um, uh, more rigorous, uh, things put in place, but that was ignored. Yeah, it's bizarre. Look, uh, even, uh, the other day, Michelle and I went shopping at our local, uh, IGA about an hour from where we live. And the checkout chick who, who recognized me said, um, uh, she said, I haven't had this thing.

And she said, but my family who ignored me, uh, when I tried to warn them not to have it, they ignored me. Uh, my brother and my sister have had it. They've had three shots each. And, uh, now they're both, uh, Suffering from, uh, intense turbo cancers. They're attending different oncologists in different cities and the oncologists have told them that, uh, their condition is related to the vaccine and that they are snowed under with people in the same situation, John.

Now, if, if the checkout chick at the local supermarket is saying that and the doctors are telling, you know, her, her siblings that then why do we have a situation in South Australia, for example, lately where the. The, uh, the health minister of South Australia, which I can only describe as incompetent, is coming out expressly pushing people to get vaccinated.

And not only that, he's saying that the reason the vaccination rates have dropped off is because of misinformation and that needs to be stamped out. He's talking about people like us.

Well he's right. Uh, I mean, there is misinformation Hootie, but it's one sided. It's not from us. It's from these grubs. Uh, they haven't got a clue. I mean that, that health minister, he wouldn't have a clue what's going on. Um, he's likely never held a job. Uh, it, it just defies belief that these people can tell us, uh, with any authority that, uh, that people should undergo this or that.

I mean, they've got no credibility. I mean, I, I was aware very early on within the health system because I was contacted, um, by this doctor, uh, through, through the solicitors. Uh, now the doctor was a health, um, practitioner, uh, that was an expert in public health, an expert in public health, a medical doctor.

Working for Dr. Kerry Chant, directly reporting to Dr. Kerry Chant, and, uh, ultimately she was fired, uh, by Hazard directly, uh, and, uh, she, she warned them that there was going to be problems. And see, it doesn't matter whether it's South Australia, whether it's, whether it's News of Wales, this is where the problem is, Woody.

I mean, how can these doctors, uh, Uh, and other health professionals. In fact, um, anyone doesn't matter whether it's Graham hood, if you've got concerns, you should be able to raise them. And you should be able to have, um, those issues aired out. There was a complete shutdown, uh, of, of, of debate. Uh, there was an authoritarian approach taken.

They were backed by agencies such as ARPA, such as CASA, such as, uh, uh, you know, any of these other regulator. bodies that came in, they just backed them to the hilt, the, the snowy hydros of the world, the coals, the bunnings, the, you know, they all just ganged up and they just did what was necessary to, uh, make everyone comply.

And I mean, this is what I find so reprehensible hoodie. I mean, you know, this, this health minister was saying, Oh, you know, in South Australia, it's only 200 people. Uh, we're, we're not revising the health policy Uh, to say you don't have to be vaccinated because we want these 200 people back to work.

They've, uh, they've probably gone off to do other things. I mean, this is because circumstances have changed. Well, what circumstances have changed? I mean, at the end of the day, you people are there on your soapbox still going, you will do this. You know, we're highly recommending this. You must do. You still believe it.

You still believe it. Uh, you know, you're getting somebody to sign a waiver now. Uh, you know, it should be, it should be I don't know. It is just completely mad to me, uh, that they're still carrying on with this nonsense. Um, you know, we, we, we know that in the UK, I think 75 percent of health, um, officials or workers in the UK refuse the booster.

Now, how many people of the 47, 000 healthcare workers in South Australia have had the booster? I mean, that's the real issue here because you can't be compliant. I don't know how anyone can say under the current regime, how can you be compliant? How can you tick the green box, get a green, green tick? If you're not up to booster number six as a healthcare worker, well, they're the rules.

I mean, why is it you say you've only got to have two? Surely you've got to be up to number seven or whatever the number is. Um, so we need to know from the health minister in South Australia, why don't you tell us how many of the 47, 000 staff have complied with having a booster? They're the numbers we want to know because we know what the answer is.

The answer is that, uh, overwhelmingly. Uh, healthcare people in Australia and around the globe have refused the booster and with good reason because they've seen firsthand what carnage these MRNA jabs are causing. Yeah, they are. Look, and, and more and more eminent people are coming out like this, uh, this professor Masayasu Inoue from Japan.

He's Emeritus Professor of Immunology at Osaka University, John. And he's come out and said, these jabs must cease, they must stop, they are killing people. He goes all through the, uh, he goes right through the technical data to back up what he's saying. He's gone public in Japan, very public. He's damning the Japanese government, uh, for their, the production, um, technology that they're introducing now to bring out further mRNA vaccines, vaccines, serums.

And he, he is, he's virtually telling them that they're going to be up for murder if they keep it going. He's very animated about it. Um, he's incredibly brave for doing it. He's come out, he's put himself at risk, um, as a lot of these people have, John. Um, but it, but for what? It just seems to fall on deaf ears.

Because it's like these, uh, these Muppets that appear on the mainstream media spruiking this stuff. You know, it's just like, yeah, they're Muppets. You know, he's controlling them. That t shirt you're wearing says it all, Johnny. Well, it does, doesn't it? Yeah. Um, ban the WHO, ban the UN, ban the WEF, do not comply, you know, hashtag do not comply.

I mean, that, that's, um, that's what it's all about that and, and, you know, these people who are pushing this still on the mainstream, I don't know how they sleep at night. They obviously don't know what's going on. I wonder if the health minister in South Australia or Kerry Chant or anybody else has actually read any of the 88 peer reviewed papers on COVID 19 by Peter McCullough.

It's not yet. He is the most published author on COVID 19 in the world and he's been censored and I bet you not one health official in Australia who's making any of these decisions has even looked at any of his papers. And what are they going on? 95 percent funding from Big Pharma to the TGA.

Australia's TGA is the most heavily funded by Big Pharma of any TGA in the world. And they're going by the data that's given to them in the WEF, John. It's not acceptable. Well, look, what do you, we've seen it firsthand, haven't we? We've seen Senators Rennick, Antic, and, uh, Senator Malcolm Roberts, and, uh, a few others, uh, question these people like Dr.

Skerritt and, uh, other people that are involved in Uh, I've been, um, at the head of these organizations and, and their responses have been completely slippery. Yeah. What else can you say about it? I mean, there seems to be, uh, you know, they want to, they want to complicate things to the extent where people just have no understanding of what they're talking about.

And they, they, they talk in riddles, um, that they look for, uh, you know, bits of truth. Um, bits of information that make their, their, their arguments sound plausible and, uh, you know, that, that, that sort of supports them. Uh, and, and, you know, Jared Rennick, I've got to say, he has been phenomenal, really. I mean, he's.

His ability to be able to, to double down on, uh, in, in a, in a scientific sense, they, they just cannot get anything past him. Can I'm he's two steps ahead of him. He is. And I mean, he, his background is finance. John, you know, he, he came into, he came into politics. To change the taxation system and make it more fair and equitable in Australia.

And he seems to have more information in the top of his head than Skerritt has in a lifetime of study. I mean, it's embarrassing to watch him debating with Dr. Skerritt. It is an absolute embarrassment to see how he is one step ahead of these people. And these people are deciding our destiny. And our liberty of conscience.

I mean, it's just. And there's half a dozen of them at a desk, hoodie. You know, and they all default to someone else. I'll, I'll hand that over to Mr. Smith. I'll hand it over. I'll take it on notice. Oh, it's Look, it's just bizarre, John. And look, the world's getting more and more curiouser and curiouser. Out of Canada.

The story out of Canada, John, is just heartbreaking. Tell us what you know. I don't know. Well, look, I only came across this the other day, Hooty, um, by accident. Um, and it just goes to show, even when you're looking for this stuff, um, or, or when you're active in the circles that we operate in, you know, things don't always come to, to fruition.

I came across the story of, um, a young, a young Ontario woman, um, Kayla Pollock, she's 37. Um, she's a mother, uh, who had two Pfizer, uh, vaccines. Now, I did stick out a Twitter about this. Now this happened, uh, some time ago, obviously, but, um, the vaccine, the Pfizer vaccine, Um, had the first two doses and then she went for the third booster because she was, she was working in a, um, in a, um, I think an education setting.

And so she thought I'll get ahead of the game. They're going to mandate it. So she went and had the injection, but it turned out that, uh, the injection that they had on offer that day was the Moderna. And apparently there was a real. Um, Scuffle going on at the medical place where she, where she was getting it because people had

been told it was Pfizer and they weren't happy about it, but she thought, Oh, anyway, within days she developed, um, very severe symptoms, uh, which, which later, um, I mean, within days ended up with it, with her being, uh, essentially paralyzed.

And so she was a dog nurse. We've done, um, Um, um, um, paralysis from myelitis and, um, geez, I tell you what, it's, it's a horrific story to, to, to read. No, I, I, I, um, I think everyone should have a look at it. Um, she's got young kids, uh, et cetera. But the remarkable thing about all this, uh, is, is, is, Is the bureaucrats.

Now, I couldn't believe this section of it when I actually read it. Um, she's doing battle with them, as you can imagine, like in Australia, uh, with regard to compensation and all, you know, as, as you can imagine. But the one thing that the Canadian government has been up, up front with and, uh, has, uh, offered her on two occasions, apparently, uh, complimentary, uh, was the assisted dying program.

Euthanasia. Can you believe these mongrels? So they forced her to have the jab that's killing her and now they want to kill her. Now they want to kill her. Free of charge. Yeah.

You couldn't make that stuff up. No. What, what, what would possess any human being in a bureaucracy to stoop so low as to offer someone a free death because they're in a situation which was brought about by their ineptitude in the first place? Yeah. It's unbelievable to you. I mean, I, I. I really, uh, could not believe it when I read it.

I mean, it, it, it's just, it's just ridiculous. Um, yeah, transverse myelitis, uh, the poor bugger. But anyway, uh, Yeah, so, uh, it said she would go on to spend several months in hospital where she says she was offered medical assistance in dying on two occasions but rejected the offer.

Rejected the offer. I don't know how these people sleep at night, mate, I really don't. Crazy. You know, it, it gets, it gets to what I wanted to say, um, towards the end because we know, look, what happened in Bondi. Bondi Junction yesterday. Um, I mean, we've been reading eyewitness reports and looking at videos and stuff and hearing about that young mum who threw her little baby to a couple of bystanders while she was being murdered.

Uh, you know, that, that just, and to me, and I was talking to Michelle about it all weekend. To me, it's like, mate, the, the compassion in the world is dying.

The author of the Canadian government to put to death somebody that they've effectively killed anyway. These things that are happening and now we've got this outrageous situation in Israel and Gaza. It's outrageous. I mean, it's got to the stage where people have just got to see this for what it is.

This is. This is genocide. You can say what you like about it. I don't care what people say to me about this. I'm not being anti semitic, but there is a geopolitical Israel and there's a spiritual Israel. And the geopolitical Israel is committing genocide on people in Gaza. There's no two ways about it.

When tanks are mowing down cars with little girls in them, that's just, that's outrageous. And I want to link all this to what's going on in the world, because I'm not, I'm not jumping on a religious hobby horse. I'm jumping on facts. Over the past few decades, we have de godded the planet. No chaplains in schools, no Bibles in schools, no, uh, no, uh, uh, swearing Bible used in swearing in.

Facebook have banned the, uh, Lord's Prayer as hate speech. I mean, God is being taken out and God is the light. And when you remove the light, the only thing that follows is darkness. And that's what's happening. And the world needs to wake up to itself. You know, people are running around talking about vibrations and the universe, this and the universe, that, and all this lovey dovey fairy stuff.

But at the end of the day, we've lost our morality. We have accepted the unacceptable for too long and the world is going to hell in a handbasket. And people have got it. We've got to come back to some sense of morality

that's based in something that stood by us for centuries. And in this country, we've always been a Christian country.

But now I'm likely to get censored for even talking like, like I'm talking at the moment. I mean, it's just bizarre. And what's going on in Israel, it would be condemned what the people of is what the military in Israel are doing to the people of Gaza would be condemned. If Israel wasn't called Israel, if it was called, you know, Mesopotamia or something like that, the world would condemn what they're doing, but because they're called Israel and because people have this conception that they are God's favored people.

That's what I say. There's a difference between geopolitical nation Israel and spiritual Israel. And they're getting away with murder, literally. And if we accept that and if political correctness prevents us from saying that we're in a real bad state in this country, we've got no moral authority at all.

Well, look, regardless of what the politics of it. Uh, is or isn't, uh, you know, the, the, the, the mowing down of, of, of innocent children and, and the like is just reprehensible. I mean, there was a situation there, I think last week, Woody, where an Australian aid worker was, uh, was killed, you know, now those cars were marked up as aid vehicles.

Uh, they'd given their routes, uh, you know, that, that whole thing just was beyond belief. Johnny, 200 foreign aid workers have been killed in Gaza. 200 people who've gone there to help from all over the world have been killed in Gaza by the Israeli Defence Force. Now, I, look, I, look, once again, people get, people get off on their high horse about Russia and Ukraine and who's right and who's wrong and whether Putin's bad or whether, uh, the other guy in Ukraine is bad.

And, and we all get on, we're getting upset now about what's going on in Gaza, and rightfully so. We're getting upset. It's, it's not about who's who on what side of the fence. It's about the people caught in the middle. And it's the same with the vaccine mandates. It's the same thing that's been going on in this country for too long.

You got the people at one end of the scale, uh, hanging onto the pendulum and you got people at the other end waiting to catch it. And most of the people in the country are in the middle. They just want the flaming pendulum to just stop so we can all just get on and live and That's so right, Woody. I mean, you know, you, you can, you can apply this to so many, um, different scenarios.

I mean, I mean, whether it's somebody committing an act, um, that harms somebody whilst they're on bail because they've got a weak judge that allows them out, you know, this is the sort of stuff that, you know, whether it starts there, it just, you know, it just motors on through. And, uh, you know, we need to take back control.

Of what's going on, uh, in our countries. Um, you know, the very fabric of what, what makes, uh, you know, Australia so special as has been lost. It's been degraded. It's been defaced. Uh, it's disgraceful. They're the moral compass of Australia as, as. And it's lost its bearings. It has, Johnny. I mean, I'll go back to, uh, recently, hot in the news has been uh, Adrian McRae, who's been on this program, running for the for the Great Australia Party in the federal election.

We've had him on. He's a great supporter and um, and we have a lot to do with Adrian. He's a really good guy. Now as a as a Port Hedland Shire Councillor, Uh, he's been new to that role, voted in, and a few months ago, he was invited, invited by the Russian ambassador in Sydney, who he met at a luncheon with a few other friends who just happened to be at this particular event, to go over to Moscow, go over to Russia and be one of the scrutineers, one of the foreign observers at the, at the election because he's done that a few times and he did it.

And he was very impressed with what he saw. He was very impressed with the process. Uh, he was, he was there in, in booths when they were being counted. He saw the security and the scrutiny. And he went on Russian television to congratulate Vladimir Putin, uh, for, for the way the election was conducted from that point of view.

From that point of view, the fact that it was so crystal clear that it was in his eyes, it wasn't being manipulated. Now, he has a right to say that, but he comes back to Australia and he's hounded. Now, he ends up on 60 Minutes with Ali Langdon, Ali Langdon, who told Craig Kelly to shut up and, um, and, and pull his head in over the, uh, over the vaccines.

Um, now she was sort of needling him. He, he, um, he filmed the interview from his side with her permission and a 30 minute interview ended up being about seven minutes. And she pulled the old card of. So you agree with the, with the country that, that shot down MH17, that shot down and killed innocent people.

And he said the Russian missile brought that aircraft down, but Ukraine was full of Russian missiles too. You can't, you can't say one way or the other. And she said, and you agree with that. And he said, I wasn't agreeing with that. But as she was saying that, I watched the interview, John, the West conveniently forgets the USS Vincennes in the Gulf that shot down an Iranian Boeing 727 with 140 odd people on it.

Accidentally. That was just a by the by that lasted about 24 hours. It's totally different when the other side do it. Yeah. You know what I mean? It's like, there's no balance in the mainstream media. It's just, it's just emotional rhetoric and it's bulldust, John. It's all bulldust and people are fed up with it.

It's no wonder people are turning to, to, uh, to us and to, you know, Maria Z and, and all these other programs now because. Um, we're just going to say it as we see it, as the grassroots people see it in this country. Well, you're 100 percent right, Woody. I mean, my, my dealings with Adrian McRae have been, um, um, you know, unbelievable.

He's been a great help to this program, um, helping us obtain people for interviews. Um, he's been a Rockstead, um, supporter of, uh, of what we're, What we're doing. Um, and yeah, dead right. I mean, he's got my 100 percent support. He did not say anything, uh, that should be criticized. Uh, he was there to watch a process.

He commented on what he saw, uh, that WA premier, you're a, you're a goose. You're an absolute Dave. Well, WA is renowned for producing goose, turning goose into premiers, mate, um, geese in the premieres. Um, look, at the end of the day, are we in a free democratic country or not? He wasn't, you know, they were, they were accusing him, what, what information did he give, uh, the Russian government about iron ore?

He said, they don't need our iron ore, they've got their own iron ore, they don't use our iron ore. What, what are you on about? I mean, for goodness sake, it's just, it's just, it's just tabloid journalism gone nuts. Ali Langdon. For goodness sake, grow up, you know, grow a brain for goodness sake. I mean, it's just, it's bizarre.

Look, every day I wake up, John, and I asked Michelle, am I still living in a democratic country? She says last I heard we are. So can I say what I want to say? Well, now I can't because I've been wanting to say that thing about Gaza for a long time, because enough's enough enough, enough, um, and, and I've been wanting, you know, I w I was like coming to the party about Julian Assange.

And enough's enough with that too. And while we're on that subject, the puppet that runs America, or seems to be, or is being manipulated to run America, that idiot Biden, that came out the other day and he said they're looking at the Australian government's request to release Julian Assange. We're looking at it.

And you know, they need to do more than look at it. They need to get him released and get him to a safe place where he can have a good life with his family. Mm. It's like weekend at Bernie's watching him, isn't it? That is such a good analogy. Weekend at Bernie's, that, that was one of the funniest movies I ever saw.

It is. He's like a robot. Oh, that's a shocker. The way he walks away from a press conference and somebody yells out a question and he stops and he turns around and he walks back to the microphone and he whispers one word and then he wanders off again. I mean. And he shuffles out, doesn't, his feet hardly move and it's like he's like one of those little wind up toys, like one of those wind up tin soldiers, you know, he just wobbles it. And why has he always got those stupid sunglasses on? I don't know. Doesn't matter where he is, he's got those stupid sunglasses on. Mate, the leader of the free world. Free world, my butt.

Is there any such thing as a free world anymore, Johnny? No, I don't think there's any such thing as a free lunch either. No, there's no such thing as a free lunch. I mean, look, we've been talking for the last 45 minutes and it's all common sense stuff. And the people who are watching us, they love us talking common sense stuff because we're saying what they're thinking.

And we're not afraid to say it. And, and to sum everything up, Tony Abbott was brilliant for us. Um, he said some things that needed to be said a long time ago, but he said them. And as a result, that's got our programs out there. More people are watching Club Grubbery now because of that. And they're watching all the other stuff we've been talking about.

Adrian McRae did what he did. As a citizen of Australia and as a free citizen of Australia to visit a country to do what he did and come back and make whatever, whatever comments he likes without being vilified by the media. Um, that's called democracy, everybody. Remember what that used to be like? Uh, we've got, we've got, uh, health bureaucrats and health ministers who are denying the bleeding obvious.

Is something wrong? Well, and unfortunately, what he, um, events around the world and domestically will, uh, We'll now overshadow, uh, you know, some of the real big issues going on behind the scenes that we've been talking about for nearly, nearly three years, four years. Um, and, and, you know, things like the Middle East, you know, it's almost like, uh, some of this stuff is, is designed to, to, to pad all this stuff out so that people forget about it.

Everyone will forget about it, you know, don't worry. That's the sort of mentality it is. Um, you know, you can say, what are you, they're desperately trying to avoid a Royal commission.

There is absolutely, uh, no doubt about that. Look yesterday, this event in, um, this tragic event and, you know, our, our thoughts and prayers and condolences goes out to those, uh, that, that were affected, uh, the yesterday, an horrific event and, you know, it, it, it should, um, You know, we should stop and pause and say, well, how do these things occur and, and, and look in the light of day, we'll probably know a bit more, but how many people are dying each day from these vaccine, uh, incurred injuries, how many people Uh, uh, having horrific side effects from the, uh, the turbo cancers, the like, I mean, we can't allow, um, we can't allow ourselves to, to, to stop pursuing what's going on here because you know, that's, that's, uh, front and center it's, um, yeah, so I wish the media would, would have a, uh, you know, a 24 hour coverage of what's going on with, with regard to the deaths from the MRNA jabs.

Yeah, look, that, that's what, that's what needs to happen. Um, we, we need it. We need a fourth estate to keep, to keep the mongrels honest. We've lost it because they are the mongrels now. They're part of it. We don't, we don't have a mainstream media. We have a propaganda ministry. Uh, that's what it is bought and paid for by the elites.

Uh, in greater Sydney that, that were then put at risk, uh, anyway. Well, critical incident debrief, Tony Abbott talked about that in the interview. We talked about critical incident debrief that, that hopefully will go on. It should do like the, the, uh, Lynn cafe shooting the critical incident debrief. And that highlighted some awful bureaucratic bundles by a police commissioner at the time, Skippy Arnie and, um, and other, uh, high ranking officers that were involved in that.

I mean, this stuff just goes on and on and on. I was looking at a documentary on the Gulf War and the war on terror and um, and Tony Blair and George W. But as a result of those two events, the overkill following that is immense. Millions of people have died because of that event on 9 11.

And how many Palestinians have died as a result of what happened on October 7th? It's disproportionate, John. And it doesn't, it doesn't pass the pub test. It doesn't. You know, it's like, it's like you living in Tumut. Someone at, uh, someone in, uh, in, um, Kuma did something wrong and they came from Tumut. So the people in, in, uh, Kuma come along and they blow up the entire town of Tumut and kill everybody else because one person came from Tumut.

I mean, it's just anyhow, we, we could go on and we have been, I probably, uh, we've probably gone over time a little bit, but it is what it is, mate. Yeah. Anyway, we'll keep calling it out. Uh, Commissioner Webb, we're not going to stop. You've got to get those police, Justin Poor, Natalie Vasallo, all those, uh, uh, good police back to work.

Yeah. 700 grand to pay our two spin doctors because you can't hold a public expression. I mean, that's just ridiculous. Yesterday's events, um, you know, show us why we do need a very experienced and a strong frontline police force. Um, and you know, the, the, the, all those services yesterday should be, uh, should hold their head up high.

I mean, uh, the, the efforts of that, uh, police lady and the, uh, And the bystanders, the inspector, um, in dealing with that. Phenomenal. Absolute hero. Absolute hero. She was by all accounts, an absolute hero and deserving of all the praise that she should be given and the support she'll need because you don't pull the trigger and end someone's life regardless of what they're doing and, and feel good about it later on.

She'll be going through some pretty hard stuff. Anyhow, look, we've been talking about a bit of doom and gloom and, uh, you know, the apparently Netanyahu's told all the people in Israel not to go to bed tonight because Uh, some big things are about to happen. So look at these times, we've just got to stick together and we've just got to keep loving each other.

Um, it's a crazy world. And you know what? I'm, I'm really bored by some of the things going on, like in the Hoodies Heroes group. There's about, there's nearly 16, 000 in that group now, John, and they just plot along every day that the, the admins and the, uh, coordinators. Uh, the moderators, you know, they're brilliant.

They are the most beautiful people and they've got this wonderful network of people coming together and, and, you know, the, the people come and go and they, they, they go back to normal and, but they know that there's a family in their little town and it's called Hoodies Heroes. And I want to, I want to commend anybody to go on to, um, Hoodies Heroes National Facebook page.

And sign up and join your local group. They're just beautiful people. They're incredible people. Um, and we, we kicked off church without walls 10 days ago, uh, online church without walls, and the response has been beautiful. It's just going really well. Some people are saying, quit it with the religion. Club Grubbery hasn't changed.

Nothing's changed. We're going to keep churning this stuff out. But a lot of people who are looking for solutions and answers for themselves and now turning to faith and church without walls is giving them that opportunity. So, go to um, Hoodies Heroes National on the Facebook, go to www.

churchwithoutwalls. com. au if you're interested in that, and of course, keep supporting www. clubgrubbery. com. au as we continue. And, the Do Not Comply shirts, they're churning them out, and they're generating conversation, believe me. There are people talking about conversations they're having in supermarkets and banks and whatever.

So, yeah. Grab one, grab yourself one of those at drifter. com. au. They're amazing and they're really generating conversation. Also, I really want to give the Aligned Council of Australia a massive plug, John, um, because I believe that they're an organization that's pulling a whole lot of people together to get rid of, to exit the who.

And really credible people in there. These people are, they're well funded, um, they still need more funding from everybody, of course, but they, they haven't gone at this half hearted. They've got a two million, uh, pamphlet letterbox drop happening. They've got massive, um, billboards at, uh, Essendon Airport.

So people on the freeway going to Melbourne can see it and also in Canberra about exiting the Who and the, uh, the pandemic treaty. And really top people and they've drawn a whole bunch of organizations like ours together under the one banner. So go to, uh, go to the Aligned Council of Australia website.

com. au and have a look at what's going on there. I think about 1. 2 million people involved in that, John. It's a lot of people. Now, Michael Gray Griffith and Cafe Lockdown are talking about a big rally on, I believe it's the 5th, which is about the digital idea. It's an Australia wide rally. Thank you, John.

So I believe there'll be rallies in each city in the country. Have you heard anything? Yeah. Well, I think, uh, Pauline Hanson's one nation's, um, um, running that, or I might be wrong, but I did say something from, um, from them. So, um, I think it was a case of what's this space for the, uh, for the, uh, for the destinations.

So, uh, yeah, that, that'll, that'll be really good if that's the case. Um, Yeah. And you know, I'm urging everybody to go along to that. I think, uh, We've got to, we've got to get the people into the streets about things like this. And we've got to make sure that, um, the governments know and the mainstream media know that there's a bigger chunk of Australia that's a lot less happy than they were four years ago.
