

2024-04-15 Graham and John talk with Rosie Marshall...

Well, hi everyone and welcome to Club Grubbery on Monday the 15th of April. It's great to have you all with us. We trust you had a really good weekend and enjoying the lucky country. Uh, Johnny, great to have you back on. Thanks, Woody. Yeah. Great to be back. And, uh, yeah, another cracking week. Thanks, Woody.

Another cracking week. And before we introduce our guest tonight, I've, you know, we were talking last night, John, you and I did a catch up, uh, to bring people into the loop with all the news that's going on at the moment. And, um, you know, we talk about how over governed we are in this country. There's been a situation on the Gold Coast and this is going to seem minuscule compared to everything else, but it just shows you how bad things get.

Um, a couple have a pet magpie that they rescued that fell out of a tree, out of a nest. At the same time, they had a young staffy dog and the dog and the magpie have grown up together and they are the best of friends and the videos are beautiful. They're just beautiful. Anyhow, the authorities came and took the magpie away after three or four years in, in the, uh, in the care of these people with their dog.

They took the magpie away because they, it was, they weren't allowed to have a pet magpie. So the magpie was taken away and held in custody for 45 days. Now, of course the people were distressed because this, this magpie had become a member of their family and the dog, there were two staffies and one of them, uh, Penny, and I think it was Millie the magpie, um, they're so close together, they're like family and this dog was bereft.

Anyhow, there was a massive campaign to get the magpie release back to the people who raised it, and that was given. And they were taken, the magpie was taken back to them after 45 days on the strict proviso that they do not make any money out of sale of media or any media presentation or writing of books based on this magpie.

Now, this is really trivial compared to everything we're going on with, but it just goes to show you just how unfree we are in this country. I mean, it's just, these sorts of things are going on all the time, all the time. So it's just madness. It's madness. You know, we need to go back 50 years and start this country again.

I think maybe 250 years and do it. But, uh, to, to join us tonight, Johnny, a wonderful lady who's devoted much, Oh, excuse me. I'll edit that little bit out has, has devoted much, uh, of the last few years to working with. All the trauma that's going on as a result of mandates and lockdowns and everything. We have with us from Melbourne tonight, but a resident of the Northern beaches, Rosemary Marshall.

He prefers to be called Rosie. Welcome to the show, Rosie. Thank you very much for having me, Graham. Looking forward to our chat. Great to have you on. Now let's, um, let's unpack who you are first before we go into what you've been up to. So give us a bit of your background. Well, I've lived in Sydney now for the last 10 years, and basically I'm a housewife, and frankly not a very good one.

I hate cooking, so I'm not the greatest of housewives, but I've got a very supportive husband, and he is on the same page as me with everything. I helped Philip Altman during his campaign when he was making a bid for the seat of Manly. And I was privileged to get to know Dr. Altman, and I know you know him too.

So that was really it's from from Dr. Altman that I've realized how serious so much of this is. And during the lead up to the election, he and I spent a lot of time walking around Manly talking with people. And I reflect now on how disappointed I was that young people are so not prepared to listen to someone who's clearly got a huge amount of knowledge, and he's, he was someone people should have been listening to.

So that was a bit of a joy. I remember meeting you with him when he shared a stage with me at the Community of Unity tour in Warrigal, no sorry, where was it? Warrigal. Warrigal, that's right, I remember that. Yes, that was during his campaign, so a lot of us were there. And it was a great crowd, it was very enthusiastic.

We're lucky there, there's a community there who is awake, unlike here in Melbourne. Right, so before we go on to what's happening for you in Melbourne, you've been, um, you've been doing some extensive work with Forest of the Fallen in the northern beaches of Sydney. Well, I've been very fortunate because it is actually a great privilege doing Forest of the Fallen.

It's an opportunity to really try and share with people and speak to people who've been silenced. I have so many stories from forests and the whole idea behind it and Selke is the most marvellous person. I don't know how she, she copes receiving all these terrible stories which she puts, puts into a file we access and print out and laminate and add to the forest.

We've got 800 now and every story As tragic as the one before it's so many, so many young ones, and that's what I'm finding every time I do a forest. I'm meeting people who've got 16 17 year 18 year olds who've been injured seems to be a tremendous number of them. Sad resignation about it too, which is heartbreaking.

They're not angry. John. Yeah, Rosie, um, the work you do with the Forest of the Fallen is very important. Uh, and it serves as a, as a, uh, as a reminder to the public and the community of, of those that have died, those that Suffered, uh, injury. Um, I, I think about the, the events of the last couple of days in Bondi, um, you know, which you, you're obviously pretty familiar with, uh, and the outpouring of grief from people, uh, flowers, uh, you know, and we've had six people tragically, uh, die in that, in that event, and I don't want to take anything away from that, but it must be so frustrating for, uh, everyone involved With these MRNA jab injuries that they're not recognized.

Uh, there is no governor general turning up with the prime minister, uh, to, to lay a wreath. Well, it's, there's always the accusation that these things are anecdotal. One of the saddest moments, well, so many sad moments, but I was at Bilgola beach, or, uh, Five or six weeks ago, and this gentleman he would have been in the 60s.

He just walked over and started crying and he sat on a bench nearby and I went over to him, you know you one has to be awfully careful with these things that you don't. Some people would prefer not to talk but I always go to someone if they're upset to see if they do. And he was crying he just said my.

My niece, who was 27, was in Italy and she took a second Pfizer. She was 27 years old and she was dead half an hour later. And what is very difficult for all of us involved with the forest is that people love to say, oh, that's anecdotal. Well, I don't think that someone dying within half an hour of getting an injection and her uncle sharing his grief could possibly be considered anecdotal.

But that is thrown around as much as possible by people who are awfully blind. You get much, much pushback at all from people other than saying that's anecdotal. Do you get people becoming aggressive about it? Yes. This last Saturday I missed Forrest because I was here. It was the first one I've missed in a long time and the boys rang me and said they'd had a bit of pushback.

It's very unusual now. Um, you can almost guess the people who will do it. And it's people who are still in the thrall of the polio and smallpox vaccines and think that vaccines have been, you know, the answer to every illness, which is proving to be not the case. But you do a dive into it. Um, I've just been reading a book which actually explains that vaccines are just dangerous.

And I'd love to elaborate on that when there's the right moment to talk about it. But my view is that every, every on their wedding list, every young person needs to have this book and every baby shower, potential parents should have this book. Yeah. How do you feel when people call you an anti vaxxer and all that sort of stuff?

I mean, we talked to Anita Huffmeister from AVN. Uh, she's a wonderful lady and, and she wears that as a badge of honor. She gets quite offended when people like us say, I'm not an anti vaxxer as though we're putting where I don't have that stigma. But I am an anti vaxxer now and I know John is, I mean, and we've interviewed countless doctors, high profile doctors from overseas who've been administering jabs who said there's no way they're going to do it again.

Well, I was quite pro vax until 2018 when I had the first flu injection. And within two weeks, I had pneumonia and pericarditis. So that rather took the gloss off. And since then, I don't like to talk about my own family, but there've been problems in my own family from vaccines. But when people come up to the forest and say, you're anti vaxxers, I wave my arm across the ocean of flags and say, well, shame these weren't anti vaxxers.

They wouldn't be dead and dying and sick if they were anti vaxxers. That does seem to, that does seem to stop that conversation. Shiny. Rosie, how does the, um, how does the, the remembrance system work? Uh, when you're actually in the forest, um, and you go to different events around Australia, are they, are they the same people, uh, at each one or are they unique to the, to the district or how, how, how does it work?

Well, um, if the. little while, uh, Selke releases another batch of, of people who've submitted their stories to her, and it's up to us to print them and laminate them. Uh, I've got a bit of a story about that, if it might be a bit long winded, but if, um, if I could share with you a recent event with this, I had another 105.

Uh, printouts done and I took them to the printer in Mona Vale and, uh, I went to collect them and he was in tears and he said, I'm not charging you for these. This is just so awful. Anyway, on my way back to the car, I was walking past a chemist and there was a sandwich board inviting me to go in and get a COVID injection.

So I went into this pharmacy, a pharmacy I visited twice before, and it's quite relevant to my concern about what currently is going on with vaccines and pharmacies. So I'd actually gone to this pharmacy It was the first pharmacy I'd gone to and I would say now it's probably 18 months or two years ago.

I went in there and there was a, it was a Saturday and I was just buying something incidental and there was a young girl, she would have been, it would have been her Saturday job and she served me. Anyway, in the course of the conversation, she got tearful and I said to her, darling, what, what's wrong? And she said, Oh, my, my brother's best friend died last night.

He was 18. He died in his sleep. And I looked over at the pharmacist and the signs saying, come and get your COVID injections. And I thought, well, I'm coming back here to speak to you, which I did that following week. Uh, he was, I, I said to him, what you're doing is wrong and you're killing young people and old people.

Uh, he was nervous and basically shuffled me out of the shop. Not rude, but just not engaged, didn't want to know. So fast forward to this particular incident. And, I actually took the bundle of papers over to the wasn't the same pharmacist. He was a man who was actually, he looked, he was a nice looking man he actually a little bit like you, Graham he had gray hair and a pleasant smiling face.

And I held up my friend Connors PDF, which had a picture of him. Covered in those ports to keep his heart going or check his heart. He'd had a shocking reaction. Two days, I think it was even the night of the second jab. He was very, very ill. And I said, this is what you're doing. You'll sign up. The front is inviting more people to have this.

And he looked at it and took it from me. And he said, yes, that's terrible. And we had a bit of a chat. And he said, Oh, I would have preferred to be using Novavax. But no, we're doing Moderna and Pfizer. And I said, well, Are you going to stop? And he just said, well, thank you for what you're doing. And so he knew that what he was doing was wrong.

And he was saying, thank you to me for going around warning people, but the sign's still outside his shop. And just, and just to add, The final nail on the coffin, forgive the analogy, uh, on Saturday, I spent a couple of hours ringing around pharmacies to find out if they were still promoting the jab to pregnant women.

And they are, and that particular pharmacy, when I rang them and I said, I pretended I was 12 weeks pregnant and said, uh, should I have any, uh, the booster before I go to England? And they said, yes. My, my heart fell to my boots out of eight pharmacies. Six said to take the booster and I've just been listening to Andrew Bridgen, who's that MP in Westminster.

He was speaking with a midwife. She said they're delivering on some shifts, they're delivering more dead babies and live ones and the babies that are being delivered a small sick at the percentage. I think he used the word calcified and I don't quite know what that means. I mean, I can imagine means look bad, but.

I, I just, it was the most distressing morning to know that they're promoting it, but not only that, they are also advising young women to take a flu and a pertussis vaccination while they're pregnant. When I was having my children 40 years ago, we were told not to eat fish or, soft cheese or no alcohol.

We, to inject people with something and pertussis is for whooping cough and that is proving to be very, very dangerous. That, that is not a good injection either for children or adults. Do you mind if I mention the book now that I think would be a really good thing for everyone to get hold of? There's a very, very interesting and very knowledgeable woman called Dr.

Suzanne Humphreys, and that's Humphreys, R I E S. She's written a book called Dissolving Illusions, Disease, Vaccines, and the Forgotten History. And when you look it up on Amazon to buy it, and you read the reviews they are so chilling that you, you will want to buy the book, every person who gets married or any time any anyone's getting together and planning a child.

I hope they'll read that because it is truly chilling. And Dr Altman told me a couple of months ago that we are now finding they are using alternative to the infant. Vaccinations. They were using something called Infanrix Hexa. Now, I'm not a medical person. I don't know if that's how you pronounce it.

And they were giving the, they have been giving this at six weeks, the child gets nine jabs, nine injections at, at 16 weeks. I get nine more at six months. I get eight more at 12 months. I get another six at 18 months. I get nine Then at four years old, they get six. So before your child is four, they'll have 47 injections.

But the most heinous of all is the newborn one, which is the Hep B vaccination. And Hep B is appropriate for drug users and sexually active people. Why are they giving that to a baby? Outta the wo, but what I'm finding the most upsetting thing that's, oh, and, and, and also this new one, it's a. I had to write this down because I don't know what it means, but it doesn't sound good.

It's a ribosomal DNA vaccination. It is genetic and it has formaldehyde and there'd be no discussions with the administrators of these injections. There's not nothing in, in the packaging to tell them whether anything about it. So they brought out a new vaccination for our babies. And. Someone spoke to me the other day, a bit of a whistleblower, really.

She works for the pharmacy industry. She's not in pharmaceuticals. And the pharmacies are very upset because they are losing half their walk in trade as a result of the eight week prescriptions that now they're getting, rather than the monthly prescriptions, which means their passing trade is diminished.

So in order to recoup the losses from that, they've thought up a great way of Engaging the public. So they're going to really promote healthy supplements, herbal supplements, all those good things. And, and while they're doing that, they're going to really push to be responsible for our childhood vaccination program.

My experience with pharmacies has not been good. I ring every now and then some idea pops in my head and I think, well, I'll ring around and find out what the answer to this might be. And. Just before Christmas, I had the bright idea of ringing around several of them and I ring and say, uh, I'm really worried about Christmas.

I don't want to be sick at Christmas. And I'm 65. I'm over 65. And, and, um, I've had two Pfizer vaccinations, but when I had my second Pfizer vaccination, I didn't feel well for a while. So what should I do now? The answer was come and get a Moderna. This is what people are being advised. And I have friends who are on to their sevenths.

Another anecdote, which is an anecdote, but I have to emphasize the fact these pharmacies are giving advice, which is nothing short of dangerous. Um, I have a friend that works in a shop opposite a pharmacy on the northern beaches. Uh, this particular pharmacy I hold in particular contempt because I've been in there several times and they told me I'll be only vaccinate old people.

Sorry. Doesn't matter if they don't. Anyway, this woman had finally been coerced into getting her first vaccine, but getting this first vaccine coincided with the time when the booster was being released. So she went in there and, uh, the pharmacist just, Jabbed it with a booster and then he looked at the paper and he said, Oh, whoops, it should be number one and gave a number one on top.

Anyway, apparently she staggered to the shop over the road and said what had happened. And this woman told me now that is an anecdote, but I have no reason to disbelieve it. Good grief. And this is the people we're going to let have our children vaccinated by. I think we are going to have to make a very, very big stand.

And I think We're going to have to really start holding these people to account. I've now gone into every pharmacy on the northern beaches. When, when this little girl in my son, my granddaughter's class died in her sleep, that unleashed. Do not upset a grandmother. The rage of a grandmother is like nothing else.

And at that point, I was so angry that I went round all the, all the chemists in Worrywood, actually. I remember the day I was wearing this dress, which I've since thrown out because it was extremely unflattering, but they, uh, the chemists must've been saying to each other, here's this mad woman in the green dress.

Who's going in here and berating everyone because I'd wait until it was full. And then I'd go in and say about this child who died and it was, it was just so upsetting, the whole thing, but have you been evicted? Have you been evicted from any of these pharmacies? No. What can they say because they know I'm telling the truth.

Well, this is the thing, Grant. Do they know I'm telling the truth? I have met so many medical people and if, we, we don't like to argue with people at, at the forest. It's not the place for arguing. It's the place for quiet respect and talking if you want to. But, um, You know, one doctor came up to me and said, you're just attention seeking.

And I looked at all these PDFs and I thought, well, I have far more things I could do rather than have 800 flags on a beach, which I've taken the time to print, laminate and put on sticks and display for hours on end on all the beaches. If, if that's attention seeking, it's, it's not my style of attention seeking.

Uh, and, uh, And he was very aggressive. He, he was genuine. He truly believed. in these injections being safe and effective. I, I, I don't really, I find it inexplicable. And these pharmacists who, those six pharmacists who without any self doubt said, Oh yes, you should get the booster. They appear to be genuine.

And I can tell you that the people at this party who've had six injections, they were quite genuine that we are. It's like we're nibbling the toenails of an elephant here. And I think the best means of cracking it, probably Silky's idea. What would you say to, uh, what would you say to Kerry Chant? Well, I had the great pleasure of actually delivering it to her personally.

I bumped into her in a shop. It was before, what was it, last, I lose track of time. I think it was just, it was before last Christmas. Oh, no, it was the one before. And, uh, my husband, my husband's Dutch and he's quite blunt, but he doesn't like confrontation. Anyway, we were in this shop. And I said to Rob, you know who that is?

And he said, yes, I do. And he said, oh, speaks like this. Oh, darling, you won't, you won't. So I said, just watch me. I'm going over to speak to her. So I went over and I just, I said, oh, Carrie Chan, are you proud of yourself? She thought I was going to be nice. I wasn't nice. I wasn't very nice at all. Carry on, I think John needs to hear what you're going to say because he'd love to say it.

Please carry on, don't hold back. I had that white flash of rage and I just said something like, I wish I could remember exactly what it was. I said, have you any idea what you've done to everyone? How you've destroyed so many people's lives and you're pushing these injections which are cheap. I really, really.

How did she respond? Her mouth was hanging open at the end of it. Well, it's always hanging open, but did she say anything? Well, no. No, she didn't really. But, I just, I just can't stand that. ignorant arrogance that those terrible people, you know, when I think of what people went through in Melbourne as well, I just caught up with a young girl today, who actually was my flower girl at my wedding, uh, 14 years ago.

And she was saying to me how traumatized she was during lockdown. She, she said so many of her friends were suicidal and, you know, these people have had absolutely no guilt laid on them. They don't appear to feel anything. And I think that's what's even more frustrating. And when you do a forest and you see the grief, there's so many stories.

Down at Curl Curl, we arrived there and on the, on the surf life saving club was a flag at half mast and a much loved member of their crew had dropped dead when he was running, left a 12 year old child. And you see the grief of everybody. And you know, another site life saving story. When we were at Palm beach, Beautiful young, you know, typical Australian young woman, lifesaver, community minded.

She came over and she was looking upset and I said, Oh, you're okay. She said, I got Hashimoto's from those injections. And I said, Oh, I'm sorry. And then she said, my twin sister got grades and that's even worse.

Unbelievable. Johnny. Well, I think just speaking to Rosie, what he gives you an idea of just how far and wide this has affected people. I mean, you, you, you don't really, uh, I think, I think we understand it, but I think a lot of people, uh, out there just think that these, these, Circumstances, these coincidences that they refer to are just isolated, but, uh, definitely not, are they?

I mean, and that's so important, Rosie. Well, I've met, I was counting it up. I've met seven families whose 16, 17, 80 year old sons have had heart issues. And, and, and one boy in particular who. I always talk about, he was in the army and he was in a platoon of 40 and they were mandated to take Pfizer's and he, he got very, very severe heart damage.

And, uh, he's been very, very unwell. And out of that cohort of 40, 15 of those lovely young men have been damaged. But this particular one, he, he rings me and we message and he says, we don't forget me, Rosie.

So where is the military in all this? I mean, it wouldn't be hard for him. Well, I understand they have looked after that, that one only because finally the cardiologists admitted, but it's so hard to get a cardiologist to admit. To it because they've risked losing their livelihood. Even now they risk losing their livelihood if they put their name to the fact that that's a vaccine injury, that that whole problem is still hugely evident with the people we talk to.

And the other day at Balmoral, this grandmother came up to me and her grief was raw. She said my beautiful 17 year old grandson was vaccinated for his last year at school. And he, Almost straight away had terrible heart damage to the point where they, they couldn't believe he lived because his heart was going so fast and he had to be operated on.

And she said, you know, he planned to go in the Navy, but with this heart damage, they won't accept him. So the government has pushed this on this kid and now he can't pursue the career that he was going to help the government with as a result. John, we, we John, we we've, we've had these interviews. I don't know.

We're in the hundreds. We've been covering these stories in the hundreds and it would be, it's so clear to me, the more of these stories that we do, that this would be over if the legacy media did what they were supposed to do. If the media actually reported this stuff, if they gave it half the coverage of what happened in Bondi, They gave it half the coverage that they gave the, the, the stupid referendum we just had.

Um, this would have been over, over and done and dusted. And you've got people like Ellie Langdon on channel nine, who's held up as the, uh, what is she's, she's the prize, uh, talking head and the nine network, um, just making fun of this whole thing. I mean, it, it's got to a point where it just, what, what have, what have we got to do to get.

The mainstream to recognize all these coincidences because that we let's tell them straight up. Don't report on vaccine injuries. Don't report on long carbon or anything else. Just say that Australians are dying from a new disease called coincidence. I don't know, the media I think are the most culpable and then the politicians.

I agree, I agree. The media are despicable and people now are saying that. I often write little bits on social media, on Facebook, on Sunrise and places like that and when that poor young Reporter died just recently. I mean, the response was 95 percent of people being awake to it. I don't know how the media can believe they've got any credibility when the whole audience is not laughing at them, ridiculing them, ridiculing them for not saying what the truth is.

It's become visible now. And it's just, I suppose it would make a difference. But, you know, I've got a friend who was going overseas and she went to her doctor. And she said, Oh, well, you're going to Africa and all that. So they actually gave her her sixth COVID injection with a flu and a shingles. And I think she had Hep A and B and unsurprisingly was really unwell.

And that's the sort of thing that people are still doing. Because the media are not coming clean about what's really happening. People are being misled to the point where their health is so compromised. It's beyond criminal. And that's, that's why I cannot leave this alone, particularly now that this, this latest business of the children and the vaccines being delivered by these people who've got apparently no conscience whatsoever, or certainly no medical training to look into anything with any curiosity.

And let's not forget that Gladys Ley and the Foreman, new of Wales Premier, made all these kids line up so that they could attend their high school certificate. They had to be vaccinated. Yeah. These things shouldn't be forgotten, but I mean, hoodie was, uh, you know, writing what he said there about what happened on the weekend.

Now, I, I, I don't, I don't want to take anything away from the, from the grief or the, or the significance of what happened at Bondi. A couple of days ago, but you know, this, this is what really infuriates me and I think everyone watching the media are still virtually doing a 24 hour coverage of that Bondi, um, scenario.

They've got reporters there, they're crossing tonight, uh, to three different reporters, uh, you know, and it's absolutely obscene. It's ghoulish. I actually find it quite ghoulish now. It's, you know, a tragedy. Today the premier announced \$18 million towards a coronial inquiry for this event. , I wonder, I, I wonder if it's because it was a knife attack and they're going to start saying, isn't it lucky we don't have guns now?

No. I, I think, you know, by the government's own estimation, they said, and the Governor General told us this, in Cora, Kai, John, 95% of the people of Australia. Voted with their feet. To be vaccinated and the other 5 percent of us are going to have to put up with the consequences. Well, that apart from showing that he had no, uh, no moral integrity, um, it, it points to the fact that by their admission, 95 percent of the people of Australia have been stabbed.

And out of those Hundreds, if not thousands, have died and many thousands are very badly injured. And that's not even rating a mention. How many millions of people are so unwell now they can't, they can't work here in Australia? I actually, I spoke to a paramedic, uh, at Mona Vale Beach, he was having his lunch, lovely young man.

And I said to him, you see huge uptick in, in heart attacks and strokes. He said, well, the cardiac issues when they put out the booster, his words were when they put out the booster, it went. Crazy. And I said, are you speaking up? And he said, Oh no, I can't lose my job. That, that seems to be the stock answer.

Well, you lost your job, John. Oh, well, what can you say? Who do you look, you know, this is just complete madness, this stuff. I mean, I don't need 18 million to tell you that, uh, security guards at shopping centers and hospitals and the like should be at least armed with, with a baton and capsicum spray and maybe a taser.

I mean, what are they thinking? You know, a CB radio and a notepad? You know? Fair dinkum, these people have got to get serious, they, they're not living in, in the same world we are. They, they, they're real. Just bureaucrats that are drunk on power. They haven't got a clue how to run anything. Uh, and, and they should just, they should just stand aside.

Uh, you know, that's why they don't want a Royal commission into this because, uh, this, they'll, they'll, they'll end up looking like, you know, complete crazies. Uh, they'll be the cooks. Um, because I tell you now, what this, what this COVID madness has done has drawn, uh, I think one of the, the really significant outcomes of this is it's woken people up to the BS it's been going on for years that we've been asleep for, uh, and I, I'm, I'm one of those.

Now these vaccines, um, are not just limited in the damage they're causing, obviously in regards to the MRI stuff. You know, the Royal Commission has to extend into what the vaccination, uh, policy, uh, grief that's caused for years, SIDS. We need to know what's going on in that now, not saying either way. We need to look at, uh, it holistically, uh, with people with integrity, not, not people Autism.

Yeah. Autism. Actually, I put, uh, something on my Facebook page about, uh, was Peter McCullough was saying these childhood vaccines proving dangerous and there's an autism issue. And someone wrote back to me and she said, I'll never, I'll never ever get over the guilt because I held my 18 months old down while they injected him and he became autistic.

18 months. Yeah, well, I mean, the list of misdemeanors go on and on and on, and still people trust. Now, I've got to, I've got to state something here, Michelle's been, Michelle's had a really bad, uh, season of asthma. She's, she's actually been quite ill for about 18 months, my wife, and um, she's been, had a very bad chest infection.

She's struggled to shake it. Um, and she was taking different medications to do it and all that sort of stuff as you do. And in desperation, I was at Albury at the, uh, at the triple event with, uh, Taffer Field and I spoke to Ian Brighthope, Professor Ian Brighthope, and, uh, And in desperation, I said to him, is there anything you can do for her?

And he prescribed, uh, over the phone, get her into, you know, six to 8, 000 milligrams of vitamin C and a few other things. And I can tell you honestly, within two to three days, gone, gone, 18 months of trying everything to fix it. And within two to three days gone, mainly because of heavy doses of vitamin C.

And this was part of the protocols announced by Peter McCullough. Ivermectin, vitamin C, vitamin D, uh, you know, magnesium and all those other things. And, and still all this stuff in the cupboard, John, as we've said before, all these things sitting in the cupboard at home, and we're racing off inventing new strategies to infect people with, with chemicals.

Yeah. Oh, and don't even get me started on the measles thing. They're terrifying people into getting this measles injection. I remember as a child, my mother was a great monarchist. And My sisters and I were infected with

measles and it coincided when Prince Charles was. My mother, being the monarchist, was reading, oh yes, Prince Charles is having bed rest and chicken soup.

So she was busily making chicken soup because she liked doing everything the royals did. And, uh, of course we were fine. It was nothing, but this scare campaign about measles and saying how dangerous it is. Measles was dangerous at the turn of the century. 20th century when hygiene was bad and nutrition was bad and people were in the depression and their children weren't well nourished.

The measles injections are quite dangerous as well. It's very, very bad outcomes for kids with that. And, and people will say, Oh yes, but you know, measles can be serious only in children who are compromised apparently. And, and that's again, what this book makes clear. But every day I'm seeing more about get your children vaccinated for measles.

It's just making money for big pharma. It's another grab. It is. And we're going to have to wrap this up, Rosie. But before we do, you're down in Melbourne. What's it like in Victoria at the moment? Well, I've actually just really been with my friends. So I haven't walked around the streets, which I'm going to do tomorrow.

I'd be interested to see what Chapel Street's like now, because last time I was here, it was really a sad place. It looked, it looked positively, desolate and depressed and despairing. You know, there were weeds growing out of the gutters there and Chapel Street was the street, which was the high fashion street.

So I have a look around tomorrow, but I have to say that people here are definitely still in the thrall of the Dan Andrews having locked everyone down and still thinking that these vaccinations have saved their and in my age group, uh, they've all They haven't stopped getting them. Well, that was my experience on Saturday night at this party.

I hope that's not universal, but I had to say it at that particular party. And these were people who were professional educated people. They're not, um, but they seem to be the ones who are most spellbound with this. They really do. And as a result, I'm very glad I didn't go to university. I think that saved my life as a result of what you just said.

One of the most despicable premiers in the country's history. Daniel Andrews is a hero to those as well. Well, I'm not sure they, they, they still, uh, in the view that COVID was dangerous. That, that's, I think that sums up. So they're still getting more injections. And some of my elderly friends on the Northern beaches are still of that mindset too.

And, you know, I went to a doctor recently and said, which wasn't true, that I was going to, I was going to Africa and I was going to be swimming in lots of rivers and I was worried about getting river blindness. So would you prescribe me some ivermectin? I just thought I'd find out whether that was going to be easy to get.

Um, Well, he certainly was very reluctant to prescribe it. In fact, uh, I must ring again tomorrow and find out if he's going to leave a script for it, but he didn't want to even now. And I said, well, it's available on the TGA website. There's nothing wrong with it. And I don't want to go blind by swimming in rivers.

And he said, oh, well, I have to, I have to look into that before I give it to you. So I just wonder how, how much people, all these so called medical professionals are even worth listening to on any count now. I've lost any confidence in them. Final comments, John. Well, I think everyone, uh, needs to try and participate with, uh, Forest of the Fallen if they can, um, volunteer, um, maybe Rosie could direct them to Uh, yes.

Well, for us, the fall, if you go to the, uh, the official web, the official page on Instagram and also on Odyssey, they've got one there too. Uh, and also look them up on the internet and you can contact Silky and, uh, organized to get a set of sticks and, uh, well, PDS. But the other thing I hope people might do is.

If they see the signs outside a pharmacy, perhaps they, they think of, I mean, just go in there and say something like my brother in law had a, well, tell them what's happened to you. I was sick or my brother in law's sick or my mother's got cancer and we think, I mean, obviously they're going to say, oh, well, That great.

You know, you've got no proof. But I think if enough people start sowing the seed and just say it, you're calmly, politely, you know, I'm not happy seeing the sign outside the front anymore. And I think you're making wrong. Also, they, they seem to be unaware that they're gonna be held liable, and they will be here with the syringe will be liable.

I think, unfortunately, Rosie, uh, it's, it's, uh, like they say it's like pushing, uh, excrement up the hill. Uh, I think the problem is the, these pharmacists and these gps. Uh, being incentivized and I've, I've mentioned this before on a club gallery that, uh, the, um, the federal government's got a program which, uh, essentially, uh, pays, uh, Any of these pharmacists and GPs, 2, 000 to put the poster at the front.

Yeah, I heard that. Actually, I heard it was 2, 500 to have that. So interesting, they're all the same, those sandwich boards everywhere. They're all uniform. Isn't that funny? All right. Well, we need to bring this to a close and we normally close with a prayer. So allow me to do that and then we'll come back.

Dear Lord, Father in heaven, we thank you so much for people like Rosie and Selkie and all those who are out there. Doing everything they can to wake people up to the inevitable. And that is that we are going to be a very sick nation. There's no doubt about that. And it's all got to do with the treatment and, um, and father, we just pray that common sense will prevail and that, um, authorities will seriously look at what's going on and do a proper debrief and, and start focusing on saving people's lives in the other direction, Lord.

But in the meantime, we ask you to continue to bless people like Rosie. And those who are at home anxious about everything at the moment, Lord, give them peace and help them to realize that what they did yesterday got them to today. And we thank you father in Jesus name. Amen. Amen. It's, um, it's incredible stuff.

And, and Rosie, you are, you know, one of the many, many unsung heroes that exist in this country. And, um, We've, we've met so many of them, John. I mean, they're just all over the place, you know, we get down and out about everything in this country and all that. And we've got a right to, but by the same token, far out, we're an amazing group of people.

The Australian people, I've got a lot of support, a lot of support. And, and Silky has been amazing. You know, it's, it's a wonderful idea and a wonderful way of getting the message across. Well, we haven't interviewed Selke at all, and we should, John. We should get her on because, um, she's doing amazing work.

So, God bless you, Rosie, and thank you so much for being part of Cluck Grubber. You did very well, considering that was your first Zoom call. You did better than John and I do, and we're doing this every night, Nellie. Thank you for having me on and thank you for sharing the message. And I hope you're going to come to Tanks Park at some point and meet all the like minded people there.

We, we'd love you to come and speak with us there. Yeah. Well we, um, yeah. Where is that by the way? Tamaray. It's Phillip Altman and yeah, it's that group. Uh, and, and the beauty of that group is that everyone's very active. Uh, that, I'm one of many. We are one, but we are many. Get active everybody. I mean, get active.

Now is the time to get active, you know, and now is the time and also it's such balm to the soul because it's so frustrating when you feel you're not doing anything. It's actually wonderful. It's wonderful to be doing something and all those people there, they come and help. It's, it's the most marvelous community.

Well, Johnny Lada, you've often been heard to say. Just couldn't make this stuff up. You couldn't make this stuff up. Stay out of the trees. Everybody get along and support forest of the fallen. And, um, and let's also please get involved with the aligned council of Australia on their website, please do that.

It's very, it's a great organization, pulling a whole lot of people together for the right reasons. So thank you for watching club Grubbery. Thanks for your continued love and support.
