

## 2024-05-14 - Graham and John Speak with Tony about announcement by NSW health...

Well, good day everyone. Welcome to Club Grubbery and today is Tuesday the 14th of May and we have a Club Grubbery scoop, um, that we're going to bring to you and we'll just cut straight to the chase, John. We have Tony Nikolic on board. He's just pulled off the freeway to pass this information on and, uh, It's interesting news, uh, Johnny, but, uh, let's go to Tony and hear what you've got to say, Tony.

Well, g'day, guys. Hey, thanks for having me. Good to see us all again. Mate, uh, driving down the freeway and we got a scoop that the, um, obviously there was a case that we were running there to help John Larder and, uh, Um, his wife, uh, with respect to the mandates, especially how they've affected New South Wales health workers.

And we received some correspondence tonight from lawyers representing New South Wales health that the mandates for New South Wales health workers will be rescinded on the 16th of May. So in two days time, 2024. And in addition to that, All recommendations with respect to vaccines will be recommended only and not mandated.

So that's a really big sort of move towards the right direction, which is something we've been waiting for for a number of years. Anyone that's been following the case with John and his wife, Caitlin would know it was almost this time last year. As a matter of fact, it was May the 19th. That we appeared in the commission, um, with myself, um, Shane Prince, senior counsel, and Tammy Wong, um, uh, Mr.

Kelly, uh, myself, John, and Caitlin representing them in their, uh, case to try and get their jobs back. Look, there's, there's still a little bit more to go, uh, because they don't, The only essence of their case, there are still a little bit, a few more pieces to this puzzle, but I think this is a great move guys and I thought I'd share that with you.

It's a scoop and no one knows about it yet, but I think everyone should know about it, especially New South Wales health workers. So what do you think this means? I know John and Caitlin are in a, in a unique position and there's going to be a lot of reticence to have them back at work. Only for this, this, the, uh, from the sheer basis of the fact that there's going to be a lot of retribution handed out because they've been so vocal and thank God for that.

But what does this mean for other people in New South Wales health that are maybe lost their jobs? And if they want to come back, does it look like they're going to be able to now? Well, I would have thought, yes, I think New South Wales health is under a lot of pressure. We see the strains every day in New South Wales health.

Um, technically, uh, they could most should be all. reapply for their jobs. Whether they get it back, I think you hit the nail on the head with one point there. It all depends as to whether they approve of people who were, um, challenging the system such as John and Caitlin and those sorts of people who were really vocal about what was happening.

I can't see how this would impede someone from applying and getting their job back. Whether they get their job back is another, is another thing, but I think New South Wales Health would be very silly not to given the state. of public health in New South Wales at the moment where you're seeing queues going out the door, you're seeing emergency staff, uh, they're just overworked.

They're underpaid. They need help. We've got to get them that help. How do they do it? Well, they need to start re employing those people. As you know, Hootie and John, especially down there at the, um, on the 12th of February, 2000, uh, 2021. Was it the Canberra or 2022? Sorry. How many? People were walking around with

shirts saying New South Wales Health 20, 25 years, SAC 12 years, 32 years, SAC 25 because they made a personal health decision that we all know was a personal health decision, should have always been a personal health decision, and it should have always only been a recommended because, hey, what are those four points?

Did not stop transmission, didn't confer immunity, did not stop the hospitalizations, and hasn't stopped the deaths. We knew that. Unfortunately, public health and politicians didn't. We're starting to see the, uh, the, uh, fruits of that labor coming through now. Well, that's great news, Tony. We know you've got to go, mate.

Is there anything else you'd like to throw into the mix before we say goodnight to you? No, just, uh, I think this is the, the essence of hold the line, stay out of the trees, and you just can't make this stuff up, gents. That's it. That's what we're, that's what we're fighting for. That's why we've stayed in our lane and we're going to keep doing it.

Great to have you Tony. Thanks for all the work you're doing. All the best to everyone. Take care. All right. See you mate. See you. Thanks Tony. Johnny Larder, what does this, um, what does this letter mean to you? I mean, obviously there's gonna, there's a lot of hurdles to come, but given that we, we, you and I, Have fought from day one to keep the borders open and that that will is yet to be tested.

If the borders ever close again, I think it would be a stupid government, although we're used to stupid government that would close the border. We wanted to end the mandates, get everyone their jobs back with full compensation. We want the kids protected from compulsory vaccination. And we want this no jab, no job, no jab, no play, all this rubbish that Morrison introduced.

That's got to be gone. That has got to be gone, because people are waking up to the dangers of vaccines, not only this COVID one, but all of them, uh, and we, we heard that at the AVN 30th anniversary the other night, John, and we backed him 100%. So we're going to really push hard to get that. And we want this Royal Commission.

Now, you know, we were talking last night with Augusto Zimmerman and Tim Dwyer, and I Augusto said basically, even the Royal Commissioners, what, what good's it going to do? And he's, he's right, but we have to put pressure on, but how do you feel having seen this letter, Johnny? I think it's a, uh, it's a vindication of the position that was taken.

I mean, this was always a risk benefit analysis and we, uh, we did that risk benefit analysis and it didn't come up, uh, smelling like roses. So, uh, hence we, we had a, we had a duty, uh, to inform the public that we weren't. Satisfied with it. Who else was going to do it? Uh, if we didn't stand up, uh, so, you know, it's been the efforts of, uh, so many that have, that have led us to this point where we are now starting to say that the damn wall, not only crack, but the water is, is flowing over, uh, substantially.

I mean, the AstraZeneca, uh, issues in the last few weeks with the, uh, recall, uh, Uh, or, or banning o of that, uh, product for human use. Uh, we know that, uh, the AstraZeneca was probably the better option of the, uh, of the mRNA, uh, jabs. So, uh, we, we certainly just have to keep, uh, fighting hoodie. There is no doubt, uh, this, this is, uh, uh, this is a wonderful present.

Uh, but it's not, uh, it's not the end of the road. They, they will make it very difficult. I mean, we spoke to a nurse, didn't we, on Saturday night that we will interview in the next week or so, hopefully, that is a Queensland based intensive care nurse, 17 years in the one hospital, uh, refused the job. Was sacked and now that has been removed and they've been allowed to reapply.

She was told there's no positions at the hospital. I mean, uh, you just couldn't make this stuff up. They are not going to make it easy. They are not going to fall on their sword. They are not going to apologize anytime soon. So we just have to keep the pressure on for the sake of the people, for the sake of those out there that need an ambulance.

Uh, I listened to Ben Fordham this morning and some poor, uh, gentleman was talking about his mother that was, uh, uh, in a chair all night at Northern Beaches Hospital. Uh, this sort of stuff's going on all over Australia. Uh, health is, uh, gone down the toilet in this country. Uh, people have just, uh, abandoned safety that they've, uh, they've lost their moral compass and we need to, uh, we need to address it.

We absolutely do. We know that there's a lot of belligerence on behalf of the health bureaucrats. They're going to play this hard. The health minister in Queensland is an absolute dope. Um, she speaks out of two mouths that lady and she's proven that time and time again. And we're going to, we need to follow up with some of the nurses that we talked to prior to this.

Uh, in the last few months to, to bring that back to the floor. And we will get Michelle on that nurse that we spoke to on Saturday night. She's willing to come on and talk about what's going on, but John, we're not going to let up until we get, until we get justice, we're just going to keep being the annoying mosquito in the corner of these mongrels bedrooms every night.

We're not going to give up. Um, you're not going to give up. I'm not going to give up. We've got nothing better to do. We're going to see this thing out. And that's why we need everybody to get behind what we're doing. And those, all those others who are doing the same thing, put this stuff out there before they shut down the media.

And, and, you know, even today I saw, uh, somebody sent me a clip from media Watson and the talking heads at sunrise. We're interviewing. Uh, I think a senior representative of the College of General Practitioners about the AstraZeneca decision. And they were talking up the fear again, oh, everyone's going to die.

And she said, no, no, it's not that, you know, she said, these side effects are very, very rare. Now that, that just proves to me that that person hasn't read their own documentation. Because they put out a paper in the, in the, uh, in the journal that's associated with the College of General Practitioners warning general practitioners against, uh, promoting the vaccine because of its deadly side effects.

I mean, it's just, and they're still pushing this stuff, John, they're still advising people. And the health minister Butler came out and said that, you know, we thank AstraZeneca for the millions of lives that they saved. What an absolute crock of dung. And the only reason it continues is because a lot of people in this country got their head in the sand. It's time to wake up and, and push this stuff out. Final comments, Johnny. You just couldn't make this stuff up. You couldn't make this stuff up. Let's close this with a prayer. Father in heaven, we pray that justice will be done, that your justice will be done and done swiftly.

And we pray that those who have suffered will see the benefits of the fruits of their fight. Lord, guide and lead us is our prayer. Bring our country back to that which we were proud and free. In Jesus name we pray, Amen. Stay out of the trees everybody. We're not doing any fancy editing tonight. This is going straight out.

Spread the word and put the pressure on. Get in touch with your radio stations. Get in touch with your politicians. And a big thank you to Tony Nicolick, Steve Kelly, Shane Prince, senior counsel, and Tammy Wong. Uh, you did a superb job and this, this is, you know, being a, a wonderful team effort from everyone that's got behind, um, what's going on here.
