

2024-06-05 Graham and John speak with Chris Nemith about his experiences...

Well, G'day everyone and welcome to Club Grubbery, Wednesday the 5th of June. And if you saw the promo that I put out earlier today, you'll see that the lineup we've got coming in the next 10 days, it's actually making me quite tired, Johnny, looking at the list. They're all confirmed. And, uh, I don't know whether you're happy with me or not.

Um, I'm always happy with your hoodie. I love you. I love you too, mate. And, uh, we're, we're kicking off this big lineup this week with a wonderful guy here. We've interviewed about 12 months ago, Chris Nemeth, uh, from Victoria and, uh, Chris, welcome to the show. We're talking tonight about your vaccine injury claim amongst other things.

And we'll get to that shortly. We've got a couple of housekeeping items to attend to. Firstly, firstly, uh, Dr. Dan, most people will know Dr. Dan. Uh, he was on with Michael Gray Griffith and, um, Cafe Locked Out. They gave him a good hearing with Paul Oosterhuis and I think Philip Altman. He wanted to advocate, uh, for vaccines that gave him a good hearing.

I thought, uh, they were, they were fair and reasonable. And since then, he's been at us to have him on the program. Now I've made a decision not to entertain Dr. Dan, I won't mention his last name. Because to be honest, he's been belligerent on social media with a lot of people who've been injured. And a lot of people have had family members who've died as a result of vaccine injuries.

Um, he has shown no, no, uh, no compassion at all to these people. And he's been quite cruel. The other thing is he said, he sent out a message after I put out the post today about all the interviews we're doing, criticizing Club Grubbery for not having him or vaccine advocates on. Dan, I know you're listening and we thank you for your patronage, but I want to say this to you, my friend, you guys have got every string of mainstream media backing your views from go to woe.

And you have right from the very beginning. And a lot of people we've asked to come on and debate with you. People like Dr. Peter McCullough, Dr. Pierre Corey, and Dr. Asim Malhotra. Have looked at your, your, um, your, uh, your, uh, background and they've looked at your, uh, your credentials and they said they wouldn't be bothered.

They wouldn't waste their time. They, uh, they alluded to various articles that you'd written, I think four peer reviewed articles in your whole career. And those are people with 80 plus. Our peer reviewed articles just on COVID and they said they wouldn't waste their time. So I appreciate your persistence, but the answer for you, Dan, is no, you will not be given any airtime on Club Grubbery.

I'm sure Channel 7, 9, 10, and the ABC will happily put you to air and you're more than welcome to go there and even criticize us if you wish to. But the people who are watching us, A lot of them are grieving, a lot of them are upset and one of them is joining us tonight and we'll be hearing his story and I hope you have a good listen to it, Dan, because there's not a lot of credibility behind your argument to continue to push vaccines.

That's all saying the matter. Thanks for your patronage, Dan. The other thing I want to point out is that when we did that wonderful show with the Australian, uh, sorry, the Aligned Council of Australia with Katie Ashby Coppins. And, uh, and a panel of beautiful people that are working with her. A grave mistake was made by one of the panelists, Jodie, uh, and which she's feeling very bad about it.

Uh, where she named Senator Josh Wilson as, and his staff as being those people who blocked their people from going in to deliver documents to the Senator, she got the name wrong. And, uh, it, it brings me no joy to have to do this, uh, because that's not what we're on about here, but I understand it was an honest mistake.

So I'll just share screen and, um, Katie Ashby Coppins, uh, Coppins has asked me to read this letter of apology, which I'll now show on the screen and read as I do. It's signed to today's date, the 5th of June, uh, attention, Mr. Josh Wilson, MP. And staff members, apologies and retraction and thank you. My name is Jody Clune.

That was the lady who, uh, who was the panelist who mentioned the name by mistake. I'm the coordinator of the National Electoral Representative Alignment, NERA, an initiative of the Aligned Council of Australia. The ACA has brought together 1.73 million people since February 2024 for the purposes of bringing awareness to the World Health Organization pandemic treaty reforms.

The NERA Initiative is a national campaign where local coordinators help facilitate the implementation of national strategies at their local electorate level. Volunteers help to facilitate local community groups to bring them together to action various campaigns and tasks designed at educating their local politicians on key issues that their constituents are concerned with.

I'm writing to you today in relation to an interview I gave on the 3rd of June 2024 with Graeme Hood and John Larder, in which we talked about the achievements of the ACA in our recent Action Week held 7 to 11 of May 2024. In this interview, I incorrectly attributed your office as not receiving our nearer community representatives when we attended on the 10th of May.

2024. The office in question was Zanetta Mascarena's office in SWAN. The NERA representatives not only had the door locked, so as to allow, not to allow them to enter and speak to their elect with their electoral office, but the Australian Federal Police were also contacted for intervention in this matter.

Thankfully, the AFP were able to escort the NERA representatives into the office to supply the letters and supporting information to have their voices heard at the electoral level. I would like to acknowledge your office of Fremantle was very courteous and welcoming to the NERA. Community representatives that attended your office on the 10th of May 2024.

Your staff allowed the concerns to be heard and accepted supporting documents submitted at the time. At that time, a retraction or edit can be formally undertaken with the, cannot be, can't be formally undertaken with the video, but Graeme Hood has indicated he will make this correction and apology publicly tonight on the next show and I have asked him to include this letter with the video.

If you wish to discuss this or any other aspects and feel free to contact me, I'm always happy to speak directly with you. Again, thank you for receiving our NERA representatives on the 10th of May, 2024. And that's signed Jodie Kloon and she's the national coordinator of NERA with the aligned council of Australia.

And I thank Jodie for her honesty and her humility in that situation. I'll stop sharing screen now. You've all seen it and we've read it and Josh Wilson. We do apologize to you because, uh, we got quite animated when we heard that that had happened. And to attribute our, uh, uh, dismay, uh, to you, we sincerely apologize for that, Josh.

And, uh, we hope that you do look at those documents and please action them accordingly. So we'd be happy to have him come on too, Woody, if you wanted to come on and discuss some of these issues. I mean, the forum's open to you, Josh. I mean, we're we're at. We're an open, uh, open, uh, door policy here, except for, uh, Dr.

Dan. Um, now Dr. Dan, let me just add a little bit there to, uh, what Hoody said. You gotta be joking, mate. I mean, only a month ago, you made a complaint against me to APRA and you want to come on our program? Mate, you're off with the fairies. I'll tell you what, go and have a psychiatric assessment. You're kidding me.

That's right. He did, didn't he? He's got to be joking. Yeah. Well, you know, people who write complaints to APRA need to be very. Uh, because the same can be done to them anyway, uh, good point. Well, my Johnny and to underscore all of that, that we've just talked about in relation to the good doctor, uh, we have now somebody who has been at the pointy end literally of, uh, of this vaccine is particular.

No, it's not a vaccine. I'm sorry. A lot of people keep telling us stop referring to it as a vaccine of this inoculation. And this man is Chris Nemeth and Chris, his life has been turned upside down from the first moment that he had the first jab. And I'd like to introduce Chris now. Welcome to the program, Chris.

It's great to have you with us. Uh, before we go on, I want you to just unpack briefly what your life was like before you had the jab, what you were doing and what happened since and what the symptoms were, and then let's get stuck into what's gone on since. Thanks very much, Graeme and John. And just before I speak, I just want to express some gratitude to you guys for the forum that you provide to the vaccine injured.

You mentioned in your opening remarks that the other side of the argument get all of the mainstream media support and we get no voice there. So we're thankful for you guys. My pleasure. Back before I took my first vaccine in July of 2021, I was 48 years old. I'd worked in international freight and logistics for 30 years, working my way up to quite a senior position, a job that I was really enjoying, earning some good money.

I'd been married for 25 years at that stage, two adult sons, 18 to 19. Uh, probably the fittest in my life, having, uh, been working from home under the government restrictions for a long while and being able to exercise and that sort of thing a little bit more. Then came the vaccination. That was on July 16th of 2021.

Within three weeks, I started to develop some symptoms. So went off to the doctor. From there, I ended up, uh, facing three separate hospital admissions in 2021. And subsequent to that, a four week stay in a rehab hospital after becoming paralysed, I needed to learn to walk again. Between October of 2021 and March of 2022, it's been a six month period of not being able to walk or needing, uh, appliances or devices.

walkers and canes and that sort of thing to assist me to walk. Uh, in March of 2022, I became aware of the vaccine claim scheme and had a look at it, and there was a 65 page policy document written in legalese that even I couldn't understand it. I'm not super smart, but I'm not dumb either, and realized pretty quick that I needed legal advice.

So I worked with a lawyer to prepare a submission or an application under the scheme. That took 11 months to pull together. Pulled together a submission of over a thousand pages, sporting documents, doing what we thought would allow us to best meet the criteria that the government set to make a claim.

So that that claim was submitted to the government in March, March 2nd, 2023. And here we are today, 465 days later. Uh, I don't have any outcome for that claim. And the most recent update, the one I got last Thursday after. The claim had been referred to their external legal experts for a second time was we can offer no further update at this time.

And when I pushed it to ask, what does that mean? When will you be able to offer something that we can offer no further update at this time? I was met with that line four or five times each time I asked a question and ended up realizing I was butting my head against a brick wall. So that's why I've reached out to you guys and a couple of other friendly politicians that we'll talk about a little bit later to try and raise some awareness.

It's not just about me. There's multiple other people in the same boat that I am where they, their claims have disappeared into a black hole and they're not getting answers and that's on top of the people that weren't able to make a claim even though they're severely injured because the criteria of the claim scheme are so narrow.

So, I guess that's a snapshot of where I am and why I'm here to talk to you guys tonight. Johnny Lada, you and I will remember, um, the, the Prime Minister, Scott Morrison. And his health minister, Greg Hunt, announcing this

greatest of ever human trials of any medical procedure in history, the greatest ever, and saying that the government was backing it up with a robust vaccine injury compensation scheme.

So that if anyone suffered any hardship or loss, the government would be behind them all the way. Well, the government seems to be behind them, Johnny, with a sharp stick. And what's happened to that scheme now? It's gone. It's finished. It's finished. It's been wound up. It's all over Red Rover. Wow. Yeah, well, it's not dissimilar to what's going on with the NDIS, Woody.

Another disaster, another mismanagement of labour. Well intended, but, you know, they couldn't run a hot bath, these people. And, you know, here we have, you know, we've got on the NDIS, we've got people that are in absolute need that miss out. And then we've got drug lords involved in the NDIS, we find out today.

Yeah. Uh, we find out that, uh, people are, uh, uh, have been taken on bus excursions to Byron Bay for, uh, you know, magic mushroom visits. I mean, this is all, this is all coming to light now, uh, no, no different to what's going on with this mismanaged scheme at a federal level for the vaccine injured. I mean, it's all just BS, uh, it's all just window dressing.

There is no real content to anything they're doing. Um, they, they make it virtually impossible for anyone to, uh, to get onto these schemes. You've virtually got to be, uh, uh, to the point where you can't even fill out the form to get on it. Uh, and then if you can't fill out the form, you can't get on there anyway.

I mean, it's just completely mad. It is looking, you know, this, this max of so many other schemes that the government's been involved in and the home installation scandal, which had a Royal Commission, of course, over the deaths, the tragic deaths of four young electricians, and 1990s when Neil Blewett was Health Minister of Australia and covered up the fact that contaminated blood with HIV was given to people and little kids age seven were dying as a result of it.

That cover up was global and there are still investigations going on into that and a wonderful expose being done by Channel 4 in the UK on the cover ups of, uh, of that particular scandal. Is it any wonder that That the people of this country do not trust their government when it comes to health or anything else for that matter.

They have not got the runs on the board. They're not acting in the best interest of the people of this country who elected them. And we thank, uh, some of those politicians who are standing in particular, one Russell Broadbent, who is, is typical of the word integrity when it comes to being in the role that he's been in for almost 30 years.

The man is an absolute gentleman. He commands respect and credibility, even though many disagree with his stand. And this man has taken Chris's, um, Chris's, um, issues up in the, in the house, as has Jared Renick and Malcolm Roberts, who are taking these people to task services, Australia. I mean, this is a joke.

Um, this is a joke, Chris, surely. Yeah. Well, Greg Hunt's words when he announced the scheme was that it was going to be a simple to access safety net with a quick administrative time. I've not experienced any of that. It wasn't simple to access. I needed to get a lawyer involved. Uh, it's not a safety net because I've not had any financial support from the government.

From the time I first became unwell as a result of the JAP. Uh, and it certainly hasn't gotten a quick administrative process. Today's day 461 since those thousand pages were submitted. Uh, the process, the way that it works is you submit your initial application to the scheme. There's four criteria that you have to tick off.

Did you receive one of the approved vaccines? Did you have a medically diagnosed reaction to the vaccine in line with the conditions set out by the government? Did you have a financial loss of more than a thousand dollars? And did you spend at least one night in hospital? So they're the four initial criteria for the first phase.

That took three months for them to sign off on my application. Once it got to that point, I spoke to a representative of The Services Australia to get an understanding of what the scheme was and how it worked,

what the processes were, and I was told it was three phases. That initial phase that I just described, the second phase was an independent medical review by the TGA, the same people that approved these vaccines as being safe and effective.

They did their review and I was subsequently told that my application passed on the first go through that uh, independent medical review and that that's very unusual. So that gave me, you know, some heart that the time we spent on preparing the application was time well spent. We ticked all the boxes.

Then the third phase was an external legal review and the guy from Services Australia that I spoke to was very excited about the external legal review. He said that's the only part of the whole process that's got a clock on it. Once Services Australia hand the case over to the external legal panel, they've got 14 working days to review it and give an advice back to Services Australia, who would then give me an advice.

After I went through the medical review, I was asked for some more information, which I provided, and then the case was passed to the external review. The external review, the legal review, they made their advice back to Services Australia, and they asked me for some more information subsequent to that review.

I provided that and then they asked for some more additional information. So three guys have additional information. They had, then we went into a phase that it was never explained to me, an internal legal review, whatever that was. And after the internal legal review, they came back wanting some more information, which was provided.

And then it's gone back into the external legal review again. And that time up was not Monday, just gone the Monday prior. Yeah. And we had the word on Thursday that there was no update at this stage. So I've been through all of the phases and an additional phase and one of the phases a second time. And they still can't give any sort of an update.

And again, I'm not the only person in this situation. My lawyer has more than just myself on her books that are in this situation. I talk to people in, you know, the various vaccine injury groups. And there are more people, um, there are about 4, 200 applications under the scheme. 2, 000 out of those have been rejected.

Another 1, 000 have been withdrawn. They say withdrawn, but what they've actually done is told people you don't meet the criteria. So we're rejecting your claim, but we're not rejecting it officially. Withdraw it and that'll allow you to come back at a later stage to resubmit your claim. Only 352 have actually been approved and had any money paid.

352 out of three and a half thousand that have been finalized.

And what's the maximum payment you can get? Well, there is no cap on the payment. There's a pain and suffering component that does have a cap on it, and that's about 690, 000, but that's only if you die. If you didn't die, it's up to someone within that Services Australia process to determine a percentage.

How much pain and suffering you've had a percentage of that six hundred and ninety thousand and again the scheme doesn't explain how that's calculated. And I've seen people who've had fairly significant injuries offered, you know, one thousand, two thousand dollars for their pain and suffering when their life has been completely turned upside down.

Well, Johnny, we need a, we need a, um, a compensation scheme for the victims of the vaccine injury compensation scheme, scheme. You're not kidding, Brian.

It's ridiculous. What was it? What was it?

What was that? Sorry. What was it ever announced for? I mean, let's face it, let's be honest, the reason they're denying these payments is because if it comes out on record that tens of thousands of people have been

compensated through the scheme, then they've admitted that their initial reaction to the so called pandemic was wrong and they blew it.

They blew it. They blew it. And, and so many people have, have had their lives affected one way or another, but the vaccine injured, I mean, they're rising to the surface. Like you wouldn't believe in numbers that just will not be ignored. There will be an apology to the people of Australia from this government at some stage in the future, probably 50 years from now, when all the people who should be held responsible for it are no longer with us.

We've got to get some action now. We saw that happen recently, Graeme, with the people who suffered injury from thalimide. It took 60 years for them to get a formal apology. And most of the people that suffered from those injuries there, they passed away by that stage. Well, and interestingly enough, um, um, uh, Russell Broadbent interviewed, uh, Senate, uh, um, oncologist, um, Angus Dalgleish, who we've previously, um, spoken to Woody.

And his comments to us were that thalidomide will Will, in comparison look like a, a pimple on somebody's bum. Um, and he, he reiterated that today, uh, in the interview with, with Russell Broadband, uh, he went on to say that we need a Nuremberg style, um, trial because these, these people that have, uh, that have put these communities, uh, in, in harm's way need to be dealt with appropriately.

And look, it's just an absolute tragedy. Uh, I don't know. Can you recall, Hoody? Remember when we spoke with the, the lady, um, uh, that had correspondence with the prime minister at the time, Scott Morrison, now she, she had a letter from the doctor, uh, if not the hospital saying that her mother had died as a result of the vaccine injury.

And Scott Morrison's department, the health department wrote back to the lady who was inquiring on behalf of her father to the compensation scheme. And they said that death, death as a result of the vaccine was not one of the recognized injuries. I remember all this stuff from our memory, John, but it keeps coming up every single day.

What is worse than dying from the vaccine, but it wasn't on their tick and flick list.

Policy has no heart. We know that, Chris. And it's a good point you raised. The government, when they set the scheme up, they decided what injuries in relation to which vaccines that you could claim for. Had I taken, I had AstraZeneca, had I had Pfizer and had the same reaction that I've had, I wouldn't be able to claim because this condition is not covered under Pfizer, it's only covered under AstraZeneca.

The government scheme is so narrow. I'm one of the lucky ones. I get to make a claim and I get to have my time wasted and, and this cruel, uh, system inflicted upon me. There's so many people out there who are injured, but they don't tick the boxes as the government set out. And so they can't claim. And there's really no way for those people to turn.

So I worry a lot about them.

Well, and we saw, uh, Pfizer being questioned by, uh, Malcolm Roberts and Gerard Rennick, and they weren't, they weren't even worried about these people. Uh, they, they, they don't have empathy, they don't have compassion down at Pfizer. Uh, they just want to keep building more infrastructure. Them and Moderna, like these factories in Melbourne and up in Queensland, uh, they are just poison factories.

I, I, I don't know what else you can call them. I mean, we see in the Telegraph today in the UK that there is now scientists believe that these vaccines may be causing excess deaths. These will. Wakey wakey. I mean, what else do you think has been causing them? I mean, you don't have to be Einstein to work out that the The deaths went up as soon as the vaccine was rolled out.

Now you, you don't have to be, uh, you know, a Rhodes Scholar to work out that there is something wrong with the vaccines. At least, at least it should be examined as a possibility, but mainstream media are just pushing it aside. They're not, they're looking at all these other causes like, Oh, you know, people are just being stressed from lockdowns and, and, uh, and climate change.

Okay. Climate change and all that, and the, and the giant syringe, the pink syringe in the room is this jab and you have, um, you have absolute, I've got to watch my language, you have gentlemen like the Minister for Health, Mark Butler, coming out when AstraZeneca was pulled saying we should all grovel at the feet of AstraZeneca because their marvellous innovation saved 65 million lives.

Where do they get that data from? And how do you feel about that comment, Chris? Thank you very much. All, all I know that is having had an AstraZeneca vaccination, it's altered the course of my life and, and not for the better. I'll never be the person I was again before I got sick. I have daily medication.

I have, uh, I go to hospital every three weeks and get an infusion. The product that'll keep me upright and, and that's, you know, for the foreseeable future, the rest of my life, that's where I'll be when, when. Citizens of Australia came back wanting the last lot of additional information. The crux of the three questions they wanted answered was, How long am I going to be sick for?

Well, it's been explained to them that the condition I've got, it's called chronic inflammatory demyelinating polyneuropathy. The very first word in it is chronic. I'm going to have it forever. So I'm going to be sick forever. How long am I going to be unfit for work? At the moment, I'm probably recovered to the best of my ability.

And I'm unfit for work now, so I'm probably never going to be fit to go back to work. And the third part was how long am I going to have pain and suffering for? As I said, I take daily medication. I have pins and needles in my hands and feet, constant. That's there 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The medication mitigates it, but it's always there.

I have balance issues. I have issues for 3

weeks and sit there for 5 or 6 hours and get an infusion. So, you know, that sounds to me like pain and suffering. And that's the foreseeable future. So, that's forever. And these are the sort of stupid questions that you get asked over and over again. I'm sick, but I've got to fight through this cruel scheme on top of everything else.

And then I have the heartlessness to say, at this point we can offer you no further update. Well, what am I to do? Where am I to turn? Thankfully, there are people like Russell Broadbent and Gerard Rennie, the wonderful politicians and a voice for the vaccine injured. Russell raised my case in Parliament on Monday and that was, I was very grateful for that.

And Gerard, And Malcolm Roberts met with Services Australia in standard estimates on Monday. And my issue and the issue of another vaccine injured person were raised by those two. And the representatives for Services Australia, one of the questions that Malcolm Roberts asked pertained to a woman who received a 4, 000 settlement for her claim, despite the fact that she won't ever work again as a result of her vaccine injury.

And the answer from the Services Australia representatives, well, my understanding under the scheme is you can't claim for lost income. We absolutely can. And it's on the claim website. It sets out what you can claim for. So you've got representatives fronting Senate estimates for Services Australia who have no understanding of the scheme whatsoever.

And that just infuriates us vaccine injured who, who live this scheme day after day, know the ins and outs and the people charged with administering it. Don't even know. These morons, these moron politicians were at the centre of a scheme that were paying out millions of dollars to people that were only ever working one or two days a week.

And they were being paid out during COVID, uh, phenomenal amounts of money, uh, in, in without question, without question. There wasn't even any checks or balances. The whole thing was just a complete joke. I mean, who remembers poor old Bernie Banton? The guy that died of asbestosis, he was in a wheelchair, he was, uh, on nasal prong oxygen, short of breath.

He fought to the death to get recognition of those that were, uh, that were set aside by James Hardy and their product. And I mean, people now respect what, what went on there. I mean, this is no different. This is in fact, it's worse. Uh, and everyone out there that, uh, is watching this mainstream media just doesn't, doesn't know about it.

Doesn't care about it. Isn't interested in it. The politicians aren't interested in it, but it, it, it will make this James Hardy scandal look like, as, uh, Professor Dalglish says, a pimple on somebody's backside. I mean, thalidomide. I mean, it's just madness. I mean, when you get in. One of the most senior oncologists in the world and others, he's not alone, uh, and, and not just the oncologist, we're talking cardiologists, we're talking numerous specialties, uh, calling for, uh, a Nuremberg trial in relation to these vaccines.

Surely somebody has to take stock of that at a political level and say, what's going on? Well, gentlemen, we now know that Penny Wong has donated 100 million extra of Australian taxpayers money, extra over and above what was required to the WHO as a goodwill gesture. 100 million. Anthony Albanese spent half a billion dollars on a referendum that was doomed to fail at the beginning.

And we've got people like Daniel Sinzio busting their chops all around South Brisbane trying to feed the homeless. And we've got people like yourself, Chris, who can't work ever again, who went out and did the right thing for the right reasons, who are now suffering for it, having been prompted, bribed and coerced by the government, and there's no money for them.

I mean, it beggars belief. There's no pub test in the world that that would pass. And I want to ask you straight up, Chris, what motivated you to roll up your sleeve in the first place? Look, at that stage, I'm in Melbourne. And we had our premier on TV every day telling us that we needed to get vaccinated.

And we were under some of the most harsh lockdown conditions in the world. I couldn't get out and my parents live in rural Victoria. I'm in Metro Melbourne. I couldn't get out and see them. We had the ring of steel and I could see that the mandates were coming and that the vaccines at that point were in short supply.

So I thought, look, might as well get it now before the rush. And you were doing the right thing. That's what I thought. I had no fear of getting COVID. You know, I was fit, healthy, 48. It wasn't going to hurt me. But the thing I didn't want to do was make someone else sick. And that was told, you know, we were told that that was a real risk.

We could pass it on to grandma, and I certainly didn't want to do that. You were also told that the vaccine was safe and effective and would prevent Every day. Every day, Dan told us, safe and effective, the best vaccine that you can get is the vaccine that you can get today. So there you go, Dr. Dan, there's been a whole bunch of advocacy for people to get vaccines and so, uh, you know.

And Dr. Dan, don't set aside, mate, how many doctors out there have been absolutely bloody selfish. And have written up that they've taken this vaccine but haven't, they've lied and now they're in a, an absolute quandary because they know these things are death, absolutely killing people, uh, it's just ruthless, it's just a slaughter and cardiologists out there, cardiologists that I know, know that this is going on, their rooms are absolutely chock a block full of injured people, but because they've told a lie, they can't say anything.

It is an absolute disgrace. And I tell you, uh, you're going to be judged one way or another, uh, at some point in time as to, as to your actions, because they got us. And the fact that he even wrote a complaint about you to

opera underlies the fact that a lot of doctors aren't speaking up to get this thing sorted out once and for all to save lives, because they're scared, scared of the dragon that Dr.

Dan is feeding with his complaints. They're scared of the dragon that you feed with your complaints, Dr. Dan. And there are plenty of really top notch cardiologists who are in the same profession as you who would have you on. But unfortunately, we can't get them onto this program to do it because they don't think you're worth the breath.

Anyway. I've been really fortunate through my journey that my doctors have been incredibly supportive. My GP and my neurologist are both backing me 100%. All the way, but I know of a lot of other vaccine injured people who have trouble getting their doctors to acknowledge, yes, it's a vaccine injury. The doctors are more willing to put down long COVID as the cause for their conditions than they are stating it's linked to the vaccine for the sorts of reasons that you guys are talking about right now.

Yeah, they don't want to come under the notice of ARPRA and ARPRA is the elephant in the room here. They, they're the people that are inhibiting the medical fraternity from speaking out. They don't want to lose their jobs. They don't want to lose their houses. They don't want to end up in a bust up with their family, uh, over any of this mess.

And it's, I can understand it, but it doesn't make it right. Uh, because if everyone had a stood up, if everyone had a taken the action that we did and said, nah, this is bullshit, we're not doing it. Uh, show us the data on, on where this is safe. Uh, you know, when we're not seeing a pandemic, we need to essentially take a deep breath, have a look at what's going on, and then, and then evaluate where we go.

As Hoody has said many times in, in, in human factors, um, situations, that was not how it played out. Uh, you fed the monster that is opera, the octopus, they've got tentacles everywhere and the Martin Fletchers of the world need to be sacked. They need to be held to account because all they've done is put people at risk.

They haven't protected the public, which is their remit. They've been an absolute disgrace. Uh, they've just absolutely annihilated the medical fraternity. They've, they've created a lack of confidence in the public's, uh, uh, view of, of the, of the medical fraternity as we speak, I mean, all the people that watch club grubbery would be out there thinking, I don't want to go to a doctor.

I don't want to go to a hospital. And yet we know that there are some amazing things done by incredible doctors in amazing hospitals buying, and you know, supported by incredible nursing staff. We know that all that's been blown out of the water. All the centuries of hard work around the, the Hippocratic oath and first do no harm.

All of that stuff has been blown out of the water by political expediency and greed. And corporate, corporate and bureaucratic interference, which has totally destroyed the health profession. It's lost its, it's, it's, uh, credibility completely. And how long are you going to let this go on? And you can call us cooks and nut jobs and all that sort of stuff, but you come and show us where we're wrong.

We're not experts. We're not medical experts. John is. As a paramedic, he's got some expertise, but we're just saying, is it worth looking at the fact that maybe these vaccines, so called vaccines are causing injury and death? Could it be one of the causes? And if it's not being investigated, why? And the reason the why is, is because those who pushed it, authorized it and mandated it are in the firing line when the truth comes out.

That's the real truth. It's not being pursued. Look, the madness is here. New South Wales Health have dropped the mandate for people to be vaccinated because the Premier said, uh, a long time ago, perite, that there was no evidence that he was aware of that transmission or, uh, or the, or the vaccination was, was effective.

He said that there is no evidence it's all, it's all concocted. So, I mean, here we are now, why would you be advertising to take boosters? when you know it's not going to work. There can't be any benefit to it. There is numerous studies that say it is absolute nonsense. So why are we portrayed as cooks for asking for a pause?

And to say, okay, we're not the experts, but let's have a, a round table inquiry. Let's stop everything. Nobody's at any risk at the moment. There is no risk. Nobody's demanding people, uh, take these vaccines. So just pause everything. Let's have a look at what they're doing. Let's have a look at the bigger picture.

And then let's evaluate where we go from there. That's all we ask. Despite having a medically diagnosed vaccine injury and one that's been accepted by the TGA, I've still been called the cooker. I've still, despite the fact that I took a vaccine, I'm still anti vax. None of it makes any sense and all the name calling back and forward.

Doesn't help anything. The government's scheme, it's inadequate. It's funded to the tune of about 120 million at the moment. They've paid out 20. They've got a hundred million. They've got 790 claims that are unresolved with a hundred million dollars sitting there that could support people. Part of the challenge that I face, the scheme sits under, uh, Services Australia's administration.

Which is Bill Shorten's portfolio as the Minister for Australian, what is it, the Minister for Government Services. Sits under Services Australia, sits there. But the policy, the vaccine claim scheme policy, sits under, um, Mark Butler's portfolio as the Minister for Health and Aged Care. So I've been told by Services Australia that they've had to write a letter specific to my case.

to Mark Butler's office seeking advice from him about what to do about it. Through my lawyer, we've asked Services Australia for a copy of that letter and I've been told, no, not allowed to have it. It relates specifically to me and my situation, but I'm not allowed to have it. So we're going to be lodging a freedom of information request to receive that letter.

But that's part of the problem. You've got these two different government, uh, portfolios trying to administer one scheme. So you've got a back and forth and finger pointing both ways. Nobody wants to help. Uh, you've spoken about thalidomide and the pink bags and these, I equate it very similar to Robodex.

It was set up really poorly. And what happened with robo debt? We had people commit suicide. Is it going to take that with the vaccines claim scheme before someone takes it seriously? Is someone going to have to kill themselves? I know that there's people out there who've been injured by the vaccines who can't work and can't earn an income, their relationships are broken down, they're at their wits end and their claims remain unresolved.

These people don't have. Much more to hang on to. Do we have to have someone die before we say, oh, yep, look, there is a problem here and we need to fix this and help these people. I have an internal dialogue with myself every day. What's going to happen with the outcome? I know that I won't get back to work, but I've got a financial future and a family to provide for.

Am I going to get a claim that will provide some future financial security? Am I going to get something that's somewhere in the middle or am I going to get nothing? And if I get nothing, and I'm someone who's got a chronic illness. For the rest of my life, can't work and have no money. Do I want to live that life?

That's my internal dialogue every day because of this scheme.

You couldn't have stated it more eloquently and it just typifies everything that's wrong about government. Bureaucratic tails wagging the dog. This is all about, this is all about draining a swamp. I hate to use Trump isms, but that's the truth. It's true, yeah. No, look, Mark Butler and Bill Shorten, I mean, you wouldn't put them on the fries at McDonald's.

I mean, they're, they're, they're a joke. The World Health Organization. He was like a teenage kid on a date with Beyonce. You know, he was like, Oh, look, I've really made it. You know, I've really made it. I made the big time. Look at me speaking to the world for goodness sake. We need Statesman again. Where are these?

We need Statesman. I mean, Oh, I'll name one right up. Russell brought me. There's a man who conducts himself. He plays the ball, not the man. He's, he's an absolute gentleman. He's much respected by everyone in, in both houses of parliament. And what happened at pre selection? Now he's an independent. You know, the Liberal Party need to take stock.

We need statesmen again. Unfortunately, the Liberal Party's lost the plot. We need, we need men and women who will go to these bureaucracies and say, pay Chris Nemeth what Chris Nemeth deserves. Just do it. And stop mucking around. Or tell me what more you need so you can resolve it. Don't tell me you can't offer me an update.

Tell me something that I can work with. A thousand pages of information and you're still offering to give them more? They've asked three times and it's been given each time they've asked for it. The fact is they've given it again to their external legal people a second time, and they've received that advice back from them.

What is that advice? Tell me, do you need more details? What is the, to tell me that you can't offer an update, they're waiting for me and people like me either to go away or pass away. That's what they want. Just like Qantas, just like Qantas, the way they're treating their vaccine injured, just exactly the same.

Give us more paperwork and then months and months and months of no communication, not even a call from a base manager to see how you're going.

My lawyer called Services Australia again today to see if there's any more updates since they weren't able to offer an update. And their response was, don't worry, he's not the only one in this situation. Like that's supposed to make me feel better. It makes me feel worse that there's other people going through the same sort of thing as I am.

And again, we're the lucky ones because we're able to make a claim. We've got this thing to cling on to that, you know, we might get some sort of outcome that'll help us. And then there's all these other people who, because the government decided what you could or couldn't claim for, why not leave it open to the doctors?

If you've got a GP and a specialist that say you've got an injury that has resulted from their vaccines, that should have been enough. Not up to the government to pick out, I think it's 11 conditions out of, there's over 200 identified COVID vaccine reactions and they've picked out 11 that you're allowed to claim for across the various vaccines.

Where does that come from? How does that fair to anybody and all that while offering indemnity to the vaccine manufacturers? Correct. It's a, it's a win-win for them, isn't it? Well, they tell everybody that there's a safety net there for you if you do get injured. But I'm telling you, if I was anybody out there, I would take another vaccine because there's no support and there is no safety net.

Or if there is a safety net, it's laid right on top of the concrete. So when you hit it, it doesn't help anyway. Yeah, that's a good analogy. Well, we better get this story out there, Chris. And we do need you to keep us updated because this will do. This is a travesty. This is another pandemic in and of itself.

It's a bureaucratic pandemic. Well, 790 people still waiting on outcomes and it's people's lives that they're playing with. Unbelievable. And Woody, this, this is likely why this NDIS scheme is absolutely failing and destined to fail. I mean, we've got a situation now where the Australian vaccination network have been on top of this for 30 years.

We don't know what these vaccines are doing to the kids. Other than the fact that we've got this massive explosion of, uh, abnormalities in children, uh, whether it be, um, ADHD or all these complaints, uh, they need investigation SIDS, who knows what's going on? And it's likely that this NDIS is just absolutely overrun because of vaccine injury from childhood.

We need, we need answers. Uh, and here we've got a situation where the NDIS. The NDIS is going to be further strained because adult people, uh, and children, uh, with vaccination injury from MRNA under mandatory, uh, policies and coercion are now going to be lining up for the NDIS because they're going to be in the same situation that Chris is in.

Uh, they're not going to get any satisfaction with this garbage that's been put forward and they're going to look for other, other options and that's the NDIS. I think Bill Shorten had his finger in the NDIS too, hasn't he? 100%. He's in charge of it. There we go. But he can't, he can't do anything to fix it because it's the previous government's problems.

And, and on this NDIS, it's such a racket. They've got, uh, they've got buses taking people to brothels. Uh, I mean, it's just beyond belief. Uh, what this Labor government has allowed on this NDIS. Hysteria from people who say, we're not falling for that again. And what are you going to do with them? Happy birthday, Chris. Thank you. What better way to spend your birthday than having a present with Club Grubbery, mate?

I couldn't have asked for a better present. Thank you, guys. Oh, look, it's been great. Johnny, final comments from you. Would you get your health advice from Dr. Kerry Chant? Or Mark Butler? Or Anthony Fauci? Didn't Marjorie Taylor Greene give him what for in the Senate in the States in the last few days?

Thanks, guys. Man, I've never been a big fan of Marjorie Taylor Greene, but I'd buy her a meal anytime she likes if I ever saw her for her performance in the Senate in America. It's worth watching. Google it. It's fantastic. Let's bring this to a close with a prayer, shall we? Lord Father in heaven, forgive us our anger, our righteous indignation.

And Father, it's true that we, we don't know the answers, but we know that you do. And we know that a lot of other people know the answers, but they're hiding the truth. So all we ask, Lord, is the emphasis to shine the light of truth on deceit, on corruption and sin, because it has to be dealt with. It will be dealt with in your good time.

We know that. But Father, in the meantime, there are a whole lot of people who are suffering at the hands of government mismanagement and corruption. So father, we just pray that you will be with those people, people like Chris and his family, that you will uphold them with your mighty hand and that you will be with people like the Australian Vaccination Network and the Aligned Council of Australia who are doing everything they can to bring truth to a situation which is the tip of an iceberg that's going to erupt all over the world in the next couple of years.
