

2024-06-19 Graham and John speak with Nicola Charles as she talks about current affairs...

Well, hi everyone, Friday, the 14th of June. We've just pressed the record button, John, you'll be pleased to know I pressed the record button this time.

I'm always glad when you press the record button, Woody. Nicola, Nicola Charles, thank you for coming on the program. Before I introduce you formally, we did an amazing interview with a wonderful nurse in Brisbane the other night. We had to break it into two parts because of a technical issue. And when I came back after the technical issue, the best part of the interview, 45 minutes was outstanding.

And when we got to the end, I realized I hadn't recorded it. Oh gosh. So we had to do it all over again. And Johnny hasn't spoken to me since rightly so, rightly so anyway, let's get into this. Nicola Charles, you are an actress, you are a model and you are an activist. And you are really thriving in the latter role, uh, in the last few years, you've got a lot of opinions, you do a lot of research, and you are getting involved in politics because you figure you've got to go out there and put this to good practice, and you have announced your candidacy to run in the next federal election for the Great Australia Party under Rod Culleton, is that right?

Absolutely right, yeah. I feel like I have to roll up my sleeve, they spent a lot of years ripping Australia apart, and it's going to take a lot of years to put it back together, unfortunately. Yeah, good on you. And I couldn't agree with you more. And, and you're taking a rational pathway. We've got to deal with the system we have at the moment.

A lot of people are wanting to crash and burn and throw it all out and start again. But that, you know, that leaves us with a whole bunch of anarchy to kick off with. But anyhow, uh, smarter minds and ours will prevail, I'm sure. Um, you've got a raft of topics you want to talk about today, Nicola, and it's great to have you back on.

The last time we had you on, it was, it went through the roof. Uh, in particular that. There is one character, a very sinister character in the world today. And, and not too many people would disagree, although there are a few people who would disagree actually, 'cause they seem as a hero. And we're talking about Microsoft Billionaire Bill Gates.

Mm-Hmm. Now Bill Gates, who can see, who seems to be able to swan into, uh, pure Billy House and, uh, have lunch with elbow at, uh, at the drop of a bucket. Uh, Johnny and I are planning to drop in and seebo next time he's a curability. Just knock on the door and say we've comfort. Uh, T and Scons. Um, but there's so much about this man.

The, the largest agricultural landholder in the USA, as we know, Microsoft multi billionaire, a man who gloats and smiles at the profits he's making on vaccines. He's, um, getting a 20 times return on his investment and, uh, he's making, he's raking the money in on that. Why he needs more money is beyond belief.

And a man who in 1997 in a famous TED talk said that. We have to reduce the global population by up to 17%. And the best way to do that is through vaccinations is now the darling of global vaccination, because he wants to save every life on the planet. Something doesn't make sense there. Yeah, I think as an overview of all that, it's important to ask who is Bill Gates, and there is a documentary called Who is Bill Gates, if you can find it, and there's some incredible material in there, all factual.

But, you know, predominantly Bill Gates is an American, right? And this is Australia. So, for me, for the longest time, it started to feel like Australia has been named as the 51st state. And I don't want to live in the 51st state of America. I lived in America for seven years and, um, worked hard in court in a custody battle to raise my kids in Australia because I loved Australians, Australian values.

Now, Bill Gates, you know, obviously first emerged as this Microsoft, you know, computer salesman, really. Um, and he's always done this thing where he's taken someone else's idea and he's supersized it. That's actually behind all the digital ID stuff because he took a system used by the Reserve Bank of India, uh, called KYC, which is Know Your Customer, which was, um, Which was set up by the Reserve Bank of India, because in India, they had a problem with counterfeit banknotes, right?

And Bill Gates has supersized this know your customer ID, which is basically your credit score, which we've all been used to for a long time. And he's trying to supersize it or sold it to our governments as a supersized prospect, um, with digital ID, which of course is banks knowing, you know, what you buy at the supermarket, how much alcohol you buy at the bottle.

Um, And that's what he does, because he's actually not a computer guy. He's actually no longer a philanthropist. I'm not sure he ever was. I feel like Bill Gates, in my humble opinion, is in the business of acquiring political and financial power. I see the guy as power craze. Of course, it also ties in worryingly to all of this stuff with, um, Jeffrey Epstein.

Because you have to ask yourself the question, with all of these things running concurrently, particularly at the beginning of this so called pandemic, sometimes, often, the question pops up in my mind, what does Bill Gates have on these people? Following his relationship with Epstein, and we know he went to Little St.

James over 30 times, that was referred to as Pedo Island, Epstein Island. Um, Melinda Gates, his wife, for God's sake, went on, you know, international television to say that she was divorcing him because of his relationship with Epstein. And yet our government seem extremely comfortable taking advice from From this man and it worries me because we've got bureaucrats in office who have lofty titles like state premiers chief health officers health ministers But all they're doing is standing there and saying to Australians, uh, well, we're just going to go on the advice from the World Health Organization.

We're not going to worry about the Senate hearing with Fauci, where we now understand it was a man made pandemic from gain of function research. That's now a provable fact. But the Australian government came out and said, well, we're not going, we're not going to see it as that, not until the World Health Organization tell us.

Now, for 700, 000 a year, these people who were supposed to be the best and brightest in Australia seem incapable, or their hands are tied, of making a decision on their own, of thinking critically, of working in the best interest of Australians, right? So what are they doing for this 700k a year? Any of us can stand there and say, well, I'm just going to wait for advice from the World Health Organization.

Now the World Health Organization is, is Bill Gates, right? So you're essentially waiting for Bill Gates to tell you what to do, as if we're the 51st state of America and we abide by what this American tells us to do. So I'm very concerned about how much, uh, political and financial power he's acquired, but also how he's acquired it.

Right? We, we don't give Elon Musk this much power as far as we know, okay? He's busy putting up satellites and Starlink and, you know, stuff that we really don't understand fully. We seem to live in a world where we don't understand much fully because, you know, we're on a need to know basis and they don't need us to know.

But no one else who is unelected, who is this disliked, and this provably untrustworthy, even by his own wife, is given power over other countries. Now, he tried in India. He workshoped digital ID and vaccines and everything in India and Africa and was thrown out of India, the Gates Foundation was thrown out.

So my great concern is why has Australia placed a character like Bill Gates in a position of such importance that our national policies depend on what he says? I just can't understand it guys, I just, it doesn't make any sense to me. Well, you're not wrong. I mean, he has, he has overlorded so many countries around the world.

His popularity in India is not only weighing around, uh, digital ID and matters vaccine, but also he, uh, he was trying every which way to control the agricultural sector over there. He owns and controls most of the seed stock in the world. Um, I mean, he, he held Indian farmers to ransom. And, uh, and, and their elected bodies, their collectives have thrown him out in that area as well.

I mean, this, this man is. He has a psychopathical desire to control the planet and he's joined by other technocrats. I mean, to a lesser extent, you've got Zuckerberg and Soros and, and, uh, he's that other clown that runs, um, that runs Google that went into the space race with that penis shaped rocket. Oh, yes.

You know, who are these people, John, who are these people?

Johnny's having internet. Well, they're people that have got access to our priming. Yeah. Yeah. Yeah. They're people that have got access to our Prime Minister, unfortunately, and, uh, it begs belief that Albanese can have one on ones with these people, and, uh, we know nothing about what they say. Yeah. We certainly don't have that much access to our Prime Minister.

In fact, Anthony Albanese said publicly that he doesn't read any comments under his posts on social media, probably because we know his team puts the posts up in the first place. But it means that you've got the Prime Minister of Australia who's actually not remotely interested in what Australians have got to say.

So then you ask, you know, these bureaucrats who say, oh, you know, we're just going to listen to advice from the World Health Organization, Bill Gates, and no one else. These are the same people that we're now finding out were in charge of safety and effectiveness with vaccines. They told us they were safe and effective and they weren't.

These are the same bureaucrats who are in charge of the safety, safetiness and cleanliness of our water supply. And now Australians are being told that PFAS chemicals are in the water and that it's busy causing cancers. Is this an excuse for all the turbo cancers that are being caused by the mRNA?

Probably, but then they jump all over you if you try and draw that conclusion. But Australia used to be a healthy country. I came here 30 years ago and I myself had a 27 year, what I would call running career where I was running on charity running teams to raise money for leukemia research and SIDS and various other charities.

And people were always out on the streets, always at the beach, they were walking, they were running, they were swimming, they were cycling, they were outside enjoying the sunshine and keeping fit. And you know, where I am, I'm semi rural, but it just changed in 2020. People stopped running, people stopped being outside, people stopped exercising, because of course everyone turned and faced big pharma and pharmaceuticals as an option for feeling good and being healthy and it's done anything but that.

So who are these bureaucrats that are being paid these enormous amounts of money to tow the line for Bill Gates and why? That question will go unanswered, I feel. Um, you know, we're left to our own devices, which is why Uh, things like the misinformation bill are going to be rushed through, because misinformation thrives and conspiracy theories thrive when government keeps secrets.

And we have been kept in the dark for so long, and the minute the people try to ask the questions and they're not getting the answers and they come up with their own theories. Then they're censored into oblivion, like we're seeing now, uh, with, with Cafe Locked Out and Facebook. I mean, Facebook, Facebook, you know, the whole world can do without Facebook, let's be honest.

I mean, that would be a beautiful world. It would be a lovely world. And Zuckerberg would, uh, can go maybe to a deserted island and start another whatever. But, you know, at the end of the day, um, we're so controlled by this garbage and the people who own all these. Uh, these multimedia platforms or these digital platforms.

They're the ones who are controlling us, not our elected representatives. And people don't see that. Well, they've been given access, right? So, so much of what we do is based on permissions. And unfortunately, the way things are being run in Australia right now, it's sort of being run not as, um, a democracy, It's being run, um, as a, as a corporatocracy.

So everything, every interaction that you're having with government, but also every interaction civilians are having with private corporations sanctioned to operate in Australia by the government. They're actually not understanding that their silence is acquiescence under law. So if you don't speak out and say, I know I don't accept this.

And we all had for years, didn't we? Even before the pandemic, constant emails and text messages saying, Oh, our terms and conditions have changed. Do you remember that we had this phase? It was absolutely nonstop. And there'd be like 200 pages of small print. And, you know, it was absolutely designed to trip you up.

And so these terms and conditions, you know, were very wide ranging to the point where, you know, if you use your smartphone, they're allowed to take your fingerprint, the finger that's touching the smartphone, that it's allowed to remotely listen into your audio in your private moments, um, that it's allowed to report, um, your history and what websites you go to, to the government if AI Um, decides that, you know, you're a worry, you know, I was told by YouTube that I was banned for life because I was a dangerous individual because I talked about digital identity before they wanted us to talk about digital identity because I'd had a tip off from a contact in the military.

And so all these permissions are really, really important because people don't understand that you don't have to click yes to give your permission in this new corporatized world. Your silence or your ignoring of updated terms and conditions means that under law you have actually agreed. And this is something that people need to get on top of.

My, my recommendation to all Australians is to have as few apps. on your smartphone as possible. And what I do is I have what's called a dumb phone, a non smartphone. And that, that's a secondary number, you know, often people have a, you know, a personal phone and a, and a work phone. And that's the phone I take out with me because these phones have become like felony ankle bracelets for people who have committed no crime that we're paying for.

So it was quite a clever thing that they did. We're paying enormous amounts of money for these phones. They're not cheap. But they're being used to geolocate us. You know, I, I never use Google Maps and all that, and yet every quarter I get a big email from Google Maps. I don't know what's going on, I've turned off my location on the phone, um, and it says, oh, you know, you visited 34 suburbs.

And I'm like, this is an invasion of privacy and I'm actually pretty sure that there are stalking laws in Australia that would prevent a lot of what's going on, including these 5G towers and these antennas that can 3D map inside your home. In other words, sort of see who's in what room and where you are.

And so I think we've sort of been, um, tricked. We've been hoodwinked into a lot of things technically here, including with vaccines, in my humble opinion, that there's technology as well as biology inside, uh, some of these injections. And, um, it, it just boggles the mind that any government, uh, who is fit for purpose would allow their own civilians to be tricked like this.

Now, the only conclusion that I can come to, you know, in this, what they're now calling the great awakening of the normies is, is that Everything they've ever told us has been an untruth. Everything they've ever told us has been sort of a sleight of hand, a trick. But only because of this time in history we're starting to realize how bad those tricks have been.

So, I don't know if there's any way back for these people. I mean, it is laughable that they want to give civilians I mean, I lead a very small life, a very humble life. They want to give us digital IDs. Politicians are the ones who

should have digital IDs. And if I made it to the Senate, I would absolutely agree to have a financial digital ID, you know, for work in the sense that, you know, I don't think they need to know, you know, how many bottles of wine I buy a month.

I don't think they need to know my blood type or if I'm vaccinated or not. I don't think they need to know how many children I've got and where I go to school. And I don't think they need to know what websites I look at if I'm not breaking the law. Not that kind of digital ID. But a digital transparency for bureaucrats so that if they are going to be corrupt and if something is going to go on, then they're going to have to do it like a drug dealer and take the money in a brown paper bag.

Because they need to be legitimate on paper and so many of them are not. For instance, I've had a whistleblower come to me who's a real estate agent, a major real estate agent in Melbourne, with information that, you know, as per the disclosures of Dan Andrews, he couldn't possibly have afforded. To buy as many homes as, as this man has sold him for cash, many, many millions of dollars.

Now, where did that money come from for Dan Andrews to become this great big property owner? These are questions that we deserve to be answered, right? Where's the money going? Where's the receipts? It's bad enough that a 700k a year salary is going to individuals who say, Well, I'm just going to do what the World Health Organization tells me.

Someone with an IQ of 85 could do that job. We don't need the best and the brightest, right? We don't need all the rich guys in those positions with influence. But it's really feeling like an old boys club, and just the general population in Australia don't have a say. Their democracy's been subverted. It feels like the 51st state of America in Australia right now.

And I think we could drag Australia back to where she was, but it's gonna take a long time. There are big things coming within the Great Australian Party, um, so that we can try and assist that in happening. For instance, uh, we've got a freedom of information request in at the moment, um, to ask Australia To name the Queen of Australia because often on legal documents and in law they refer to the Queen of Australia, right?

They don't refer to the Commonwealth Constitution of Australia 1900 UK anymore, even though it's still valid. They don't want you to know about that one. Anything that came after it that contradicts that constitution is not valid. They don't have jurisdiction, I believe, including the Digital Identity Bill.

But we've put this Freedom of Information request in to ask, please name the Queen of Australia that is discussed on these legal documents, and also the time, date and place of her coronation. Who are you referring to? Because there has never been a Queen of Australia. Never. Not even Queen Elizabeth the second.

So it's interesting, uh, what's going to come back. Um, there are also court cases going on with Rod Culleton. I can't say anything about them because obviously they're in court, but there's going to be some huge breaking news about just how this country has been operating. Since the 1970s, thanks to corrupt bureaucrats, and I know that you know all about who they are, um, and it's been sort of a, it's been sort of a, a layer of a fake government and, and parliaments over the real ones, you know, they even moved.

They moved Parliament House in Canberra, right? They moved out and now they hire it out. My husband's been there. They hire it out for conferences and silly parties and stuff. They couldn't disrespect it anymore if they tried. Yeah. And these people are like crazed lottery winners at the moment. They're raping the treasury.

This is what happens when these sort of despots get into power, is they rape the treasury, they demolish a country, and then unless people stand up and fight back, it gets worse. I think Australia is standing up and fighting back. I mean, what else can you do? I reached a point where podcasting about it, screaming and moaning, bitching and moaning about it wasn't enough.

People were asking me, what can we do? I was recommending that Australians go into politics. I know it's not for everyone, but I just made the decision. My husband ran for the federal senate last time for the informed medical options party. He didn't get in, but he tried because he didn't want to sit on the couch and do nothing.

And so I thought it's time to put my money where my mouth is. And, um, I think it would be, I think it would be harder for them to shut me up if I was a senator. They've enjoyed for a long time shutting me up, um, on social media and publicly. But I had an interesting phone call of support from, um, a major Melbourne newspaper.

There was a story that appeared in that newspaper, and they said you've got our full support and welcome back, girl. So I think there is discontent and feelings of ill will towards this government across a lot of industries, and including in the media that seems totally corrupt. It's just that we don't know about it.

So what it feels like is that the media can't print what the actual journalists think about what's going on, because they receive all of their news now and they just put their name to it. They receive all of their news from a centralized point in the EU. Foreign interference, right? However, if someone like myself or yourself, guys, if you step forward and say something publicly about policy, about behavior, about corruption, they can publish your comment.

And they probably will because they'll agree with you. They just can't publish it as their comment. So in fighting for my own freedom of speech, I'm sort of fighting for the freedom of speech of the media as well. Johnny. Yeah, Nicola, um, those, those causes are, uh, are dear to everyone's heart, watching Club Grubbery, but what, what are some of the other platform items that you, you're going to be running on, uh, with GAP, um, where do you stand on nuclear, uh, energy and climate change and all those sorts of things?

Yeah, gosh, you know, I'm, I'm not against nuclear at all. Um, but also I'm very pro coal. And the thing is, Australia is also very pro coal, despite telling everyone globally, Australia's going to get to net zero. So, let me just tell you, the evidence is there, Australia can never get to net zero. Australia effectively can never be green.

And I'll be honest with you, Australia doesn't really need to go green because she doesn't contribute as much as other countries. Also, I don't believe that carbon is a problem. Bill Gates now trying to eradicate methane, methane, natural gas from the world, whether it's coming out from under a rock when you undertake fracking, or coming out of a cow's back end.

He seems to be anti methane as well. He doesn't like anything natural, this guy. He wants everything genetically modified. But people don't seem to realize that, um, and I'm, I'm screaming it from the rooftops and I'm pro this, right? This is business. This is industry. I've always been a conservative. Um, Australia is the second largest exporter of coal in the world.

on the globe. Australia exports more coal than America and Russia. I mean, that's extraordinary to me, right? Now, uh, Australia rakes in as a nation, but of course not as a nation, as a new corporation that is raping the nation financially. Australia is raking in 83 plus billion dollars from that coal annually.

That's why we all know these guys, right? If they're young enough and fit enough. And they want to buy a house or start a life. They leave their wives for six months and they go off and be a coal miner because you can earn enormous amounts of money doing it because there's just so much coal to be mined.

So Australia is selling all this coal and they're selling the coal to China and India primarily. Right now, I know that Anthony Albanese stated that he doesn't read social media comments. That doesn't mean I'm not going to have a crack at him on X every opportunity I get. And I asked him on X the other day, um, what do you think China and India are doing with that coal exactly?

Do you think they're sitting in the corner fashioning it into small ornaments? No, they're burning it. And Australia knows that China and India are burning this coal when they sell it to them, right? To make steel and warships and all the things we dread from China, right? But that's okay. They buy the coal legitimately.

They can do what they want with it. However, Australia doesn't consider then the carbon emissions from the coal it sold to China and India, because as long as it's not burnt on Australian soil, that's fine. We're green. No, you're not. So Bill Gates and Anthony Albanese and Peter Dutton, who it seems to be the presumptive new Prime Minister of Australia, very suspect as nobody's voted yet, um, they all seem to think that, you know, getting Australia to net zero is what we need to do.

So let's play devil's advocate, right? Let's say that Australia gets to net zero and is completely green, right? That would mean that there are no people, there are no animals, there are no cows farting, there's no fracking going on, no plants are growing, there's no farming, and Australia is, as many people see it from other countries, just a vast, hot rock.

Imagine the whole country is like Uluru, and it's just being mined to death by international mining companies, right? You could say at that point, Australia's at net zero. Net zero people, net zero animals, net zero crops, right? Yay! We've gone green, but there's nothing left. Does that mean that Australia's green?

Not in the slightest. Not in the slightest? Well, you've sent the second largest amount of coal anywhere on the planet To China and India who are burning it now. I'm sure Snopes would fact check me and tell me that I'm wrong and a conspiracy theorist. And we don't in fact share the same air and atmosphere as China and India, but I'm pretty sure we do.

So there's no way for Australia to get to net zero unless somebody starts saying we're not going to export any more coal. We're not going to export anything for energy again. And it's weird. It's like, Net zero only applies to Australians, right? Everyone has to get these solar panels. Everyone had to get a remortgage, 10, 000 a solar panel.

Then they get penalized for having the luxury and the privilege of a solar panel. And then Bill Gates blocks out the sun. Good luck charging your solar panels, right? And now they want to put all these wind farms out in the ocean and destroy the views, destroy the sunsets in Australia, destroy the ocean life with the grease and the oil and everything else that.

You know, is needed to help them move. We have to destroy everything so that what, so that we're not using our own coal because it's so valuable. They want none of that coal to go to Australians. I mean, the metered pricing for electricity in Australia is through the roof. It's disgusting. I know people in average family homes, their bills are coming in at 1, 200, right?

This is unsustainable. So why isn't, why isn't Australia, and I think it's probably because it's not, Behaving as a Commonwealth nation, it's behaving as a greedy corporation. Why isn't Australia, um, Australians, why aren't they benefiting from the fact that they have all that coal? Because in certain UAE countries, which is oil rich, right?

Residents who, and it's most of the residents, residents who have a clean driver's license, I have a clean driver's license, right? They get free fuel, free diesel, free petrol all over the UAE. Why? Because this is yours, right? This is a shared resource. This belongs to the people, the populations of the UAE.

Yes, we sell it overseas for enormous amounts of money. You know, look at Dubai. They're winning. You win. You've got the best fuel. You win with oil, right? We love it. I drive a big 4x4 and I'm not giving her up. So, but their people benefit from all that oil. That's a natural resource. All natural resources in a nation are supposed to benefit populations.

But instead, Australian energy prices and electricity prices are through the roof. So again, we're being ripped off, but we're being lied to, because we can never get to net zero, because the corporate side of Australia will never let it happen. What do you think about the agricultural sector in Australia now?

We were, uh, we got messages Hoodies Heroes members down in Tasmania. Uh, saying that, uh, coals and woollies have pulled all the eggs off their shelves. You can't buy eggs in the major supermarkets down there. Uh, it seems like the agricultural bureaucracy is going nuts, linked in with the World Health Organization with the bird flu.

Uh, it's going to affect every part of agriculture as we know it, and therefore food supplies. I mean, the whole thing is just going to go completely pear shaped again unless people speak up. I don't think they're going to get away with it again. I think they know they're not going to get away with it again.

It's the emperor has no clothes on. They're running down the street naked. Everything's flopping around and everyone is laughing at them. And on occasion, when they come out and talk about this stuff, I do feel sorry for them because, you know, I was an actor for 30 years and I can see in a person's eyeballs.

When they're lying. I, it's also like sort of a, an innate human sort of trick that I've had that I always know when someone's lying to me, even if they've got a massive smile on their face and it's, it's kept me safe throughout my life. And so I almost feel sorry for these people. Um, look, I shared on my ex account yesterday, cause this is, It's so far reaching and so much more than people think it is.

Um, there was an NIH study in America, you know, we seem to be doing everything that the NIH and the World Health Organization tell us to do. that showed that egg yolks, egg yolks, um, halt the progression of the SARS CoV 2 spike protein in the human body. Yep. So I, I don't think it's for nothing that after COVID, Um, we have avian flu and yesterday it was in the press in Victoria that it's COVID with wings.

And I thought, I thought COVID already had wings. It was airborne. That's what we were told that that's as many wings as you need. You don't need a bird. You just sneeze on someone. But there was the headline. It's COVID with wings, right? They've killed all these chickens on these farms, whether the chickens were for eating or for egg laying.

And a lot of these farmers in Victoria have stepped forward with an official letter that they've publicized and they've sent to me and I've shared, where they're saying, look, they've destroyed half a million birds today, the government, the state government, and for avian flu. But just to let you know, we didn't have any avian flu on our farms.

We tested negative for avian flu, but they slaughtered all the birds. Anyway, so that can't in any way, shape or form show that this isn't like mad cow disease in the UK. They only killed the cows in the UK if they tested positive for BSE, right? So why are we killing healthy chickens? Where are the chickens that have avian flu?

And is it like COVID where we're never actually going to see an isolate of this avian flu? Because if we did, if a real scientist got hold of it, You would actually say that it was something that was as a result of gain of function, which has just been proven about COVID by Anthony Fauci at a Senate hearing in America.

It is proven fact now and people don't realize like everything to do with this World Health Organization treaty and the amendment to treaty, right? Whether they amend the treaty or they don't amend the treaty. The global pandemic treaty that they all seem so keen for us to adhere to, despite the fact that all of our governments and we know for a fact the U.

S. government has broken all chemical and biological weapons treaties that have ever been signed, that's what you did when you, when you use gain of function in the Wuhan lab and in America at University Chapel Hill, when you allowed gain of function research to occur, you were breaking all known global chemical and biological weapons treaties.

Yeah. Put that aside. They want us to adhere to this World Health Organization treaty. So I, I break things down and I take them a piece at a time. So I had a look at this World Health Organization pandemic treaty before the

amendment as it stands now. Now this treaty. States clearly naturally occurring pandemics, but we've provably not just lived through a naturally occurring pandemic.

We've just lived through a man made pandemic. So never mind amending that treaty, that entire treaty is not valid to what we've just been through anyway. So let's say that you believe, um, and I'm going to talk about this at a speech I'm doing next week in Gippsland. I'm going to get a show of hands from the room.

Even if you assume that the 1918 Spanish flu outbreak was naturally occurring. I don't from the evidence I've seen. However, to play devil's advocate, I'm going to assume that the 1918 Spanish flu pandemic epidemic was naturally occurring. Even if you assume that was naturally occurring, that's over a hundred years, a hundred years since the last pandemic, because this one doesn't count because this was manmade.

So when, um, Tedros, the terrorist. And Bill Gates tell you that this is an emergency, a health emergency, a bio threat emergency. And even though this round of talks failed, we need to achieve this amendment by the end of the year. It's still not valid. There's no emergency. Where's the fire if we haven't had a naturally occurring pandemic for over a hundred years?

There is no fire. I believe what has happened here is that they have levered and crowbarred biological terrorism, whether it was an intentional release or accidental, they have levered biological terrorism into a pandemic, right? Because then it's an excuse for why everyone's sick. Then it's an excuse to put things in people's bodies, MRNA, that is essentially a human software update, right?

It's a, it's a rewriting. It's like a rewritable disc. It's a software update on your phone, on your laptop. The human body doesn't behave the same way afterwards. It does things slightly differently, not always good for many people. And, um, I feel that those injections were administered to cover something up.

This is just my own personal hypothesis, but I am suspicious that whatever happened, With that bioterrorism, and they probably had these biological weapons in development because you never know, you never know if you can trust your adversaries in China and Russia and Iran, and I'm sure for years and years our governments have had billions of vials and a lot of biological weapons on standby, but for whatever reason, whether it was, um, you know, malfeasance in office, Anthony Fauci and all those guys, For whatever reason, it escaped.

Who knows? Bill Gates is involved. It may have been deliberate. We're never gonna find out. If we do, it'll be in a hundred years, uh, when these people are dead and gone. But I feel the injections were to cover something up. Cause if you can put something as, um, dramatic, And like a software update in a human body in the blood like mRNA, then the blood is not going to tell the story about the bioterrorism and the gain of function.

And it makes me think about when Bill Gates said, you know, we're not going to go back to normal until we largely vaccinate the entire planet. Now that was really suspicious. Right. And the reason I never took this stuff is because never got vaccinated, the official term, is the, um, the forcefulness with which it was offered.

It made me suspicious and I still believe it was offered to cover up a crime. When you're bullied, coerced and, uh, and cajoled into putting something into your body, you can automatically assume it's not in your best interest to do so. Yeah. Nicola, did, did, did you think, uh, back, back in your acting days on Neighbours that yourself and Holly Valance would be, uh, you know, such strong female, uh, voices, campaigners, uh, in a conservative, uh, way in 2024 fighting all this?

No, look, I was always on the outs in the acting industry anyway, because I came in it, uh, from the modeling industry. So at the time in the nineties, early and mid nineties, there was a, a reasonably detrimental, um, an acronym, I think it's called, uh, to describe people like me, which was MTA model turned actress.

And so you didn't get as much respect as someone who'd been an actress since they were a child and, you know, gone to drama school and done all that stuff. So I was already on the outs and then, you know, I didn't sort of walk into studios and announce that I was a conservative, but it was pretty obvious.

Um, I certainly wasn't into a lot of the, the, the left wing rhetoric. And just to make it clear, I actually grew up with two incredibly left wing hippie parents. Uh, my mom used to wear, you know, CND, Ban the Bomb t shirts. My dad used to take us to nudist beaches. It was all free love and craziness. And I think because I grew up in that kind of environment, it made me a really staunch conservative.

So I, I already felt really, really different because I could see from a very early stage, um, that a lot of people were being, um, sort of programmed and hoodwinked with propaganda and they were believing a lot of the lies that come from bureaucrats. I find it amazing. That anyone that's in the theatrical industry, um, when acting is essentially lying for a living, right?

The better actor you are, the better liar you are. That they would believe these bureaucrats, I mean, some of these bureaucrats, particularly in Australia. They really do deserve an Oscar. And in fact, um, Andrew Cuomo, the mayor of New York got an Emmy award for his performance during the COVID 19 pandemic.

And I thought, well, that's just choice, right? That just tells you everything you need to know. And they were so proud to give it to this guy. You know, and as I said, I could see when Dan Andrews was lying. I could see when Gladys Berejiklian was lying. I could see when Brad Hazard was lying, health hazard.

Um, And so, I, no, I, we've got Emmys here, they're called Orders of Australia. Ah, there you go. Yes. Very good. And all you've got to do is become a despot to get one. Didn't he get the AC, which I thought was quite funny, but actually corrupt.

Michael Gunner's not happy because he didn't get one. Oh, Michael Gunner. They still talk about him in America. They, they talk about him with respect to the, like, he was so stunned with the lies he had to tell that his eyes often went off in different directions. You know, he was literally the deer in the headlights.

And I think this is part of why I've wanted to get into Australian politics is that, um, quite often, you know, this is how they, I'm not making a comparison, but this is how they brought the Nazis down right. It was with satire and with shame. So I think if I can get into politics and hold up a mirror to these people, now I try and do it on my limited social media platforms.

I think I'm up to about a quarter of a million followers. But it's really still not enough. And it's harder to shut someone up, holding up a mirror to their lies, like the lie about net zero and that Australia can ever be green. Of course it can't. No country can. It's too late. The horse has bolted on climate change a long time ago because countries like to make money selling energy.

And so I think, um, you know, at least when you're in the Senate, I mean, you only have to look at somebody like Jackie Lambie, right? They can't shut you up. It doesn't matter how you say things, um, or what you're saying, you at least get your say. And I feel like there aren't enough people in there giving Australians their say.

And I worry about it deeply because, um, When I look at these people like Katie Gallaher and they stand there and they say, you know, we're pushing through this digital identity bill and there's going to be no debate, no discussion on it. So they are refusing debate, um, uh, democratic debate by elected officials whose job it is, by the way, to debate that bill.

And I think it's because these people again are given scripts and they're acting and they stand there and they don't talk to you as I'm talking to you now. They're reading from a script. They've become very good writers. You know, a clue is they always have to put their glasses on, right? I'm blind as a bat as well, but I don't need to put my glasses on to talk to you because I'm not reading from a script.

And, um, that's the reason they can't have any debate because they probably don't know or understand why certain things are happening either. They've been weaponized as puppets to simply read out orders from a

nameless, faceless individual who is probably not Australian. So this is foreign interference in our democracy, foreign interference in elections.

We can see that going on in the US right now with Trump. All the foreign interference you can muster. And so this is why they can't have debate. Because if someone were to ask them a question about a subject that they fully don't understand, then their whole narrative would fall on its face. And it's interesting that they call it a narrative.

Klaus Schwab always talks about narrative, right, and narrative is a story. I'm also a writer, and he talks about weaving a narrative for the new world and climate change. Weaving a narrative means making up a story. And often when these people speak, it looks like story time for five year olds, because they're just telling you how it's going to be, as if you're very stupid.

I often think, gosh, how IQ of Australians is? That they think that's real, that they think that's possible, that they think that's fair or that they think that's democratic. These people are getting enormous pay packets and they're not working for Australians. So the question begs, who are they working for?

When, when and if you get into the Senate, who are you looking forward to working with?

I'm not a fan of most of them. I won't name names. But even some of the guys who are, I mean, you know, there are great guys in the Senate. You know, there's, there's a couple of great guys there, you know, I love Malcolm Roberts, like everyone else. I love Gerard Rennick, but there's a couple of people around who should be, who, who claim to be on our side, on the side of Australians and, um, you know, They are like these very fast speedboats.

This is how it was described to me. I'm paraphrasing. I won't say from who, but they're like very fast, flashy speedboats with an enormous engine. You start them up and they make an awful lot of noise and they look very flashy and impressive, but someone forgot to put the rudder on, so they're not going anywhere.

So a lot of these people, including these political parties, We all know the ones, right? They're on the right side. They position themselves publicly on the right side. They do all the right things. They put great promos together. But they never affect any change. Not in the direction that Australians want it.

So we're left with very few politicians Making anything better. And I would like to see some senators and some MPs trying to make life better for Australians. Because life just keeps getting worse, right? And that's why we have this feeling that, you know, and it was the same for every generation, but we have this feeling, don't we, that things were better in the good old days.

You know, the 1990s in Australia feels like five minutes ago to me. I've got grown up teenage daughters now. And they talk about the 90s, the way we would think about the 60s, they say to me like, you know, I really wish I was alive in the 90s. It sounded like so much fun. The pictures are amazing. You know, every time they talk about me going into politics in the press, they always drag a picture from like 1994 where I'm like had three glasses of champagne and I'm at the Logie Awards and I look like, you know, a party animal and that will continue.

So anyone thinking of voting for me will need to know those pictures will be coming thick and fast. But it does feel like five minutes ago, but because through that time, the truth about what was happening in Australia was hidden, things have slowly got progressively worse. But it was very like the frog in boiling water scenario, right?

If you put a frog into boiling water, the frog jumps out. But if you put a frog into cold water, And slowly turn up the heat, it stays there till it dies. That's what's been happening in Australia. That's actually an analogy that's used for abuse. That's abuse 101. That's why people stay in abusive relationships.

Because it happens slowly and the person is slowly turning up the heat. And Australians, I believe, have been abused by their government and their bureaucrats for a long time. Now, Unbeknownst to us, not knowing why

we had this feeling of things used to be better in the good old days, things changed dramatically, obviously, in 2020, when this great awakening occurred, because the lies they were telling and the corruption that was clearly going on became so great that people started reanalyzing what's happened, for instance, since the 1970s, like, um, The deliberate ending of manufacturing in Australia, Australia, it seems can't manufacture its own chocolate, for instance, that there's one thing I know we've got all the big things, cars and everything else, everything's from China now or overseas, but Australia can't isn't allowed won't be given licenses.

Companies have tried. They've told me they've whistleblown to get licenses to mass produce chocolate in Australia for Australians, but they can't get the licenses no matter how good it is, because governments that are already in business With the big chocolate makers, Hershey's Cadbury. So that's all you'll see on the shelves here.

And of course then, worryingly, it's very easy for someone like Bill Gates to buy up those companies, and I do believe that he did buy Nestle, to buy up those companies and control the food supply. So everything's been whittled down, right? We've got less choice, we've got less Um, quality, the quality has gone down, particularly if it's made in China.

I've got, I've got no beef with made in China unless it's made by slaves, which is Nike and iPhone. I absolutely don't own any of those products because I refuse to support slavery, unlike our countries and governments, including America. You know, you can see the hypocrisy anywhere, everywhere. It's, it's like the, the encouraging solar panels and then telling us they're going to block out the sun, right?

It's like, um, Joe Biden calling for reparations for slavery, that people who've never owned slaves, Americans, must pay reparations, millions, to people who've never been slaves, because slavery is bad, and then Joe Biden does a state visit to America. of a dictator, Xi Jinping, lines the streets of San Francisco with communist flags, supporting a man who's absolutely fine with slavery, while calling for reparations for slavery.

These people are complete hypocrites. The mirror needs to be held up. Yeah, it needs to stop. These double standards need to stop. They're starting to feel like an abusive parent. It's do as I say, not as I do. You know, you will get poorer. We will get richer. No, you're not allowed to ask questions. No, you're not allowed to vote for the other guy.

If you try, we're gonna take him to court and say, you know, he's got all business irregularities like Trump. And look, I'm not a massive Trump person. I'm just using it as an example. You know, you can imagine here if Anthony Albanese was doing this to Dutton, of course he won't, because we've got the uni party and they're funded by the same corporation in America, listed in America.

Um, so, so they can't be trusted. And the sad fact is, I guess when they're sat down and they're told that this new world is coming, right? That we're all going to have digital IDs. No, we're not. No one's even getting a digital VicRoads license. We're all refusing. You either do well now, you're either one of us, or you're one of them.

And the sad fact is that human beings, whether they're in public office or not, are easily corruptible. So we need a bunch of people who are happy to live simply, who are everyday people, Who are not looking to get rich, who actually want life to get better. Now, those people are parents. They are grandparents.

They are people like yourselves who've spoken out and risked everything and lost everything. You know, I'm in the same boat as you guys, right? I've lost, you know, 600k a year up for four years. It demolished me financially. Now, I'm not looking to make anything back. I'm just looking to get the train of Australia back on the track so that it can be fair for everyone.

It used to be that if you worked hard you could achieve anything. Now they've made it that you will work hard and you'll only just be able to pay your power bills. You won't be able to go on holiday. You won't be able to get a second car or a caravan. Right, you won't be able to probably even buy a home.

And my husband works in the construction industry. And I see the photographs and the plans of what is constituting a half a million dollar or 600, 000 home in this state in Victoria, Rome. These tiny rabbit warren homes where there is no living room because the living room is a tiny single car garage that's now been put inside the house.

We used to put garages outside the house, it's now inside the house. It's got um, an electric vehicle charging station in there, which by the way emits an awful lot of radiation, so that's something you might want to consider. They are not allowed a gas feed, so in the many power cuts we have in Victoria, and we do, that go on for days and days, usually if you've got gas you can light a match and you can boil the kettle and you can make hot food.

The lights might not be on, you might have candles going, but you can still eat. They're taking all that away from people. And these tiny homes are starting to look like this dystopian 15 minute city plan. And in fact, I was approached by one of the parties from the uni party. I won't say which one, they know exactly who they are.

I was taken out for coffee and, and I guess it was sort of a bribe, right? It was an attempt to see how I'd react. I didn't speak much throughout the meeting. They offered me a position in a suburb of Melbourne. in local government to oversee the implementation of a 15 minute city. Now, my husband actually has relatives, like really close relatives in that particular suburb.

And I'd already, you know, heard about this horrific 15 minute city plan. And I thought to myself, wow, you know, you really do think anyone is purchasable. You know, it was a big salary, lots of money. I thought you really don't know me at all. I'm never going to do that to Australians. I'm never going to do that to Australia.

I think I will be someone that they try and discredit because I'm not like them because I'm not in the club. You know, I've, I've had a great life. I will say that I have had a great life. I'm not suicidal. I've got a great life. I'm getting married in a few weeks. Um, and I've got three beautiful children.

And yes, they did demolish my career that went prior, my media career. But I feel genuinely like I owe Australia a debt of gratitude because I always say I wasn't born in Australia. That is true. Um, but I am 100 percent made in Australia. Unlike Bill Gates. Right. So the interesting thing is, is if I did get to the Senate, if I receive enough votes and I get to represent the people, which would probably make me the happiest I've ever been, I think there'd be lots of tears.

I'd have to hold it together. Um, I would be asked to renounce my British citizenship, which if that's something I have to do to represent Australians, I'm happy to do. I get asked that all the time. However, why would I be asked to renounce British citizenship if we're running as the Commonwealth? If we're the Commonwealth, then the UK cannot be considered a foreign power.

It's the same as Australia. So there's another issue that we're looking at at GATT. And yet people like Bill Gates, what that's not foreign interference. Australia behaving like the 51st state of America. That's not foreign interference. Following the dictates of the EU parliament with regard to digital ID.

That's not, um, interference by a foreign power, but someone who's been here for over 30 years, like myself. Bill Gates doesn't have to renounce his American citizenship. So it's interesting. There's a lot of stages we're going to go through with myself and GAP. There's a lot of freedom of information requests.

There's one in particular that could turn out to be horribly embarrassing for them and something that they would not want the majority of Australians to know about what's going on here legally, about how this place is being run. So, so, we shall see. It is my job to, um, inform and try and get things back on track.

So, I hope I get to do that. And you know what? If I don't get to do that, if you guys don't have faith in me to go into the Senate and speak and fight on your behalf, then I'll just keep doing podcasts. I'll get on some kind of

radio show and I'll just keep sounding off because I'm not going to shut up about what these people have been doing.

Well, we're, uh, we're planning to interview Rod Culleton and one of his barristers, uh, been talking to Rod over the weekend, trying to line all that up, uh, to bring some breaking news to our audience. And I'm looking forward to that. We've got to wrap this up, Nicola. I was, I was actually going to ask one more question and I don't have to ask it.

Uh, why should the people of Victoria vote for you to be in the Australian Federal Senate? Uh, I think you've answered that beautifully in the last hour. Johnny, any final comments? Uh, well, maybe Nicola, you could just give a 30 second pitch to mums and dads as to why you should, uh, uh, be elected. Uh, what's going to be your 30 second grab?

So, um, early on in the pandemic, I was watching, um, a live feed from Rookshan and, uh, I saw a teenage girl the same age as my daughters. being strangled by a Victorian police officer for wearing her mask under her nose. She was pushed up against a wall, kicked and punched. She was screaming that she couldn't breathe.

And I burst into tears that this could happen to a young girl in my state, Victoria, the same age as my daughters. I then saw my teenage daughters come home and tell me that a pizza truck An American sliced peach pizza truck has showed up at the gates of school at the end of the day and was offering teenagers giant American pizza slices if they would just inject a COVID 19 vaccine and become a medical experiment.

I pulled my girls out of school at that point and started homeschooling them. If you don't know that something is afoot at this time in history, and that you need to vote for people and support people who are going to try and protect these children, we've had our lives, their lives are just starting.

They are fodder for these people. They intend to funnel them into 15 minute cities. Where you will hear your neighbor snoring, you will smell your neighbor's cooking, you will hear their screaming arguments, and there will be no escape from the government control and surveillance. So I would ask that you help me to at least put the brakes on, um, you know, the destination that we're at now, which is already a critical one. Beautifully pitched, my dear. Wonderful. And I think we need all the support we can get into that and I want to bring it to a close with a prayer. Dear Lord, Father in heaven, we say it every night.

We just seek truth. We seek integrity and truth. And Father, we know that the only way to do that is to turn to the author of our, of our faith. And even those who don't believe is starting to ask those big questions now, because as we've heard in the last hour and a bit, um, there are very few, in fact, no institutions on the planet that we can trust.

So Lord God and lead our steps as we try and bring the spirit back to our nation is our prayer in your precious name. Amen. Amen. Thanks guys. Thanks for being on Nicola. Uh, please keep us in the loop. I'd love to get you on with Rod Cullet and that would be an interesting show. John, we wouldn't have to say anything.

We just sit there and those two go for it. Johnny, you've often been heard to say. You just couldn't make this stuff up. You couldn't make this stuff. It'd be like herding cats having these two on together. Um, and stay out of the trees, everybody. We love you because you're Australian and you love your country.

And that's why this country is so great. You're fantastic. If you love somebody and you haven't told them, please give them a call and tell them you may just save their life. What you did yesterday got you to today and all that other fluffy stuff. I like to say to you, because we care. Keep us, keep us, keep us going.
