2024-08-16 Graham and John talk about current events for this Friday...

Johnny Lada, look at you, you even got a handkerchief in your pocket, mate. You like that? Yeah. Far out. Have you had dinner with, uh, with, um, Hazard? No, there's no blood on your coat, so. No. I wouldn't dress up for hazard. No, you wouldn't, you wouldn't mate. But it's, um, anyhow, it's good to see you. Everyone's saying, where are you guys?

Well, uh, Thursday, the 15th of August, they love Mel McCann on Monday night. And, uh, and, and, uh, yeah, we've had a lot of stuff happening at the moment at our place. You've had a lot at your place. Now you've been, uh, wandering all over the nation's capital again for the last two days. Tell us what's been happening.

Yeah, I had an opportunity to go down to Canberra. I'm sorry. That was a. A bit of a stop by to catch up with a few people as well. anything for you. And, you know, wonderful, wonderful Australians representing us, uh, with, with a great passion.

Well,

they are, you know, and, and they're there because they've been drawn by the magnet of people with integrity in the name of Russell Broadbent, which he really is. He's, um, he's a man much respected. I truly respect the guy and, uh, you know, we have a good relationship with him. We have, uh, we have good relationships with quite a few of them, Jared Renick and Malcolm Roberts.

Um, so I mean, uh, yeah. So what's transpired? I believe we've got Bob Katter

coming on. Yeah, well, I was lucky enough to speak with Bob Katter last night for about 20 minutes and, and one on one tell him what was going on behind the scenes. And, you know, I think he was, he was a bit shocked. Um, I, you know, I, I think too, a lot of the times, Canberra bubble.

And, um, a finer gentleman you'd never wish to meet, you know, just such a decent bloke. And, uh, look, my, my favourite run in Qantas was running from. Doing the afternoon run from Brisbane to Mount Isa in the Boeing 737 and, um, I do that four or five days a week.

I used to love it. I'd sort of leave home at lunchtime. I'd be home by 1030 at night. And I just love flying in the outback. And going into Mount Isa is just great. You know, it's just beautiful. It's one of my favourite. It was my favourite destination. I did that every week for ages. Anyhow, um, Bob Catter was always going out there, um, and always a lovely guy to talk to and he and I have had lots of chats on the aeroplane and, uh, and then when

Michelle and I were touring Mount Isa on our Queensland tour, uh, we got to know Robbie Catter Jr.

very well, Bob's son. So, it's, it's a family that's, um, That's put out a lot in, in the service of the state and in the country. And, you know, Bob's seen as a bit of a, a bit of a quirky kind of character, but boy, oh boy, the Catta family, uh, when they set their teeth on something, mate, they don't let go of you like a dog with a bone.

So I think it'd be really great for us to take that opportunity to, um, not to educate him, but to maybe shine a spotlight. And the reason these guys are unaware, John, as you and I know, is the mainstream don't talk about it. Yeah.

It's, it's hard. It's hard to keep abreast of all this stuff. It's changing every day.

Um, there's stuff happening, uh, you know, around, around the clock, isn't it? Um, but yeah, so I'm looking forward to that and I managed to catch up with Malcolm, uh, today as well. I, I sat in Russell's office and I rang Senator David, uh, van I rang, uh, Senator, uh, uh, Pocock, Senator, uh, Thorpe, Senator Lamby, and. Uh, one other, I think Senator someone or other, um, now they failed to vote on Pauline Hanson's, uh, discrimination bill on, on COVID 19 vaccines yesterday, they didn't turn up.

The coalition voted, uh, and supported it, which was great. And all it needed was a bit of cross bench support and it would have been up.

again? I'm not sure. We'll have to find out. But I mean, it's absolutely ridiculous. So, so, you know, I rang, personally rang each one of the Senators today and, and I gave them a bit of a dressing down. Uh, well their staff, not in a nice way, I told them that essentially they're paid to represent us.

And. Uh, you know, they should be voting, uh, abstaining from voting is, is a weak

act, weak act. It's a weak act. Uh, you know, and I've come to expect nothing less from Jackie Lambie, I've got to be honest with you. Now, now Lydia thought, you know, all

fist pumping the air when she walked into the Senate, you know, going in there to kick butt.

What have you done, Lydia? What have you done, girl? You know, I mean, more power to you. Good on you. You got in there, but what have you done with it? You've done nothing. You know, you've done absolutely nothing. Did you get to speak to any of these people?

Not, not the senators. No, but, uh, look, I, I, I asked them, um, and look, I've got to, got to say they were respectful.

The staff are respectful and I've told them that they need to organize meetings with, with people like Russell to make themselves aware of what's happening. You know, they've got a perfect opportunity to be briefed by, you know, we could, we could put together a little team of, of politicians. We could get, uh, Gerard and, uh, Alex and Malcolm and Pauline.

Uh, and, uh, Russell Broadbent, uh, in an office with anyone that wants to listen. And, you know, I, I challenge them to do it. I mean, why not educate yourself on what's going on? mean, uh, but John, look, you know, on other issues, this country is becoming more and more and more, um, a mess.

It really is a mess. Yeah. We have lost virtually every industry. I mean, there's We don't have industry in Australia or anything. I have it on very reliable sources, not rabbit hole sources, these are sources within Canberra, that Albanese may have been ready to call an election by the end of August. And he's not going to.

And do you want to know the reason he's not going to, John? The reason they're not going to hold an election until probably later in the year, is because we don't have a paper manufacturer in Australia and the electoral commission do not have enough paper to print the ballots. I kid you not. Now that, that's from, that's from a reputable source inside government.

We don't have a, we don't have a paper manufacturing industry anymore. We make wood chip and pulp and we send it over to all these other countries around the world. Now that's just one thing. Wow. So our election is being delayed because we don't have any paper. All right. The next thing, uh, a great many surgeries around Australia at the moment, uh, medical procedures.

have been postponed because we have run out of saline and Hartman's fluid. Now Michelle and a lot of other nurses are doing a course on, uh, with Ian Brighthope, uh, to administer vitamin C infusion. I've been listening in on those, uh, that the training sessions online and they're, I'll

tell you what, Ian Brighthope is just That man should be the Minister for Health.

No, he should be the head of the, he should be the head of the, uh, the health department. He really should. Integrated medicine's the only way to go now. If they're really interested in health in this country, that's where they go. Now, none of the practitioners who have been administering intravenous vitamin C can get any saline.

Now there is a shipment of saline coming in in three weeks in a couple of containers and all of that's already been allocated. Now they're, all it is John, and Nick Coatsworth came out this morning and talked about this too. He said for goodness sake, why can't we produce salt water in Australia? All it is is salty water.

You know, there are facilities in this country that are capable of manufacturing saline. But here's the thing, John. The TGA are now looking at approving imports from other countries, like India, uh, in order to, uh, to boost supplies in Australia. We also know, John, that we have less than 11 days supply of diesel in this country.

And our bulk supplies of diesel are held in storage in trust in trust. In the United States of America. So 11 days supply, if we're involved in any kind of military action on our own soil, all the Chinese, for example, all the Indonesians who I don't, I'm not naming names, but all I have to do is blockade Australia.

And we won't, we won't have any fuel. It'll just be come in and take it. We don't have an automobile manufacturing industry. Now, um, someone close to our hearts is involved in manufacturing in a small to medium sized business with a large turnover every year and about 150 staff. Things are tight at the moment.

Uh, people aren't spending money. And, uh, his sales have gone right down. And because of the payroll tax situation in Australia, he has got a massive debt to pay in payroll tax. Now, bear in mind that I've never really understood payroll tax. Renekon to talk about it, but his staff are paying income tax. Now, why, why are we doing everything we can to castrate small business in this country?

If you employ over a certain number of people, I'm not too sure what the amount is, but if you employ over a certain number of people, you've got to pay a payroll tax. So the government is double dipping all over the shop. And what happens? Uh, these people are going broke. Lots of people are going to lose their jobs.

I mean, it just makes no sense to me. Another situation. Um, very, people very close to me, uh, good friends that I've met since all of this started, who live in Queensland, have, um, have, We've gotten involved in a, in an investment. They bought some shares and those shares were going to, um, provide them with some passive income for their retirement.

For some reason, the, uh, the ASIC have frozen those shares and nobody can have access to them. That's been going on over a year now, over a year. And not only that they were given some data information that if they reapplied another tax return for I think it was the year 2022 and made some alterations to that that they would get a large chunk of money back from their tech from it with a tax return a revised tax return.

They did that as many other people did thinking that it was. Yeah, okay, it must be kosher. And then they got a letter from the tax office saying, no, it's not kosher. Give us the money back. So they had to give the money back. Now that money they invested in those shares. So they can't access the shares to sell them to give the money back.

And not only that, the tax officers hit them and other people are involved in that. Innocent people, innocent people with an 80,000 fine. Wow. And interest on that, if they can't pay it, the interest is like 15 or 16%, something astronomical. So these people in their retirement are now broken hearted and they have to sell their house.

Now these, these are people who have paid their taxes all of their lives. Yeah. And they're not the only ones. There are thousands of them, John. Good everyday Australians have always abided by the law. They've always paid their taxes. They've educated their kids. They've supported this country. And what does this country do for them?

It grabs the best part of 500 million and blows it on a divisionary. a divisionary tactic from Albanese with the, with the voice campaign. How much money are we seeing wasted? We're seeing hundreds of millions of dollars being sent to Ukraine over and above what's already been allocated for them. Penny decides, oh, we'll give, we'll give Ukraine another 150 million.

What's all that about? When good, honest Australians in retirement have done the right thing and now faced with having to sell their bloody home.

Oh, look, you got me. I mean, this, uh, one of the events that I went to, uh, yesterday, hoodie, uh, there was a welcome to country and the welcome to country consisted of. Essentially a 10 minute lecture from the person welcoming us to country on why we should be voting for Anthony Albanese and how, how, uh, how disgraceful it was that the voice lost.

Did everyone stay there or did a lot of people walk out? Well, look, the, the problem is that the, these things that you go to, uh, tied up with these organizations, they're woke. They're very woke, Woody, uh, they're, you know, they think, they think climate change is real. They think solar panels in, uh, prime agricultural land are the answer to everyone's problems.

Uh, so, yeah, it's, it's not something that's perceived to

be a problem. The other thing, John, it seems like Anthony Albanese, who is one of the most spineless politicians I've ever come across. I think he's one of, he has to be apart, next to Billy McMahon, two of the weakest prime minister we've ever had.

And now he's jumping on this bandwagon of calling Gerard Rennick a cooker. I mean, he's all about division. He's not about unity. He's, he's, um, I mean, the, the guy is an absolute joke. And the political system in this country and the legal system is going to hell in a handbasket. The uni party, two party system that we have in this country has failed dramatically.

And, um, I'll tell you what, the people have, the people are growing in consciousness about this. And I've got to revisit what we've said before, John, the reason why they're bringing in misinformation and disinformation bills to apply to social media people like us. These things thrive when governments keep secrets and don't tell the truth.

Conspiracy theories are alive because of that.

Woody, uh, you know, I'm sure people might be across this by now, but, you know, I was speaking with John Ruddock last night. I mean, you'll find this hard to believe, um, if you haven't caught up with it, but the, the local government, uh, nominations closed, uh, yesterday at 12 o'clock.

Now the Liberal Party has failed to lodge applications on behalf of those that were going to be putting their hand up.

Anywhere from eight to 12 local government areas. So people, uh, I think the mayor of Lane Cove, a liberal mayor resigned from the liberal party, uh, on, on Ben Fordham's program this morning.

They are in turmoil, Woody. The liberal party in New South Wales is in absolute turmoil. I mean, can you believe. But you can have such a stuff up and there's obviously more to this, that there'd be a background story to this, who knows what's going on behind the scenes, I wouldn't even begin to try and work it out.

But you've had all these, I was sitting with a guy last night who was number one on the ticket in his local council area for the Liberal Party. And he was told that he's not in the election. And so he's a sitting councillor. But he's not going to be a sitting councillor in, uh, three weeks time or four weeks time.

So he's not re nominated? He's not re nominated. They

can't. An admin error. Because of an admin error. They're all gone. And how are these people expected to run a country like Australia? That's why the, that's why the country's in a mess, John. It is an absolute mess. We haven't had a statesman in this country forever.

We need a statesman with backbone to stand up and pull all this together. And, and you know what the truth is, the truth is, and we've got a lot of, we know a lot of really good people involved in different parties. Yeah. We met some of

them tonight, but the truth is I think political parties involved in running a country, I think those days are gone.

I think there's a new system that needs to come. And, and, and, and I'm telling you this, I'm saying this, I'm being honest about what we're seeing, uh, countries around the world going through this debacle at the moment are on the verge of open rebellion. And if that happens, it would be a disaster. But if it happens, it's happening because of the governing parties and the way that they operate.

They lie. They don't tell the truth. They manipulate, uh, situations to suit themselves. They're largely fools. A lot of them are fools. Who are just being guided by the bureaucracy that they work in. And those bureaucrats are running the whole show. Now people are just getting to a stage where they're sick and tired of being over governed, they're sick and tired of all these bills and taxes and cost of living and everything's, everything's going around the S Bend at a hundred mile an hour.

And these guys are fiddling, Albanese's like Nero, he's playing the fiddle while Australia burns. And they're on about renewable energy and all this other stuff. We have got to consolidate this country before it disappears. We've got to stop all this crap, consolidate it, reinforce it, and stop. Excuse me. Can you wake up for a minute? Uh, your house is on fire. You might want to do something about that now. It's an inferno. It's an inferno. Now listen, John, we, all we've ever wanted to do is use rational argument wherever possible to wake people up to what's going on. I mean, Michelle and I are going to New Zealand in September.

I'm going to be MC at two of the great, um, events over there in Christchurch and Auckland. With, uh, with, with, uh, a great many doctors from overseas, it's great. Big, big venues, it's going to be great. But people are warning us that the New Zealand government has imposed legislation over there, John, that if they declare another pandemic, police have the right to hold you down while medical people vaccinate you against your will.

They've been given that power and they're going to use it. And medical professionals, nurses and doctors have been given the right to detain people, John, till the police come. Now, that's in New Zealand. Now, if, if, if people in Australia don't think that these kinds of things are coming, or they don't think it's bad, I've said it in a thousand talks, John, um, when, when Hitler was doing what Hitler did in Germany, the people were prosperous again.

Hitler made them prosperous. And in the middle of their prosperity, some of them were asking questions. Why are they burning the books? Why are they jailing the dissidents? And we've got to be rational. We've got to be disciplined. We've got to be sensible and we've got to stop giving people ammunition to call us cooks and make us look like idiots because there's plenty of us out there giving them the keys. We need statesmanship type leadership in this country to bring the people together and wake people up gently and say, come on, um, we're going to need you because things are really going crazy here before you know it, your kids are going to be dobbing you in.

This is the, this is their way to, uh, to, um, attack us again. There's no doubt that, you know, there'll probably be.

Further attempts to pull this rubbish on us again, but we're prepared now.

We're prepared. Well, you know, film me once, call me Billy, film me twice, call me silly. I mean, people are awake, people are awake to the fact that it wasn't safe and effective. Uh, that it wasn't, um, it, it didn't stop transmission. I mean, none of that can be denied and the vaccine injuries can't be denied much longer either because people are, people are drowning in vaccine injury stories and they've been proven.

And, um, so I mean, for those, for those people who, who, uh, who attack what they call anti vaxxers and call them cookers and all that sort of stuff. I've been looking at some of their stuff too, John, and I've got to be honest, they're no, they're no different to us. Some of the, some of the

commentary that they're putting up there is so sick that all it does is when I look at, when I look at the commentary from both sides, John, as an Aussie who loves his country, I see a country that's more divided, John, than it has ever been.

For our blackfellas and, and, and giving them all this, uh, stature and recognition, but we can't even, we can't even pull it together. We can't pull it together on anything in this country. We are more divided than ever.

And unless we start waking up to that fact, um, well, that's what they want, isn't it? That's, that's the objective of it. Yeah. Uh, you know, they've got this fear campaign going and it serves their purpose, uh, because You know, it's, it's not good for anyone. Um, I mean, because we're now at a point where you can't trust the government.

Unfortunately.

Dark crap has been happening on this planet. Since creation. And the sun comes up every morning and it goes down every afternoon. What have you done? What have you done today to make the world a better place for someone you know? That's the question we should be asking ourselves. And politicians should be asking that question.

What, what have, what could I do today to make the world a better place for the people who voted me in? And they're not doing it, John. And Peter Dutton's not doing it. And Anthony Albanese's not doing it. And the Greens aren't doing it.

I mean, it's a real opportunity to show leadership and, uh, you know, cause there's a void of it out there.

So anyone that does, we'll instantly, we'll instantly, um, you know, be able to, uh, bring people along.

the common sense, I'm sure that you'll be guided pretty sensibly.

Absolutely. And you know what? Um, when you love your country, you love the people in it and we're doing what we're doing because we, we, we love you guys. Not only the ones who agree with us, the ones who don't. And I want to, I want to live in a country that thrives because people disagree.
