

Club Grubbery Raw Transcript:

2024-08-22 Graham and John speak with Charles Mackenzie about infected blood products...

Well, hi everyone and welcome to Club Grubbery again. We're midweek of, uh, the 21st of August, Wednesday night, the 21st of August. And uh, this is a really good interview. This, this is a real eye opener. We're coming at the health system in Australia from a double barreled approach and I've really been looking forward to this interview, John, with Charles McKenzie.

How are you, John?

Good, mate. Yeah, it's really, uh, interesting interview this because it sort of leads into aspects that we've covered with a number of medical experts about the contamination of blood and it'll be interesting to see where this interview goes.

Exactly right. A lot of people concerned at the moment about getting any kind of blood transfusion because of spike proteins and the like, and with good cause, you know, with really good cause.

And once again, we're all about trying to, um, to bring a discussion to the table, to, to increase awareness. We're not wanting to run down rabbit holes, but we need to understand the system we're working in clearly. And to that end, we have joining us. Uh, tonight we have Charles McKenzie from Infected Blood Australia.

Welcome to the program, Charles. G'day.

G'day, gentlemen. Great to be here.

It's great to have you on, mate. Now, we've been announcing your arrival for the last few episodes. We've been talking about you coming on and about the reasons why we are inextricably linked through a massive Distrust, if you like, or skepticism around health in this country, if not this country, around the world.

Infected blood relates to infected blood products that go back to the 1990s. Is this where we're at at the moment, where HIV infected blood was given to people and covered up?

Actually, to tell you what Infected Blood Australia, and our website is infectedbloodaustralia.com for everybody. Okay, to tell you what we are, we're actually representative or we're a group fighting what was formerly Australia's deadliest medical scandal.

So before the year 2000, I really don't think many Australians know this, our deadliest medical scandal was the contamination of our blood supply. And I've actually been a witness on behalf of Australia. To the largest, uh, legal investigation in British history. That's called the Infected Blood Inquiry.

And it's just concluded, it concluded on May 20th. And the chair of that inquiry, a former High Court judge, made a finding which blew the world away. The finding was that what happened in blood supplies in the UK and in Australia was no accident. And so after the Second World War, this is what happened, Graham, Johnny, um, people can find this for themselves.

You know, the Australian Red Cross is the blood bank today, but originally they were the British Red Cross. The first blood bank we had in Australia was the British Red Cross. And that came around in the post war period. But incredibly, as Sir Brian Langstaff, this is the chair of the Infected Blood Inquiry, has found that blood banks in the UK, the, uh, pioneers of our blood banks here as well, knew that the blood supply was tainted from day one.

They basically knew that they had in the Second World War what they call battlefield hepatitis. You had actually, uh, you know, they called real problems in France, for example, even for the Australian troops, they had some hepatitis and battlefield hepatitis. And a lot of those patriots were asked to donate blood when they came back from the war.

And, uh, that hepatitis went into the blood supply. And so really what we've had is we've had a tainted blood supply 1980s, and the 1990s. And it got safer in 1999. And the reason it got safer in 1999 was the advent of what's called nucleic acid testing. This is where we could really, uh, zone in on whether someone was infected.

And it reduced things like window periods, which had been a problem for testing in the past. But the other problem for us in Australia and the UK was criminal negligence. You see, the blood banks knew and the manufacturers of the blood products used by patients with bleeding disorders, like haemophilia, they knew that a certain percentage of blood transfusions were contaminated every year.

Let me give you a ballpark figure. Um, pretty much I'll, I'll go on the record here because I'm about to go into a major court case. I'm going to tell you the ballpark figure. Uh, Pretty much you could say from about 1950s, you've got about 7 percent of blood transfusions in Australia, uh, were contaminated by some form of hepatitis.

Hepatitis B or hepatitis C, which is deadly. Okay, hepatitis C, by the way, for everyone out there, uh, is not caught through saliva or, uh, you know, from using, uh, uh, other people's implements. It's caught through blood. And it's deadly. And it's also the leading cause of liver transplantation in Australia today.

So what happened was, because, you know, public money pays for all of this, Australians got confused, because we see the Australian Red Cross, and we see that symbol. And we think it's just all about a humanitarian agency. Oh, no, no, no, no, we're talking about a multi billion dollar business. It is today a multi billion dollar business, right.

And so what what the Red Cross didn't want to do was to say, Was they didn't want to, um, be fair dinkum with the Australian public and, and what, what I mean by that is to tell them, listen guys, when we give you blood transfusions in childbirth, because thousands of Aussie women popped the deadly virus Hep C from blood given in childbirth, and what the blood banks did was they didn't want to want them to know.

So when they knew that they had infected these women on mass, we can prove, as I'm about to prove in court, that the Australian Red Cross lifeblood deliberately and knowingly decided not to tell those women. So very often you had thousands of Australian women who've. just had a, you know, just started making a family.

They're probably young wives and they didn't understand in 1970s, and even into the 1990s, why they were so fatigued, why they felt so ill. And because there was a coverup that's gone on for decades, the GPs couldn't tell them what was wrong with them because they hadn't been informed. And so they wrote it up as postnatal depression.

And very often these women was put on medications that they didn't need and they lost their marriages because their husbands were saying, why are you so different? The doctors checked everything that could be wrong with you and we can't find a thing. So. Virtually every marriage ended and then you've had accident patients that weren't told.

You even had elective surgery patients for decades that if they'd been told there was a deadly hepatitis risk they might have deferred their operation until such a time as they could have been assured of safety. Graham and Johnny, I'm here to tell you that we've got tens of thousands of Australian families out there who are infected and highly affected by HIV, hepatitis C and hepatitis B contaminated blood.

It's been going on for decades. Good grief. 1, 400 Australians with a bleeding disorder hemophilia have been killed by their treatments. And I just want to add this, anyone that knows about hemophilia might know it's a rare condition. Okay, we only had a couple of thousand hemophiliacs in the country.

Guess what? 1, 750 of them and not all of them use blood treatments. 1, 750 hemophiliacs in Australia out of 2, 000 ended up with HIV and hepatitis C. And guess what? One of our great mates, a great Australian patriot, and I won't mention his name just now because it's going to be a criminal matter, but a wonderful Queenslander and haemophiliac died this morning, and he and other surviving haemophiliacs have had no help despite decades of trying to get help.

John?

Well, what do you, uh, you know, it's, it's difficult to, uh, come up with words for this, isn't it? Um, I, I atrophy it, it lends, uh, it lends itself to other stories. And I suppose this is why vaccination of newborns with the hepatitis vaccines and the, and the like, is, uh. Is suddenly required.

John, can I just interrupt there?

John, one thing, I hate to do this to interrupt, but I wanna tell you everybody, okay? If you go to infected blood australia.com to our website, go to a section. The evidence they didn't want you to see, you just mentioned the Hepatitis B vaccine. Now I'm gonna tell you something. The reason this has been covered up for decades, the reason that Australia is the only first, what cool world country.

not to offer help to its infected blood victims, not to offer help to hemophilia families when everyone knows that in many cases this was an avoidable and preventable scandal is because in the 19 late 70s and early 1980s Australia was advertising for blood donors. in sexually explicit gay publications.

No other country in the world was doing that. Now, if you go to our website, you'll see that evidence. It's incredible. Why was Australia advertising in what were essentially gay pornography magazines in the early, early 1980s? When they knew That there had been a deadly form of hepatitis out there for decades when even the editor of what was called the Observer, the Sydney Star, I think it was called, gay magazine, even that editor in 1979 wrote an open letter to the former premier of New South Wales, Neville Rand, saying, listen, we've got hepatitis outbreak in the gay community.

Please send help. You're killing people because there's not enough aid. Well, guess what? They didn't send help. They sent mobile blood collection vans and advertisements in these gay

pornography magazines because they wanted the tainted blood donors in the early 1980s. Why did they want them? Because the Australian Red Cross weren't just our blood bank.

Oh, no, they were moonlighting, and they were developing a hepatitis B vaccine with the American pharma giant Merck. And we even know that the World Health Organization was involved. So what happened was, they asked these gay men to come in and donate their tainted blood, which will be put in a process to make the hep B vax, right.

And they re injected these gay men. Now, let me tell you something. When those gay men were going in, that blood plasma they were donating, was Not only was it used to make a hep B vax, but they also sent it to an organization called the Commonwealth Serum Laboratories, now known as CSL down in Melbourne, and they made it into blood products, which were used by haemophiliacs.

So, what happened was, in 1983, Uh, the first reports of HIV or this AIDS, uh, you know, uh, scandal emerged in blood transfusion recipients. So the next thing you know, the Australian Red Cross went into a huge cover up at that moment in 83 and the first murmurings of privatizing the Commonwealth Serum Laboratories occurred that, and eventually they were privatized in 1994, okay, because they didn't want to have this looked at.

They didn't want to have this revisited. What was it they're trying to get away from? They're trying to get away from criminal negligence. These scientific madmen who are moonlighting, using our blood supply for dual purposes, had actually hit an iceberg. And that iceberg was HIV. They killed all of the gay people that they were developing the hep B vaccine.

And then they killed 1400 haemophiliacs. And I might add this, hundreds of those haemophiliacs that they killed, They were children and they knew that they were knowingly infecting them in many cases because they knew that the hepatitis was in those haemophilia treatments from the early 70s. So now in the early 80s, they go and do something immoral, negligent after infecting all these haemophilic hepatitis.

They go, you know what, let's start advertising gay pornos. We'll get all this blood plasmarin. We'll use it to develop a hep B vax, which will bring us all this money with the pharma giant Merck. And oh, let's give it to haemophiliacs. And guess what? We can also show that some of that blood ended up going to women.

In childbirth.

Grief. My God. I am, I'm staggered Charles. I'm really staggered. So how did you get involved in this in the first place? What got you into it?

Well, what got me into actually Graham was I was a kid in Sydney growing up and I went to a school called St Andrew's Cathedral School, which is, uh, if you know Sydney, it's, it's right by the town hall there.

And It was a really great school, you know, and I found out that a kid that I went to school with called Martin Hatch was a haemophiliac and he was a mild haemophiliac. And what that meant was that this kid was never going to die. He was, he'd live a normal life like all of us, right? But the clever dicks at these blood banks, uh, coerce just like with COVID jobs, they coerce young people saying, Oh, you know, you've got a bleeding disorder.

You'll need a protocol that they call prophylaxis, which was, they'll give them these tainted, not they didn't say they were tainted, but they give them these. blood treatments to prevent a bleed before it

happened. Okay. So it's a way of stopping bleeds before they happen. And what they did was they injected these children with this prophylaxis protocol.

The problem was they collected the blood plasmids, which made up these, what they call factor eight and factor nine treatments. They were mass pooled blood plasma. Okay. So they could have hundreds of different donors in them, sometimes thousands. Well, what happened to this kid who had no need of these treatments?

Okay. He developed HIV. And he got his parents got no help whatsoever. And they actually had to sell their home. And AIDS was a very, very scary affliction. In the mid 1980s. I was just a kid. And I didn't see that kid cop any shit from other kids at school. We're all very supportive. It was a Christian school.

It was really touching. But what blew my mind away was as supportive as the school and the other kids were, the government were totally unsupportive. There was a I remember John Dowd in New South Wales. I think he was the Attorney General. He flatly refused even to give as much as 100 a week because of private nursing costs.

Many of the nurses of young Martin when he was dying in hospital, uh, they shunned him. They wouldn't treat him properly, but he was a young kid. He needed proper care. And so his parents sought that extra money and that forced them to go into litigation. So they sued to try and get some care for their young son who's dying of AIDS.

And guess what? That court case found against him. Martin died a few days. I think he died a couple of days before the court case ended and the court case did end in 1990 and it found against him. Well, guess what? I now know that his doctors lied. I've got the transcript of his court case. I can prove his doctors lied in that case.

I can prove the Australian Labor government lied in his case. And I can actually prove, guess what? That even British, the British government were involved. In, in trying to defeat his case, a little Australian boy of 11 with HIV, even the British Australian government was helping defeat that boy's case.

And I'll explain why that was later. So this trauma of seeing a young kid, basically with the scariest virus in the world, be betrayed by the people we elect to serve us. That was a big, big thing for me. I, you know, I, I, Growing up, learning about Australian history, I learned about Gallipoli, I learned about breaking them around, all of these sorts of things, and here I see a young kid, Aussie kid with AIDS, and hold on, Australia is rich enough to do the right thing, get in private nursing, and no.

So that changed me, right? Well, after that happened, guess what? As the irony would have it, my bloody bone marrow failed in 1988 after an adverse reaction to a drug I was given by a GP for some bloody acne that I didn't even need the drug. Gives me this wonder drug, this tablet. Nixie, you know, I end up with bomarifolia, the same disease as the boy in the plastic bubble.

So I was put into isolation. I couldn't have any germs around me. I had no immune system, no ability to make blood. And so guess what? I needed blood. And blood products, blood transfusions, platelet transfusions. Well, because of how badly Martin Hatch had been treated, right? I told everyone at the time, because they told me I was terminal.

I had an 80 percent chance of dying within three months when I was 16. And so I pretty much thought I'm a goner anyway, to be honest with you. But I said to them, listen, Uh, this blood they're

going to put in me, it's tainted. Oh no, the doctor said, oh no, everything's fine. We've got HIV tests and oh no. And I said, no way.

You know why? Because I don't trust them. I don't trust them because of how they treated that little kid that went to my school. So I had the blood and straight away I had a weird taste in my mouth. I felt real bad. And I was just a kid and all the doctors said, now, listen, mate, I think because you've been told you're terminally ill, I think you might have what they call hypochondria.

You crazy in other words. So they sent me to a psychiatrist, which I thought was pretty amusing. And I go to the psychiatrist, and the guy goes, Well, I can't find anything wrong with you. Actually, it's pretty rational, because what these doctors didn't know about me was that I actually am a very avid reader of medicine.

And so while they were bullshitting me, I was actually reading uh, the actual medicine that they didn't care to look at anymore and um, I knew I'd been infected. So what I did was they told me, listen, the psychiatrist said, there's nothing wrong with it. And I just said, look, I'm going to go outside, find a doctor outside of the hospital system and get privately tested.

Well, I did that on my own, despite being called crazy. And it turned out to be a great idea because I was one of the first people to get tested for the deadly virus hepatitis C. And in 1991, it was confirmed. that I had actually been given tainted blood as a kid. So that then led me to doing some research for a few years.

And in 1994, I made the decision on behalf of Australia. And I found out there were tens of thousands of us who've been through the same nightmare, but no one believed us because a bit like child sex abuse, it gets all covered up because institutions don't want to face their own failings. And so in 1994, I made the decision, I'd be full time, I'm going to go at this.

And I'm going to cause court cases. I'll be a witness. I'll do research. I'll do whatever it takes for us to fix this problem. And here I am, uh, 30 years later.

What's what do you do for an income though? How do you support yourself?

I'm do nothing now. I'm a disability support pensioner because I've, uh, fortunately, uh, my illnesses have progressed.

I'm very well today feeling well, but I survive on a very expensive form of medicine because the tainted blood has now gone to my brain. Uh, and which I'm still compass, but I've got like motor function problems. So it's kind of similar to Parkinson's, you know, I basically, I can't, the only way I talk is through medicinal cannabis.

So I can't, I can't stalk with a sputter stutter and I can't use, you know, But my bodily functions are controlled by it, right? So I, yeah, I'm not much good anymore, but I'm here to end this, okay? And I didn't get a cure for my original disease, which is severe aplaskanemia. I didn't even manage to get a bone marrow transplant.

So I've been told that I could die any moment. I've had that hanging out of my head for a long time. And so that, that really motivated me to want to get to the bottom of tainted blood because then my life Would be of some use because so many of us in our group at Infected Blood Australia had injuries before we got given tainted blood.

So so many of us have known that our time is limited and that's what's driven us.

Well, how do you feel about the medical board given you've just mentioned medicinal cannabis? How do you feel about the medical board's approach to 40 doctors in New South Wales have been prescribing this to the effect that one of them leading the charge in this, Dr.

Sarah McDonald is giving up medicine?

Why are they giving up medicine? Sorry?

Because they've been, they've been, uh, it's suspended. Yeah. John, go ahead.

Yeah, it's been suspended by APRA, uh, and the Medical Board, um, and can only act, uh, under supervision, uh, at present is my understanding and, uh, can't prescribe any of, uh, any of

those drugs.

Well, what do I have, okay, what do I have to say about it? What I have to say is this. Um, I believe that the bureaucracy that's running our healthcare system in Australia is in criminal breach across the board. So, uh, they can do these things, like they did with COVID, it was like, uh, living in East Germany.

Any doctor that wrote a, um, an exemption, someone that didn't want one of these ridiculous COVID injections, would get pinged by the health department. They are criminals. And I don't say that as hyperbole. I say it as someone who's about to bring the largest series of cases in the history of the Commonwealth and including manslaughter cases against the Australian Labor government.

This bureaucracy are not fit to serve. Okay, so that's what I think anything that they do. Um, I no longer pay much attention to it. And we've got many doctors and many medical experts who are with us. And I prefer I favor their advice over these imposters that we have in the healthcare system.

You won't get any argument from us, Charles, John, would you?

No, definitely not. I suppose Charles, I've been coming on On a program like this must be refreshing to you. I don't suppose that you've had too many opportunities to speak to

mainstream. This is a landmark moment for us because no media will go near us. We've been trying to get the Australian Broadcasting Corporation.

I've had many meetings. I had four corners over to my house 20 or 22 years ago. And they were saying, um, you know, with a view to. doing a four corners on Australia's infected blood scandal, and they said, Okay, so how many people are involved? I said, Oh, there's tens of thousands of us, you know, there's tens of thousands of people who receive contaminated blood transfusions, about 1000 Australians received HIV from blood transfusions and blood products.

But I can tell you this, a conservative number with without this is I'd say this on the stand any moment, and no one would argue we've got a minimum of 20, 000. People who obtain a blood transfusion risk recipients who got Hep C, thousands of them died from liver failure and liver cancer. Okay, there is a quick, rapid cure today for Hep C, but you have to understand that cure has just happened in the last, say, five or six years.

For many of us, they had chemotherapy like drugs that didn't work. And the longer you had this Hep C thing, the more chance you have of liver cancer. So we literally have had. Uh, thousands of

Australians killed by tainted blood transfusions. Okay. So it, it, the ABC, I had four corners over and I told them there were tens of thousands of us and they dropped me like a hot brick.

And so basically, occasionally, whenever I've gotten to call action overseas or force a ridiculous Senate inquiry, like I did here in 2004, that Labor covered up and people lied under oath, but basically the ABC won't go near us. And there's lots of reasons for that, and the media won't go near us, and I'll tell you one big reason why the ABC won't go near us.

The ABC's, uh, recent chair, Ida Buttrose. has made 40 years for the last 40 years Ida has been championed as a bastion of truth and you know Ida told me therefore I believe it and Cole Chisell, you know, had that very famous song about Ida telling us Ida told me. Well guess what? Ida, was the face of the AIDS campaign in Australia.

Okay. And as a result, the ABC don't want to have the likes of me on because if they have the likes of me on, they know that I'll burst the bubble. I'll burst the ITER ABC bubble where for 40 years, we were told that ITER led some supposed world renowned response to HIV, AIDS and others when it was the complete opposite is true.

Um, we've got people in our group, ITER and her friends have made Uh, a lot of fame for themselves and a lot of book deals and a, uh, a lot of money I should say off this lie that they've led this great response to HIV while we've got Australians who are tainted blood victims today, who got HIV from the blood supply and are forced to visit food banks right now in 2024 in order to eat.

People should go to jail, Charles. Oh,

they

should go to jail. When we had the Senate Inquiry, we had witnesses saying people should go to jail, and I'll tell you what, Graeme, it's in, it's, it is a relief to be here today because I'm talking to two Australians, right? The ABC won't have us on. SB, the SBS won't have us on.

Now, I don't blame the commercial networks because they are commercial networks. They've got some good journalists. They really do. Like, there are top journalists in this country that know about this. Ross Coulthard has known about it for 30 years. Yeah. You know, he, I've Yet, Ross Cordhartz knows all about this.

You ask him, he knows me. To ask him if he knows Charles McKenzie, he'll laugh in his response because he knows. Uh, he knows that no network wants this story. Why don't they want it? Well, the ABC don't want it because they're complicit. They never told Australia. They can't invent a time machine to go back.

And show us where is the Four Corners, where is the 7.30 report that you did to warn Australians that our blood supply. Now I'm not saying that our blood supply is not safe today. Let's be careful. What I am saying is, we can't trust the managers of our blood supply. The Australian Red Cross Lifeblood.

Listen. The Canadian Red Cross, because they had a Royal Commission in Canada, they were booted out. from the collection of their blood supply in the mid 90s. And here we are stuck with this Australian Red Cross. It's only a logo, right? There's no humanity there. It's basically the shopfront for Australia's or what has become Australia's third largest business, CSL.

Now, CSL was Commonwealth Serum Laboratories and the lefties and labour types in the government in 1994 said, you know what, instead of having accountability, Right and coming clean with Australia and saying that we've had the worst treatment scandal, we've killed 1400 haemophiliacs and we need to have an inquiry.

What did Labor do? They privatized CSL. Well, now CSL has become the darling of the stock market. And so most, you know, you'd probably be irresponsible if you didn't have some sort of investment in CSL. You know, a major funds manager. So I would imagine that most of the major commercial networks have some sort of money in CSL.

I know that Queensland Labor, Crikey, recently reported that Queensland Labor had 10 million in CSL. So if they do a story, if they have the likes of me on, guess what happens? Their investment in CSL might be a problem, you see? And that comes right back to when they privatized CSL with, you know, The Democrats, the defunct Democrats party, were trying to get an inquiry into the haemophilia genocide and into CSL in the early 90s and it's on the Hansard.

You can see that Labor senators said no to the Senate inquiry into CSL because they said it might affect CSL's share price.

John, there's a lot of similarities here, is there not? Well, look,

the other thing, Hoody, I was just about to say, I mean, there seems to be a lot of coincidences. Now, at Club Grubbery, we always give the opposition the opportunity to come and speak on our program.

We're happy to have them on. There's absolutely no reason why they can't come and put their side of the story. But, uh, Do you think there's, there's, I mean, I've been told that Dr. Kerry chant, I mean, these people find themselves in these positions and you wonder why Australia, they're all in these positions.

Uh, now Kerry chant. Now I understand from, from those people around her that she has a very strong interest and an expertise in HIV AIDS. Now, do you think it's any, any, is it coincidence that she's the head of the health department during

this pandemic? No, it's the. We will have to talk again because I could talk to you guys for years, a real relief to be here.

But I'll tell you what it feels like. Um, it feels like being let out of jail because they've got me in North Korea. Okay. The, and, and it's no coincidence. Let me tell you what's happened. Okay. In 1983, the Australian Labour government came to power and Neil Blewett was a former Labour health minister.

Yeah, and he's on the record you can find this on the internet for saying that his first day in office He heard about this new gay affliction. I think they called it grids It would later become identified as a virus be known as HIV right his first day on the job now I've got to tell you something the British have now had the outcome of this infected blood inquiry And they've made a 12 billion settlement to their infected blood victims, okay, and their affected family members.

Well, guess what?

12 billion, and they're saying it could rise to 20 billion. Uh, Australia has had nought since. For our infected blood victims. Okay. So, um, basically what happened was this inquiry found out that in

1983, they had a health minister in the UK called Kenneth Clark, uh, and he gave evidence at the inquiry and it didn't go too well.

He was found to be, uh, uh, very dodgy indeed. And, uh, there are even talks of having his peerage removed. Okay. Because he, he was found to have basically done the wrong thing and was very unimpressive and very callous. Well, guess what? His counterpart in Australia did the exact same things. I'm talking about Neil Blewett.

If you look at a timeline of what the British did in response to the infected blood scandal, and they're in big trouble, they did the exact same things that we did. And guess what else? I've got documentation that I took to the UK Inquiry, which shows The blood bankers in Australia and members of the Australian government were writing to the UK going, please, can you give us advice on how to put down these tainted blood cases?

Please, can you give us advice on how to put down an 11 year old HIV hemophilia case that's about to go before the courts? We've got that documentation. You can find it in my statement, the statement of Charles McKenzie published online. So what happened was, Neil Blewett entered into a criminal cover up with the British government.

So what did they want to do? Well, Neil Blewett wanted to make it because Neil Blewett did something that's quite spectacular. And everyone needs to tune into this part because I predict there'll be many movies made. Did anyone out there watch the TV series The Staircase? It was about an American author, and they made a documentary series and a drama series that went quite well.

It was about American author who'd had two wives who both died in the same way. They'd fallen down a staircase. Well, the second wife's family, they said, Hey, we reckon this author did it. And when the court case happened, they found out that the, the, the two wives have found out that he was having gay affairs, right?

Now I'm not suggesting that Neil Blewett's doing anything like that. But what I am saying is this, Neil Blewett was hiding a secret when he became health minister in 1983, he had a secret, that secret was that he'd been having a longstanding gay relationship. With his boyfriend from university in Tasmania.

Neil Blewett met him in the 1950s. But in the early sixties, Neil Blewett goes to England. I think he was like a Oxford, uh, you know, what, what do you call it? Uh, I don't know the term when they, when you're really smart, they give you an Oxford, uh, go, go at Oxford or Oxford Scholar. Yeah. Yeah. Oxford Scholar.

They made an Oxford Scholar or something like that. So here you've got a kid from Tasmania is putting on a posh voice where he's at now an Oxford Scholar and he meets a young English Rose. And he, she's from a good family, and he whisks her off the feet, and you'd know this, Graham, being a former pilot, Australia was some distance away, uh, in the early 60s, you, you didn't get there in 24 hours, you had to have a couple of refueling stops, and so perhaps they came by ship, but she uprooted her life, uh, in the UK and came to Australia and was Neil Bluett's wife for many decades.

Well, guess what? She had no idea that when he became Health Minister, that the entire relationship he'd been having a gay relationship with his original boyfriend. So what happened was, when HIV came out in the media and all the rest of it, the former head of the Australian Medical Association, whose name escapes me unfortunately, but at that time, he had said, Oh, Neil Blewett's response to

tainted blood and his response to HIV and all the rest of it is basically biased because he's a closet gay.

So, Neil Blewett came out and said how dare you, and I can send you this tonight Graham, you can see the articles, he said, this is scuttlebutt, quote, he said there's no truth in any of this, right, and I will, I'll defend my family. So he goes and sues this bloke, right, for defamation. This is while he's covering up the infected blood scandal.

This is why he's not giving aid to parents whose kids have been injected knowingly with tainted blood, right? They're dying in the background. You've got people like famous author Bryce Courtney's son. He's dying in the background. But Neil Blewett's suing this former head of the Australian Medical Association over defamation that he is a closet gay.

Well, guess what? In defamation, As, uh, the former, uh, uh, proprietor of Marsden's law firm, uh, uh, the fam famous lawyer found out when he sued Channel 7 for defamation, uh, the other side can throw a bit of mud. They can throw a bit of, uh, their evidence, right? And guess what? They did throw some evidence, and it was that Neil Blewett had been having a gay affair.

Well, his wife had no bloody idea! So guess what happens? The next thing you know, front page headlines, Jill Blewett found dead. Jill Blewett. So Neil Blewett's wife is found dead in 19, I think it was 1987, 88, right? Okay, well, guess what? He is now one, he's basically lied about the fact he's gay. Two, he may have perjured himself.

He won the court case, right? But now his wife is found dead. And he says, Oh, she died through electrocution. That's what he said. The coroner had an investigation and returned an open finding of 20 years later, he gives an interview at the Good Weekend magazine, and he admits that less than 12 months after his wife died, he moves in with his gay lover, and he said, we didn't want to report that it was suicide because of the, you know, protecting the kids.

Well, all of that's going on while he's covering up the infected blood scandal and not holding inquiries and not being fair dinkum with the public, right? And all this is going on and next thing you know, Labor then privatised the very laboratory that's infected all these haemophiliacs, the Commonwealth Serum Laboratories, right?

So Neil Blewett helps the privatisation, right? And then he sets up a couple of organisations, what I call stay behind networks. Now, importantly for COVID. And particularly for people in Victoria, when the COVID jobs were mandated for workers, the Victorian government outsourced the decision to the Burnett Institute.

This is a research unit, uh, publicly funded in Victoria, but the Burnett Institute were actually established by Neil Blewett, the coverup merchant, the man who'd been lying up lying about hemophilia genocide, the man who covered up manslaughter, the man who's about to be recalled to court may go to jail.

He's in big trouble. So he sets up this Burnett Institute and they basically are pouring water over the hemophilia issue for decades. Right? He had a sidekick. Neil Blewett had a sidekick. His understudy in the Labor Health Government of the 1980s was a health official called Bill Boatel. Bill Boatel also hailed from Tasmania, but Bill Boatel was different from Neil Blewett.

When he was hired by Blewett in 83, bill Botto was an openly gay man. Okay? And so Bill Botto was very concerned about discrimination against gays, as was closet at that time. Closet Gay, Neil Blewett. So they set up the whole response, the infected blood scandal around discrimination,

around the Grim Reaper ads and it around, you know, let's defend the gay community, which isn't a bad, uh, um, intention.

I'm not saying that was, but it was a false. They used it falsely to cover up their own tracks, to make it look like, Oh, we're so forthright. We don't want to be discriminatory. And we want to, Australians to be leaders in how we respond to HIV AIDS. These guys gave themselves lifetime awards, right? And this Bill Botell understudy, guess what he does?

He sets up another, uh, infectious diseases unit in New South Wales called the Kirby Institute. Okay, and guess who the Kirby Institute ended up getting funded by? Bill Gates, Bill and Melinda Gates. And so, how did the Kirby Institute and Bill Botel attract funding from Bill and Melinda Gates, are you ready?

And I can prove this to you, John, and I can prove it to anyone listening, you ready? Bill Botel went to Bill Gates and told him that he was the architect of Australia's world renowned response to HIV AIDS that brought together affected communities. Which communities were those? It didn't bring together my community, the community of hemophiliacs and women infected in childbirth.

We didn't even heard from it, mate. We never got no aid whatsoever, but you see, because of the cover up and because he was so sure that cover up now they've sold off CSL now that Neil Blewett's been anointed as a God. Now the Burnett Institute, the stay behind networks being financed. They're, they're good to go.

And so guess what? He used the infected blood lie that he was the architect of a wonderful thing to get 10 million. from Bill Gates. So he sets up his own. I think he calls it Friends of the Pacific Fund. Okay, so now guess what happens? Now I can prove that hundreds of millions of taxpayer money went to Bill Gates for his global HIV fund for global HIV to fight HIV globally.

Well, we've got Australians in my group right now who copped HIV from the blood supply. Some of them copped it. When they were accidentally given a blood product, they shouldn't have been given a hospital. They got HIV and guess what? They don't have a single centenaire today and they have to, you know, swallow their pride and go to a bloody food bank to feed themselves.

Meanwhile, Bill Botol, the sidekick of Neil Blewett, Who covered up the infected blood scandal said that he was the architect of a world now in response that brought together effect communities. And guess what? He opened up Australia to the gates of hell. He was the man. Bill Botel was the man that made Bill Gates such a big influence in Australia.

And if you look at Bill Botel, COVID 19 on Google, you'll see in 2020, he was saying things like Australians are sitting ducks without COVID vaccination. And he said things like masks. were the equivalent to what condoms were for HIV. But because the ABC, they gave him basically a residency throughout the pandemic, even his own webpage on their, on their website, basically, he was anointed.

He was, he was the anointed one, the expert on COVID because he was the hero of HIV and nothing could be further than the truth.

I just need to ask you for the sake of Lots of reasons, uh, Charles, and the information you have about Neil Blewett, uh, in particular his sexuality. Is that on the public record?

Oh, yes. Now, everything I say is on the public record because I have to be very, very careful. And that's a great question, Graham. We have to be very careful. I'll tell you why. We are about to start

these legal cases and we just had a great friend of ours die today and I'm going to be going to police. We have some reason to go to police.

We've also got reasons to go to British police. Okay. Um, now, Neil Blewett's sexuality, uh, has, should have no bearing on any of this, but I will tell you why it does have a bearing in this case. Are you familiar with the, uh, was it the, the cruise ship, an Italian cruise ship, the, the Concordia, was it the, the, it basically ran aground, ran onto rocks.

Yep. Yep. Okay. If you know, if you, what was the ship called? Uh, the, uh, it escapes me, but anyway, this ship, the captain of the ship had been misbehaving. And he, he drove the ship too close to shore, I think, to show off to somebody and there's some suggestion there were drugs involved and of course, he was the first guy to hop off the ship.

Yeah. Well, because there was a loss of life, investigations had to inquire as to what was happening in the buildup to that, that's, that disaster. In the same way, the courts will have to look at. What was happening in the build up to Neil Blewett's decisions not to do his lawful duty? Why did he not call for a Royal Commission?

Why did he not call for immediate aid for thousands of women who'd been given tainted blood transfusions childbirth? And in particular, why did he not call in the police when he found out that children were being experimented on in Australia and that hundreds of their children had been killed by these experiments?

He should have done that. He didn't do that. Why not? Well, perhaps it was the case that he was nervous about HIV and this, these viruses that it might lead to discrimination against gays. Perhaps that was a genuine reason, but perhaps that impaired his thinking because in his concern about the gay community, he completely abandoned perhaps the haemophilia community because he didn't authorize any aid, aid that was available in all these other countries.

So was it his sexuality that, that was? The, the, the, um, the cause of his problematic response, because he was lying to his wife. There are many gay people who are very competent at what they do, but they don't have to lie to their partners. Why did Neil Blewett have to lie to his wife? And, you know, do you think it had a bearing on his effectiveness as Health Minister, the fact that his wife is being found dead?

I mean, how would that affect your work? Truly, there needs to be an investigation into his conduct while he was health minister. And one of the big reasons why there has to be is because there is this manslaughter issue. We are going to be bringing criminal cases. And I'm very sorry to upset Neil Blewett's blushes and the blushes of his now, uh, partner, but I'm sorry.

We've had hundreds of children who've been killed and their parents are telling me that it's manslaughter. And we've got a legal verdict that it's manslaughter. Unbelievable. So who's on your team? Well, who's on my team? Other survivors. We've got, uh, you can see us at Infected Blood Australia. Um, we're on Infected Blood AU on Instagram.

We've got, we're only allowed to have 17, 000 followers because Instagram have told us that they censor us and shadow ban us. We have the same legal team that forced the UK's Infected Blood Inquiry, the same team that got the 12 billion pound settlement. They've been with us for some years. So they're guiding us towards what we're about to do.

And we are. interviewing currently Australian lawyers because we're going to need quite a few of them. We're going to need administrative lawyers, public lawyers, criminal lawyers. Okay, so if you

know anybody, get in touch with me, Charles McKenzie. And I'm actually going to be holding a legal conference, a major meeting for the Australian victims and their loved ones of this scandal in Sydney on Tuesday, September 10.

And the, the time and venue is to be announced very soon where, uh, Australians can actually come and chat with our British legal team and talk about their legal rights and what we're going to do going forward. And again, we're going to invite politicians, journalists, and lawyers to come down and meet with our victims too, because they're going to be.

The successful lawyers that we hire will be working, uh, with our British legal team. Uh, we are going to, as I say, about to go to police as well. I have actually been to police before and I'll be going again. And I'll also be going to British police and I'll tell you why that is, uh, Graham and, uh, John. The Infected Blood Inquiry found out that they actually outed a guy who was a child murderer.

His name was Professor Arthur Bloom and he was one of, uh, considered to be one of Britain's leading haematologists. Guess what they found? You can find this online, anyone. Type in Professor Arthur Bloom, Infected Blood Scandal. You'll see it yourselves, everyone. Professor Bloom breached National Health Service guidelines in the 1980s, where the guidelines were they should not use high risk imported blood products for children or haemophiliacs because they knew it.

These things had an elevated risk of hepatitis and in fact HIV. So this Professor Bloom deliberately and knowingly breached NHS guidelines and imported high risk American blood products and injected it into children that he described as being virgin haemophiliacs. What that meant is they'd never received blood products before.

So he injected this into babies. And those babies immediately develop full blown AIDS and hepatitis. And there's some very, very tough videos out there, everybody. You can see them on our social media pages, of those little children's most, uh, last moments. It's tough viewing. Um, they were murdered. And now the UK Inquiry has confirmed it.

And Sir Brian Langstaff said that, uh, Professor Bloom was a child murderer. Professor Bloom died of a heart attack in the early 90s. But for our interest in Australia, and why we should be very concerned and why I'm going to be contacting police, and I've been told that Britain is about to have a criminal investigation, we can prove that Professor Bloom came to Australia.

He came here in 1983. And he was working with what's called the Haemophilia Foundation Australia, a supposed charity, which is part of the cover up, publicly funded, it's all about public money. And guess what, the same experiments that Professor Bloom did on British kids. They did here in Australia and the boy that I went to school with, Martin Hatch, I strongly believe he was one of those children.

I strongly believe that Martin Hatch was murdered by Australian health authorities and I strongly believe that hundreds of other Australian children were murdered in the same way and it's for those reasons that I will be contacting, I have been asked by survivors and their relatives in my group to make contact with the British police and of course with Australian police so that we can finally get an investigation into why so many parents lost children.

Yeah. Oh, cause I, I, I recall, I, um, you remember the, uh, the commentator on channel seven, um, Sandy Roberts, uh, his son, uh, died, um, from AIDS as a result of contracting it. He was a

hemophiliac. And I remember Greg Norman wearing, uh, his name, uh, during a golf, uh, tournament. Uh, so it's effective so

many kids, isn't it?

It's devastating. The amazing thing is. Some of those kids, can you imagine being one of those kids in the 80s? I mean, if we can take ourselves back there, it was so scary, you know, AIDS and all of that. Well, guess what? Some of them actually survived and they buried it. They got on with their lives. And now, you know, just even mentioning hearing this scandal, it can cause people to melt down because they've had to really work on dealing with the fear and, and putting their lives together.

Right. But what we have is we have many of their parents had to give up their careers to nurse them so they could still survive today. So we've got, for example, we've got, I've had mates who, you know, unfortunately died recently. They die in their forties, you know, things like that, but their mums gave up their entire careers.

So they're now in abject poverty themselves. And, uh, in one case she's had side effects from the COVID jabs and is Very ill. So we've got entire generations of families who've been affected by tainted blood and now the COVID jabs. And in fact, we've got tainted blood victims who are now victims of the COVID jabs as well.

So it's just a never ending problem.

History repeating itself, isn't it? I know you said earlier that you're not suggesting that the red cross blood bank has, has any issues, but. I mean, surely, I mean, I am,

I'm not what I'm saying is I'm not suggesting that mRNA is tainting the blood supply. I'm not saying people are dying from mRNA contamination or anything like that.

The Red Cross have accused me of saying that. You've got AFP fact checkers, and this is part of them trying to preempt the battle with me. Try and make out that I make technical errors or that I'm some sort of weirdo. No. Um, what I'm saying is, is that, listen. The reason why we had the COVID issue. We don't know, do we?

Well, we don't know. And that's why we need to have the best managers we can have. And look, Graham Hood is a former Qantas pilot, right? I would have no problems flying in a plane with Graham, okay? But I do have problems with the people managing our blood supply because they don't operate like Graham.

They don't operate like pilots. They operate like political operatives. They use smoke and mirrors. And let me just tell you, The UK inquiry, the scandal over so much malfeasance, so many lies has led to then, uh, developing a new law that's come off the back of this. And what that means is that bureaucrats must give the correct or the truthful answer at the first time of asking when, when a British person has been injured by their healthcare, right?

Well, guess what, everybody? My lifelong dream. I believe that you're talking about the coincidences or the similarities between the two things. I'll tell you why COVID happened. It happened because we never had a bloody Royal commission entertainer blood. The same bureaucrats like Bill Botol who covered up the infected blood scandal and who's made millions in public money from salaries over 40 years, that same man, had he been held to account, had Neil

Blewett been held to account, the Burnett Institute, they'd The Kirby Institute and all of them, there wouldn't have been them mandating jabs, right?

We'd have had, I think, people being rightly far more cautious. The same people that covered up the infected blood scandal were the same people pushing the jabs. It's all connected because there's never been any accountability. And my dream, if you can see there in the corner, you can see what looks like a baseball cap.

I'm selling them right now, okay, on my website. And the money is going to help us put this legal action together. Now. This is going to be the, the largest series of, of legal actions in the Cornwall of history and much of it's going to come from, uh, we've had legal opinion, we can fund much of it with legal aid, but in the early stages, I've got to raise a little bit with our group, but a few bits and pieces and these caps about making accountability happen again.

They're going towards paying for these costs. And actually quite a lot of Australians are already wearing them. They're very happy, right? You've got a QR code there. People can just click on that photo of that and they can access the cap straight away, right? So we're going to get this legal action happening.

And what we're also going to do is say this. Did you lose your job because of these mandates? Okay, because I'm sick. I really hate that. Right. We also want some of the money from these caps to go towards people who lost their job from the mandates. We'd also like money to go towards paying for lawyers.

If there are people out there who've been injured by these COVID injections. Yeah. We'd like to help them with their battles too, because we see it as all part of the same thing. We're not saying that, that, uh, uh, jab injury is the same thing as attained a blood infection, right? They're different. They have different things, but we are saying is We've been harmed by the same system, the same malfeasance bureaucracy, the same bureaucracy that cannot tell the truth at the first time of asking.

Well, and I think that's the problem, isn't it, Hoody? I mean, you've said on so many occasions, there's been so many lies. We just don't know what to believe. And, you know, there's just a complete lack of trust out there now. Uh, and, and, you know, I think back to, I've heard stories about MH17. I've heard stories that, A number of, uh, aid specialists were on board that flight and it was taken out.

And I mean, even recently, um, uh, the, the recent, uh, aircraft crash, I've heard that a number of specialists were getting on board that flight. And we're, uh,

suddenly the plane You ready for this, John? Are you ready for this, Graham? I've got to tell you something. I'm so glad to be here. I get so very little opportunity to talk to other Australians, right?

I've got to tell you something. I got the shock of my life in the year 2000. And the reason I got a shock of my life was I found out that a witness that we were trying to put on the stand had been found dead. He was the former head of the Queensland Red Cross. His name was Dr. Ian Young, and he was British.

He was brought here in the 1980s to run their blood bank. The problem is Dr. Ian Young sent a memorandum to the other blood bankers, and this is what cost his life. He told them if they didn't do the available testing for the deadly virus, hepatitis C, and he said that in 1987, he said they would be found in legal breach, and we had a state run blood bank in those days.

We didn't have federalized blood banking That came in in 96. So guess what? Dr. Ian Young implemented what they called surrogate testing. So they didn't have a specific test for Hep C, but he used a thing called surrogate testing for Hep C in 1987. None of the other states blood banks did, they just allowed the blood to keep going out, infected, didn't give a shit.

And guess what? So, when we, when law firms tried to get him, he agreed to be an expert witness, and he'd left Blood Banking Australia, and he agreed to be an expert witness for Australia, you wanna know something? He never got to the stand. He was found dead. And his own lawyer told a journalist, that he'd been assassinated.

Well, that was in year 2000. I've got to tell you something. We've got some senior ex police in our group. And I actually had a mentor who was one of Australia's top cops. He was the head of the, what was then called the National Crime Authority, a wonderful man called Robert McDonald. And I mentioned it in my statement to the UK Infected Blood Inquiry.

I went to him and said, listen, I'm going to get assassinated here. Well, I now think that the reason they assassinated that guy was because he was a doctor and he'd be more impressive on the stand, whereas if I got on the stand, I'm just a victim and obviously therefore biased in their opinion, right? So it doesn't have to carry the same weight.

But if they had one of their own, a former Red Cross blood banker on the stand saying, listen, I sent a memo out to these people saying, you're deliberately and knowingly sending out a tonne of blood and we're going to be found to be in legal breach. Well, if he got on the stand, guess what? CSL, which was privatized in 1994, their market capitalization when Ian Young was murdered was in, uh, was less than 7 billion, but they had takeovers.

They were doing a takeover in Switzerland of a, of a ZLB, a Swiss. Blood products manufacturer that had FDA approval. So it gave CSL its first chance to get into the American market had Dr. Ian Young's evidence got being able to get into the courts. CSL would have been found to have done the same things that the infamous blood products manufacturer Bayer did and would have been closed overnight.

But today they've got a market capitalization of 140 billion and of the world's largest blood products and vaccine maker, they actually export, uh, I think more than 4%. Like more than 4 percent of America's exports. Uh, more than like soy and corn is blood plasma, and it's by Australia's CSL, right? None of that would have happened if, if these people had been able to make the stand.

So for many years, I've had people like criminologists telling me that I'm quite likely going to be bumped off. So trust me, when you hear about these aircraft going down, I don't know about those things, right? But you know, I will, I do know about this. Um, it does prove very handy for companies like CSL that no one seems to ever be able to get into the court.

And no one ever seems to get a TV show made about them. I mean, we had a Four Corners episode in 2018 that was talking about blood business overseas, talking about how bad it is, and at the end they read out about, Oh, and by the way, Australia's CSL is a wonderful company and has a hundred years of excellence, and, you know, they're not to be considered part of this.

You see, at every turn, the bad guys are protected. So I got to tell you now, are they prepared to kill people to stop this evidence coming out? Um, yeah, they are. Absolutely. And do I feel nervous? I had felt very nervous for many years. But I got to tell you something. Today, I've lost my nerves. And I'll tell you why.

A much loved member of our group, a Queenslander, is a former bloke, he was a painter, he had a hundred painters, he used to paint great big factories and big jobs and he worked for some big companies. He was a, he could have been a multi millionaire, but he was given a tainted blood treatment, he didn't even need it, and he was given it in 1980, in the 1980s, and it gave him Hep C.

And he's been fighting to stay alive and, and he, he lost his home, a multi million dollar home and his family ended up in public housing and this morning, he passed away. And if he'd been Canadian, he'd have been helped 30 years ago. If he'd been Irish, he'd have been helped 25 years ago. If he'd been British, they've had access to ex gratia payments for 20 years and now they've just given 5 million to each of these people.

If he was American, if he was anything else other than Australian, but because he's Australian, He got zero. And guess what? I've lost all my fears. Maybe some people out there might not want me to be able to give my evidence in court or the evidence of others, but I'm not scared of them anymore because they've killed really great Australians.

And let me tell you something, if we don't make a stand about this and the things that are going on right now, there won't be one Australian family that's not touched by this madness.

I'm speechless.

I'm so, you know what? I can't even believe I'm actually relaying this information. I actually flew up to see Queensland Senator Gerard Rennick a couple of years ago, just to tell him about this. As soon as I got off the plane, someone recognized me and that's amazing considering I have so much censorship.

What are you doing here? I said, I'm here to see, um, Senator Rennick. Oh, we should make that bloke prime minister, but they'll never allow it. That's what this guy said to me straight off the plane. They'll never allow it. And you know what? I don't believe they ever will. I never allow him because he actually is a, he plays a straight bat.

He actually cares. And I, I, I'm not saying I'm not a promo team for him. You know, I'm just saying he's the one politician. No other politician would speak up for us. And the one Australian politician did, you know, he has, he's spoken up for us. And I tell you what, now our country's in a real tough state with the, we have to get Judy of Canada happening.

We've got to get candor happening. We do. We have to have our bureaucracy tell the truth. You know, maybe we can't get every tainted blood victim. Maybe we can't get help for them all. Maybe we can't get help for every COVID job victim. But we can do something to fix the accountability. Otherwise, we're all screwed.

Exactly right. And that's what we have to do in this country. We need honesty and integrity in the system because I have said a hundred times with you, John, I trusted the system until the COVID mandates came out and I started looking and seeing what was really going on. We have been, we have had our trust in the health system in this country decimated by the bureaucrats and the politicians and the corporates and the media that have been pushing this stuff and they've overcooked the goose and they've turned us all into skeptics.

There's a good reason for that. And then they're going to introduce a bill to shut us all up because they don't want us talking about it. Uh, but we need to talk about this and people like Gerard Rennick and Malcolm Roberts and Alex Antic and these people, Pauline Hanson and the others. They're demanding accountability and you know what, so are we.

We're demanding accountability. We're not saying that everything that Charles is saying is true or not. We don't know, but we need to find out. We're not saying Investigate

me. Investigate me. That's what I asked for. Come on. Come on Australia. Let's take this court. Let's go. Let's do this.

Yep. And we want to know.

We want to know what's behind the COVID vaccine rollout. We want to know all those things because we have a right to know. Our lives have been turned inside out and upside down. People are dying and we need to know why. We just need to know why. And our concerns may be wrong. They may need

accountability and the British have just got it right.

Come on. Come on, when are we, when do we allow the British, right, to, to, to eclipse us? We're not having this. If the British can have duty of candor laws, because they found out that everyone lied over this infected blood scandal, so can we! And while I'm alive, I ask everybody, come on everyone, let's make accountability happen again.

Now look, I'm going to reveal I'm going to have a lot of lawyers going into me. I've already had a lot of looking into me. I should say I've got a lot of lawyers in the UK who've investigated me and all the rest of it. I've lost my privacy. I, you know, I don't enjoy that fact, but while I'm here, everybody, I promise you one thing.

I want to help us have accountability, right? So this never happens to us again. Come on. It's not that hard. All we have to do is, and I'm, as I say, with this team of lawyers that we're going to have, we're going to agitate and we're going to make this happen. Whether it be politically or legally, where we're going to have a situation where we're going to change a law that any bureaucrat that thinks that they can gaslight or, uh, you know, give us, uh, bullshit answers when we've had Australians injured en masse, that bureaucrat will go to jail.

We must have that. Now we do in Australia have duty of candor laws, but what's happened is they're not, they're not, um, enacted. So we had to bring a new law to say, no, no, no, no. If you lie about an Australian being injured, You're off, you're off to jail. And in fact, I met with the former Chief Justice of New South Wales, Sir Lawrence Street.

And I asked him, it was a great meeting. I had the pleasure of having a meeting with him. And I said to him, tell me something, if you're aware of a danger to someone's health, Are you, you know, duty bound to inform them or to report it to a relevant authority? Absolutely, yes. He said that without even, even waiting to answer.

Okay. So, candor is fundamental to the law. It always has been. Okay. We are a, uh, we are a first world nation. And I think we've had a blip. And I'll tell you why I think we've had a blip. If I get into a car accident, and I need surgery, I think a surgeon will do a good job. But I think when it comes to disease, I'm not so sure that modern healthcare does always does its best job or knows what it's doing.

And so for them to be given the chance to mandate us when they have commercial relationships with these pharmaceutical companies is an outrage. Okay, we've got to have candor. We've got to make accountability happen again, Graham and John. I ask everyone in the audience, please, if you

just grab one of these caps, they're very high quality, or if you're short on money, they're only 45, or please go to infectedbloodaustralia.com.

com and support the petition for a royal commission into the Australian Red Cross CSL infected blood scandal.

Well, we've got to bring this to a close. It's been an incredible hour, Charles. And, uh, I honestly don't know what to say. I don't know what to say, Johnny. You just couldn't

make this stuff up.

I mean, this, this is, uh, this is, these are profound revelations.

Look, we, um, um, Charles has expressed his, his position very strongly and candidly. Uh, he's done a lot of research into this. Uh, anything he said about Neil Blewett is, you know, about Neil Blewett's sexuality. It's nothing to do with that. It's about the, the, uh, the disease and, and the infections that have happened as a result of those things.

Possibly being a factor in the situation. All these things need to be looked at. We need to understand where it's at.

And we need to have the option of unvaxed blood. You'll see this shirt that I'm wearing everybody. I'm not saying the blood supply is tainted. What I'm saying is I would like to have peace of mind.

I've already had tainted blood once. Support unvaxed blood. You can go to my website, unvaxedblood.com.au. There's a petition there so we can separate blood from people. If, uh, if you want to be a blood donor and you haven't had a COVID jab, we'd like to have a new blood bank. So that those of us who do not want to receive blood from a COVID donor can have that choice.

We're not saying it's tainted. I'm just saying it's about peace of mind.

Peace of mind and, and the right to choose the right to choose based on informed consent.

Yes. And on that hoodie, uh, New South Wales Ambulance. I mean, they put out a training package that I've now become aware of. I mean, these grubs.

These grubs sacked paramedics on the background of needing to have this MRNA jab, there was no risk assessments done, there was no nothing, they couldn't tell anyone about the safety, but they sacked paramedics, they sacked non clinical staff, they sacked police officers, they sacked fire officers, they sacked a whole heap of people.

Now, it comes to life in their self training package. Ethical principles, autonomy, definition. The principle emphasizes the right of patients to make decisions about their medical care without undue influence from clinicians. These people

are on

drugs.

No, it's a pleasure to have you on and we always close with a prayer, Charles, are you happy with that? Oh, wonderful.

Yes, I am. I'm a man of faith. I'm very happy to hear that.

Right. Let's do that right now. So Father in heaven, we just pray for truth. Lord, we, we, we want accountability. You want accountability, Father God.

You want us to repent of our sins and to come to you with a clean spirit and a clean heart. And that's what we're asking our government to do. We are locked in a battle between good and evil. There is no doubt. And, and, um, the, the, the things we've heard tonight are a clear indication that that battle is ramping up.

Lord, we pray for protection for Charles and, uh, we pray that he's kept safe and we pray that the information that he has will seek the light of truth in the proper forums. And we ask father God that you would bless all of those people who have at this moment received tainted blood. and infected blood.

Father God, we pray that you will watch over them and their families. Lord, it's crazy. We know it is. And we thank you for being in control. We thank you in the name of Jesus. Amen.

Our refreshing Graham. I really loved that. I really enjoyed it. I really did. Thank you so much. And especially we lost a great Australian this morning.

And so, yeah, I'll be doing more prayers tonight and I really appreciate that. Thank you so much, gentlemen, and goodbye.

It's a pleasure. Thanks for joining us. And, uh, Johnny, you've often been heard to say You just couldn't make this stuff up. Stand of the trees everybody, it's time for a whole bunch of compassion in this country.

If you love somebody and you haven't told them, make sure you call them and let them know. And don't forget in the midst of all this drama, what you did yesterday got you to today. Let's do it one step at a time and get behind the causes that really need support. God bless you all and we'll talk to you next time on Club Grubbery.
