

2024-10-07 Graham and John speak with a panel on up to date information...

Well, G'day everyone, Monday the 7th of October, I'm coming to you from Perth on the Swan River and Johnny's in Tumut holding up the flag over there and it's great to have you back on Johnny. Mate, great to be back and, uh, how are you enjoying Perth? Well mate, it's been very busy and I'll tell you what I can say about Perth is the number of people who are awake, uh, I was speaking at a men's camp over the weekend and I was astounded how many people are saying, That they're losing loved ones and, uh, turbo cancer stuff's happening, that they got jabbed and they got sick straight away.

And people have, people have smelt the rat in the cheese factory. And, um, you know, the stench is just getting bigger and bigger and more and more people are noticing it. And that's what we've got to talk about because there's a whole bunch of stuff waiting in the pipeline. Uh, that we have to be aware of.

So we, it's important everyone that we share this stuff because it's all right for people to wake up and say, hang on, they got me, but what are we going to do with what else they're going to throw at us? And we know that there's more coming. It's, you don't have to be a rocket scientist. So joining us today.

We have a wonderful crew. We have Dr. Robbie Peterson, uh, joining us. How are you, Robbie? Yeah, very well. Hoodie yourself. Yeah, we're, we're really good, mate. We have, uh, Karen Fox from Australia Exits the Who. How are you, Karen?

Excellent. How are you doing everybody that's out there?

Yeah. Good to see you, mate.

And of course, our old mate, Duncan Symes, uh, vice president of the Australian Medical Professional Society. Great to have you back on, Duncan. Yeah, thanks for having us, uh, Graham and John and, uh, G'day to all the viewers out there. Now, we're very heartened, John, because we know Professor D Gus Dalgleish was interviewed by, um, by Ben Fordham on 2GB on Friday and we believe that was recorded to be released sometime through the week.

And we know that, uh, Angus is not going to hold back on anything and, and having spent some time with him in New Zealand, John, we can say that, The information he has is not only up to date, it's relevant, it's factual, it's frightening.

Yeah, that's exactly right, Hoody. Um, I think they were a bit nervous about whether to go, uh, full throttle in the interview.

And they contacted me and I said, no, don't hold back. Uh, give it to them. Uh, and that's exactly what happened. We need to do. I can't wait for that interview to come out sometime this week. It'll be an absolute bombshell on mainstream media. That's for sure.

Absolutely. You know, and over here in the West, I can tell you all that, um, that people have been harshly dealt with over here.

That's for sure. And I am surprised at the number of people who are actively talking about the possibility of Western Australia seceding from the Federation. They've had enough. They want out. They not only want out of the government structure system that they have here in the Western state government, they want out of the federal system as well.

And who can blame them? I mean, this, this is a division that's been seeded by Morrison and Albanese and, and these henchmen premiers and the bureaucrats that have been supporting them, they are fracturing this country. It's not independent media. It's not false information, misinformation, and disinformation.

It is fact. That Australians have had a gutful and they're rising up in numbers. And so we need to discuss the things that are coming. The pandemic treaty is still alive and well and forging ahead with the World Health Organization and the international health regulations are still fermenting away there.

And we have limited time to speak about this stuff because the government this week, Duncan Syme, is going to be talking and tabling the misinformation bill tomorrow.

That's correct. This is as early as tomorrow. So and this is a frightening, frightening step made by any democratic government where essentially they, it's a, it's a censorship and propaganda bill whereby, uh, all of the individuals in Australia can be shut down and it's only the government who can be the sole source of truth and immune from criticism.

If you try and criticize them, uh, then you're likely to find yourself with massive fines or potentially jail time. I mean, it's, it's, it's just unbelievable that they could be proposing this sort of legislation. Um, I gather there's been a huge response to submissions, uh, as it was when they tried to. Put this, uh, a similar bill in last year, but, um, you know, we've got to keep the pressure on, um, uh, you know, all the political parties to, to prevent this type of legislation happening.

Otherwise it's the, uh, um, uh, the complete demise of, uh, democracy.

Now AMPS, we now have been, uh, sponsoring the visit of, uh, Professor Angus Dalgleish and Professor Paul Marrick. Uh, that's been going, I presume, most of the week. How's it been, uh, how's it been seen and received?

Uh, well, it's certainly been received extremely well.

I mean, you've got two international, um, uh, medical giants talking, uh, about, about this, this very issue about the censorship that they had, that's, that's occurred to them. Um, yeah, Professor Paul Marik, who's, uh, been, uh, was lost his job because he's, you know, he was. He's such a ethical individual. He was trying to fight for the patients, um, the best treatment for patients.

And he was being shut down and told, told he could only treat patients a certain way. Um, and this is, uh, so yes, the, the, the, uh, tour is, is going well, but, uh, there are still seats available. And, uh, um, I think they're in, uh, in Canberra today and tomorrow, then Adelaide and then Melbourne, and then I think, uh, WA, um, next week.

Now, John, you and I emceed the event in Auckland together, I emceed the one before you came over in Christchurch. These men are powerhouses, there's no doubt about it. I mean, uh, Professor Paul Maric is acknowledged by pretty much every doctor in the world as the best critical care physician. Specialist on the planet.

This guy is amazing, as is Angus Dalgleish, a professor of oncology at St George's Teaching Hospital in London. You know, 50 years between the two of them, they've got about almost 100 years of profound medical experience behind them. They're open to the thoughts of integrative medicine. In fact, they're promoting it now with the use of vitamins.

And they're seeing, they're uncovering a whole bunch of things as they look at vitamin C, vitamin D3. These things have to be discussed. We need to be setting up a parallel health system. And I believe you're on your way to Canberra tomorrow, John, not only for, um, the visit to, uh, to Canberra by, uh, Paul and Gus, but also for the Forest of the Fallen.

Tell us about that.

Yeah, that's right, Hoody. AMPS is putting that on, obviously, and it's a great initiative. And these two doctors, they're remarkable. I mean, this is the equivalent of the Pope visiting regional churches in Australia. I mean, these people are demigods. Uh, they, they are the go to, uh, for doctors in the world.

There is no question about that. And it's going to be an absolute pleasure for us tomorrow to go over and, uh, be part of that Forest of the Fallen. Um, I'm actually heading over with Foxy, Derek Fox, our aviation, uh, uh, club grubbery, uh, um, expert. So it's going to be a great day and I'm, I'm, I'm really looking forward to it.

So I encourage everyone to come down. I'm really hoping, uh, that those. Guys, Paul Maric and Professor Dalgleish, uh, have an opportunity to meet with as many politicians tomorrow as possible and that they open their hearts and their minds to what's going on.

Exactly

right.

Um, let's go to you, Karen, because, uh, Australia Exits the Who has been your hobby horse.

You've been on, uh, you're involved in several initiatives. I know you're, you're interested, very interested as we all are in renewable energy. Give us a praise on, on what's going on where you're concerned with what we're facing in the next few weeks and months.

Well, if you want to start on the non renewable unreliaables, as we prefer to call them around here, and they are factories, not farms.

Um, it's a little bit like calling that MNRA GMO gene therapy vaccines, um, farms has a nice connotation. These are industrial installations that are going in. all over our most magnificent parts of Australia at the moment. So I was at a, uh, uh, convention, you could say, of one night, um, which was called, Is the Renewable Energy Zone Broken?

And this was for the New England area. There was over 240 people, mainly farmers, and anyone that knows something about farmers knows getting and getting them to something that's a little bit like a protest is hard work. Over 240 people, all run by volunteers, all run by people that are concerned about what's happening.

Barnaby Joyce was there. He has been a great advocate for us for stopping this lunacy. A couple of the major facts. We all know that our electricity has gone up 60 percent in the last 10 years and Australia used to have the world's cheapest electricity as we should with our resources, and it's only this green dream that has forced our electricity prices and our cost of living through the roof.

Um, there was some wonderful data and district and Demonstrations on how there is no way on earth that the non renewables can ever get us to net zero. Um, as we all know, the wind turbines have, I think it's 400 tonnes of concrete at the bottom and need oil to run, um, when they do run. And, um, the components of all of these things are not able to be recycled.

They have a high carbon footprint if you want to go there. Another topic that came up at the CPAC conference that I'm just back from is that emissions are plant food and it's time that our right wing governments admitted this and started this battle for real and stopped pandering around the emissions.

However, if you want to talk about emissions, there is only one way to get to net zero emissions and still have power, and that's nuclear. Assuming that we are not allowed to continue to use the coal that we sent to China for our renewables. Some other themes that came up at the CPAC conference, um, the COVID betrayal is beginning to be linked to the climate scam and talked about in, um, circles, at least in right wing circles.

So I think that that's a very big progression from this time last year. And, um, another really interesting topic that's close to my heart, um, and Duncan and, and, um, Rob, I think after our experiences recently in dealing with politicians is that Liz Truss, who was very briefly the Prime Minister of Great Britain, Discussed the issues with left wing bureaucrats really running the government and I actually had a chat to her about this and she assumed that as a junior minister she was not able to control bureaucrats but as she became PM she was hoping that she or maybe someone at the top of the tree had some control over these left wing bureaucrats.

And she found that in Great Britain as Prime Minister, she had very little control. So I still think that our Humphrey Applebees, um, here, as well as in Great Britain are in control. They're permanently there. Um, we don't get to vote for them and even the Prime Minister can't necessarily control them. And, um, it's a deduction that we've been able to make in our dealings with, um, But to hear it first hand from someone who has been in that position was, um, interesting to say the least.

So, I still think that, um, getting our left wing bureaucrats under control is a major issue for any right wing party that's trying to push in the right direction.

Well, so, um, with what's coming, with what's coming down the pipeline, uh, with the WHO, what initiatives do we need to now put in place, Karen, given that your organization, Australia Exits The Who, is at the forefront and part of the, uh, Aligned Council of Australia?

What do we need to do?

Well, I'll just segue into what I was just saying. Um, a lot of these changes in the International Health Regulations and Pandemic Treaty are designed to ensure that our elected representatives have no say in any of these things, that all of the organisations that are leading them.

to implement these changes are run by bureaucrats. So it's, it's all a little bit linked. So we have a new campaign. Um, I'll just see if I can share screen. She says, trying to make the tech work. Um,

there we go.

Alright, are you seeing that screen now people?

Yep, we are.

Okay, so this is, if you go simply to getflyersnow.com.au, you will be looking at this new flyer that we've produced. You can download them yourself or you can request to have them posted to you. For a small charge, we are only charging for the sheer cost of printing these flyers.

Very plain brochures and postage. Um, and we are trying to get to Middle Australia. We deliberately wanted something easy to post and that was very straightforward. We have deliberately left the word vaccine off here altogether. We are trying to put something that looks official and plain in the letterboxes of Middle Australia to pique their interest in what is going on.

And that's why we've started that flyer with cost of living increases, lockdowns. Business closures, all the things that affected people out of the last lockdown. And we know that the World Health Organization is all about taking control and enforcing more lockdowns in the future. So that's, um, one page.

I will see if I can start. Stop sharing that one. So just so you know that you've gone to the right page, um, that is on Joel Pryor or the Winston Smith initiatives, new site phase chamber, um, and it's very simple to negotiate. I will, sorry, navigates the word I want. Um, I'll stop sharing that one, um, and go back to share, sharing the second section here.

So you can be taken to that website by going to getflyersnow.com.au. Okay.

And can we see that second page now? So this one is simply on We Say No to COVID. And this page will give you some more information. You're able to create letters on this topic, which you are guided through that you can send to any of your elected representatives or anyone else, um, in your community.

Uh, they could be local council. They could be leaders of the community that don't know anything about this topic. And we've got some reasons down the side of that page about why This is so important. So all of these things are leading into censorship, surveillance, incredible amount of funding of our taxpayer dollars going to the World Health Organization, which we remember is funded 80 percent by the Gates Foundation, um, and reporting.

So a lot of this leads into your MAD Bill. It's why we're seeing the MAD Bill jumping out of the ground because all These new treaties, including the PAC for the future that was signed recently, are asking for censorship, um, and surveillance of the population. So there's a lot of information on that page.

I'll stop sharing that now, but it just gives you a little bit of a guide on what we're looking at. Um, I'll just add to Duncan's earlier comments about the MAD bill, well, misinformation and disinformation. We think MAD's a wonderful acronym for it. that you can be punished for sharing the truth. So it is, has nothing to do whatsoever.

As everyone that knows fact checkers are actually narrative reinforcers. So they're only interested in making sure that whatever you say follows the narrative, you can be penalized heavily for speaking the truth, no matter as we've seen with the doctors and the scientists around the world, no matter what your credentials are.

This is a bill to make sure you don't speak against the narrative and it's not concerned with truth. So I thought that was an important point to make.

Well done. Dr. Robbie Peterson, you're chomping at the bit, Robbie.

Well just extending from what Karen has said, um, people need to know that on June the 1st, which was when the World Health Assembly, uh, voted on these international health regulations.

Um, now the international health regulations used to be recommendations that they now have become binding. But within the World Health Organization zone. regulations. They said that every country needed to have four months advanced application of changes that were made in the regulations. And they also said that when they came to a vote that at least 50.

1 percent of the nations voted. On the last day of the, in the final session of the meeting, they voted on them, but, and that's with the fact that they gave the final draft. of the international population changes the day before. So forget about the four month notification, that went out the window. And at the vote, there were only 30 percent of the country said they passed it, so that went out of the window.

So the WHO forced these things through. Our government signed up to them, knowing that it was against the law. The World Health Organization's own regulations and they've signed up to these with 300 changes which are now binding. Now they include all the things that we're talking about. Karen showed, you know, or everything we went through during the pandemic, which is the lockdowns.

And, but there's a few little other extra goodies. And one of them is that you can be forcefully restrained to have an experimental. And they mentioned in the earlier draft, but they pulled it out, but nonetheless, all the way along, they were talking about a hundred day tested vaccines and our government signed up to it.

So basically what's happened is, The fact that, as Karen said, the World Health Organization is 85 percent funded by Bill Gates and Big Pharma and of course they tell the World Health Organization what to do. So the 194 countries that are part of it or are voting with it, They're just a sideshow, but they're going to be forced to follow this incredible totalitarian takeover.

So we're in the middle of a coup and the fact that the government signed up to these Uh, international health regulations, which are no longer just, uh, recommendations, but a binding. I think they've committed treason. I mean, we are in diabolical trouble here. Um, you know, we're in the middle of a coup, um, with regards to the misinformation, disinformation, that's one of the regulation changes.

And it gets back to just expanding what Karen said before. It applies to all future science. Thank you. So the scientific method is out and whatever the who says is the science and with regards to medicine, independent doctors won't be able to say anything objecting to any, any statement they make. And, you know, it is frightening what we're up against and we just have to wake Australians up and we've got to make sure all politicians are absolutely flooded and told, you've got to get us out of this.

And if you're not voting to get us out, then we're not going to vote for you. So we're, we're here, we're at the crossroads of Western civilization and we are being confronted with a totalitarian takeover, which our government has signed up to.

Yeah, you said it pretty well, Johnny. Well, Hodie, that should be a red flag to everyone.

I mean, here we have, uh, a doctor, uh, that, that has given 45 years of his life to, to the community and to Australia in absolute genuine service. And he's saying that the government is treasonous. I mean, it tells you everything about where we're at. Uh, it is absolutely diabolical.

Just to link the things that, um, Rob was talking about then, within the MAD Bill, there is actually a clause that says one of the things you cannot do is criticise a health incentive.

Or a new treatment. So it's actually written into that MAD Bill. Another one that most Australians wouldn't be too happy about is that you are not allowed to criticize a financial institution. So we can't complain about forced mandated gene therapy and we can't complain about the banks or the superannuation companies.

So does that apply to them when a narrative springs out about the importance of vitamin C and vitamin D3? Are they, are they, are we allowed to talk about those initiatives?

Not if it contradicts what they're saying. So if they're saying you can't use those things, um, it doesn't matter if they cure you instantaneously, it's against the narrative.

They're the sole source of truth if this comes through. So, um, yeah, that's, uh,

But Duncan, they shouldn't be allowed to change the rule books, should they? I mean, you know, you just heard Robbie say that they, they only had 30%. Vote for that at the who, uh, they require a minimum of 50 percent for it to be passed.

To be fair, there actually wasn't a recorded vote either. They, they actually threatened representatives of that meeting with, you're not allowed to leave until we get this through. And they use the consensus method, which means put up your hand if you're not happy. Okay. Everybody's gone quiet. It's it's voted in.

Yeah. Yep. Yep. I mean, it's appalling. I mean, that, that sort of behavior just suggests, yeah, tells you everything you need to know about the World Health Organization. And we need to be, uh, yeah, as every country needs to be rid of it. Yeah. We can run public health without, uh, without having any agreement with the World Health Organization.

Um, and it's, it's patently obvious that the World Health Organization is being, uh, controlled by commercial interests who have got, uh, their own agenda at play, not the health of the, the people of the nations of the world. Um, the other thing that Australia needs to do is needs to, uh, basically get rid Well, uh, at least, uh, uh, adjust the biosecurity act of 2015, which basically, um, uh, signs us up to, uh, uh, whatever the World Health

Organization says, if they call up, uh, an alleged or, you know, or either alleged or real, um, pandemic of international concern or public health emergency of international concern.

So the biosecurity act. basically commits Australia to follow the WHO's recommendations. So that's, uh, that's essentially what happened back in, uh, 2020. And, uh, with these amendments, it'll just mean that, uh, you know, that the, uh, more severe recommendations will be followed. And, uh, the politicians that frequently say, Oh no, Australia is a sovereign country.

We wouldn't, we won't necessarily sign up to those amendments. Well, you know, the fact the biosecurity actors. Has already agreed that we will follow whatever the who says if they, if they, if that single individual Ted Ross decides to call a, uh, an emergency, then yeah, we're

in. As far as I can see, the WHO is a, is a health, uh, a health catastrophe of international concern, you know, as they are, I mean, for goodness sake, where do these guys get off?

So one, one thing that's really surfaced with, uh, with our tour with, uh, in New Zealand, Uh, talking to a lot of incredible professionals over there, and we're doing a lot of conversing with Professor Ian Brighthope and others as well. There is a real desire and a push, and I think the resources are there to set up a new alternative integrative health system that's going to look so much better than the public health system that we have now, that people are going to want to flock to it.

Do you guys think this is, this is a feasible approach? thing that we could be doing. Do you think we can set it up? And do you think the energy and the impetus is there to do it? Robbie Peterson, I'll start with you.

I think the first thing is there, Graeme, is to wake up a large percentage of the, the docs we have.

And it's quite really disturbing to me that with all the scientific information that came out in the middle of last year, particularly with regards to the composition of the JABs, that And people should never ever forget that around the world with the Pfizer jab, all the governments accepted the fact that they weren't being told the total composition what was in the jabs.

I mean, that was just amazing that they did that. But anyway, last year, Kevin McKernan and Professor Buchholz, Um, identified all these other goodies in it and it's become crystal clear. We now know the, an enormous amount with regards to the, the incredible damage that these jabs have caused people. And yet with, uh, that knowledge, we're still promoting boosters.

So that's number one, I think we have to get an awakening of, uh, of the vast majority of doctors. Uh, to actually what's going on now, there's a percentage that do know and they have to look at themselves in the mirror and judge themselves, but down the road without a shadow of doubt. Because. You know, we only have to look at the other side of the equation there to the, uh, which is the food industry and the damage that that's been causing.

Um, and we have to change how health is delivered in the future because the pathway we're on, uh, these big pharma companies are only interested in making money at the expense of the health of, uh, humans.

Johnny. Well, look, Hoodie, uh, look, mark my words, I reckon within, within five years, hopefully less, you'll be able to book a club grubbery cruise and you'll be able to go into international waters and you'll be able to treat, be treated by professional people, uh, with alternative, um, medicines and it'll, it'll be so beautiful.

Everyone will just be so much better for it. You get a lot of vitamin D there, John, too, in the summer. Exactly, you

will. You will. You'll, you'll, you'll. Yeah. Yeah. It could be, be like that, uh, I think, didn't the, uh, they, back in the UK, back in the 60s, they had a ship that sort of sat outside the international waters and broadcast radio.

So you could have, uh, you could have ships, uh, taking patients out and getting treated, uh, you know, outside the international, um, uh, whatever the, the line is called, uh, and then they come back. I'd like

to, I'd like to fund an international cruise for bureaucrats in Australia.

And, uh, laugh as we watch them on CCTV, rearranging the deck chairs, bring that on, bring that on. So we look, collect, we, but Duncan, just get back to that question about a new parallel health system. We've got to start looking at new systems because, We seem to be stuck in an echo chamber that we're bursting the break out of and we've got to, we've got to look at alternative financial platforms, health systems, education, judiciary, there's a whole bunch of parallels that we need to reconstruct because it's clear that the people have lost faith in most of these institutions.

Do you reckon it's a doable thing?

I think, listen, any, any, anything is potentially doable. I'm very much, I'm very positive on, on that concept. I mean, naturally it's a challenge in the current conditions because you've got, uh, some powerful forces working against it, but, uh, I believe the, the bulk of humanity, uh, And, uh, you know, the medical workforce want to help their patients, but they're in a, in a, uh, sort of a, a very, uh, closed paradigm at the moment.

So, um, there's no doubt that, uh, parallel systems need to be created so they can show the path for how we have a better future. And I think that's probably one of the things that the, the freedom movement hasn't done. It's highlighted the deficiencies and problems in the systems. It hasn't, uh, been attacking the way to go forward and, uh, you creating, um, a viable parallel system will be a, uh, definitely a way to go forward,

yeah.

It seems like we've got to do something, Karen. What do you think?

I think that's so right. Um, everyone will have an opportunity in the future with, and look, even if we just talk about it, hopefully that, um, Karen,

uh, yeah, I was just referring to your reference, the previous question about, um, about, you know, parallel systems.

I think it's essential. I think a lot of people that have delved into all of this, be they medical or like me, just someone that's looked into a lot of what's happened, we have to understand that this narrative has been building for 30 or 40 years, perhaps more. And that so much of what we've been taught needs to be unlearned, if that's the right word.

That everything from the food pyramid, what we've been told is good for us, what isn't good for us, the push away from whole foods like eggs and milk and, and meat. Um, and trying to tell us that sugar laden cereals and seed oils are what we should be eating. And anyone can look at images of a beach in the 1970s versus what's happening now to see that our expenditure on health has, or the health system, which is not a health system, it's a sickness system, has grown exponentially while the health of the population has gone down.

incredibly backwards. So, um, we obviously need a different system to what we have, how we arrange that. Obviously, it's got to be outside of the controls of ARPRA and all of the organizations that, um, so far have shackled the doctors. Anecdotally, um, on a table of seven at CPAC the other night were two doctors.

who had the gerbs and then realized there was something wrong. I've pointed them to AMPS, Duncan. I'm looking for members for you. Um, I then spoke to another two doctors that I wasn't aware of that didn't know anything about AMPS. They're going to conservative conferences. They know something is wrong.

They're still practicing. So it's very dangerous than putting their heads above the parapet, but they're out there and they know that something is really wrong. So it's a matter of making it safe for them. For them to be able to come out and say, maybe what we're doing is not working. Is there a better way?

Um, I think we need more of them on side, but it's got to be the way of the future because most of, most of the people who have been hard on this from the beginning, like myself, I'm not likely to go to a hospital until we're at death's door. We just have no faith anymore. And that's not a great place for any of us to be.

Yeah. No, the way the public health. Managed all this has, uh, has done exactly what they've, uh, Yeah, caused a massive loss of confidence in the whole system, which is, you know, supposedly one of their, their, their goals is to create confidence in the system and they've done the exact opposite by the censorship, the, the, uh, prosecuting of, uh, ethical doctors, um, you know, destroying the doctor patient relationship and destroying informed consent and, uh, destroying, you know, bodily autonomy.

And that's, and that's. Laid straight at their feet.

Absolutely. Karen, how well was the CPAC conference attended?

Over a thousand people. Um, a good number of politicians. Um, the, interestingly, the Liberal Party from Queensland, um, where they're about to have a state election, barred any of their representatives from going to that conference.

Um, which is really scary stuff for mine. Um, there was a lot of national representatives there. Um, you have Jared Renick, of course. Um, Malcolm Roberts was campaigning heavily for the upcoming election, which is, I'd say, the first time in some time he hasn't been at a CPAC conference. Um, Peter Dutton was not there, but we had multiple national representatives.

Um, It was a good roll up and the most promising thing for me from it was the number of very bright, engaged younger people. We still would have had an average age, probably a little bit older than myself, somewhere between you and me, Hoodie, but there was a good number of young people that are heavily engaged with this.

And one of the takeaways from a few people that I've spoken to. Is that we have a really big issue with the 25s to 40s that were indoctrinated with the climate scam from the time they entered. primary school. But there's people under 25 that have started to see through this and there's real hope among the 18 to 25s that they are rejecting the extreme left wing propaganda and they're looking for a better truth.

So that I think is really promising. I can give you a couple of choice quotes if you'd like. A couple of quotes from some of our favorite politicians. Yeah. Um, of course, Ian Plymer was there, the wonderful professor who, um, you know, he's one of the, uh, advocates against the climate scam. And of course, if.

The whole worry is 3 percent of carbon dioxide is produced by humans and this is changing the planet. Why are we not talking about the 97 percent that's natural? I think that's a really good comment. Um, some of our favorite politicians, um, Liz Trussell, so apart from talking about the left wing bureaucrats, was the public are on the side of the right and obviously the voice showed that in Australia.

So I think that's something we really need to remember and a lot of our politicians need to remember. Um, Alex Antic said we need a long march. direction through our institutions. And everyone knows that that's the truth. Um, Matt Canavan said the most dangerous thing in Canberra is a difference of opinion.

We all know that one's true. He also said that the government wants to silence the opinion of people. is the sign of their weakness, not their strength. So the government wanting to shut people up is obviously a sign of weakness because if you have a good argument, why can't you just use all arguments and come out on top?

Um, Daniel Wild, who works for the Institute of Public Affairs is very good public speaker. He said that we're looking at a unilateral economic disarmament. And that would be very close. So all of these climate policies are heading us for disaster, and it's a way of disarming all of our countries. Um, discussed Ian Plymer.

Another that Professor Plymer had to say is that, um, if you really look objectively at the climate, um, situation, we are already at net zero times ten. Because of the amount of forest and trees that are still left before they keep putting these renewables in. Um, so I think that's something we really need to remember.

He has a new book out called, um, The End of the World, but it's actually a positive message and aimed at our young people that have been told that their breathing is going to eliminate the planet we live on. We wonder why people have, young people have mental anxiety. So it's more, um, a factual book to let people know that, um, There isn't, it isn't, uh, there's no consensus on climate change and that perhaps the planet's not in too bad a place.

Doesn't mean we shouldn't be looking after it, but our breathing is not going to end the planet.

Unbelievable. And Duncan, Simon, we've seen, we've seen misinformation and disinformation being used to cover up terrorism from bureaucratic organizations all around the world. And that's alive and well right now.

We've seen it played out in our own backyards in Australia. Um, the, the misinformation bill, we have to fight this. And, but we can only fight it. Do you think on the band, on the, on the grounds that everybody should have a right to say what they need to say, everybody should have a right to process protest in a democratic society.

Uh, absolutely. I mean, uh, it's a, you know, basically, you know, for society to progress, you've got to have a contest of ideas and the best ideas win. Um, and we've got to remember that a lot of the people who are sort of, uh, highly influential in the stuff that goes on around the world, their, their, their goal is to create division because that's how they keep control by creating.

Yeah. Uh, The, I suppose that the people, um, uh, lower down in the, in the, I suppose the financial stakes, um, fighting each fighting each other, and that's a real, really big problem. So, but if we unite, we can, uh, the people unite, then we can create a much, much better place. Um, then, then we've got at the moment and, uh, the trouble is the people at the very top don't want that to happen.

So they, they, uh, instigate lots of division in many, many facets around the world.

Yeah, exactly right. It's, um, you know, as that beautiful lady said on the stage at CPAC, um, Karen, you know, we must make sure this never happens again. And that's what we're all doing here. There's, there's a tyranny that was alive.

Back in the 40s as it's been alive for hundreds of years throughout history. And yet we keep saying we must never let this happen again. And yet we are, we continue to let it happen again. And it just happens in different forms. And you know, that's why, you know, Johnny, when we spoke at Auckland and I made that speech at the end of the presentation in Auckland, it was about how long are we going to let people sacrifice their lives for freedom and give it up for smash dab on toast and Friday night at the pub.

We can't keep doing that. We can't keep putting ourselves ahead of the sacrifices that were made for them at the cost of our kids who are coming after us. It just, to me, we've got a long way to go, Australia. I really believe that. Robbie?

What

you,

what you touched on there, Woody, is, uh, look, 105, 000 Australians have given their lives fighting for freedom.

And here we found that, you know, with the signing of these international health regulations, our government with the stroke of a pen, it's just handed away our freedoms. And like, I mean, it's just, it's abhorrent. We need to wake up middle Australians and that's what we're on about because the vast majority haven't got a clue.

And the implications of signing these international health regulations, it's literally. The 105,000 people that died fighting for freedom, they'd be rolling over in their graves now if we do nothing. And we've got to wake up as many people as we can to make them realize. This is what's happened. So, you know, getting back to the, uh, the get flyers now.

com.au, it's really important that people, um, you know, go there and download the flyers and disseminate them all, all the freedom people and, and, and people that want Australia to remain. As a, an individual nation that we should be proud of. Yep. Now's the time you've got to, you've got to roll your sleeves up and put in because we need to wake up the middle.

Now, the sands in the hourglass are running out. And as we know, this misinformation disinformation bill, if it goes ahead tomorrow, it's going to be in the Senate, probably November the 27th, 28. Well, between tomorrow and November the 27th, 28, we've got to put pressure on all that. Senators and all the independent senators and get them to vote against it.

But bear in mind that one of the international health regulations that we signed up to is misinformation, disinformation. It's in the international health regulation bill. So we have to stop that as well.

We got a job on our hands. We do indeed, don't we? Final comments from you Karen.

I just thought I'd say in relation to the MAD Bill, sunlight is the best disinfectant.

There's never been a time in history when those censoring the information where the book burners were right. So we need to keep freedom for all and we need to stop the MAD Bill. Um, so the two websites for us are, um, get flyers now.com.au and, um, you can go and get some flyers, get them out to your local community.

Um, we're hoping to wake as Katie Ashby. Coppins likes to call them the wobbly middle and, um, get them engaged. Uh, the other thing to remember that we haven't touched on is that your representative. Your parliamentarian, your senators, probably don't know about this. They have been given the one page synopsis that says that it's rainbows and unicorns from the parliament, no matter what side of the house they're on.

Even if they've signed 50 letters that say, it's all fine, we've got it under control. So if you can get a direct meeting or you know anyone that's in direct contact with your senator or representative, that is great. by far the best way to try and get through the bureaucratic maze and be able to talk to them.

We also have some resources including a short video from, um, our lawyer, one lawyer friend that's been working with this that would be a really good resource if people have access to laptops and could play that five minutes. Um, speech from a lawyer. You might get through to some of your representatives using those tactics.

So we have quite a list of ways to go about this on the odds ends, whose site as well.

Absolutely. Great work, Karen. Love your work as always. God bless you. You're a tireless fighter. Duncan, final comment.

Uh, well, I can just, uh, um, second what, uh, Karen said that, uh, you want to go, go to those websites, download your flyers or buy your flyers, um, get out onto the, onto the, the pavement and, um, uh, engage with middle Australia.

Because as you were saying, Hoodie, there's a lot of people who know that there's, there's something deeply wrong at the moment and, uh, uh, getting them to understand, you know, have the World Health Organization. And, uh, and the UN are playing their part in creating, um, um, essentially a one world government is, is going to help them, um, stand up and, and, and push back.

Absolutely. Absolutely. We need to do it. Robbie.

I think that, uh, this is equal to the Japanese in the second world war have actually invaded Queensland and they're marching down towards Brisbane. That's where we're at. So, you know, we just have to wake people up and once you're aware, I think you need to notify as many organizations, rotary clubs, whatever, get spread the word.

We need an exponential growth period now. And you know, once you wake up, once you, you, you see this, do everything in your power to notify as many people and get them to go and read, uh, go to the sites. But now this is it. We, we've gotta wake people up in this next sort of five months. It's, it's critical.

Absolutely. We do, we do

indeed. Johnny. Yeah. Look, everyone, uh. If you can come down tomorrow to Parliament House, get down there to the Forest of the Fallen. Uh, hopefully you'd have an opportunity to meet Dr. Paul Marrick and Professor Angus DalGLISH and you know, all the great politicians and AMPS doctors that have been doing so much great work on all this COVID madness.

Uh, but yeah, just, uh, stay strong. That's all you, all you can do is keep chipping away. And as, uh, as Robbie just said, look, have a conversation with someone. That that's the best thing to do. I think just keep waking people up. Uh, just if you get an opportunity to bring it into the conversation about what's going on, it really does work.

Um, you can really. Uh, have great, uh, outcomes from doing that and just keep chipping away.

Absolutely. We do. And, um, and we'll, we'll get this done. We just got to keep at it. And I think on that, I'd like to pray us out, dear Lord, father in heaven, I just thank you father God, that you are a God of compassion.

And Lord, while all these things are going on around the world, and while organizations are greasing bureaucrats to slip into places where they can do the most damage for those people who love truth, we pray that you will shine a spotlight on them and that they will be rooted out father God, by one means or another, they need to be called to account.

So Lord, whatever it is within our power to do, may we do that with your blessing. And we pray that you will bless these three guests that we have on tonight because they're doing powerful work and all I want is truth. And all I want is people to live free and as we would expect to live. So God and leaders, we pray in Jesus.

Holy name. Amen. Karen Fox, Robbie Peterson, Duncan's God bless you for coming on. We'll get this out tonight. Johnny, you've often been heard to say. You just couldn't make this stuff up.
