

Club Grubbery - Raw transcript of interview:

2024-10-23 - Graham and John talk about the Port Hedland decision and the reaction in the community...

G'day Johnny, it's either a feast or a famine, am I right? Definitely a feast at the moment, Woody. Mate, it is a feast, I tell you what, there's so much going on around the Port Hedland Initiative and Adrian McRae and those wonderful doctors, um, uh, who've been speaking out, Gus Dalglish and David Speaker.

And, um, I'm happy to announce that we're organizing a panel between those learned gentlemen to come on and discuss their, uh, their findings and to give their recommendations to the people of Australia, John, because this is going crazy at the moment. Wow. What can you say? You couldn't make this stuff up.

Let me quote a learned friend of mine who appears with me often. You just couldn't make this stuff up now. The latest news hot from the press is, uh, with the Port Hedland crew. And, you know, we're talking about lawyers working on this and some very good strategists. I'm very happy to say. Um, yeah, just hearing back from Professor Dalgleish as we speak, it looks like Paul Maric is going to be joining us as well.

Wow. Professor Paul Maric. So this is all shaping up to be an absolutely top notch Club Grubbery in the next few days, hopefully John. But, um, There is an amazing team of people coordinating this effort Australia wide at the moment as a result of Adrian McRae and what he pushed through with the aid, incredible aid of Julian Gillespie, Katie Ashby Coppins and various others who've been in this fight, John, forever.

The website is up and running now, uh, the Port Hedland website. We're going to be, uh, posting that at the end of this broadcast. And also at this, at the last count I received from Stuart Robertson, about 4, 100 emails have gone out already. About a thousand of those have been opened and read, according to the stats.

And they are now being bombarded with queries from councillors who are wanting more information, John. This is going nuts.

Well, we've come a long way since I was booed off the, uh, rostrum at the, uh, local government conference, haven't we? I don't look so mad. Now, do

I mate you all, you always look mad.

Don't try and talk yourself outta that. You're a nut job and you know it and everybody else, but no, I get called a nut job you Anyway, let's not even go there. Um, but um, mate, this is, this is outstanding news and, um, it's clear that, uh, from the response of the tga. And, uh, various, uh, councillors who have come out, one we're going to be referring to in a moment, they're, they're really nervous and, uh, they have every right to be nervous and they have every need to be nervous because Uh, this is going gangbusters over 30 million views of that speech in Port Hedland around the world.

Uh, getting responses from people who are very concerned. You've had responses from councillors wanting to know what to do and where it's all going. Johnny, you've got a letter there from a very nice mayor of Toomba Shire.

Yeah, look, I, uh, I've been, I've been given a, uh, well, it's actually a, a, a quote back in an email, I think from the mayor of, uh, of whatever it is, uh, Blue Mountains, Blue Mountains, that's them, uh, Mark Greenhill.

Uh, so this is his, uh, reply, uh, to a constituent, uh, well, I presume it's a constituent. They've sent it through to me on my council, uh, email. It says, uh, So, this is Mark Greenhill, to put it in context, this is Mark Greenhill's response, um, to, to this email, um, and he's the Mayor of, of, uh, of the Blue Mountain Shire Council.

Now, it says, sorry, I don't know of this letter, uh, so they're obviously referring to the, um, situation in Port Headland, sorry, I don't know of this letter about which you speak. But if this is some sort of anti vaccine issue, you will, you will issue a vaccine issue. You will find no joy with my council and nor with me.

I am pro vaccine. The council has passed resolutions in support of COVID vaccines and we have banned anti vaccine activities from all our council land. If this is about something else and I'm mistaken, please let me know. But if it is some sort of anti COVID vaccine issue, please don't respond further because I am not interested in supporting such.

By the way, you have cc'd Kevin Scriber, who retired from council back in September. Regards Mark. Unquote.

Well, Mark, you need to realise that it is not your council for a start. And you have an obligation to respond to the concerns of your constituents. And, uh, I think you've gone a bridge way too far on this issue.

And the fact that you, you resonate about about cancelling all these events. You were ruthless with the, um, with the, uh, the VAX bus that was up there, uh, the AVN network, just trying to share information with people. Uh, you're acting like a communist, Mark. And, um, perhaps, Mark, you're a Marxist. Um, and, uh, you are the mayor of, uh, you're Marxist, uh, Mark Greenhill, mayor of the Blue Mountains.

What could possibly go wrong? But you need to reconsider, my friend, because Um, let, John, if, if a council like Mark's council approved, let's say a toxic substance to go into the water, I'm not even going to talk about fluoride, into the water. And they said, we're pro this and that's it. And we've made our decision.

And people started dropping dead in their homes and in the streets because they were drinking water that was, uh, toxified by some substance the council approved. Mark, would you, uh, revisit that or would you just let that go? Because it's your council, Mark, your goose. Thanks. Thanks. Well,

not only that, Hoody, I mean, I sent you a copy of a text today.

Now, I mean, you can't make this stuff up. I mean, we spoke about this last night. Council's saying it's got nothing to do with health. I mean, what a lot of rubbish. I mean, that, uh, text I sent you today, Hoody, I'll just, um, I'll just drag it up. Now, Snowy Valleys Council, which is, which is the council that I'm on.

Um, now here we go. Uh, do you have a passion? Do you have a passion for improving health outcomes and have a genuine interest in improving the health and wellbeing of your community? Murrumbidgee Local Health District and Murrumbidgee Primary Health Networks are calling for expressions of interest to join the Local Health Advisory Committee in 2025, blah, blah, blah, blah, blah.

Now all this is on the Snowy Valleys Council Facebook page. They're promoting it, sending it out. Um, so, I mean, it's absolutely disingenuous to be saying that you, you're not involved in health. And I'm not saying that Snowy Valley's council, uh, in, in my instance is, is saying that, but I mean, there are councillors.

We had that lady yesterday, Claire Willington or whatever her name was, said that health wasn't their remit. So, uh, you know,

sorry, councillors. Nice. Try. Nice. Try. You know what? It sounds like guys, you counselors who are responding to your constituents like this, it sounds like you're going to love this job.

The dog at my homework, sorry, teach the dog at my homework. Sorry guys. It doesn't cut it. You're going to get detention. How many times did you use that already? I, well, maybe I used it so often I had to stop going to school when I was 13 because I wore out all the excuses. Um, the dog ate my homework. Mark Greenhill, the dog's going to eat more than your homework unless you start acting responsibly.

Now, let me ask, let me ask Mark Greenhill this question. We posed it yesterday and we're going to keep posing it. Um, I'm going to be, uh, I'm going to be speaking on a podcast tomorrow, Courage is the Cure with Robin over in WA. And I'll be posing this question in a light article that I'm writing as well.

If you thought, no matter where you stand on all the issues we've been on about, if you thought that somebody was doing something to tamper with your DNA, would you like to know about it, Mark Greenhill? Because that's all this is about. Would you like to know about it? And if the answer is no, then you're a bigger goose than you sound.

But if the answer is yes, why wouldn't you want to look at this material and examine it for yourself? You're not fit to counsel, my friend. You are not fit to counsel. You know, we all have to be open minded. We're happy to be wrong. In fact, gee, John, we're begging. We're hoping that we're wrong because if we're right, a lot of people are going to die and we don't want that to happen.

We want to be wrong, but we need somebody to take it seriously enough to say, we're looking at this. Am I right or wrong? Oh, you, you're right.

Um, but unfortunately we're not wrong. Uh, it's, uh, well past that stage. Um, We know, we know we've seen the evidence, uh, and, and so many experts, uh, that have spoken out on Club Grubbery and elsewhere are saying the same thing.

They're, they're, uh, they're independently saying the same thing. And, uh, it's, it's got beyond a joke now. Um, it was beyond a joke 12 months ago and even before that, but I mean, it's absolutely ridiculous now, isn't it?

Well, absolutely. And Mark Greenhill from Blue Mountains Shire, um, I hope it doesn't happen, but you may well be faced with a very embarrassing situation.

You've obviously mandated council employees, given your stand in that letter. You've obviously mandated them. How many of those are well and happy now and how many of those have suffered as a result? Um, you have created a situation, a draconian situation in your shire, um, where Mark really footpaths.

Rubbish collection, basic health. I wonder how many, um, how many drag queen story times you've had in the blue mountains. I think I've heard that there's been quite a number of them up there. Mark, have you got to stand on that? Mark, Mark, Mark. I sound like a dog with a hair lift, don't I? Mark, have you, have you got it?

Oh, we're going to have fun with this, this whole issue, John. Look, it's fun.

And I was, I'll tell you what, it was great to see too, John Ruddy. Today in Parliament calling out the King, um, for, uh, he's basically said to him, look, he supports the monarchy, but, uh, if he's going to, uh, start, uh, telling us as a monarch about global warming and all the other nonsense he goes on with, we'll abdicate.

Uh, because Queen Elizabeth, uh, you wouldn't have known one of her political views. And I think that's a pretty fair assessment. Um, so I think that's, uh, well, it's mad,

mad, mad, mad. Look, John, things are hotting up to such an extent that we, um, uh, I'm glad we've hung around for over three years now to see all this happening on our watch.

We're not going to, we're not, we're going to be there at the party at the end. We really are. And, um, and we're going to sit now, let's, now let's look at what's going on with Adrian McRae. Because Adrian is now out in the open. Uh, I knew about it, uh, beforehand because we stayed with him at his place for a couple of weeks in Perth.

He is now in Russia with Augusto Zimmerman, professor who both these gentlemen have been on our show. Augusto Zimmerman is the expert in Australia on constitutional law. There's no doubt about it. And Michelle and I sat with Augusto in, um, in, in, um, in Adrian's place, uh, for an hour or so. We had a wonderful chat.

We prayed together. This man is a, a fantastic Australian. These guys are really doing Australia proud. Now they are in Russia at the moment and they have appeared on Sputnik TV. They're over there to attend and perhaps speak at the BRICS conference. Which is about a new alternative currency being formed by nations that have encompassed nearly 80 percent of the world population.

They're talking about bringing in a gold standard currency because the U. S. dollar is collapsing along with the U. S. economy and the U. S. nation. Sad to say, but true. He has made, he has been interviewed with a panel including John Shipton and Augusto Zimmerman and a couple of other Aussies, uh, over there at the moment to talk about freedom of speech in Australia.

And he was asked questions and I've got to say his response to one particular question blew me out of the water. He basically said that he cannot believe he's in Russia, a country that we're told is down on freedom of speech and, and manipulative and doing all the other bad things that Russia is supposed to be doing.

He's over there at the moment because this is really the only way he can tell his truth about what he's learned about what's going on in Australia with MRNA shots and the loss of freedom of speech in this country. He's in a former communist country talking about the Marxist state of Australia. Now, he openly said, I can't have this conversation in Australia because I'm censored.

Now, when he comes back, there'll be people who'll jump on that bandwagon and say, this nutjob's the nutjob who moved the whole thing about Port Hedland and rubbish. He's an idiot. He's a traitor to Australia. I got to say this, I would love every Australian to be like Adrian McRae. I know this man very, very well.

And I'll tell you what, if I had an opportunity to be in Russia, I'd be there with him. I would be there with him saying the same things. Now before you, Penny Wong, come out and bag this patriotic Australian, you need to take stock of the fact that people like him and us are speaking out against the narrative your government has been forcing down our throats for years, because you have lied to us.

And we no longer trust you. You have created an environment where people, good, solid, patriotic Australians are traveling to Russia to be able to voice their concerns in a free speech environment. Don't you dare come out and criticize. Don't you dare, John, this, this, this will be used as an antidote, this will be used as

a distraction.

Look, you know, I, I mean, these, these people are unhinged. I mean, we've got a government that is giving arms and money, uh, hand over fist to, uh, to countries being run by blokes. Getting around in a tracksuit. Uh, I mean, fair dinkum. Uh, I don't know, I don't know what you can say. I mean, it's just, it will be a diversion.

There's no doubt about it. Hey, poor old Adrian will come back here in 60 minutes he'll be crawling all over him saying what a, what a, what a deadbeat he is and you know, how unpatriotic he is. Couldn't be any further from the truth. I mean, this guy is a stand up model of an Australian. I mean, he should be the next prime minister, really, if you want to get fed,

I mean, Him as prime minister and Augusto Zimmerman as, as a attorney general.

Could you imagine that?

Wow.

Gerard Rennick as finance minister. Yeah. Yeah. You know, Malcolm, Malcolm Roberts as minerals and energy. I mean, we're talking a dream team here. I mean, it's incredible. Adrian McRae has always been very low key. He just knows his stuff. He does what he does and he loves this country.

Now I'm going to come out. People will say, Oh, you're sponsored by Adrian McRae. Yes. John and I both have a water bottle given to us by him. Uh, that's the name of his company. GBTK proprietary limited. I'll disclose to the Caitlin's got one as well. Yeah, and Michelle's got one with her name on it as well.

Now, I want to disclose that up front, pecuniary interests have been disclosed. I want to say this about the name of that company. He won't say it because he's too humble to say it. But that name on that water bottle, GBTK, he had to come up with a name for his company, uh, when he formed it, uh, 20 odd years ago.

GBTK represents his feelings about Australia. G Gallipoli. B Beersheba. Tea to Brooke and Kay Kokoda. That's what it stands for. It doesn't get any more Digger or Aussie than that. Adrian McRae's company is named after standout events where Australians stood proud. And he doesn't want to tell everybody because he doesn't want people to think that he's riding on the coattails of the Diggers and the Anzacs.

Callipoli, Beersheba, Toobrook and Kokoda. We should be tipping our hat to Adrian McRae. And I'll tell you what, I'll be standing with him till the cows come home. John, I know how you feel, and every solid Australian should stand behind Adrian McRae at this time. He did an interview with Ali Langdon on 60 Minutes, now he knows Ali Langdon very well.

And I'm going to get him on to talk about how, what a debacle that was. They, the interview was going to go 40 or something minutes. Ali, he said to Ali, are you going to be, what's, are you going to be hard? Oh, no, we're going to be easy on you. Dah, dah, dah, dah, dah. They showed about eight or 10 minutes of the interview and they completely dumbed him down, completely dumbed him down because he was told he would have 40 minutes.

And they cut it off before he had a chance to defend himself. He was going to let them get all their bile off their chest and then he was going to come out. And then they said, thank you for coming on. Ellie Langdon, who told Craig Kelly, he should be ashamed of himself. Ali Langdon. Anyway. Yes. What can you say?

You just couldn't make this stuff up, John. Haven't you heard that before? This, uh, look, this is going gangbusters. Now we've got to bring this a little bit to a close. Uh, it'll be a long show tonight. The reason we're doing this is we don't want to interrupt the time of our next guest who we're about to bring onto the program and Sherman, uh, who we have interviewed before on the horrible state of affairs in Victoria.

You will remember that her son. Committed suicide in a very public, um, uh, situation that she's been involved in. She's been heavily involved in, uh, prevention of youth suicide ever since. She's an incredible woman. She's got some interesting information about the appointment of Daniel Andrews to run the Origin, um, the Origin Group, which is in charge of, uh, mental health in Victoria and elsewhere in the country.

And we can't wait to hear what she has to say. But we have to give this. Information out to you now about what's going on in Port Hedland. Rest assured there are wheels within wheels and things are working and this is not going unnoticed everybody. And why? Because you're getting involved.

Has there ever been a better time to be involved than right now John with this Port Hedland thing?

No, look, I think it's really, it's really been a bit of the glue that we needed just to, uh, get everyone together. And I think it has, I think it's, um, I think it really has been a binding agent and it's given people purpose.

Um, we've always said that, you know, people are, People are at their best when they've got something to do. Well, now they've got something to do.

Yeah, this is it. And for those people who've been talking about unity in the freedom movement, I don't know what the freedom movement is. I've got no idea. If anyone asked me to paint a picture of it, I wouldn't know where to start.

I have no idea. But I tell you this, there's a whole bunch of everyday Australians like you who are watching us, who are starting to smell the rat in the cheese factory. And you're speaking out. Now, I got a text message from Sharon Cousins, uh, this morning from Wollongong. She's been a really staunch statistician who's been collecting data and presenting some wonderful presentations.

Uh, she's doing everything she can to speak to, uh, the Wollongong Shire Council at their, uh, at their meeting, the next meeting they have to prevent, to present data. And we're hoping to get her on the show to talk about her stuff as well. You are doing it. You're getting involved in grassroots. Keep pushing these, uh, grubby Councillors who don't want to know you.

And make sure that, um, that they pay attention to what you're doing. Do it with respect and with compassion, but do it. You've

got the other thing is, uh, look out on your parliamentary websites. Now I know there's an inquiry coming up, uh, into regional health in New South Wales, it's been chaired by Dr. Joe McGurk.

Uh, who's, uh, the local member here in Snowy Valleys. He's the member for Wagga Wagga, took over from, uh, our, uh, very good friend, Darryl McGuire, Gladys's, uh, uh, former boyfriend and, uh, Joe's a doctor, uh, Joe's an emergency staff specialist that has been a bureaucrat. And so he, he knows full well, uh, about health.

So look, bombard them with all this. Don't be a shy to, to reach out to these people, there's committees all over the place, there's another committee on, uh, on health that's chaired by, uh, Rick Furman, who's the mayor of Temora. These people need to know what's going on. Uh, so get in their ears. The Mayor of Temora, Rick Furman, uh, he's the chair of the, uh, Area Health Service that sits with the Minister for Health, Ryan Park.

Now, I mean, we've got to get in.

Why would a member of a local government organisation be sitting in a health committee with the, with Ryan Park? Why? They've got nothing to do with health

authority. We

don't do health. Uh, uh, look, you know what, uh, forget the whole thing with Anne Shearman. We're going to do that.

I think we need to do that for another episode because I want her to have a full hour. Um, we'll put this one out tonight, John, and we'll put Anne Shearman out tomorrow night because I think we can do this separately and get this out there. Excuse us discussing tactics, folks, while we're, while we're recording.

This is the way we roll. Our production staff. Yeah. Which is John and I and Stuart Robertson and, uh, we can't, what about? And Suze. Suze. Far out. I mean, we've got incredible people helping us out on all of this. We love them to bits. Um, so, yeah, so stay informed, go to the website, go to the website, which we will post in the, uh, in the comments and links to this particular platform.

And spread the word because I'm getting text messages as we're recording. Uh, Gustel Gleeson, looks like Paul Maric is saying yes with David Speaker, the man who found the, uh, the, uh, DNA contaminants in the vials, uh, they're coming on and they're going to shoot the TGA down in flames. We'll have Philip Altman on with them.

This will be a gangbuster program. I think it'll be a probably two hour, two part special. And this will go beautifully in with what we're doing with the Port Hedland thing. Get active folks. Well,

here we go. I've got that there, Horisa. Here we go. New South Wales Legislative Assembly. So, this is for all the people in New South Wales, now this will be going on in states all over the place, you can, you can bet your life on it, you've just got to go on to the, have your say on health reform in regional New South Wales, submissions are closing soon.

The Select Committee on Remote, Rural and Regional Health has commenced its third and final inquiry into the implementation of recommendations made. In a landmark 2022 legislative council report, the council wants to hear what progress has been made in areas that require collaboration between governments in consultation with remote regional and rural communities.

Submissions closed on the 1st of September. I mean, they need to hear about the lack of coordination between state, federal and local Government and every other bureaucratic agency that buried, buried the data on these poisonous, murderous vaccines that continue to be given in abundance to people throughout Australia and the world.

It's complete madness.

I smell

you filling in an application

form for that. I think we should, I

think we should put one in on behalf of Club Grubbery. Uh, you got nothing else to do, Johnny. Your life's pretty quiet. Oh, that's right. We've got Dr. Joan McGurr, the chair. We've got Janelle Saffron, member for Lismore on it.

should, uh, offer our, uh, services, Johnny. We should. Janelle Safford. Yeah. She's, um, she's been very good on a lot of issues.

That's very good. Um, I might, uh, I might do a bit of lobbying there and see what we can do. We might be able to come to, I just hope that they have a balanced viewpoint when they come together. But anyway, let's see what happens. Well, okay. Um, anything else before we put this one out, John? No, I think that, uh,

I think that's it.

I, I mean, I just reiterate to everyone out there, just get in contact with your councillors, get in contact, get the list, go onto your council website. It'll say about council or, or our council. It'll have some reference to council. And it should have all the contacts there for every councillor, uh, just put together your submission to them, um, in relation to the Port Adelaide stuff and anything else you want to, uh, bring to their attention and just send it in an email and, uh, demand, demand it be, uh, spoken about it at, at the next council meeting.

There you go, from a shy councillor himself, Johnny Larder from Snowy Valley. Um, alright, well, we'll, uh, we'll go to a prayer in a second. Um, please go to the website that'll be linked. It's the Port Hedland website, it's the official website discussing all of that stuff. Also giving you great information and resources on how to do this the best possible way.

It's time to get organised, Australia. We've finally got something we can sink our teeth into. It's, look, it's targeted, it's on the rails, it's being managed well, a lot of people are coming to get it. This is our big shot, Australia. It's time to get behind it. Um, so there's a whole lot more going on in this space.

Can't wait to talk to Adrian McRae and Augusto Zimmerman as well when they come back from Russia. I think Augusto's back tomorrow, the next day. Um, but I'm really proud of those guys. I really am. And any Australian who criticize them, you don't know what you're talking about. You don't know them. You don't know the situation and you're not bothering to learn.

On your head be it. So let's bow our heads. Lord, father in heaven, we thank you for the light of truth and father, we, we want nothing more than to bathe in that light. As we've said a thousand times, Lord, those who are speaking out in truth against tyranny and evil, because we are in a battle between good and evil.

Give them courage and strength. Amen. and the tenacity and build around them an army of like minded people who just want the right thing done by the freewill citizens of our country and the world. We ask all this in the precious name of Jesus. Amen. Amen. You've often been heard to say. You just couldn't make this stuff up.

I've said that more times tonight than you have. You have, I think. It's good to be back in swing again, Johnny. We're going to have a full week of programming. And, um, thanks to all of you for your patience. Uh, don't forget I'll be speaking in Melbourne with Dr. Tim Jennings. This is a Christian thing. It's not a club grubbery or political thing.

And, uh, that's also posted on, uh, on all the pages. Uh, Tim Jennings is, we've shown him on Club Grubbery. He's an incredible human being. And he is got a beautiful way of looking at faith. That's very, very simple. And, um, I look forward and I look at that today, buddy.

That's, that's all about Remedy, uh, solutions.

Remedy. Yeah.

Yeah. It's all about the, it's all about Remedy. And, um, uh, this guy is, he's, uh, he's a profound human being and Johnny, all the people we get on this program, uh, integrity Plus. Um, and courage plus, I mean, it's just amazing. So looking forward to seeing you in Melbourne, uh, you folks in Melbourne, he'll be coming to that event.

There's also going to be one in Sydney the following weekend. All the details are on the pages, be there or be square. It's free. There's no charge. Nobody's making any money. Um, just go along and learn something and be amongst beautiful people who are wanting to find the way to the truth. And, uh, Hope to see you there.
