

2024-10-31 Graham and John speak to the CDC statements for 2024-2025 season going forward

G'day everyone, and uh, Thursday the 31st of October, and a Club Grubbery update coming to you straight as we get it. Uh, Johnny, good to see ya. Good to see you too, mate. Good to see you. Yep, um, look, so much going on now, it appears like everything's crumbling around the governments. Uh, with everything that's being revealed, um, I've been in hospital for the last couple of days, as you know, John, and I haven't been able to get across, uh, what's, what has gone on with this inquiry and the results of it, but it appears that, um, it appears that they're in disarray.

The rats are jumping the sinking ship and, uh, the sharks are smelling blood in the water. What can you tell me about the inquiry?

Well, look, uh, from what I can understand, Hootie, it seems to be all a bit of a smokescreen that's sort of funneling everyone into this. Uh, CDC, uh, Center for Disease Control, that seems to be the main objective of the Labor Albanese upgrade government, uh, in terms of, uh, where they're heading with all this.

I mean, there's, there's a bit of fanfare around the cost of COVID and the, the criticism of the government for not rolling the vaccine, uh, the vaccines out quicker, which they, uh, claim, you know, has contributed to. Uh, to health outcomes that were poor, but, uh, I think what they're really doing, Hoody, is that they want this, and I think Butler said it yesterday, they want an authoritarian sort of approach to, uh, management, uh, I mean, I don't know how you get any more authoritarian than what we saw over the last three years, but, uh, they'll give it a red hot crack.

Uh, Luke Sutton sent me something the other day, and I think it's pretty relevant. Uh, the CDC. Uh, and, uh, I've got a document out that says it's sponsored by the CDC. It's got their, uh, thing on it from America. So basically the, the, the 2024, 2025. Uh, recommendations for four, for six months old to four year olds in the U.

S. is to have three, uh, Pfizer BioNTech, uh, vaccines, three. That's the 2024, uh, 25, uh, schedule. So, that's, that's what we can expect from a CDC in Australia, Woody.

Yeah, just what we want, another word salad, uh, bureaucracy that's been created to, to duck shove and cover up what's already been done. Now look at all the other ones we've got.

We've got a target. We've got, we've got the FDA. We've got, uh, the TGA. We've got, uh, APRA. We've got all these Quango, uh, organizations set up supposedly autonomous from the government, but clearly influenced by the government and big pharma. And, and, and Mark Butler wants to create another one to add to this, to the, the salad of, uh, already useless and dangerous organizations that have been set up and probably without any oversight, any ministerial oversight.

I mean, where does this rubbish end, John? These people in the photos behind us are demanding answers. These aren't nut jobs. These are everyday mums and dads who rallied in Canberra to warn the people that this was going on.

All

the people behind you in that crowd, John, right through the guts of it are everyday mums and dads who were there from frontline positions, who'd lost businesses.

Um, I was in hospital in Queensland over the last couple of days. The nurses there all know what's going on. The doctors were talking to me about it because people recognize me in there. The doctors were telling me that it stinks, that it's all going south at a hundred mile an hour and people are in denial.

I was in denial. And denial stands for don't even know I am lying. And these people, John, these people that you have fronted in court. Well, you, you didn't front Brett Hazard in court because he didn't have the guts or the courtesy to show up, but Hazard and Chant, Chant who said. I am your only source of truth, Morrison, who said, we don't mandate in this country.

These governments, these, these state and federal governments were told by their health bureaucracies not to lock down and not to mandate. Am I right? A hundred percent Woody.

Uh, and, and they did. Kerry Chant. I mean, it's hard to believe that she didn't have. Uh, information to the contrary, uh, I mean, we, we may never know, I mean, the, the cover up on this is just extensive, uh, there was never any information from Pfizer or anyone else that suggested that transmission was in play.

Uh, with regards to these vaccines and that's what she based her whole, uh, decision process on that people who are unvaccinated, we're going to be a risk to others that were vulnerable in the community because they're unvaccinated and they were likely to transmit it. That's what she said. That's what she told the Supreme court.

Now that was a lie. I don't care what anyone says. That was a lie. Uh, you can, you can say about it what you like, uh, but she, she has, she has misled the court. Uh, and it's an absolute disgrace.

And the, the, the costs are hanging over your head. This whole thing, this demands a retrial, John. This demands a retrial, but we're not likely to see it, are we?

Because everyone's complicit in this from the top down and they're, they're butt covering themselves. Look at what's going on now. We've got, um, everything coming out of Port Hedland. Uh, I saw an email yesterday from one mayor who contacted the mayor of Port Hedland to ask him what was going on up there.

And the mayor of Port Hedland said, Don't worry about it. It's a load of crap. We don't work. We don't support this at all. It got through by mistake. You know, there's another buffoon that needs to have a good look at himself. I mean, who are these people, John? Who are they? They are just leeches on our society.

They've been elected to roles that they don't have the backbone to carry out. And, and something needs to happen. The people are just over it. I can tell you I'm over it.

100 percent of it. I mean, people are just being put at risk, uh, because of bad, bad decisions. And you can't even say that these people are naive to what's going on now.

I mean, they know, they absolutely know. Uh, and if they don't know, um, you know, they can't say they haven't been informed because I mean, when you've got Professor Dalgleish, And Professor Maric and Dr, uh, Philip Altman telling them in no uncertain terms that these mRNA products are absolutely dangerous and should be removed from, from, uh, distribution.

How do you ignore that?

I had an opportunity, as I said, John, to talk to several staff members in the hospital I was staying in. And, uh, I've made it a point to bring the subject up and I spoke to some pretty high profile people, a couple of doctors, one doctor said to me, I've got the job to keep my job but there's no way my kids are getting it.

Um, I spoke to a radiographer, I spoke to some nurses. And they all said that cancer rates are going through the roof. They'd never seen so much cancer. They can't believe one top doctor that I spoke to, he said, we, we can't

explain why we're seeing younger people getting higher rates of cancer. And they're presenting at stage three and four in their thirties, forties, and fifties.

When we used to see From 60s to 70s, I was presenting with Stage 2. Now all of this, they're backing up from inside the hospital. And this was said on our program the other night by Gustav Glish and Paul Maric. They said this was going on. And I backed it up in the hospital yesterday. I heard it with my own ears and I spoke to people about it.

And they're telling me the same thing. We've got clusters, John, of breast cancer in nurses in hospitals who were forced to take the jabs. And it's believed that that may be associated with certain batch numbers. Clusters of nurses with breast cancer. Johnny, it's just out of control. And these people are going to, they know that they're going to get caught out.

They know. And who's going to be running this CDC?

Who's going to be running it? Uh, some authoritarian lot, another lot of bureaucrats, uh, with an alphabet name. There's no doubt about it. It's an absolute disgrace. This is more control. Uh, that's, that's what this is about. This is about. Uh, further extending themselves into our lives and, uh, and, and destroying Australia.

Well, I'll tell you what, there's a whole bunch of other stuff going on, John, because I spent some time over the weekend with a, with a very, um, angry paramedic from Queensland

who's,

is, who's in charge of a group up there of 30 odd paramedics that still cannot get their jobs back. Even though the court, the Supreme Court in Queensland found that the ambulance service up there.

Acted against their human rights in sacking them. They still cannot get their jobs back. They're still fighting it in the court. We've got the fireys in Victoria, who have been misrepresented by the union and by the organization. We've got 25 of those guys down there. And I can tell you, John, you've spoken to them and so have I.

Some of those are suicidal, those guys. They've had it up to here. They can't believe that this has happened to them. They showed integrity at the start, They did their risk benefit analysis. They wanted more time and they'd been treated badly. I'm sick of talking to Qantas pilots who were telling me the same thing.

People who said I was an idiot when I spoke up originally and now saying you were right, you were right. We're sick. We're not happy.

We've

lost members of our community.

And look at these, look at these idiots that are running the health department. Kerry Chant, you're an absolute farcicle. I don't know how you haven't been sacked up till now, but you should, you should fall on your sword and go, fair dinkum.

I mean, I've been told and I, and I. I categorically, uh, believe this is a hundred percent true that they, they were offered an anesthetist at Truman Hospital that has a theater, and they, they knocked the, knocked the anesthetist back being on call because of cost, because of the, uh, the funding. Now they, they won't have an on-call anesthetic.

consultant there for emergencies for obstetric work or anything else or general procedures, uh, where you've got a hospital with a theatre. You won't pay for that, uh, Jill Ludford, the CEO of Murrumbidgee Health, but you'll

fund, um, multi hundreds of a thousand dollar, uh, law, law, uh, intervention to prevent Caitlin and myself going back to work.

How much does that cost? How about an FOI into how, how much that's cost the taxpayer? Senior council, junior barristers, half a dozen solicitors every time at the industrial relations commission. How much does that cost? But you won't fund an anaesthetist at a hospital. You people are sick. Uh, I tell you, I said yesterday, I wish there was a vaccine for morons, idiots, imbeciles, fools, grubs.

I mean, fair dinkum, we, we, we, we wouldn't have enough factories to manufacture them the way we're going.

Yeah, look, right, rightful anger, John. And, um, you know, um.

Well, and Woody, you know, like, I, I, I mean, I, I'm in receipt now. I mean, I can't believe this, to be honest. After our, our discussion last week with Ange, who lost her son to suicide.

Just an absolutely dreadful period for so many. Uh, there is such a need out there for, for, uh, people to work in this area. Now, Murrumbidgee Health, Murrumbidgee Health, you have put out an advertisement for a mental health youth worker, 20 hours a week, part time, and it's only a temporary role until sometime next year.

I think it was June. Now Katelyn applied for this role, now I want to read this out for you because I mean I just, I just cannot believe this, it's just beyond belief really, I mean this, this tells you everything about these, these people. Now, Katelyn applied online, and so the manager of mental health, could see that she was actually applying while she was filling out the application.

And while she's filling out the application, she sends her this email. Hi Caitlin, I noticed you've started an application for your youth mental health worker position, which is fantastic. I just wanted to check in and see if you're planning to complete the selection criteria. They don't need to be extensive, just a concise outline of your relevant experience and skills.

I've seen that you've undertaken some great training in the past couple of years that would be highly relevant to this role. So I'd really encourage you to finalize your application if this opportunity interests you. The position is set to close today, but if you need a bit more time, you need a bit more time, I'm happy to keep it open until Monday.

Just let me know. That to me, Hooty, I mean, I'm, I'm not, not, not a rocket scientist, but that to me says it. Thanks. They want her in that role. She's probably the only applicant. That's why they're hanging onto the. You know, the, the, the computer to see who's applying. Uh, so she goes for an interview and within 24 hours, she's rung and said, Oh, thanks for applying, but you're not, uh, you're not suitable.

Now, I told Caitlin to write back to them and ask them for, for some feedback. So this is the response that comes back, back today. Dear Caitlin, thank you for your follow up and I appreciate your patience while waiting for feedback. Our focus in recruiting to the Youth Mental Health Worker position has been on finding someone with specific experience in therapeutic interventions.

As this skill set is essential for the level of support required by our consumers. And it goes on to say, the position will be re advertised again shortly. So they haven't filled it.

Now there's a vendetta going on, John. Well, I don't know what else you'd call it, Woody. I mean, now, I mean, I know I might be a bit biased. Uh, but you, you would not get a better applicant than my wife for that role. I mean, she is so passionate about that, that area. I mean, she comes from an emergency background, so she has dealt with people in vulnerable situations with mental health, uh, for, for in excess of 20 years.

She worked And therapeutics. And therapeutics. Yeah. She's in a wellbeing health in reach role that was, uh, uh, working with, uh, vulnerable children in schools and families. Uh, she's currently doing a counseling course. Uh,

she's a mindfulness coach. She's got qualifications in, uh, women's health. She's got a, uh, a diploma from Sydney uni in critical care and a master's degree in clinical teaching.

Now, what, what more do these people want? They just don't want anyone in the role. So you just leave it unfilled. Do you? Is that what you do? I mean, we're talking about a temporary role till June next year, 20 hours a week.

To work with kids who are on the edge.

I don't know.

She's also been a mother of six children.

Six children.

Yeah,

look, you know, um, this, this really. This is really starting to smell from the head down. I mean, we've known it all along, but the wall is cracking wide open and they're doing everything they can to stick their thumb in the hole. I'll tell you what, mate, they need to know that this is going to break wide open.

And you know, the thought that the people of Australia will be sucked into another set of lockdowns or mandates, they've got to be crazy. The people I'm talking to, mate, Uh, some, some people who were dead against what I've been doing, what you and I've been doing for the last three or four years have come out now and said, no way are we going along with this anymore?

We're done. We're finished with this. You know, I've, I've had people, as I've said, who criticized me harshly. They thought I was an idiot. They thought I was irresponsible and I don't want to be right. You don't want to be right because this is not about being right. This is about seeing justice done. And all those people in the photos behind us, John, they're still demanding it.

They're sick and tired of being duck shoved around and this government is now creating a misinformation bill, a misinformation and disinformation bill, and who's, who's going to be protected by that? The banks and health. Who's not going to be as subject to it? The mouthpiece media and the government and the bureaucracies.

Who's going to be subject to it? People like us. Us. Because they don't want the truth to come out and they're going to push like crazy to get this through before it's too late. But I think John. I think they've missed their boat. I think they overcooked the goose with the mandates. I think they overcooked the goose with the rollout.

And I think they're overcooking the goose with this man, with this, uh, mad bill. And I think they overcooked the goose with the referendum. This government is on the nose and it needs to go.

And we've got a

situation in Queensland where Stephen, did you see Stephen miles, uh, victory, uh, sorry, his. He's, uh, he's speech to after the, after his defeat now, the smiling assassin, he used to be the health minister in Queensland, Steven miles.

You guys were cheering because I, we're going to make it hard on the new government. I'll tell you what, I've got no confidence in the new government in Queensland. Christopher, we had no policy. And he just, he rolled with the wave. He just rolled. You know why, Stephen Miles? Because he didn't win the election.

Massive queues of people buying gold and they're paying nearly 4,000 bucks an ounce for it.

It's twice the price it was 18 months ago. It's unbelievable. People have lost confidence, Johnny, that, and you know, the banks are canceling bank accounts because people are taking too much cash out.

Heritage, the people's bank. Would you believe it? Um, you know, you haven't been using your cards enough and you've been withdrawing.

So what they did was they relaunched their tax return and, uh, they got a, they got a refund equivalent to the refund that they got when they launched the original one. And they thought, Oh, good thinking that if, if, uh, their application was in any way, not kosher that the tax office would knock it back.

The tax office didn't knock it back and they were given their money, but a few weeks later they received a letter saying that their resubmission was fraudulent. They had to not only give the money back, they also had to pay an almost equivalent amount in fines and charges. They've had to sell their house.

can tell you. Um, and it's, you know, you know what their attitude is. When you break a leg, you suffer a bit of pain, but after the cast comes off, you just get on with life.

That's the spirit of Australia. That's the spirit of Australia. What a shame it isn't supported by our bureaucracies and our governments. People have paid enormous amounts of tax all their lives.

So it's not about vengeance. It's just about seeing people get restored at the very least people need to own up to gross misconduct. On the other side and incompetence at the very least. Apologies need to be made to the Australian people and sooner rather than later, because the healing needs to start now and Lord, we know that you want us to be restored and we know that you want reconciliation because that's why your son, Jesus died on the cross, that we might be reconciled to you.
