

Club Grubbery - Raw transcript of interview:

2024-11-19 – Graham and John speak with two councillors who have had success in bringing to council's attention the health concerns of DNA contamination...

Yes. But before we go any further, Julie Sladen, um, you, uh, we had the, I had the great pleasure of spending the weekend with, uh, you and the ASF. At the, uh, at the, um, at the event in Melbourne, it was just amazing. Some great people were there. We had a wonderful time and we were hoping and praying that we'd start to see some good news.

And, um, you know, Gigi Foster and the crew working with you and others to formulate solutions going forward. It was truly a great weekend. Definitely was. It was great to see you there, Hoodie. And, and there were so many brilliant minds and grassroots people and just people who have been, Oh, um, putting their, um, shoulder to the wheel over the last, you know, few years.

And, uh, we, we had a fun weekend. Uh, we got some good things done, some great ideas that came out of it, uh, to take forward. Uh, we're not just about, you know, um, complaining about the issues at hand, we're actually, ASF is all about. What are we going to do about it, you know, and not just, um, you know, from a big level, it's also individual community and organizational.

So that's what I love about it. There's something for everyone. Absolutely. And, uh, and to think that that's culminated in today for you, it's really capped off an amazing week for you. So give us a rundown on what happened at in council today. How did it all go? Well, firstly, I just want to say, um, thank you, Adrian, for being the, the leader in this and being the first person.

I get to be the first follower by the sound of it, but you know, you, you actually provided the benchmark and which, you know, I tried to get, um, and that, that's probably the hardest one, you know, to, to do. So as first follower, um, I feel very privileged and yeah. So today I, and I published. I did publicize this last week that I was going to be bringing a motion to council and that council meeting was held today.

Um, I had actually advocated for a special meeting, but, um, my council colleagues, um, uh, we decided against that as a council, so that didn't happen. Let's just say I'm one of nine. So I really do only, you know, represent, I have a voice of one of nine. And so, um, we brought it to council in a regular council meeting.

And, um, I've got to say the support from the, uh, community was, Absolutely astounding. But, but firstly, the motion that I brought to council was slightly different to, um, Adrian's and we did amend it during the proceedings, um, today, but it was all about, um, having a really good debate around the table. And, uh, I was speaking with somebody afterwards about, you know, I said that really was democracy in action where you had Quite a good debate.

Various views put around the table and then an amendment was put forward that um, at least five of us could agree on and that's what got it across the line. So we, the motion got through five to four after quite, like I said, a vigorous and intense period of debate. And, uh, for those who are interested, you can actually see the motion in its entirety on the West Tamar Council, uh, website.

It's, uh, wta.tas.gov.au and look under council meetings and agenda. And, uh, the things that we got through were to receive the exhibits and findings as per the attachments. So, um, and I had the exhibit one, but the report by Dr. David Speaker. And Russell Broadband's letters, um, on the 20th of September, 25th of September and the 29th of October.

So counselors, you know, acknowledge, like they say that they've received those. And in light of the information they resolve to recognize the matter as a public advocacy issue with potential public health implications, advocate on this potential public health issue to ensure community welfare and trust reaffirm our commitments to transparency.

public confidence and accountability within our public health institutions and receive six monthly briefings on developments related to reported DNA contamination in COVID 19 mRNA vaccines from the state government and the TGA. This should first be sought in the new year and West Ham Council to maintain an awareness of the emerging issues.

Now I had a number of points below that, that, um, and that was part of the amendment where those were taken out. Um, they just weren't palatable to the other councillors and there were some, uh, letters as well to the pro prime minister, the, the, the, Tasmanian Premier, the TGA, and also to the local health practitioners.

But, um, so that was part of, I guess, the compromise, um, that was made. But that said, you know, this really sends a strong message that a council is now aware of this issue and are prepared to advocate for the community on that. And by advocate too, we had. I don't know, I'm sure somebody's counted, over a hundred people in the gallery.

It was packed and at one point, uh, somebody asked for the doors to be closed and they couldn't close them because people were leaking out into the corridor. There simply wasn't enough room. And I, I, I've got to say, I'd sort of had a. Dream about this that it might be like that and it literally was and I just couldn't believe it when I saw it for real the gallery was packed and the people were very respectful. Passionate I was very pleased that nobody got ejected for their passion. Especially when there were you know, obviously people were putting both sides of the story. The, their opinions of the council, but at all times, you know, that they're respectful of that.

So, um, I'm grateful. So, um, big day. Um, just excuse me, if I look away from, um, there's so much going on at the moment, these messages and I'm, I'm trying to keep up with it all. Um, yeah, just incredible stuff. So Adrian, um, you must be really pleased of course, Look, it's a, it's, it's, it's a wonderful, um, it's a wonderful day.

And it really shows that, um, you know, we, we're being on the Northwest coast of Australia and now we're getting the, uh, you know, the same or very similar motions, um, passed on the Southeast, uh, the furthestmost Southeast part of Australia and Tasmania. We've got, uh, it's, you know, obviously this, um, this idea is not, uh, you know, as, as our Premier and WA said, we're off, you know, we've gone off the rails and this is, uh, And, uh, it's, it's just so reassuring, I think, I think to the communities across Australia to see that what, what people can do when they get together and, uh, and, and push from the, from the bottom up, rather than expect, expect change to come from the top down.

So it's really, um, it's really given such a great, um, view and a great perspective on where change really needs to come from. And it's, and it's, and it's from us here at the grassroots level. It doesn't, uh, it doesn't happen. You know, these people at the top, they, they've really got to be pushed hard to get them to do anything for us so that, um, you know, we've really got to take the matters into our own hands and, and hearing, you know, hearing such a big turnout in Julie's council meeting today over there in West Tamar, it's just really refreshing.

This is, it just shows, you know, when we had, uh, you know, we had a big gallery, probably 50 or 60 people in Port Hedland. Um, which is a huge turn out in our gallery, Barney Hull's about, uh, 30 or 40. So the standing room only in Port Hedland as well. So it's, it's, um, it's refreshing, you know,

when you see, cause I assume, I don't know what it's like in West Tamar and in Tassie, but certainly in, uh, in Port Hedland, you know, it's very unusual to see a gallery full of people.

And, um, and when they come out, it's a, it's a really good, um, you know, it's, it's a really great feeling to know that, uh, you know, what we're doing at the council level is, is supported at the grassroots level and seeing that people show up in numbers like they have. I'm sure that would have had some bearing on the outcome of today's, on today's vote in Tassie.

So this is, um, you know, today, you know, congratulations, Julie, it's amazing what you've put through. I wish we had, uh, you know, we've got a nurse on our council, but having a doctor on your council must add some serious weight to the argument. Anyone that votes against you as a, as a doctor is, um, look, I don't want to, I don't want to criticize them.

They probably had their own reasons to go against, but. But, um, you know, when you've got a doctor of your integrity, uh, Julie, on the, uh, on the, uh, on the council, it's, it's certainly, um, such a, it's, it, it adds so much weight to it. And look, it's just, you know, it's really overwhelming for us over here. I've told the other councillors in Headland what's happened today and they're all just like, you know, they're really, they really feel, you know, of course, having the government sort of crack down on us up here and, and, uh, it's, it's really kind of shown that this is.

This is not a, not just a Port Hedland issue, this is a West Tamar issue, and this is, you know, like I said, on one side of the country, the North West, down to the South East, this is, um, really going to, uh, spark something, you know, we just need to fill in the gaps now, if we can get, if we can get all the councils across.

Between us, we will, um, we will really start something, not just here in Australia, but globally. So, exciting day, and thank you again, and thank you again, uh, Julie. It's just amazing what you've achieved. Well, thank you for setting the example. No, not at all. Johnny, what's, what's your take on the day, mate?

Well, I think it's a massive day, Hootie, uh, but, you know, we still have to be prepared, um, to keep going. I mean, we know that the TGA have, have essentially labelled, um, the, the very, information that we're bringing to the public's awareness as misinformation. They've said that the information on there is misinformation, that this fluorometry is a lot of garbage, and the efforts of people like David Speaker are not valid, that the control measures that were in place were misinformation.

We're, uh, we're not to standard and all sorts of stuff that they're trying to throw, uh, throw, throw everyone off the scent. So, I mean, it's difficult, isn't it? I, I, I, it's, it's, uh, it's a good, we've got to take these wins when we get them, but it, it just demonstrates that it's, it's still not over. We have to, we have to keep, uh, Keep pressing on because these mongrels will do anything to, uh, to, um, to maintain their, um, you know, their, their, their hold on all this.

Um, I mean, it's really upsetting for you, uh, Adrian, um, you know, having brought all this to the attention of the public, this, this DNA contamination, the TGA, I mean, that. They won't even they won't even put their hands in the air and say, look, we'll have a look at it. They just immediately label it misinformation.

Look, it's a I was going to say. Sorry. Sorry. You go first. Sorry. Sorry, Julie. Um, Yeah, look, and I just wanted to really emphasize that I didn't, I didn't sort of, you know, talking about the grassroots and the 57, 000 that I forgot to mention of people signing signatures and people saying petitions don't, uh, don't pack punch in, in the lower house or the upper house.

McKernan had raised it as a problem.

And we started, we started raising it and writing to the TGA. They didn't even look for the SV40 promoter enhancer until October 2023, um, after it was brought to their attention because Pfizer didn't tell them about it. Now, I don't know, that sounds a bit dodgy to me. And not only that, as I'm sure you gentlemen are well aware, all of the, many of the TGA documents that we request come back redacted, including the batch, batch assessment report.

So, um, if there's nothing to see here, there's no truth in any of what we're saying. Great! Let's unredact all the report. That's really all we're asking for. We're just asking for answers to our questions. You know, science is an evolving thing. And as a scientist, you actually have to change your mind and opinion over time.

Heck, I've had my mind changed, you know, on more than one occasion. And you've got to be humble enough to do that. You know, all the way along this, I've been saying essentially, prove me wrong, please prove me wrong, because I'm worried. And, and that was the message that I was trying to um, send I, I guess to the council in that there are all these reputable people, scientists around the world who have not been able to um, get this information out by normal channels because it seems to be being censored.

But we have enough evidence now to say there's reason to be concerned and we need to be asking questions. And I don't actually think anyone should have a problem with that. And that was the basis of my motion. I'd like to sum up for everybody watching, you know, whether you agree with us or not. The basic question for me is pretty simple.

I want to ask those of you watching, if you thought there was a chance that someone was tampering with your immune system or your DNA, would you like to know about it? Because there is evidence that that may be going on. In fact, we believe that there's evidence that is going on. So all we want to do is find out whether it's true or not.

So we just want to see this brought out. We're sick and tired of all this censorship. I, we have said all the way along that we would dearly love to be wrong on this issue. We want to be wrong because if we're right, the consequences are horrendous. Now, if we're facing a horrendous consequences, we need as a nation to fess up that we screwed up and then start looking at solutions collectively, bringing everyone together to the table from both sides.

I was talking to David Speaker from Canada this afternoon. He's itching to come out here and present his findings to the government. He'll come out here. He's willing to come out and, and, um, these are people who are prepared to put their money where their mouth is and they need to be brought to the table for good proper solution management, problem solving models and get this stuff sorted because Australians are dying.

Australians are dying. And Julie, sadly. Today, uh, you were supported by Dr. Andrew Corbett, who is a wonderful church pastor from Tasmania, who, who runs a, who lead, was leading a very large congregation down there. Now, he came onto our program, John, a couple of years ago. And apologized. He came on to talk about how he apologized to his congregation because he was strongly affirming, uh, the need to be vaccinated and he realized that he'd done the wrong thing and he apologized to them and Julia, I know you're upset about this because you're very close to Andrew.

Um, but Dr. Andrew Corbett presented medical evidence in his hand today and spoke, uh, at, uh, at the worst time I can, so, because. Sadly, he is vaccine injured and his doctors have acknowledged

that and they've given him two years to live and he's been told to get his house in order. Now there is too much of this going on.

Brad Hill from the Kelly Hotel in Singleton every day is sending me at least two text messages of his patrons who have dropped dead. Adrian McRae, you talked about the funeral directors in Port Hedland, seven times the number of, you, you constructed a cold body storage facility for them because they can't handle it.

So if you think we're all crazy, if you think it's all misinformation, then let's get it all together and let's work out what's truth and what isn't, and then let's get on with restoring this country. Well, I think what's crazy too, Woody, I mean, let's, uh, highlight what Gerard Rennick's uh, also exposed today in, in Senate estimates.

Um, I, I think this is very significant. The TGA were made aware of a, of a 52 year old gentleman who died of a heart attack in front of his 16 year old son and his wife, um, tragic circumstances. And that, that was covered up by the TGA. Uh, he died within seven days of the Pfizer vaccine. Now it was never recorded as a death, despite the fact that the forensic pathologist, uh, advised them that the death was from the Pfizer vaccine, uh, as a result of myocarditis.

Now, they are ignoring it. Now, I encourage everyone to watch Gerard's post on this because I tell you, I was quite stunned too, to learn that my cousin, uh, was one of the lead people in the TGA answering Gerard's questions. Uh, so you can see this, this thing's not too far from your doorstep at every angle.

Um, families have been ripped apart by all this madness. Uh, I mean, one side of our family thinks we're completely nuts. But we're not. I mean, and, and they're in the system, they're in the system denying these deaths are occurring. Um, and, and how do you do that? I mean, how does the TGA get away with this?

They, they, they, they never contacted, uh, anyone. They never contacted the family. They're saying, um, there's nothing to say here. Oh, it's just beyond belief. And they continue to push it. And I love the remarks of Robert F. Kennedy Jr. in the States a few days ago, where he said, uh, he was urging, uh, the, um, FDA and, um, and the CDC in America to make sure they weren't disposing of any evidence and to pack their bags because they're fired when he gets in.

I mean that sort of rhetoric really builds our spirits because we haven't heard much of it on our side but we've still got to be sensible about this. I mean, we've seen Trump get in that's led to, uh, RFK jr. Taking on the role as a result of that, uh, see Malhotra. It looks like he's been tapped on the shoulder to participate in that.

We put in a call to a same today to see if he would join us on the program to discuss his views on that. Then we're seeing all these other issues. Uh, we also had Russell Broadbent yesterday deliver a, um, an amazing speech. In, in the House of Representatives in Canberra, backing all this stuff up again.

Once again, speaking to the motion made at Port Hedland and the findings of Dr David Speaker. Uh, and we've had what's happened in, in, uh, the West Tamar council with Julie Sladden today and also John, uh, John Ruddock, the Libertarian, uh, member for the lower house in, um, upper house in New South Wales, sorry, in New South Wales.

He delivered an impassioned powerhouse speech and it's not over there either, John. Give us a brief on that. Yeah, look, John, John's essentially, uh, called out the bureaucracy within New South

Wales. He's, he's called for the, um, this bureaucracy. Disbanding of the Healthcare Complaints Commission, the Healthcare Practitioners Authority and all these bodies that are created in the bureaucracy to control everything.

Just get rid of them, he says. He went on to call out the COVID fraud that we've witnessed, the Uh, the overreach and demanded that everyone be returned to their jobs, be compensated and that Kerry Chant be sacked. And, uh, Dr. Kerry Chant, and I think, um, he'll be speaking for about 30 minutes tomorrow in Parliament on this with his motions.

They're pretty wide ranging and they're very sensible. Uh, and it was very, very, uh, uh, impassioned, wasn't it, Hoody? It was a magnificent speech. It'll, it'll go down, uh, in history as, as one of the better ones we've witnessed from a politician, uh, uh, during this COVID madness. But, uh, Yeah, I, I agree, mate. And I really appreciated that he mentioned you and Justin Poore and Natalie Prasalo as three frontline workers.

He singled you out to be reinstated immediately. And believe me, when that happens, when that day comes, John, I'm going to sit back and think where to from here. I might get the rod out and put the boat in the water because that's. That's what it means to me to see you guys get your jobs back. Um, but the other thing, um, that was really interesting about, about all of that is that at all time, it, it was very coincident with the fact that, um, you know, uh, I had a long chat with Justin Poor today, a New South Wales police officer.

I've never heard a more passionate police officer in my life. This guy lives and breathes to do police work with integrity. And, um, an amazing guy, an amazing guy. And he's been struggling. He's raising five kids. He's gave up his football career, uh, to be, to be a copper. He was a really, really good copper and he's itching to go back and serve the community.

And Karen Webb, Karen Webb, needs to get her act in order and perhaps, uh, join forces with Kerry Chant in getting the desk packed and getting out of there because these people, Roland Crystal, Natalie Persallo, all those people in the police force need to be back at work. Yeah, look, I don't know what you say other than that, Woody.

It's just mad, really. Everyone's a victim. At some point in this, uh, and, and that's very, very sad. There's a lot of bureaucrats and there's a lot of politicians, uh, that not, not, not the ones we speak with on a regular basis that, uh, um, are detached from all of this, they, uh, they. I don't know how they live with themselves, some of these people.

They must be on a different planet. But, uh, I mean, this is going on in aviation, as we know. It's going on in restaurants, in, in, uh, hospitality, in councils. It's going on everywhere. I mean, this madness is still going on. I mean, I see, still see that there's a requirement, uh, from New South Wales Health. They drop all this garbage on the, on the front line.

Uh, for intensive care nurses and doctors and everyone else. But if you're a student, you've still got to be vaccinated. I mean, you can't work any of this nonsense out. It's just complete, complete craziness. Um, and I'm, I'm, I'm still getting word from, um, numerous university students that are, uh, having to having to be vaccinated to comply with, uh, the requirements of the university degree.

So we're, uh, we're still got a long way to climb this hill, unfortunately. So, Johnny Larder, when are we likely to see a similar move happening in Snowy Valley Council? Well, look, Snowy Valley's Council has already got a motion, uh, on, on the books for a Royal Commission. That was voted, uh, an eight to one, uh, and, and, uh, that went to Albanese, uh, well over 12 months ago that, uh, he hold a Royal Commission and we got the usual garbage back, uh, saying, oh, you know,

we're going to hold an inquiry and.

Blah, blah, blah, usual nonsense. Um, so we'll, um, we'll just, uh, I'll put forward another one. I just, why with interest to see what happens at these other councils, because I think it's, I think it's good to have the momentum, um, as well. So, you know, if, if we get a bit of success in, in November and there's a few more councils, uh, Put this stuff forward, um, you know, on the back of, uh, Adrian and, and, and Julie's great work, uh, in December and January that it'll just keep that momentum momentum flowing.

Um, so I mean, it's, it's, it's really, really good timing. I think with the federal election coming up, I think that they'll be under a lot more pressure to actually act on some of this stuff now, because they'll realize that it's, it's the grassroots that, you know, are really upset about this. Um, I mean, people don't generally, I mean, Julie works, uh, for Russell.

I mean, people don't generally pick up the phone and, um, start complaining en masse about, um, about issues. I mean, you might get the odd person will ring up and, and complain, but I mean, generally, I mean, you're not going to get thousands and thousands of phone calls or petitions. Uh, so, I mean, it tells you the level of interest in this stuff, and you've only got to see.

When people like Ben Fordham raise this on their programs, it goes nuts. That there's so much comment and interest because it's, it's the story of the day and people are living it and breathing it every day of the week and they want it resolved. Yeah, absolutely. And, uh, look, there's more action on the, on the horizon as well with so many other things going on now, Adrian McCray, you wake up the other morning, you sent me a text message in the middle of the night or something about an event that you, that you must've dreamt about the other night, which is actually happening in Perth.

Um, which is called the Great Debate and, uh, mate, you've really amassed a lineup of speakers. I mean, everyone from Gigi Foster through to Malcolm Roberts. Give us a rundown on this event and tell me all about it. Tell us what's going on. Let's get it promoted. Look, it's, um, there is going to be an event in Perth called the Great Debate.

It's very short notice. Obviously, there's still a lot of energy around the, uh, the Port Hedland motion and now, of course, the West Tamar motions that have got up, um, Carartha, up here in the Pilbara, our nearest, um, nearest town, and they're sort of a lot bigger than Hedland, but they're just up the road from us, and they, uh, the City of Carartha held a Council meeting last night, and they were doing a very similar thing, calling for a Royal Commission into the entire COVID response, and, uh, yeah, It wasn't, uh, it was postponed.

It was sort of, uh, probably too big an issue for them right now. They're postponing it until I think the first or the second week of December. So that's going to be a, you know, I think they're going to. I'm hoping that they're going to get support for that, especially seeing now these other councils like West Tamar that have jumped on board and doing, um, doing great stuff over there.

So I think it's going to give more and more councils the confidence to see that it's not just Port Hedland that's off the rails, that, uh, that West Tamar is also off the rails. But while they're saying that sarcastically, obviously, but while they're saying that, While this energy is in the room, there's a lot of, there's a lot of people, there's a real groundswell of people across WA in particular that I see because obviously that's where I am and that's where I have the most hands on involvement.

I'm getting calls from councillors and members of the community all across Australia. But, but in WA where I, a little bit more, you know, connection and maybe a small bit of influence, we

decided to, we're seeing all these people go to council and not really sure how to, how to attack this and how to bring it to their own councils.

And so, uh, I decided to, uh, not just I decided, but a group of us decided to put, uh, a great lineup of people together that are really been behind this from the very beginning. Now, the key players in this entire, uh, Move at the likes of Julian Gillespie has been working so hard on this for a number of years on different legal angles to challenge the government at you know the federal courts and in the High Courts and even in the state supreme courts and we've got obviously Katie Eskid Coppins who's been working on so many of these cases in alongside alongside of Julian and helping so many of the senators writing letters and uh, These two have been so instrumental, but then you get, um, you know, investigative journalists and researchers like Rebecca Barnett, who has just put so many hundreds, not hundreds, thousands of hours into researching with the most most finesse and most accurate detail.

Um, you know, if you, if you know Rebecca like I do, she is one of the most amazing journalists. She does not put a word out of place and she's, uh, she will not put anything in writing unless it's absolutely quoted. It's absolutely, uh, backed up by, um, you know, by verified science and by some of the best scientists on earth.

So I thought if I can get these three in a room, and then of course, uh, getting Russell Broadbent, of course, who was the original one that sent the letters to the Prime Minister that, uh, the Port Hedland motion was even based on getting, you know, our, our motions in Hedland were based on the fact that, um, you know, the Honourable Russell Broadbent couldn't get a single response out of the Prime Minister, and it just seemed to me that he was, uh, you know, he was, you know, sort of a lone ranger, uh, in Parliament there, not getting the responses he needed.

So I Um, I thought if I could bring him in as well, and then I thought, uh, you know, if he's coming, then of course, imagine getting, getting the likes of Professor Ian Brighthope, who's been an advisor to many ministers, you know, federal ministers of health over the last, uh, over the last decades, one of the most, um, Most upstanding and you, you know, you won't find a, uh, a health professional or a doctor or a scientist or professor in anywhere in the world with more integrity than, um, professor Brigham.

And I've been a huge fan of his for, uh, you know, 20, almost 20 years now. So, um, to get all these guys in the room and also, you know, of course, Malcolm Roberts is doing amazing work in the Senate and he's, uh, he's, you know, a wealth of information in this space. So, and, you know, fortunate to, you know, having to have the opportunity to meet all these guys.

And then, of course, you know, it was. Bring you over to MC. And so it's, it's, you know, bringing, getting all these guys in the room at the same time and, and really tell the story of where this whole thing started and where the, where the science came from and where the, uh, you know, where Russell's letters came from, and then of course, uh, the TGA's response to that record, Rebecca Barnett, her work to shoot that down.

And of course, of course, the. The, uh, the strategy and, uh, and the legal, legal minds and all the letters that have come and written by, uh, my Julia and Katie Ashby Collins in the background to bring all this together and fill a room full of people and also stream this, stream this across Australia and the world to see how, how, how we got to where we are, but how to move forward.

So this, this event is really. Um, it's aimed at, aimed at community, it's aimed at grassroots, it's aimed at, uh, councillors and, and people, you know, obviously communities that, that have been approaching their councillors to give them a clear path of which way forward, how to, uh, you

know, how to approach their councillors and how to do what we've done in West Tamar and how to do what we've done in Port Hedland to really stir this up because obviously, uh, you know, we insulted the PM by daring to ask such a question in, um, in Port Hedland back in October 11th.

And, uh, and now we see other councils around Australia on literally the other side of the continent, um, asking the same questions that we're asking that shows that we are just, you know, this is, this is everywhere. We've only had two councils in Australia put these motion, had these motions go to the council and we've got, we've won both of them, two out of two.

So this is not, uh, you know, it's not like we are. One, this is, this has been one motion and we've lost 100. We've had two of these motions go to council and we've now won both. So, so far we're on 100 percent record. Of course, it won't stay at 100 percent record. But there's a very good chance that the, that the record is going to stay in our favour now.

People are going to have the confidence. They're going to see that more than just, uh, you know, Port Hedland, of course, people look at Port Hedland as a working class industrial town. We, you know, all these guys know about vaccines and now we've got the likes of West Tamar where, uh, you know, uh, an absolute, um, legend champion of a, of a doctor in, in Joliet Slaten has put the motion forward and this is a doctor, this is a doctor putting the motion forward.

This isn't a construction worker like me that should know nothing about, uh, you know, what we're talking about here in the whole scientific field. This is a, this is a trained doctor that's had years and years of experience that understands the science and understands what she's talking about. So this is really, uh, today's motion is, um, it's, it's changed, changed the whole energy as it's given the whole movement in Australia, a real shot in the arm.

And I think, um, you know, leading into our event next week in Perth, I think we're going to see a, um, uh, you know, a huge crowd in Perth. It's going to be, you know, the energy around it on social media. We've got, um, You know, people catching, you know, there are people hiring buses from New South Wales. There are people flying across from Melbourne to this event.

You know, there, it's just, um, you know, there's going to be a lot of energy around. Certainly, um, I, I feel, you know, I, I feel Roger Cook is going to be, um, perhaps under some serious pressure as, as, uh, we get closer to this event, because this is going to build some serious media, some serious, uh, energy and hype around it.

They're already talking about it on Talkback Radio. Um, we've, you know, we've obviously, it's been, it's gone through the council up here in Hedland. There's, uh, some councillors that aren't happy that this is, this event's going on. There are other councillors that are, that are coming down from Port Hedland to, to be there, to see, to see, because, you know, of course, you know, for this, for this whole, the people that haven't been involved in this movement since the beginning, um, sort of unlike myself, they're just learning about this stuff and they come to Perth and they see, uh, thousands of people in the one roof cheering and hearing the real story about This is, um, this is really eye opening for them.

So it's, uh, look, it's, um, I'm really proud to be involved in it and, uh, and to see what, what the group and the team are putting together, we've got some wonderful people on from the WA freedom movement, really stepping up to, you know, they're doing leather leaflet drops and they're doing, um, they're doing so much behind the scenes to make sure this event is, uh, you know, sort of one of its, you know, first of its kind in Australia.

And I think it'll be, uh, I think there's going to be more of these happening all around the country.

And, and I always said at the beginning, it was, you know, it's It wasn't a matter of, of, uh, if people would wake up to this, it's just a matter of when. And, uh, you know, I just feel that we're in a moment in time now that people are really starting to ask questions.

There's too much wellness. There's too many people dying suddenly. I had a, you know, one of my very closest friends died over the weekend, just dropped suddenly 50 years, dropped dead 50 years of age, young family. It's just, it's, it's too many, it's too hard to ignore now. And this is, um, you know, this is really personal for me.

It's really personal for, you know, I think everyone involved, we've just. Uh, you know, sort of shunned aside by the community through the craziness of people starting to realize the stupidity of what we've just been through and people want answers. And certainly, you know, it's not good news as, as Julie mentioned earlier, we, we crave to be wrong on what we're talking about here.

But unfortunately, as more and more scientists are coming out, even, uh, Uh, we didn't mention on this call earlier, but, um, even the, the famed, esteemed, uh, um, scientist from, from France, Didier Raoult, who's, who's just come out in the last couple of days and he's, uh, verified he's, you know, he's, he was, uh, sort of hoping to disprove this as well.

And probably the greatest, uh, you know, molecular biologist slash virologist in, um, in France has just come out. And even he's now saying, and I was talking to Jessica Rose about this the other day, and she's saying, he's the guru, he's this, There's no one greater in the U. S. and North America. They all kind of, you know, he is the, he is the peer of peers, Didier Raoult.

And, uh, and now he's come out and said, you know, he's frightened because he's finding the exact same thing. He's using the same, um, testing methodologies as Dr. David Speaker and, and Kevin McKernan and Philip Buchholz and Koenig. He's now finding the exact same results. So he's now pushed out saying, please, we need to stop this.

So when, when the likes of the calibre of people that are speaking out against this, it's really so important that we keep pushing. And I just think the, uh, the perfect bet that we're having on Friday 29th in the Riverside theater, the biggest theater in Perth. Um, you know, I think it's just, I think the energy around this is really going to, um, you know, I'm, I'm, uh, I'm stoked that Tasmania has taken the shine off us today, but I think next week, Western Australia will take it back.

You know, I'd like to make a bit of competition out of this and really, uh, you know, watch what the other states can do to try and, uh, to drive the energy like we are, uh, certainly, um, driving here in Western Australia. So, yeah, look, it's, it's really exciting what's happening in Perth next week and, um, I wanted to, uh, to have, um, you know, everyone's support and certainly, uh, having you, uh, we'd like to have you come over any time soon for us.

Oh, look, it's a real honour. And, um, it, um, it's yeah, I'm blown away. It's all happening in a hurry. And apparently there's been an event organized, uh, where you and I will be at a Topolini's restaurant in Perth on Thursday night, uh, before the event next Fri the event is next Friday night at the, uh, Convention Centre, two and a half thousand seat venue.

Um, and the ticket prices are very, very reasonable and it's gotta be a costly venue. Uh, 29 a seat, I believe, Adrian. Yeah, look, we, um, I, I, uh, it's, it's only 29. So even if we fill it, we're not going to cover a cost. But right now, this is, uh, far bigger than any individual or any sort of sponsor. This is, this is about, uh, getting the truth.

And you can't put a value on truth and people's health. So it's really important that, um, you know,

we, you know, we've got a great team pushing it. And, uh, the more support we can get, you know, locally, um, internationally, and I guess across Australia as well. Um, we really need to make sure we get a lot of bums on seats and certainly at this stage there's a lot of interest in this event and, um, yeah, really looking forward to seeing how many people we can get in there.

But yeah, 29 is, is the, is the standard admission price. There are some, I think there's about 100 VIP tickets for backstage prior to the event to have, um, drinks and canapes with all the speakers. Um, but that's just an earlier thing, but, uh, Those tickets will sell very quickly, we know that, but certainly the, um, the entire venue has sort of been set at a, set at a price that, um, hopefully, uh, hopefully we don't lose any more than about 10, 000 or 20, 000.

So, look, it's, um, it's, you know, even if we do sell out, we can't, we can't possibly make our money back, but we've just sort of set the price at the, In the minimum ticket, ticket pricing standard for Ticketek, which was, uh, which is in that, um, up to the 29 range. So we just put it at 29 and, uh, hoping that, um, you know, people, you know, if people can't afford it, I've even said a lot of people on Facebook said they're out of a job.

They haven't been able to work for a couple of years. So I just said, look, if you can't afford it, you can't afford it. If you're in a situation you can't afford it, contact me directly and I'll just give you a ticket for free. So, it's um, look, it's, it's, uh, it's really important that we, uh, get people there because this, uh, this information is, is far too vital to be, uh, to be held away from people just on the, you know, on the basis of, of a, of a cost or, or a small loss in dollars.

Now, Adrian, you have sent a letter of invitation to Roger Cook, the WA Premier. Yeah, look, I didn't send a letter. That was, uh, that was sent by, um, by, uh, the esteemed professor, uh, Professor Ian Brighthope. So he, he did, uh, he, he did write a beautiful letter to the, uh, Premier and to the, to the WA Health Minister, inviting them along to hear their side of the story.

And hopefully, um, you know, hopefully that letter is taken seriously and, and, uh, maybe they can send someone to give us their side of the story. But look, it's. Um, my good, my good friend Steve Kirs in the US has had millions of dollars up to grabs for anyone that will debate him. And, uh, RFK. Um, no one's come forward.

You know, there's certainly been, uh, you know, the, um, you know, f these guys have all been offered, uh, millions of dollars to come and, uh, have a debate on this subject. But, um, look, I, I dunno that they would, uh, you know, I, we would love for them to come. We would love to hear their side of the story. We'd love to them to bring their science and tell us, and show us how and why we're wrong.

Um, I genuinely can't see it happening because it's, uh, you know, it's at this stage, you know, the, the TGA sites that the TGA has been using all this time we know is through the Freedom of Information request that Rebecca Barnett was able to able to squeeze out of them, that they're using a, uh, an outdated methodology, the QPCR, which, which Moderna's own patent says you cannot use the QPCR to measure DNA contamination in mRNA solutions.

So, It's, uh, unless they've suddenly got some new science that they can, uh, bring out then unfortunately they're not going to be able to come and debate us because they really have, um, they really do have nothing but, but certainly, um, you know, we'd love to hear their perspective and we'd, uh, you know, we'd love to, you know, he'll certainly be given a, um, you know, he won't be, uh, it won't be a hostile, he'd be welcome to join us and certainly, um, you know, there'll be a respected, uh, respectful crowd there that, you know, would love to hear what they have to say, but I don't think, um, I don't think the health minister or the premier would, um, You know, ideally, we'd

love them there, but I don't think they'll take, take Professor Brideau up on his invitation.

Well, we'll have a seat on the stage for them anyway, I'm sure. Adrian, now Johnny, um, straight after that, that event on the Friday night, uh, I'm flying across to Adelaide and you're flying, uh, from home to Adelaide as well. And we're meeting up for a wonderful event in Adelaide at the, uh, National Free Media Summit 2.

O, uh, which is held at the Norwood Concert Hall in Adelaide starting Sunday, the 1st of December from 3pm to 7pm. It's a great event. There's going to be stalls and everything. There's some live entertainment as well. I'm sure you and I will provide a bit of live entertainment, Johnny. And, um, we're really looking forward to seeing all the people from the Flag on the Hill group over there and many others who attend.

It's a great event. Speakers, uh, you, John, myself, uh, Kurt Malberg, Katie Ashby Coppins and Rebecca Barnett. Another great lineup. Oh boy, I'm breathless just talking about it all. It's just unbelievable. You need to go fishing after this, Hoody. I desperately need to go fishing after this. I need to take Johnny Larder to teach him how to catch a flathead because his son Luke tells him he's not very good at it.

Luke or me? Anyway, look, we better end this and get this out. A lot of people are really keen to get, this is a good news event and we want to get it out there. So, um, as always, I'd like to close with a prayer before we, we finish up. Lord, Father in heaven, we thank you for the light of truth and we thank you, Father God, that, um, if we continue to stand in that light and hold the line and ask questions and act respectfully, And respectfully and act with compassion.

Then your truth always wins out in the end. It always shines. And we can see that starting to bear fruit now. So we thank you for all the events that are being planned for the wonderful, courageous people who've been stepping out for so long. And we pray that you'll be with all those who are really struggling at the moment.

They just want to see an end to this so we can rebuild this beautiful country. It's a great country, father, and we need your help to rebuild it. We ask for this in Jesus name. Amen. Oh Lord, please be with Dr. Andrew Corbett, father. God, we just pray that you would lay your healing hands upon him in Jesus name.

Amen. Johnny Lotta, you've often been heard to say just couldn't make this stuff up. You couldn't make this stuff up. Uh, stay out of the trees, everyone. Don't forget if you love somebody and you haven't told them it's time you rang them and told them they might just need to hear it. Uh, Dr. Julie Sladen, uh, the last three and a half years have been really, uh, Polished off nicely by knowing you and working with you.

John and I have interviewed you several times. We've met you on stage. Um, you're a real champion. You've never given up and we just love you to bits and we thank you so much. Feelings quite mutual guys and, uh, great to have you on the team too, Adrian. Uh, looking forward to meeting you in person one day.

Did you forget meeting me in Canberra? Oh yeah! No, that's okay. The damage is done. The damage is done. He didn't look quite bad. That's so memorable. I even, I even bought you, I even bought you dinner. My God. The high bids, eh? The high bids put you off. The high bids put you off. Yeah, I'm not sure. We can debate that later.

What can I say? My nickname for Adrian McRae is Slugger. He's always out there throwing a

punch. Um, Adrian, always great mate. You're just such a powerhouse behind all of this stuff. You try and keep a low profile, but I've got to warn you, your profile is not going to be kept under a bucket for too long, my friend.

It'll go back under the bucket soon, mate. We'll, um, we'll get these, uh, we'll get a few more of these councils to, to wake up for us and then, um, then I can go back and hide back under my rock. But, uh, we've got a few more battles we need to win just yet. So, uh, we'll stick at it. What do you like with a cable stitch, by the way?

How's your knitting? My knitting is, um, look, I was just practicing my knitting while we're talking here, but it's like, it's, it just keeps falling to bits. I'm not, uh, I haven't quite, I haven't quite got it down pat yet, but, uh, Roger Cook's going to give me a lesson apparently on the next Friday at Well, we look forward to that.

So I look forward to seeing you all at the great debate and it also at the, uh, the media freedom event in Adelaide on the 1st of December. It'd be great to see you there, Johnny, to catch up in person again. And, uh, from all of us at Club Grubbery, God bless you all. Don't forget, this is a great country and we're not done with it yet.

Stay in the fight and, uh, we'll see you around the ridges. Bye for now.
