

Club Grubbery - Raw transcript of interview:

2025-02-26 Graham and John speak with Dr. Connie Turney & Sarah McGuire.

📍 Well hi everyone and welcome to Club Grubby on this, uh, fantastic day where I am looking out the window. It's just absolutely beautiful the 25th of February, Tuesday. Can't see any helicopters spraying fire ants at the moment. I live in Hope. I live in Hope Johnny. Good to see you back on again.

Oh, thanks honey.

Well, well look, I'm sure if they were spraying the fire ants hoodie, they would be rural fire service helicopters because nobody else would get a start.

That's exactly right. That's exactly right. And uh, today's topic is about fire ants and we have two incredible guests who have been dealing with the absurdity of the way this particular epidemic.

Has been treated. I, I mean, we've seen failures in so many things, cane, toads, uh, you name it. There's so many things we can talk about. And here we have this infestation of fire ants, which is being dealt with abominably by our state governments and, uh, bureaucracies. But before we go to our guest, Johnny latest years, a couple of items you've got,

yeah.

Look, hoodie, uh, uh, we're hearing, um, on Chris Smith's program today that, uh, Aaron Molen has been appointed by, uh, Elon Musk, uh, from X as, uh, the journalist for Australia, uh, to obviously report on things. Uh, so that'll be an interesting development. Yeah. And, uh, and look, the other thing that I, I think we should, uh, cover off on hoodie is this absolute madness that continues with education facilities, universities, TAFEs, uh, demanding that students that are doing, uh, assistant in nursing courses or, uh,

Or, um, um, handling of, uh, patients', uh, courses or whatever it may be, uh, when they go into a placement in the hospital to actually form part of their training to get that certificate from TAFE or wherever the education provider is still demanding that they, uh, show evidence of three, uh, shots, uh, otherwise they can't go and do the placement.

Now, this is just completely mad hoodie and I, I mean, people are contacting me saying, well, we don't want it. I, I mean, I'm working in a nursing home now. I don't need it. I said, why would I get it just to go and get, get the qualification? It's mad.

Yeah. Look, the madness continues and in spite of overwhelming evidence, John, that is coming out thick and fast, uh, but sadly not being covered by the legacy media who are just abominable.

Uh, legacy media's got a lot to answer for. We've said that before, but all this evidence is out there. Still people are not doing their research. Like the head of the general practitioners, the Royal College of General Practitioners obviously had not done any, uh, research or peer reviewed papers on the effects of the COVID-19 so-called injection or inoculation.

And, uh, and still pushing the same narrative, which I believe is reckless. I think that's reckless endangerment and these people are heading up our organizations and it trans it, it transcends a whole bunch of other issues that we are facing in the world today. Now I live in the northern rivers in New South Wales, and, um, fire ants, uh, have been seen in the area.

Some people have picked them up and dealt with 'em in their usual way. Farmers have got ways of dealing with ants. Um, and we've had some restrictions. We can't get any kind of soil or, um, or mulch or anything like that.

Uh, across the border from Queensland into Northern New South Wales because the bureaucracies are saying We're gonna be spreading fire ants.

Fire ants are a very unique critter. They raft up on the creeks and rivers and they spread like crazy. And, and sadly, in order to deal with fire ants, the authorities have taken it on themselves to poison the creeks and rivers in order to kill the fire ants. And they're killing everything else as well as endangering our health.

And to have this discussed at much greater length, we have Dr. Connie Turney. Uh, Connie, thanks for joining us.

You talking to me?

Yeah.

Um, I'm, well, let me just introduce myself. I'm, um, con Connie Turn. I'm a researcher, um, normally not involved with fire ants, um, but, uh, researcher for 20, since 23 years. Um, I,

Have been involved here with fire and because I actually sprayed my place. Um, we moved out in the country wanting to be pesticide free and, and the first year we moved out, they sprayed our place. Um, I wasn't aware of what they spraying. I wasn't aware what they were even doing that they were spraying.

Um, and when I found out, um, uh, basically this was in 2022, um, uh, I've basically been fighting it since then because I think it's, it's, it's destroying our environment. Um, but to my, it is to my amazement, not many people actually know what's going on. Only if you are directly affected, um, by helicopter when you see the helicopter and when they actually inform you.

Um, but many people don't know what it is, and we have the usual state. It is safe. And somehow people believe the government it is safe and therefore it's not harming us. But it is actually under contrary. It's not safe for the environment. Um, it's basically spraying pesticides over a huge area since, and it's started in 2001.

Sorry, I'm checking over here. It started in 2001 when they found one nest in the port of Brisbane. Um, and they have been spraying since then. They did a little Mickey Mouse study where they looked at two areas, um, and decided that, um, one area had more biodiversity than the one with the nest in it. Mind you, it doesn't even tell you whether they used toxin to destroy the nest.

Um, and that might have killed the biodiversity, so there were no repeats. Um, so it's, we can't really. Clo, um, draw any conclusions from that at all. And they decided, yep, that's it. It's destroyed biodiversity, let's go. And they've been spraying it. So it's, it's, it's shocking. They're spraying two gross regulators.

One is Esso Supreme, one is PAREN. Um, oxen is sprayed six times a year, um, as Mesrine is sprayed four times a year. Um, and this has been going on, like I said, since 2001 from the One Nest when they stopped their first, um, program, they have now extended it for another 10 years. But when they stopped the first one, we had, um, 15, over 15,000, um, nests in an area of 600,000 hectares.

They then extended this for another 10 years. Now we have 850,000 hectares and they keep on spraying these two, um, post promoters by helicopter. They have just been here this morning again with the helicopters, um, in our area. Um, I live in a rural area. It's a tremendous large area from Kaba, Caboolture in the north to treat heads in the south and stretches out to Gatton.

But we already have nests way past that. We now have a nest, um, or some nest near Lum Beach up north and it went all the way out to Oakley now. Um, and of course it has been in New South Wales. Um, so what is happening? So since they sprayed, um, I think it was in November, 2024, I looked at their map. They have an active map and they had seven, 17,975 nests.

So. Um, they spread, they actually, from America, we know, we've been in contact with Dr. Joshua King from the central, um, university, Florida University. And he told us that you are actually spreading it by this program by bombarding everything with, um, insecticides because, um, um, you're taking away the natural, um, the competition, the competi, compe, competing end species, um, because they actually also, um, take up this bait and the fire, and people say they don't, but there has been actually a study done with five native ants and they all took it up.

Um, so you're destroying the native ants and you are basically, once they're gone and. Assuming there's fire and somewhere else, they can come back in. And they are the first one to reinve. So you, we are actually by doing this, um, encouraging that they can invade, um, making space for them, so to speak. We are also taking their predators away because all these, um, insecticides, it's a gross regulator and they are actually broad spectrum.

So they're not just for fire ends. They, they're telling us other species won't take it up because, um, it's in bait format, but first of all, it creates as well. And the degraded, um, products are actually more toxic, toxic than their product itself. Um, and they have been classed, some of them have been classed as, um.

Toxic, very toxic. And one of the products, um, has been classed as extremely toxic. So, so they're actually worse. And there's no studies done on these, um, degraded products. Um, this, well, I shouldn't say low, I've found a couple, but they, they weren't very extensive, but they're telling us how dangerous these products are and they stay in the soil for 30 days.

Um, so, so they actually we're not only having the product itself, but we're having the degraded products as well. So, and they're not only affecting the insects, but um, we found that they also, um, affect, um, amphibians like the frogs. Um, they have been found to affect mice. We know that they get, um, that they are bioaccumulative, um, they in the tissue.

So when you give it to chicken, they actually, um. It gets into the eggs and into their tissue. When you give it to cows, it gets into the milk. And so it's not only affecting them, it'll affect us in a sense too, if we eat chicken and, uh, if we eat eggs and to drink milk. Um, so it's, it's not just a little effect, it's a huge effect.

Um, and it's a huge effect on the soil as well. It kills the soil enzymes. Um, the bite, the degraded products are very toxic to earthworms, so we're having a huge impact on the whole environment, and we're spraying in areas where the ants are actually not going. So these ants, they like disturbed soil, so they are found near roadside, wherever you disturb, disturb the soil.

They, they, that's where they are. They don't like forest, so you wouldn't probably find them in a forest. Um. And, and we are spraying everywhere regardless of where they actually are.

Okay. So, yeah, thank you. Uh, that was a very lengthy introduction, but that's, that's, that's all good. Okay. No, that, that's okay.

Um, and Sarah McGuire, you're a, um, you're an accountant by trade. Tell us a bit about your background prior to coming involved in the finance and how you living in the Sanford Valley, in the northwest of Brisbane. So tell us a bit about that.

Yeah. Well, um, yeah, I'm a chartered accountant. I also teach piano as well.

Um, I, I love, I've got two children. I've been living in Sanford, which is a beautiful valley. Um, lots of creeks and waterways. Me and the kids just love walking and going in the creeks. And so, um, yeah, I'm just a regular mom, not, you know, just, and somehow I've now ended up having to speak about this absolute.

Tyranny that's going on at the moment we're, uh, the assault of helicopters, as Connie mentioned, you know, I just woke up one morning, um, in May last year, and the helicopters are swooping all around the valley, and I

just, as a mom, I was like, what's, what's going on? You know, all this stuff is coming out and, and I could see it clearly going into the waterways.

Um, so yeah, the Sanford story has hit the news because, um, we, we, us residents took water samples, um, independent independently, and, uh, 'cause we could see all the creeks were covered in these poisons. And, um, we got, uh, a result back saying the levels of those chemicals in our creek was alarmingly high and, um, a serious contamination event.

So, and the program subsequently admitted that same week that the helicopters came in a, in a public meeting in Sanford, that they've made a mistake. They're sorry. Um, and, uh, they've reported themselves to the regulator, but I literally only got a letter last week saying, um, that they were fined \$20,000 by, uh, department of Environment.

Um, if that had been a mining company or an individual, it would've been at least double that, I'm sure. Uh, but then they didn't even have to pay the fine. They just got a slap on the wrist and told, oh, well as long as you do a study in the area. So they're now doing a \$20,000 study in Sanford looking at native ants.

However, they should have done this study a year ago before they put the poisons down because there's no baseline for that study. No. Um, so they, they, they're now paying themselves the fine to do a study here that they should have done previously. And this study only looks at native ants, it doesn't look at all the other animals.

This is affecting and we've since had sick geckos lizards. Dead birds, dead, um, poultry, um, paralyzed poultry, people with skin reactions. Um, at the day I went to that creek and got those water samples. My face ended up burning up because it was all in the trees 'cause they dropped it over this canopy area.

I had a red burning face. There was people with respiratory issues. So it's just been atrocious what we've had to live with. And um, and now they're back in my area just poisoning every property and they go on to people's property and just spread this corn grs type stuff around. It's full of these pesticides.

Um, and so yeah, today they're driving around my area and it's about to rain and they're not supposed to put these chemicals into waterways and they're not supposed to do it before rain. And every time they come here it rains and it washes it again all into our waterways.

Good grief. And I'm. They're quite draconian.

These guys, these crews that come around to people's properties, you don't seem to have any right to, uh, to deny them access to your property or anything. And the way this has been implemented by the Queensland government seems to be completely reckless, Johnny.

Well, it amazes me. Uh, you know, how is it in this country that we, we've, we've ended up with a situation where, uh, you know, they, they'll argue that, you know, 40, 50 years ago things were very laissez-faire.

You know, you basically do whatever you like, remove asbestos, and, you know, nothing, nothing to worry about. But I mean, with all this added governance that, that's now upon us, I mean, how, how does this sort of stuff occur? I mean, it sounds to me, uh, anecdotally that things are worse than they were 50 years ago.

What do you think, uh, Connie, is it, is it mad? Well, the,

the problem too is that they're not listening. They're not listening to the signs anymore. I mean, we've seen this before. They just ignore, they just pick the signs. They pick the ones that say something they want to hear and then ignore everything else.

And that, that is just not science. I mean, you, you have to look, hear both stories because I mean, we put up hypothesis and we say, this is how it is, and then we try to tell, prove it. But if new knowledge comes in, this might have not been right. And if you don't listen to both sides of the story, you, you, you never advance.

You just stay where you are and Yeah. And that, that is a problem. And I. The governments also work with each other. So when my property was first sprayed, I looked at the permit and it was, and it said there, do not spray if there's no fire and or residuals or fire and present. So I basically told them, you can't spray here.

It's not, they're not, they're not present. I went to the PVMS, the Australian Pesticide and Medicine Authority, uh, veterinary Medicine Authority, and I said to, uh, I basically said, there's a breach of the permit. So they said, oh yeah, we take this very, very seriously. Two years later, they put my complaint to the deaf and said, um, and they were looking at it, and of course there was nothing to see because they're in charge of the fire end group.

And my complaint just went. Into nowhere. Um, so, so they're not actually, I mean, this is a, I mean, how can you basically, um, look at a permit when you are doing the thing and then giving a, um, saying there's nothing there to see. Um, that's a conflict of interest to start off with. And the fire and the PVMA has the authority to actually bring things to, to court, but they didn't want to do that.

And then, um, in, in the, no, in two, uh, two, sometime later, I forgot what the date was, sometime later they changed the permit and took that sentence out. So, so they could spray, I mean, what is this? Um, I mean, either you shouldn't spray when it's not, when there's no fire ends, because there's a reason why you put that in, in the first place, but all of a sudden that reason's gone and you asked them for.

The same with them. I live, all the farms around here are organic growing. Um, so they were on the roadside and I came out to them. I said, why are you spraying here and it's organic. And they taught me, oh no, you can't spray this on organic ground. And well, I didn't know that at the time, so I couldn't argue there.

So I looked it up and I asked, um, organic grow, um, grower association. So, so can you spray it? And it turned out there was a withholding period of a year when you spray on organic crown this stuff. Um, and um, sometimes later in the same year, the department changed that and it is now a withholding period of three weeks.

So we are coming from one year down to three weeks. How is that possible and where on earth is the, the, the, the studies they have done to prove that this is not affecting us anymore. They of course, wouldn't give this to me. They said I needed to have a right to, um, information request, and we know how that goes.

Uh, like black out most of the things. Um, so yeah, so the snow study done, I can't find any studies that say that this is, um, that they can spread over so many, um, over, so such a big area. And the permits they're having, they are, um, limited use permits. What are the minor use permits? What that means is a, according to their own definition on their website, you can only spray 10% of a total area of crops, number of elements or areas of situations, or 10,000 hectares.

Now we spraying over 850,000 hectares. How is that a minor permit? Um, actually it makes no sense whatsoever. So, yeah, so, and that's, that's our problems. They're not listening, they're just changing so they can do it.

So we, we've seen the department of, uh, primary industries in New South Wales, uh, pick up, uh, a small infestation of mite.

And as a result of that, they destroyed thousands of hives within a radius of Newcastle. They wiped out several businesses and, uh, they destroyed millions of bees. They put a, a petrol soaked rag in the top of every hive and killed the, um, and killed the bees. Now I've seen video of, of, uh, beekeepers crying because they love their bees and they all said that all their hives were checked and there was no var varroa mite in any of the hives.

But it didn't matter to the DPI. Then months after eradicating so many hives and achieving nothing, they came out and said, no, maybe that wasn't such a good idea. Maybe what we need to do is just learn to live with var mite. I mean, but, but yeah. How, how often do we have to put up with this rubbish? It's the same with the vaccines.

John, the, the COVID-19 injectables. We've seen the same thing happen there. They're oblivious to the damage they've done. They're quite happy to say, it's all right in 50 years time, we'll apologize, uh, to Australia, and that'll make it all right. I mean, where do you go with that Sarah McGuire?

Yeah. I mean, this, this is exactly what's going on.

Um, it's just another way to, um, I don't know, get money. For me, this is about the money. As an, as an accountant, the first thing I did when I found out about this program was look at where the money's coming from to pay for this program. I since found out they have spent almost \$1.6 billion. In the last 20 years on this program, and the ants are now 20 times worse.

And they keep saying they're eradicating, but they're not eradicating anything. These ants have just grown. Like even when they found them back in 2001, they were already covering about 40,000 hectares of land that would've been the largest ever eradication if they could have done it back then. And they couldn't.

They, the ants were already here. They were very entrenched. They think the ants had been living here for about 10 years prior to that time when they found them. So they had no idea where the ants were. And, um, so they, and, and they only get money from the commonwealth if they call it eradication. So the Queensland government who's running this program only, uh, gets the funding from the other states if they call it eradication.

And so far, Queensland only contributes 10% of that funding. So out of 1.6 billion, all that money's coming from other states under Commonwealth, and they're just wasting the money. It's become like an employment program. They employ 500 grand crew to go around and terrorize us in our homes, and they force entry onto our property.

They say they bring the police with them. Now they, they say, um, step aside, are you going to be violent? So people are going, no, no, I'm not violent, but I, I'm, I don't want this on my property. So they just, they just jump fences. They break, they take bolt cutters, they cut your gate down. They, um, there, there was an incident in Beachmont only a week ago, they turned up on mass with the police, um, to all the properties that had said no and wouldn't let them in.

And they broke their gates. They jumped fences. There was women crying, there were children screaming, and they just did not care. They went on those properties and they poisoned everyone's property in Beechmont who had actually tried to say no. And the thing is, though, with the biosecurity Act, it's like what they did during Covid, you know, they bring in all these draconian measures and say it's for the greater good.

But in the biosecurity Act there's one little section, section 3, 3, 6, and it says, um, you, if a person has obstructed an officer, the um, a person must not obstruct a designated officer, but unless the person has a reasonable excuse. So we've been talking to lawyers about what is a reasonable excuse. And at the moment, the program gets to decide if you have a reasonable excuse.

And even with health issues, they've said to people, that's not reasonable. We don't believe that's reasonable. So they still come on and we're trying to, um, assert our rights here under the act that says we can have a reasonable excuse. And they, they don't let us. They, they, they are ignoring it. I have a lady at the Gold Coast who has spent \$30,000 on legal advice to keep them off her property.

And the barrister told her, I think you should just let them treat your property. Even a barrister saying that. So it's like, um, like I've saying, I, I've, I've been, since CS all started happening in Sanford, I set up a group called Fire

and Treatment Alternatives. 'cause I believe there's an alternative way to deal with this that doesn't involve poisoning the whole environment and taking over people's property rights.

But, um, as much as advice we got, I've been working with Peter Fa, the human rights lawyer. They've even stonewalled him. They, Peter Fa wrote a letter on our behalf to ask the commissioner of Police, what is your involvement? In, um, you know, running this program with the, or, you know, uh, what, what do you believe is a reasonable excuse?

'cause your police officers are allowing people to enter properties when they're being told no. And they just sent us a non-response, you know, just saying, oh, just look at our policies. We are just working within the guidelines and we don't offer legal advice. But if they're being judge and jury on the day of saying whether your excuse is reasonable or not, that shouldn't be allowed.

I mean, it should go to a judge or a magistrate, you know, it, a, a judge should be deeming whether I've got a reasonable excuse. But even when you've got doctor certificates, um, they, they're saying that's not good enough. We want the pathology reports to show it's that the be it's our poisons that are pesticides that are causing your illness.

So it was like during Covid, you couldn't get a doctor's certificate to say. You shouldn't have the vaccine. It was like, you know, unless you had a, um, an anaphylactic response. But it's like this. There's no, um, there's no justice here. There's no accountability either to what they're doing. So

John, uh, once again, state governments, uh, militarizing a police force as thugs to enforce ridiculous policies that are upsetting people and, and, uh, destroying their lives.

Well, dy I, I'm, I'm just sitting here thinking about this Now, you, you, you know me as, as well as anyone there. I, I'm not a violent person at all, but, you know, I, I'm just sitting here thinking, I, I mean, APA is accusing me of civil disobedience. I mean, I mean, you cannot sit here and participate in listening to this every day of the week, um, for the past five years and think that, that unless something happens, we, we, we are just going down the toilet quicker than you could imagine.

I, I mean, people must be just thinking here. Ham, what are the authorities doing? Wh where is safe work? Uh, whatever they call themselves in these ju jurisdictions, I mean, do they even operate? I mean, the police are all over you for, for doing five kilometers over the speed limit. Uh, but this sort of nonsense goes on every day of the week.

And I mean, people must be just sitting there thinking, how do we take back this country? Because it is absolutely being decimated by clowns. Uh, and, and, and look, I heard Albanese this morning on Ben Fordham's program. Um, you know, he was, he was outed, uh, uh, about some bureaucrat knocking back \$2 million for the Red Nose Foundation hoodie that we were talking about the other day.

Uh, for the sids. Now, I mean, I'm, I'm sure that money is, is, is, is doing a a, a lot of good work for, uh, for, for families that are. Uh, needing support after going through such a tragic event. But how is it that he can get on two GB and and reverse that decision to, to hand over that money in 30 seconds? But all this stuff just goes unchecked.

Uh, uh, uh, and it doesn't matter what it is. I mean, you're pouring chemicals into creeks. You've got evidence that, that, that, that things, um, you know, skyrocketing. Uh, w we with toxins, nobody cares. Nobody gives two hoots.

No. Look, it's absolutely beyond our comprehension, but it is getting worse, as you say. I mean, you know, they're, they're bringing out all this hate speech legislation they're bringing, they're taking away all of our freedoms because they're realizing that the people are getting more and more angry about the ridiculous nature of the legislation that's brought to, to bear on us in this country.

Legislation that gives permission to. Police forces to act like thugs, like enforcers, and that's not their role at all. Their act, their role is actually to protect and serve the public. And they're not doing that. They're being used. They're being used in conjunction with aiding and abetting. What we can now really say are criminal organizations that are doing, that are doing things that are hurting the people that our police are sworn to serve.

And that's not the way I, you know, I can guarantee you that they're, most of the officers serving our state police services did not sign up for this. This is not what they signed up for. And it's up to them to say, enough is enough. Well, buddy, true.

I mean, look at, look, look at the scenario here. I mean, you, you, you don't have to be Einstein to work it out.

I mean, you, you, you, you pour this stuff down the river and half a dozen chooks on some, on some free range farm, drop dead from drinking it. Next minute, these grubs from these authorities, they'll be pouncing on this farm saying, oh geez, we've got chook influenza here. We've gotta destroy everything and, and, and create some new BS drama.

You know, this is how these gros operate. I mean, th they need to, they need to be, uh, held to account. Um, I, I mean, I don't know what a coup looks like in Australia, but a fairing, and we need one here. I'll tell you these. These jonos that are running Australia are absolutely running us into the ground. Uh, they, they are playing from some playbook songbook that's, that's written elsewhere.

I'm absolutely certain of it, but we've had enough, uh, and I'll tell you, it, it, it, it may just be, uh, smashing up albanese at the next, uh, election. But, uh, really and truly, uh, I mean, have a, have a Cold Bath people and wake up to what's going on. I mean, this is just completely criminal. Well, a,

after this happened in Sanford, I obviously went to all the mps to say, Hey, this is going down here in Sanford.

What are you gonna do to help us? The Greens didn't want a bar of it. They, they just totally ignored me. I went to my local member, um, state member Nikki Boyd. Um, we said, please help us, you know, Sanford's had this serious contamination event. She said. I can't really help. Um, I have a conflict of interest.

My husband is Reese pta, who is one of the advocacy managers for the Invasive Species Council that lobbies the government for more and more money to spend on this program. So our local member couldn't help me. So then I went to Peter Dutton because he's our, our, our federal member. And I said, please help us.

And he did actually meet with me and he was the go, he, he was the one that suggested we go to the commissioner of Police with our lawyer's letter to ask what the police involvement is with this. He also said, you know, it would be good with the change of state government to liberal that we could perhaps have any, a commission of inquiry into this program.

'cause they already had a Senate inquiry last year, but it got railroaded by all the chemical companies just saying, no, fire ants are really bad. We've gotta poison everything. So they, they're just trying to say fire ants are worse than the chemicals. So, uh, which. They're not, 'cause they're not even gonna eradicate fire ants after doing this.

And this is what we're trying to get across to people. This is not eradication. Um, but

just let me ask you what, uh, you live in a, in a rural area, farmers are very, very innovative with how they deal with, with pests on their properties. Are there any alternative methods that farmers are using that you know of to eradicate fire ants on their own property without having to do this?

Yeah, I do actually. Um, so Professor Joshua King in America, who Connie was talking about earlier, he invented, um, a machine, a hot water, slow flow, hot water machine that actually kills fire ants very effectively. I mean, obviously it's a bit more labor intensive than just chucking chemicals out of a helicopter.



But, um, it actually works because it actually kills the whole nest with boiling water. Anyway, um, there's a farmer at a dare, um, his name's Trevor Hold. He's been helping now with, um, this fire scene. 'cause his, he had two calves that died shortly after all his area was baited. And what what we're finding is, um, it is affecting, um, um, sort of more the development of animals rather than killing them direct.

But, um, anyway, he got involved and he actually con contacted Professor Joshua King and he's built this hot water machine. So we now have the first hot water machine in Australia, and he's been going around to farms, helping farmers kill the fire ants that are on, you know, sensitive properties. And, uh, it, it works really well, but the program doesn't want to recognize it.

They said, we don't recognize this hot water machine. We haven't got any studies on it. We don't know how effective it is. Um, we only, um, recommend and chemical fibril that they use for direct nest injection. That's what they used during the varroa mic. Il and it's a class one carcinogen and a forever chemical, and they're di they're directly injecting it into nests.

It's crazy. But I just wanna say as well, like what cardio say in my area, we don't even have fire ants. I've lived in Australia for like 25 years, and I've never seen a fire out, never heard of them until this program came along. And then suddenly there's little nests popping up all around here and, and it's very convenient, convenient that suddenly these nests are being found.

And there was even a newspaper article that went in the Cairns, um, news saying that, um, fire Amp people were being accused of planting ants on people's properties. I don't, I, I don't have any knowledge about that, but it was in a newspaper article in Cairns, and I'm starting to feel like it's, you know, create a problem.

Here's, here's a solution, you know, and the solution,

and here's the money. We know that, um, that, uh. Obviously this boiling water machine is being treated like ivermectin in the covid disaster, you know, um, while all the time telling us that the chemicals are using are safe and effective in both different, uh, genres.

This is just madness.

It is madness. What would happen, I mean, if you could attach that, uh, hot water machine to the helicopter like you do with fire bucketing, um, and, and use the hot water. I mean, they would say it's too dangerous to drop the hot water. I, I mean, I could read the playbook from here, but they're happy to Dr.

Drop thousand liters of Chemical. Uh, yeah. You wouldn't

be able to drop hot water. I don't see it from the helicopter. 'cause the hot water has to be, um, pumped right into the nest. So it floods out the queen 'cause it's the queen out. That's the problem. Um, but there is also people I know in Logan who have, like Logan is just as heavily infested now as Texas in America.

They have this expert every year from Texas called Dr. Robert Puckett. And he comes around and does all these talks trying to tell everyone how bad fire ants are. And they're gonna kill you. They're gonna kill your babies, they're gonna kill your dogs. Uh, you'll never be able to have a picnic in the garden ever again.

You won't be able to play sports anymore. Your whole life is gonna be ruined. And this guy, he goes around fear-mongering with the Invasive Species Council that Reese piano. And um, it's an absolute joke. And they show these presentations with babies all bitten and, you know, it's like, it's insane. I mean, he puts a baby in a fire nest, but, um.

It, it is, um, it, it is like creating this fear. But then last time Dr. Puckett came, he said, oh, areas in Logan are just as heavily infested as we are in Texas. And I'm like, well, why do we need you here to tell us how bad it is? Why don't we just go to Logan and say to people in Logan, Hey, how's it, how's it going?

Living with fire s So I did that. I went to Logan. I found a lady, she's got 400 nests on her property. I went to, I went with Trevor, the guy with a hot water machine, and we treated a load of nests together. Um, I said to the lady, I said, how'd you handle this? She went, well, we just live with them. Like the horses don't go near them.

The dog doesn't get bitten. Um, okay. She said, sometimes if they bite, some people do react with these pustules, but I actually got bitten that day and I didn't get anything. It didn't even hurt like a green ant. I mean, a green ant was way more painful. And what we gotta look at is we gotta put things into perspective.

People have been. Like Covid, they've been frightened to death that all these fire ants are gonna take over our lives. They're gonna kill us all. I mean, if you compare fire an deaths in America to to bees, um, in, in America, they've had these fire ants there for a hundred years, and so far they've had about 85 deaths from fire ants.

So that's less than one per year. You've got more chance of being struck by lightning. Um, and only 35 of those deaths were actually attributed to fire ants. Definitely. Um, on our, you know, in comparison, 75 people on average a year die from Bings. So, you know, if you wanna look at what is more dangerous, so b is more dangerous than a fire T, but we don't go, let's kill all our bees, you know, all what he did with the var.

Right? But, um, if we gotta put things into perspective, these ants are a nuisance and they are very invasive, but. They're here to stay. It, it doesn't matter. They could nuke the whole of Southeast Queensland and those ants will still be here. 'cause they, they're called, their real name is So synopsis Invicta, isn't it Connie?

So, synopsis. Invicta. Yeah. Yeah. Invictus meaning in invincible. These ants are invincible. We will never get rid of them. And so we just need to now calm everyone down and get the government to just stop bullying People stop coming onto properties where we don't have fires trying to preventatively, um, bait us and, um, let people deal with it themselves.

You know, we, we could work in syndicates and, you know, work with council, work with government, work with private pest controllers. That's what people need to do. Whereas they don't even let the private pest controllers help out.

I think that's very good advice, Sarah, because, uh, I mean, essentially, uh, this is no different, uh, uh, playbook from the Covid man.

Uh, you know, he, he, the, the cure is worse than the, the problem. Um, and it's no different. Um, uh, Connie, I'd be interested to, you, you're a researcher. Uh, you're, you're a doctor of research. I mean, what, what do you know about the mRNA vaccines? Have you had anything to do with them?

Um, yes I did. Um, we wrote some papers on it, um, of the dangers of that, and that is a whole, yeah, basically you shouldn't have any boosters at all because they absolutely bug up your immune system.

Um, besides all the side effects, um, it, it, it is really shocking. It's, it should. It is the same, a little bit the same as the fire ants. So when you visit fire ends from America that you cannot eradicate it. And this Joshua King actually wrote us letters and said there's, there's nowhere where they have actually eradicated these fire ants with just sway with pesticides.

Um, it's so there are the exceptions are biological. Um. Measures like they have a, um, an insect that um, puts their eggs into, um, fire in heads and kills some, and that way they can control it. And that would be the only way you can actually control it. They have actually, um, there was an article a couple of days ago that they actually found an insect here that could potentially be doing that as well.

Um, but I mean, this is gonna be a while off till they can release or can actually go to the point that they can release that.

Yeah, but then they're gonna poison that anyway with the pesticides. That's right. A solution, aren't they?

Yes. But yeah, the, the solution, I mean, in America it didn't work. They have more fire s now than they had when they started the same as here.

And we knew that before they started and that, that's always a shocking thing. And the same as the covid vaccine. I mean, I was, when that came out, I was already pointing out the, the dangers of that that were already in the literature. Um, and I, I basically wrote, um, mps, um, um, I wrote to the, yeah, politicians, I wrote to the university.

Nobody answered me. It just was totally ignored. And this is the same here. This, this, the, the, in the as well. We knew you can't stop them. What you're doing there. It's not gonna stop, stop them. Um, so why are we thinking we are so much better? Why, why do we think it works here? Nothing has ever worked here.

Why if it didn't work overseas? So why do we have this? Yeah, let's just ignore everything they've done over there. Why do we not learn from them? Why do we go and just do things and why do we not? There's a precautionary, precautionary principle in science that if you hear of adverse events, um, or you hear that it's not working, you shouldn't be starting it.

Um, so, um, why are we not listening to, to what's out in the science? What's out in the literature? And like the Covid vaccine, there was already so much. There were doctors from the, um, from America telling us how dangerous this is, but we just ignored all that we went by. Oh yeah. It's so good. It's wonderful.

Um, and let's, let's do it. And it makes more sense to me. We are ignoring the signs, we are ignoring the experience that has gone before us. But it's just like the, why would you repeat something that is not working? It's just dumb.

There's a new name for it. It's called Civil disobedience.

Careful Johnny. Be careful.

APR will come down on you again. Sarah, what? Where can we go, what can people do now to try and um, highlight this even more?

Yeah, well it is just about educating people, which is what I've been trying to do. I've been going around doing talks everywhere I went, even as far south as Byron Bay 'cause they've got fire ants down at Byron Bayer.

And um, I've been to lumbar, I've been all the way up to the Sunshine Coast. So I've been trying to educate people in communities. What I've realized we need to connect together within our communities. And because these guys are not listening to us, they're not responding to any of our letters. They're not answering the questions.

'cause my first question was, where are the environmental risk assessments or environmental impact studies that show this whole thing is safe and they can't produce it? 'cause they've never done one. So this whole program is a huge experiment and, um, where are the Guinea pigs in it? And my children are the Guinea pigs in it because endocrine disrupting chemicals, which are what these growth.

Um, these insect pesticides are, they're, they're growth. They stop the Queen Amp from reproducing. What is that doing to my children's, um, hormones and, and you know, if they're endocrine disruptors, I, I, I'm, I'm horrified. And, and yet, you know, I don't have the right to say no. And they, they, they, they actually quite, um, proudly say, yeah, you do not have the right to say no.

We can come on your property. We don't need your consent. Um, so I'm telling people if they're concerned, join our, um, Facebook group. Um, I've got one called Fire Amp Treatment Alternatives. And I've got a page that I post to, um, and I've got a crowdfunder going at the moment. 'cause I'm trying to, you know, do more marketing to get signs up.

I'm telling people to put up no trespass signs, no poison signs. And actually those signs seem to be keeping the first round of biosecurity officers off your land. 'cause I actually got a notice saying, um, um. You know, we didn't enter this property 'cause there was a sign up. So in some cases that does seem to be working.

So I'm selling these no trespass signs. Um, but then once those compliance teams come, once you've been put on that naughty list, once you've been, you've been approached three times, you get put on a naughty list and then they just come with the heavies. That's when they come with the police. They're wearing body cameras, they're filming you.

So I'm telling people a bit like what John was saying, we need to pull together and almost, um, obstruct them on our property. But we can do it if we're in a group. If we are not in a group. Um, and you're on your own, they just, they just push past you. They don't care. Uh, whereas if you are in, um, a, a group and you get the media, so what happened last week at kaba, there was a, a few residents said it got notification that they were coming and they were coming with the police.

So, um, we called Channel nine news. We got channel nine news there. Um, Trevor Hold has an advocacy group and so people can get help from him. He's advocating on people's behalf. Um, he turned up, a whole bunch of people turned up and guess who didn't turn up? They didn't turn up. So they, it actually worked.

They don't like, um, the publicity. Um, they don't like the bad press. One of their KPIs is that they have to have at least less than 1% of the population not, not agreeing with this. So as long as it's only 1% of us that's disagreeing, they, they can still run this program, but they've been told if it's more than 1% of the population that's against this, um, program, they, they, that they're not reaching their KPI.

So the program will have to stop. So let's show them we are not 1%. We're way bigger than that. So I'm telling people to, as soon as you get the notices put in your letterbox. You write to the department, you say, I'm objecting. You make it clear you're objecting and that you have a reasonable excuse. The program then needs to get into dialogue with you about that.

And then they should be able to warn you when they're coming, I think with the heavy, but, but they keep changing their, um, they keep changing their, their, their procedures. Every time we come up with an idea, they, um, they come up with another, another way to get around it.

So, um, who is the department? What are they actually called?

So it is, um, it was Department of Agriculture. It's Staff Fisheries dpi. It's now DPI. They changed. Yeah, they changed to D

Clean DPI in Queensland. Yeah. Yeah. Well, people need to flood their Facebook page. Uh,

I think what needs to happen, when I was first, this is two, um, oh, nearly three years ago now. I was always, um.

Well, I basically came with the permit. I complained to A-P-V-M-A that they're going against the permit. Um, I, they then told me they still want to come. Um, they threatened me with, um, with, um, um, there's \$13,500 fine. And I went back to the department to, to, to, to the fire and group, and I said, stop bullying me.

I basically complained and I stood up against them. And in 2022 that worked. And I said to them, I am not preaching my permit. I'm responsible as well. I am not preaching my permit. That's against the law. And they left me alone. And because I complained to everybody, I complained to basically whoever I could find a complaint to.

They, they now, basically, when I say something, they know me already and then leave me alone. So you what their message here is, you need to complain. You need to complain to the authority, you need to complain to A-P-V-M-A if there's a breach, if they're preaching their permit because they can't ignore that.

Um, if it's too much, they cannot ignore that. And, and you need to complain to the department as well. So you don't just sit back and have this letter, write to them, write to their

Connie. The other thing is too, don't forget there's an election coming up. So find out where the candidates are, having their local forums go along there and absolutely pester them with this, uh, and make it an election issue.

Uh, advise them what's going on. I know Malcolm Roberts has mentioned it, um, in, in, uh, estimates. So look, it's certainly something that should be, uh, pressured upon. But I mean, hoodie, uh, we know. You know, these things are coming up all the time. I mean, if it's not fire ants, it's something else. But I mean, these guys have got real solutions that aren't gonna cause any harm.

I mean, it's madness that they're just being ignored.

There's no profit in that, Johnny. There's no profit in harmless solutions. There's only profit in chemicals, you know? That's it. And, and this whole, this whole madness just has to stop. It really has to stop. Yeah. Put me down for a couple of those signs.

Sarah. I've got, I live on a farm property in the Northern Rivers, and I wanna make sure that, that's clearly displayed on my property. So please, the no police. And we've also got

really big signs 'cause we started a new campaign with the Australian advocacy group called, stand With Me. Just Say No. So we're saying to people, stand with your neighbors.

Form your, your groups on Messenger or on signal. And have people available to come and support you because they bully you and intimidate you. Yeah. And women are feeling quite frightened. They've actually gone onto people's property and there's a woman in the shower and she's looking out the window and there's all these guys in orange shirts all swarming her garden.

I mean, that is unacceptable. Um, we should feel safe in our own homes, whereas I feel violated if they come onto my property, I would feel like totally violated because this is my home, this is my castle. I should feel safe here. I had a lady with PTSD the other day say to me, can you come with me? I wanna report this to the police.

I'm feeling harassed. These, these people, these fire people don't leave me alone. We've told them to only talk to her husband 'cause she's an ex veteran. She's, um, got A-P-T-S-D and um, they just ignore it. So the police said, oh, just put a note on your gate telling them to ring your husband. They didn't even wanna help, like file a report or anything.

And I said, the police are supposed to here to protect us and we are feeling like, you know, you are protecting them and enforcing this, this draconian, you know, thing onto us. And so yeah, it's, it is just, um, I, but I've sent them letters. I've sent 'em numerous letters. I sent 'em 32 questions back in July last year.

I've sent 'em a letter of demand in October this year, and I copied that letter to all the senators, all the, all the mps. I sent it by registered post to form the four heads of the biosecurity department. I haven't heard of Dickie Bird. They will not reply. They just ignore you. Um, and so now I've got my final notice last week or two weeks ago saying they're gonna find me \$16,000 if I don't let them on.

Now, that is an empty threat, I think because so far I've only seen people find \$160. And, and out of that, there's only about two of them. Um, yeah, I, I'm, I know what else I'm supposed to do.

Sarah, I, I put it into perspective. I mean, look at these government departments. They'll stop you building a house for months and months, likely years, uh, because somebody spotted some field mouse that was an albino with three beaks or something.

Uh, but they'll allow you to spray all this stuff.

Yeah. Well, you know, we've actually got, um, vulnerable species in our creeks here. We got the, uh, Mount Gloria spiny crayfish, and we've got the lungfish. That's a very, um, vulnerable species. There's a sacred totem to, um, indigenous people and. You know, they've now changed that permit that Connie was saying that when they changed the permit, they actually said, we can now spray where there's vulnerable species.

They've changed it to say they can do that as long as you're in the zone, it's, this is what they do.

Mm. Approve the goalpost. Yeah. This is what happened. Covid make a new public health order. Yeah. Make some new law. This is what they do. That this is just completely, uh, egregious what they're doing. And, uh, when Peter,

Peter found the human rights lawyer helped us, um, analyze the biosecurity act to see if there was any, um, you know, ways we could get outta this.

He said, unfortunately, Queensland has one of the worst, um, biosecurity acts in the country. I mean in New South Wales. They have to get your permission to go on your property and you can actually deny them, um, permission to go on your property in New South Wales. But I think they're gonna try to change the, because now they need to do New South Wales.

But, um, Peter Fan said your biosecurity act in Queensland is really atrocious. He said, however, it's not as bad as Western Australia in Western Australia. They can come into your property and forcibly vaccinate you. So, um, that, that's where I feel we're heading. And I feel like this is just a precursor to that.

They're testing the water to see how compliant people are with letting them on, letting government agents onto your land. Next time there's a pandemic. My concern is they'll be forcing entry with bolt cutters to, you know, do that. That's what

Sarah, I mean, would he, do you, I mean these irs uh, uh, this is where we're going.

I mean, this World Health organization that where they, they want control, uh, and they'll get it unless we stand up to them. We, we have to, uh. We have to get out of this WHOI mean, it's, it's just a, an absolute disgraceful outfit.

Well, the problem is though, I've been speaking out factually with Connie Turney about this subject right from the start.

I, I've only said things I can prove. I, I haven't said any misinformation and yet the ABC did a hit piece on me. They put my picture in, in the news saying I'm not a scientist. And, um, and, and then accused me of talking about this thing. Uh, they said, oh, Sarah McGuire erroneously claims that Fire Amp Bates makes babies heads small, and she's an anti-vaxxer conspiracy theorist.

And I'm like, they don't know any of my medical records. And I never even spoke about that subject at the rally. I mean there, there is, um, there was studies done years ago that showed one of the chemicals could be linked to this microcephaly in babies, but it got higher, very discredited. So Connie and I tend to not not mention it

because it's one of those things like, you know, they can say, oh, well it was discredited, but it was never, um, it was, it was never withdrawn, I don't think that study.

And, and there's another study that I recently found in chicken embryos that affect neurodevelopment in chickens using the same, um, chemical. So now they're dumping it into our creeks and waterways. Um, I do have concerns, but what I'm saying is when people like me, you know, I'm just a, trying to live my life quietly here and I was speaking out, I suddenly get trashed in the, in the news and made out that I'm some kind of lunatic

gaslighting.

Gaslighting. That's what the media does. Um, you know, they, they should change the name of the A, B, C to the A GC, the Australian Gaslight Corporation, A GL. I mean, it's just, it's just pathetic. Look, we, we have to, we have to keep speaking about this stuff. It, we go on ad nauseum about it, but at some level, people are gonna have to wake up.

Now, the people who slept through Covid may wake up for this. They may wake up when Central Bank digital currency comes in. They may wake up when 15 minute cities are enforced, but it's gonna be too late. Then now's the time to wake up, you know, and there is an election coming. And Peter Dutton, you're as useless as tits on a ball.

You really are. I, excuse my French, but you, you have no concept of what this country's going through because you live in the Uniparty bubble with your mate Albanese. I urge everybody, and I'm sure we all do, urge everybody. To vote for the minor parties and the independents. Give the greens a miss. Give the teals a miss look.

The world's changing. It looks like, you know, Germany's gonna elect a new chancellor very soon, and he's a man for the people. He's never been a politician before, but he's standing up because he thinks that, that we have to stand up. But is a trend going around worldwide. And if you think Australia's immune to that, Peter Dutton and Anthony Albanese, you're a goose.

You're a goose. In fact, you are a goose. Um, I just cannot believe that, that the people of Australia are just laying down and letting all this stuff happen. And they're, even, some of them are even gloating about it, John.

Well, look, I, I'm glad to see the Libertarian party, uh, thankfully hoodie, John Ruddick putting out last night.

Um, a an option whi which we've spoken about with, um, with, with Stewart and, um, and, and Jared Rennick previously about being on the one ticket. Bringing these minor parties together so that they can be on the one, on the one ticket, on the, uh, on the ballot paper. Now, hopefully everyone can, can actually be reasonable about this so that we end up with some success because, I mean, the last thing we want do is, is see people like Senator Jared Renick, miss out on, uh, on, on a Seat or Malcolm Roberts.

Um, they're the people we need in there Now,

Nick Johnny, we are interviewing a bunch of five candidates in wa running in the straight, the state election, I think on Thursday. And they've, they've done exactly that. They've come together under the one ticket and they, they have the opportunity to kick some serious political butt over there in the state.

Look, they, we've gotta be honest, what Clive Palmer's done with, uh. The trumpets of the Patriots and, and, uh, what one nation's been doing and what Jared's been doing. Um, if only we could bring 'em all together. If only we could just get 'em to come together because, you know, the, the trumpet of the Patriots, everybody's going, oh, hoo-ha, whatever.

Uh, it's corny. It's, it's whatever it is, but it, what it is, is indicative of the people who, the who are, who the politicians are sworn to serve, have had a gut full. And if the, if the, if the uni party thinks that they're gonna

keep holding the majority of power, having rigged how the, how the monies are paid out from the AC and all that sort of crooked bastard that they've been up to, to protect their interest.

They're only doing that, John, because they know their interests are under threat. The people are coming for you.

We we're having a rally, um, we're, we're, we're having a rally on the 22nd of March. And we've invited Malcolm Roberts, and I believe he's put it aside. Um, we've got the Libertarian candidate, Jim Wilmott, who is an expo security officer himself.

He's coming, um, and we're trying to unite all the minor parties that have the same concerns as us, that his property rights, our property rights, the, the greens aren't even looking after the environment anymore. And so, um, we're, we're trying to hold they ever have,

they never have. Ah, there are the,

yeah, we, but we're gonna be announcing, um, a rally where, you know, all the concerns, like the fire concerns can be said there, that renewables concerns can be spoken there.

And, um, we, we want to try to cook form an alliance. With all the minor parties that have our concerns and the freedom groups that, um, I've, I've been coming across. So, um, yeah, the it, if it will be announced on our sort of Facebook page when, when it's all organized, but it, we are thinking it's gonna be over in D somewhere.

Hmm.

Well, let us know and we'll promote that for sure. And, uh, and in the meantime, common sense needs to prevail and, and you ladies are giving up so much of your time, uh, to bring this to people's attention. And, um, John, why is it always the women? Why is it always the women that are doing this stuff? You know, where are the guys, what are you doing for goodness sake, let's get with, let's get with it.

Hey, let's really get with it. And, um. '

cause we are the moms. We know when something's wrong and when it's gonna harm our children. And so that's why we stand up. And Erin Brockovich only did a talk about this the other day. She said, you don't need to be a scientist, you don't need to be a doctor, you don't need to be a lawyer.

We just know 'cause we are moms. And that's where I'm at. I'm like, you know, I'm a mom bear. Nothing's gonna harm my children. These people are not coming on my property and poisoning my, my organic veggie garden. You know? No way. I'm not having it. So that's why I'm standing up. Um, I'm having a community meeting in Sanford for anyone that wants to come on.

Um, the 7th of March, Friday night at the Sanford Community Hall. And we're having a meeting at Currumbin on the 13th of March as well at the Eco Village for people that are concerned and want to come and share their stories.

Yeah, I've heard about the Eco Village. Very impressive place. Alright, well we'll close this off with a prayer.

Lord, father in heaven, we just thank you that, uh, we're able to still speak in truth despite legislations that are going through all over the place to alter that. But the truth will not be, uh, silenced. And the truth will always set us free. And Lord, we wanna stand in that truth, but we wanna stand in that truth guided by you as we stand against tyranny at government levels, uh, which is clearly being led by in the battle of between good and evil.

By evil itself. We pray that you'll strengthen us and give us discernment, courage, wisdom, and grace. We ask this in Jesus' name. Amen.
