

Club Grubbery - Raw transcript of interview:

2025-04-18 Graham and John speak with Trevor Loudon about his research and book...

Well, good morning everybody. And I say good morning because it's, uh, club grubby time. Thursday the 17th of April. It's seven o'clock in the morning, Sydney time, and we're up early, John, because we've got a great guest. I've really been looking forward to this, uh, from New York City. We we're talking to a Kiwi ex-Pat, who I think is living in New York City, Trevor Loudon, uh, an author of Reno and, uh, very topical subjects we're gonna be talking about today.

Great to have you back on John.

Yeah, thanks sweetie. And, uh, yeah, great interview and looking forward to it. Uh, a friend of mine, uh, that, uh, Charles CVEs has been, uh, talking very highly of, uh, of, of this interview. So, uh, yeah, it's gonna be. Fantastic.

Well, it's very timely too, because we're facing, uh, a may kind of a mayday election, which is quite topical, isn't it?

Mayday being, mayday being a, uh, a, uh, a communist, uh, realm. Let's, let's say, but we have with us today, as I say, a Kiwi who's coming to us from New York in author Trevor Loudin. Now let me, before we get you speaking, Trevor, the book, we're gonna be talking with you, uh, about today. One of your many books is Comrade Prime Minister Anthony Albanese, 40 Year Alliance with the Australian, with Australian Communism.

And, um, this is very, very crucial at this time because we know we need to understand. Uh, what makes one of Australia's most divisive and yet weak prime ministers, uh, tick and where all that comes from. But you've also been the author of, uh, nine political expose books, including Stealth, Kamala Harris's, communist Roots Reds, communist Socialists, and Security Risks Running For US President and Barack Obama, and The Enemies Within.

Um, man, amen. You've lived a very colorful life. You're a, you're a filmmaker, a public speaker from Christchurch in New Zealand for more than 30 years. You've researched the radical left Marxists and terrorist movements and their covert influences on mainstream politics. We in Australia have realized in the last five years at least in fact, we go back to Goff Whitlam, that Australia is a Marxist communist country in drag.

That's the way I describe it. It's dressed in drag. Um, Trevor Loudon,

welcome to the program. Well, thanks so much, Graham and John, and, and, uh, greetings to the list. All the, all of you is out there. It's a pleasure to be on.

Well, obviously, uh, we're gonna divide, John's gonna have a heap of questions. I'll have a heap, but let me kick off.

Uh, Anthony Albanese. Um, he has been more divisive, I think, than any prime minister we've had in a long time. He, uh, he, he made an absolute blunder when he, uh, when he brought out the, um, the, um, the yes and no campaign. Um, uh, the referendum that we had on, on, uh, on our First Nations people was so divisive and it cost more than half a billion dollars and everyone knew it was gonna fail at the beginning.

And he seems to be hell Ben on setting Australians against Australians, and he will not debate with people on the street. He's, he's an absolute clown as far as I'm concerned, but a dangerous clown. What do you know about him?

Well, look. You talk about the voice referendum, you know that that's coming. If he's reelected, that's coming back, at least at local level, it it, he's gonna implement that because that is a Marxist program to bring about revolution.

And what, what it's aiming to do is to install a small group, which will have veto power over the Australian parliament. And that small group will be the Marxists that have nurtured and guided and funded Albanese for 40 years. So in, in my book, I, I, I. I trace his background back from, you know, when he used to hang around with the Communist Party back in the eighties, and people know a little bit about that, but he has worked with Australian communists right up to the current day, and the voice referendum was 100% a project of the Sydney based Search Foundation, which was set up by the Communist Party of Australia, funded by \$3 million of communist money.

When they dissolved in 1990, they dissolved, but they didn't go away. They set up the search foundation to infiltrate the left wing of the ALP, the Australian Greens to take over the ACTU, the Australian Council of Trade Unions, and the voice referendum was 100% their project, 100%. A few hundred of these people in Sydney almost changed the Australian constitution.

So, um, Anthony Albanese is their boy. He was picked out by Tom Yin and Arthur Geel and Bruce Childs way back in the eighties. These were all people, leaders of the left wing of the ALP who worked with the Communist Party of Australia, and they chose Anthony Albanese back then to be their standard bearer to eventually us usher in a socialist Australia.

Unbelievable. How far does that go back though, beyond Albanese? We know Goff Whitlam was, was um, did a great deal to destroy the, um, the commonwealth of Australia constitution. Really? He distorted the whole thing. It's been an absolute mess in Scott Morrison. How far do these things go back?

Well, it was Goff Whitlam who, who opened Australia up to China for a start, you know, because before that Goff Whitlam, you know, Australia was aligned to Taiwan and, and China was kept in its box.

It was a very backward economic, it could be backwardly economic, it could never threaten anybody. Goff Whitlam in tandem with a whole bunch of other far left Western leaders started the China thing rolling. But Goff Whitlam was an extreme leftist. But the, this, this goes back to the 1920s, you know, the Communist Party of Australia was founded in, in 1920 by the depression era.

All, all of the Communist party members were also in the ALP about in 1929, the ALP kicked the communists out, but they started to rein, infiltrate. Ever since, by the end of World War II, there was a real fear, a realistic fear that if the labor won the 1949 election, I think it was, um, that would've been a, a communist controlled Australia.

And, uh, the fact that, uh, Bob Santa Maria of Melbourne set up a rival labor party to split the labor vote and allow Menzies to become Prime Minister effectively saved Australia. Well, the, the Communist Party of Australia basically started infiltrating the left wing of the Labor Party, the, the left wing faction in the early sixties in every state.

And now they control the left wing completely. They took over the executive, I think in 2022. And, um, they're the people who put Albanese into power. So this goes back a century. We are riding, we are, we're at the crest of a wave that's been building for a century now.

And it seems to be a global wave, doesn't it?

I mean mm-hmm. Mm-hmm. The state of the world at the moment is purely leading towards, um, Marxist communism. Uh, we see that with all the transgenderism and all the other WMS that have been going on around the world at the moment. I watched with interest, uh, in the UK, a police officer, uh, almost threatening to arrest somebody because he asked somebody to speak to him in English.

Um, uh, I mean, a lot of people have been watching that. Yeah, I saw that. We're seeing this go crazy around the world, but we are talking specifically about Australia. Johnny,

who are the, uh, the main players within the a LP currently? Trevor, I mean, obviously you, you know, the book centered around, uh, Albanese, but, uh, who are his, who are his go-to within Parliament?

Well, Butler, Mark Butler, you know, um, from South Australia, penny Wong, obviously she is as Marxist, as radical, as Albanese, came from the same, same sort of circles as Albanese. So they're the two main ones. Linda, Bernie, uh, the indigenous affairs minister who's, who's. Stand who's standing down. She has a a 40 year connection to the Communist Party, the search foundation, et cetera.

They would be the main ones in the actual Labor party hierarchy. The other one would be Tim Gartrell, who is albanese, he's chief of Staff. Mm-hmm. He is a card carrying member of this communist group called the Search Foundation, named by the Australian a couple of years ago, is the second most powerful non-elected person in Australia, a Marxist Albanese chief of Staff.

And then you go across to the unions, you got Linda McManus, um, Sally McManus of the, uh, A CTU, who's also a search foundation member. So you've got this inner circle around Albanese, um, mainly connected to the Search Foundation. People like Patty Crumlin of the Maritime Workers Union, and a few others who have formed this clique.

This clique runs Australia now, and they're implementing all the policies of the Communist Party of Australia that they could never get implemented under their own name, but are now getting implemented through the search foundation, the a LP left and the A CTU.

Well, it's a worry, isn't it? I mean, and we look at the, uh, the links of Butler.

Um, he, he's obviously been given that health portfolio for a reason, and, and we see the international health, uh, regulations, uh, from, from, uh, the WHO, et cetera. That's obviously all a, uh, a plan by Albanese.

Well, look, Albanese contributed to a book, um, and I, I write a whole chapter about it in my book. Um.

I've just forgot a, a, a book written by several search foundation members about 2021, and it was all about how to use the covid to clamp down on the economy. Albanese launched this book, contributed a whole chapter. Several other Marxists were involved in doing this, and the whole thing was about how to use Covid to advance socialism in America.

But just getting back to the World Health Organization, people were sort of, they don't really think of communists as having a big impact these days, but here's one. The head of the World Health Organization Compliance Unit is Susan Mickey of Great Britain. She is the one she ran Boris Johnson's response to Covid.

She was called the Mask Nazi. She was the one who said that we might have to wear masks for the rest of our lives. While she's now head of the behavior and modification unit of the World Health Organization, she will enforce, she's a social psychologist. She will come up with the slogans to enforce the restrictions that come out of the next pandemic.

She is a 50 year veteran of the Communist Party of Britain. She has worked in communist China. She's worked in communist Cuba. She will be. If there's another pandemic, um, Ted Ross, an Ethiopian Communist who heads the World Health Organization and her will be the two ma most powerful people on the planet next to the next to Xi Jinping of China.

Communist Party of Britain able to dictate health policy across the world and it will all be the Chinese line masks lockdowns, um, vaccinations. You'll never hear anything about Ivermectin or vitamin D therapy or herd immunity. The covid, which was given to us by China was they, they, they applied their mass line policy.

Well, we lived for two and a half years under Chinese communism. The mass line is where the Chinese Communist Party sets a policy and nobody can deviate. So. What happened to all the doctors who advocated

herd immunity, vitamin D therapy, whatever, shut down, shut down, shut down. The Chinese mass line was lockdowns vaccines and masking.

We, we, we lived it for two and a half years. And if there's another pandemic, which we all know there's probably gonna be sometime a whole bunch of countries have signed up to a protocol actually giving the World Health Organization full authority over the response. Well, can you imagine what that might look like?

Well, I think we already know, don't we? Uh, Trevor, I mean, uh, I mean, I don't think it's a, uh, a jump too far to say that they will have the powers to come into your home and force vaccinate.

Look absolutely children the whole lot. Well, you look, do, look at Australia. Here's the thing. This is my contention and I've written extensively on this.

All the countries and all the states and all the regions that had the harshest lockdowns, they were the ones with the most Chinese control. Now you look at Victoria, Daniel, Andrew, Andrew. Complete chill for China. Brought Victoria into the belt and road against the wishes of Scott Morrison. And then you've got the, um, Chinese controlled unions in, in, in Victoria, all controlled by the Communist party of of Australia, Marxist, Leninist.

There's no accident that Victoria got the worst lockdowns. Because the purpose of the lockdowns was not public health. It was to do maximum damage to our economies and to get the people used to doing what they were damn well told to do. And you'll see this all over the, all the states of America with the worst lockdowns.

California, Washington, Oregon, Massachusetts, New York. They're all the ones where the Chinese had most control over the unions and most subservient politicians on their payroll.

How far does this web extend, um, Trevor, because we, we've seen, um, you know, if, if anyone said 15 years ago that the world was going to hell in the hand basket, there were three countries that most people would want to go to, to ride it out.

New Zealand, Canada, and Australia. Absolutely. Um, they seem to have become their most draconian countries during this whole past five year period. Is communism spreading through those countries as well? Has that had a major influence?

Well look, you know, I, I've written several articles on Jacinda Ern, who was the Prime minister of, of New Zealand through the Covid.

She was the former head of the International Socialist Youth, um, heavily involved with the Malist movement in New Zealand. And she had people around her, like Chris Ens, who became a health minister and then became Prime Minister, who was a hardcore student. Maoist Proin Communist. So you had that, you know, we got the Chinese mass line in New Zealand through Jacinda Ern, and then through Chris Ens, thankfully no longer there, but Canada, you know, um, Justin Trudeau, a red diaper baby.

His father, whether, well, some people say his father was Castro, but. Even if you say his father was Pierre Elliot, Trudeau. Pierre Elliot Trudeau was a hardcore radical leftist going to China, going to the Soviet Union, going to Cuba to meet with Castro. And, and Justin Trudeau has done more to bring China into control of Canada than anybody else.

The, the, the, the Canadian Intelligence Services released a report in 2009 saying, after the Chinese cleared outta Hong Kong, they brought the triads and the Chinese Communist Party into, into Western Canada. The security intelligence service said by 2009, the Chinese already controlled both British Columbia and Alberta.

It's 15 years, 16 years ago. And so, and now I. We, we face the possibility of a globalist, um, coming to, taking over again in Canada and a possibility that Albanese will get the second term. So, and uh, so it doesn't really

matter about New Zealand, if Canada and Australia go to the left, New Zealand's not gonna stand up for much, unfortunately.

And I'm not trying to trash my own country, just acknowledging we are small players in this. We go the way Australia goes, you know, and Australia recovers its liberty. Australia kicks the Chinese influence out. We will do so. But if Australia carries on down under a communist Albanese, we are, we are all in big trouble.

Well, but we, you've just seen, you've just seen, have you not. China having life firing exercises off your, off your coast. Yeah. China doing a deal with the Cook Islands, uh, against the wishes of New Zealand to develop the seabed for China. And now you got the Russians talking about putting bombers in Indonesia.

But we're, as Helen Clark, my communist Prime Minister said, we live in a strategically benevolent environment. Right. Wow.

It's, uh, it's unbelievable, really. Um, yeah, Trevor, I, I, I noticed too, uh, that there was some legislation, uh, attempted to be brought into the Australian parliament in, in 2019. And, and Senator Patrick at the time wrote a descending report on it.

Now, the, the Labor Party and the liberal party voted against this bill and it was for checking of ministers. Uh, so essentially what what it's saying is that there's rules for everyone else, but no rules for. Uh, anyone that holds a portfolio of, uh, any note within Parliament. So background checks, a IO checks, all these things just don't occur.

They don't either see, see, the, and this is the problem, and I write in the back of my book, you know, an the B Anthony Albanese book, all of these AIO guys who've been watching Albanese for 40 years, who know he's been working with Chinese communists radicals who'd been, who probably got a big fat file on him, and Penny Wong and Mark Butler, and Sally McManus and all the other parts of his little crew.

And Tim Gartrell Albanese is their boss. Mm-hmm. So what they, what do they do? What, what do you do when the people you've been watching for 40 years now run your organization? How, how maddening that must be for all these ASIO guys who actually do know what Albanese is about. They can't dar well say anything, you know, Albanese, the AIO used to have a place in the Australian cabinet as of right in cabinet meetings and aio representatives would be there.

Well, Albanese stopped that. He kicked a out of the cabinet and he used his chief, uh, one of his chiefs of staff to do that. And I've just forgotten the name of the guy. But that guy was a big champion of the Confucius Institutes in Australia and had connections going back to the search foundation in the Communist Party of Australia.

So he's sidelining anybody who could expose him, anybody who could challenge him. This is the classic how a dictator works. A potential dictator works. And, and Ozzie is thinking, well, this can't be happening in Australia. Well, look, it happened in, in Venezuela, the once richest country in South America, a very finely developed democratic country.

It's happened in many countries. But what Australia's gotta understand is Australia is the key nation in the Pacific for China. If China is to dominate the Pacific, they've gotta dominate Australia because that's where the Yanks have bases. That's where they've got pine gap. That's where all of these things are.

And Australia's very strategically situated a gateway to Antarctica. Uh, very important to the Philippines and Taiwan and others. So the Chinese have put massive effort. To co-opting Australian politicians and getting influence in this country. You're a very big target, and I think a lot of Aussies don't want to confront that possibility.

It's not a pleasant thing to think about, but it is realistic. If you were the Chinese, wouldn't you be interested in controlling their government of Australia? Wouldn't you wanna do that? Absolutely. It just

seems mad, doesn't it? Hoodie that, uh, you know, we had all that ruckus about people holding dual citizenship and they went to the high court and threw these people outta parliament.

Uh, you, you have to fill out a thousand forms as a politician to say that you didn't take \$20 off a developer. But in this case, you can go through and be the prime minister of Australia with a file that could be that thick in, in the, a Z's, uh, intelligent organization. And there's nothing to see here.

Yeah, there's no security checks. No background checks. Why? Because they couldn't pass them. Mark Butler couldn't pass. Penny Wong wouldn't have a prayer. You know, she's involved in communist organizations her entire life. Her family before her in Malaysia was believed to have the similar, uh, similar allegiances.

And so, um, and Albanese is not a show. Neither could his wife, Carmel Tett, his former wife, Carmel Tett. She's heavily, she was heavily involved in all this too. So

why wouldn't the liberal party, uh, bring this on as a, as an election issue, Trevor? I mean, you know, does it infiltrate there as well? What are they scared of?

I mean, you know, they should be out front and center saying, listen, you know, this is a matter of national security. Every politician that holds a at, at the very minimum, a portfolio, um, should be given a background check.

Great question. Look, I a hundred percent agree and I was hoping that this would've been done, you know, but I.

Look, look how, how the Chinese work. They get the left through ideology and money. You know, a lot of the labor party left are communists straight out. They would far rather have China running the Pacific than America far, far rather. But they also get many of the conservatives through money. They get them, you know, in business deals, they put them on the boards of Chinese banks.

And so you've got a compromising situation in both political parties. Um, and that doesn't help. The other thing is just straight cowardice because a lot of, um, you know, look, I think Dutton thought. I'm gonna win this. We just, you know, Albanese is so darn unpopular that we just have to stay a steady course and not do too much and knock rock, knocked, rock the boat and we'll be fine.

Well, unfortunately, Trump put tariffs on Australia, which has boosted Albanese standing and Trump put tariffs on Canada, which is, which is, which was almost certainly gonna go conservative, but now it's likely to stay leftist. And so this is the opportunity's. Fast. Fast. You know, it seems a bit late at this stage, but look, um, I put the book out there to nearly eight months ago so they could use this.

Many of the top liberal politicians have seen the book. Many top journalists have seen the book. The universal reaction has been, this is a little bit too hot to handle. This is a bit too much. You know, and they're just terrified of. Being labeled McCarthy or this is old stuff. You know, there was a few things that came out a couple of years ago about albanese flirtation with the communists back in the nineties and it got a little bit of play.

But you gotta understand the, the media, well as you know, the media is so far left in Australia that they can squash these stories, they can distort these stories and the accuser gets more of a hard time than the accused gets. So, but what we, what we're gonna have to have is we gotta win, we gotta hope that Albanese is defeated and then whoever wins Dutton, whatever, has to actually start reinstating security procedures in Australia.

Again, people have gotta pass background checks to have cabinet, you know, cabinet positions. People have gotta be investigated for working with the Cubans and the Chinese and other. Hostile elements 'cause it's going on in, in a big way. And right now you've got a left-wing government that's working with the Chinese and a whole, a whole bunch of media organizations that don't wanna rock the boat or like the Chinese too.

This is, this could be the last chance for Australia because you know, how many immigrants have they brought in the last three or four years? 2 million or something. Yeah. Well you'll see 5 million in the next three years of Albanese as his way. 'cause he wants to swamp Australia with people who will vote for his party and will never vote Conservative people think we got another chance in three years, four years.

We may not.

No, that's right. It's happening so quickly. Trevor and I, I've just come back a few days ago from the US where I had a chance to speak to, to some pretty influential Americans. Uh, they're all of the view now that, um, if there's gonna be a war with China, let's have it now before they get too strong.

And, and there seems to be an appetite for it. There also seems to be an appetite out of China with the rhetoric coming outta the, um, Chinese ambassador in Washington. He's saying, bring it on. Um, how important do you think the current regime in the US see the Ansys Alliance and can we rely on it?

Unfortunately, not that well. They should see it as a lot more important than they are. I, I think, you know, right now Trump's not trying to negotiate deals with Russia to free him to face China, but he seems to be blind to the fact that he's losing Australia right now, that South Korea is rapidly going communist and that he may lose Canada as well.

I think he's so focused on the economics. He's not really looking at the strategic partnerships. That that's a, that's a scary thought. But, but the evidence seems to bear that out. Maybe wiser heads will prevail and maybe, uh, it'll come aboard. But I'll tell you what, I don't think he's gonna be very friendly to an Albanese government.

Um, you know, real, really not, Albanese certainly not gonna be wanting, uh, to car to be friends with the United States. Albanese will be over to China within a week of being reelected. You know, so will Penny Wong. They won't be going anywhere near Washington, DC So I think the Trump administration should be focusing a heck of a lot more on its traditional allies than they have been a lot more.

He's looking at economics. He's not looking at the strategic, um, view America needs Australia, America needs South Korea. American needs these friends. It's not just a one way street. They're not just protecting all of us. We do our bit in our corners of the world too. We are useful. And China, all those countries in the Pacific that have been taken over by China right now need a strong Australia and a strong United States to stand up to this.

Otherwise, they're just gonna run rampant through the Pacific and we won't be just seeing live exercises off our coasts. We'll be seeing, seeing a lot worse than that, unfortunately.

Where, where do you see the Greens party in Australia in relation to this link up with communism and labor? They seem to be in bed with one another as well.

Look, the Greens party is run by the Search foundation. Adam Band is completely in bed with the search foundation. Maureen Faruki is involved in it too as deputy and, uh, even the senator from South Australia, Barbara Pocock, she is a full Search Foundation member. She is a communist, a member card carrying member of the search Foundation, as is her former Communist Party husband, as are two of her children.

One of them was on the board of the search Foundation, so the greens are completely in bed with this Adam Band is a full on Marxist and he's just there to mop up the votes That won't go labor's way, you know, to, to mop up the, the real hardcore, to give labor a bit more chance to appear a bit more moderate, you know, at times.

Because most Australian Labor Party supporters are not communists at all. They just think they're voting for, you know, they think they're voting for Bob Hawke, you know, they think they're voting for traditional labor values. They don't understand that the labor left after 50 years is now in control of the a LP.

The labor left, which is basically set up by the Communist Party now runs the a LP. So the greens play their role and, and they fight a little bit with labor sometimes over certain seats. You know, like two mafia gangs might fight each other over a, over a corner where they sell drugs, you know. But basically they're the same.

They're cut from the same cloth they are. And, and the, the teals are gonna follow along as well. They're there to soak up the people who wouldn't vote greens, they wouldn't vote, uh, labor, but they don't really like the coalition either. And they sort of a bit more, a bit more. You know, blue, uh, the, they're bit more free enterprise orientated, but they like the environmental stuff.

So the Teals, the Greens and Labor are really a coalition to, to maximize the appeal and the selection to try and get them across the line because they only have to do it one more time. One more time. And they can clamp down on their opponents, flood the country with immigrants, uh, give 16 year olds a vote, give them ice creams to vote, and it'll be real hard to beat in the future.

Geez.

I'll tell you, it's a shocker, isn't it? I, I mean, this election is looming as probably one of the most important, um. You know, events in history really, when, when you consider what's going on, um, you know, this search foundation, I mean, it just amazes me, Trevor, that, I mean, we can have a, uh, terrorism watch list and everyone's advised who's on it, but, but you can have organizations like, like you are referring to, uh, that, that are engaged in activities that are just as dangerous as terrorism and, and, and nobody knows anything about them.

Where, what's a ZO doing?

Well, well, well, AIO o knows about this stuff. Look, the Search Foundation is bringing Cuban activists into America to agitate amongst the Aboriginal population right now. They model it on their Cuban literacy program. The same thing they did in East Timor, which was also. The, the, the East Timor was basically a revolution.

There was organized by the search foundation in the Communist Party of Australia, and they got the Australian Foreign Affairs Department and the Australian military to install it. And now East Timor is bringing China into their, into their country, 80 miles from Darwin. This, this is more dangerous than somebody who's gonna stab somebody in a mall.

I'm not minimizing that at all, but I'm saying this is things that could absolutely destroy Australia's national security at a very critical time and world history. And these people are running rampant in your government now. Like who, who knows the communist background of Linda Bernie or Penny Wong or Anthony Albanese or Sally McManus or, um, I.

Thomas Mayo, Thomas Mayo, the head of the Search foundation is a, a head of the Voice. Reverend is a search foundation member mentored by the Northern Territories Communist Brian Manning. He's a protege. Brian Manning, who used to run the covert radio networks for the East Timorese rebels. He gave you Thomas Mayo.

Thomas Mayo campaigned across the country that your government spent untold hundred millions of dollars propagandizing your population. And I gotta say, what gives me hope is the fact that what should have been a slam dunk for the communists, the no vote. And the, and the, and the hardcore activists stop that.

That was a major defeat for the communists, but now they're trying to bring it in the state level. Now they'll bring it back. If Albanese gets back in, they're, they're not gonna take no for an answer.

Mm.

And they're already writing about that in their literature. I read this stuff all the time. How do we go forward now?

How do we overturn this? No. What are we gonna do in the next government? Where does this Bill Gates fit into this whole show? Well, I think Bill Gates, you know, look, this, this is the thing, you know, people, people will tell you communism is a movement of the working man and the, the working class, and it's all about equality.

I would say no. Communism is about concentrating all wealth and all power in a very few hands. Ultimately, you know, the head of North Korea doesn't, uh, ate rama noodles for dinner. He eats six course meals prepared by a French chef with his Swedish mistress, you know, and then he goes out for a drive in his Mercedes.

Same in Cuba. All the communist countries, the leaders live it. Rich Bill Gates is one of these elitist who thinks the Chinese Communist Party is the model for the world because it allows business, but it also clamps down on unions. It clamps down on freedom of speech. It clamps down on these pesky bloody workers who want to have their own lives, right?

So Bill Gates and people like him are very happy to cooperate with the Chinese communists 'cause they think this is the model for the future. And I personally think he's gonna get lined up against the wall and shot like, like a lot of others. But he thinks he can ride this tiger. He thinks he's the boss of this tiger.

So, you know, I, I think Bill Gates is very much part of this. Um, you know, there has always been a, a, a, a link between certain elements of big business and the communist movement. And, and, and the famous Whitaker Chambers who wrote the book, witness a great book. He was an American communist, a Soviet spy who became a Christian and renounced what, what he had done.

He testified against Alger, his, and was a major case. He, he wrote in his book, he said, when I was in the communist movement, the working men were all Democrats. The middle class were all Republicans, and the elites were all communists. You know, it is not a movement of the masses. It's a movement of the elites to concentrate all wealth and all power in a very few hands.

So there's a, so it's like a beehive. There's a, the, the, the rolling class. The soldier class to keep us under control. Then everybody else's drones, everybody else are worker bees, sexless, gender worker bees.

It seems that the more left the world goes, the more there is a rise of ultra nationalism and we're seeing that played out, you know, neo-Nazi groups rising up all over the country and all around the world, in fact.

And that seems to play into the narrative of keeping the division as wide as it can be. So the communists fill the gaps. Is that how it works?

Look, exactly. Well, look, look, for instance, you know who gave us woke? What is woke? Woke is Chinese maoism. It's what the Chinese used to call consciousness. Raising woke means to be aware of issues of class inequality, to be awake to the gay, the gay oppression, the um, white privilege.

It's maoism. It came through the Maoist movement. So we see this woke is getting into everything. We are all disgusted by it. 'cause we just want to be normal people, right? We want a free country. We wanna raise our kids, we wanna worship as we see fit. We want freedom of speech. The chance to make a dollar have a good life.

So we see this woke shutting everything down and then you get this sort of neo-Nazi stuff on the other side and would be given this false alternative. If you wanna stand against the woke him, be a Nazi. No, be an Australian, be an American. Support the constitution. Support the separation of powers. Go straight up the middle, you know, keep things on an even keel.

But you see, you know, the Russians, they're heavily into funding the, the neo-Nazi groups. The Chinese are heavily into supporting the woke groups and they have this in the scissors strategy. You know, either way you turn. So the answer is keep saying, keep rational. Keep your constitution, keep your separation of powers.

Keep freedom. Don't go for any crazy stuff. Just a good straight up, you know, Australia is what we want. A good straight up New Zealand, a good stable America. That's what we want. And, and there is, there are populous movements around the world that are standing against the woke and that aren't Nazi, that are straight up, you know, which are good.

And I see a lot of those in Europe, but they're trying to, they're trying to polarize us into either being a, basically a Nazi or a communist. And that's not the options, you know, to be in Australia, to be an American, to be a Canadian, that's to be a Sri Lankan. Support your country. Be a patriot. That's, that's the real option.

Westminster Westminster system has always been held as the, one of the best systems in democracy, but it, it gets subverted so easily and it has done in Australia, our constitution of nine, uh, commonwealth constitution has been totally ignored and it has done, it has been ignored for many, many years. And we're seeing this two party west, which just appears to be completely taken over.

Like, it, it, the Gelian dialectic one, one party seems to be at odds with the other, but they all seem to be looking for the same result. And we Yeah, they

what

the states that the uni party, you know, the,

yeah.

And, and, and Trump has disrupted that to some degree. And some of these populous groups have also disrupted this.

Look. Um, look, and I, I, I'm a conservative, right? I, that's, that's what I am. It doesn't mean I support every conservative party. We are in the situation. We are. Because we've had so many gutless conservative leaders for too damn long. Yep. You know, it's not that the communists are so clever, you know, if there've been a, if, if, you know, it is.

It's just we've had so many wimpy conservatives who just want to get along and go along and not rock the boat and not stand up for anything. Go along with the covid mandates or whatever it wa is, you know, look at what Trump did. He said fake news. It's all, it's all garbage. Stood up, rouse the people. You know, millet in Argentina is doing similar things.

This is the time for faith and courage. This is the time for courageous leaders. We gotta be looking for courageous leaders more than anything else. 'cause just electing another conservative isn't enough. I. We gotta elect anti-communist, we gotta elect people who will stand. And if there aren't any, we gotta raise them up.

And it ain't easy. It ain't easy at all. But that's, that's what we face here. We gotta have leaders who will stand for the country and not for the, not for the party, not for the, for the uni party. Um, but I, I do think, you know, we're gonna need some God's help here and, but God helps courageous people, does he not?

Yep.

Where, where, where? Where's, where's there Bible story about God helping some gutless wimp. Yeah. You know, David verses Goliath, Gideon's army verses the horde. You know, look at America, the, the Patriots versus King George. Um, look at, look at how many times the people of Australia and New Zealand have stood up against tyrants against all odds and defeated them.

How many times? That's the spirit we need now. It's the only spirit that's gonna get us through this. A wonderful being a cow going along is just a waste of time. A wonderful, we've gotta think about kids. We've gotta think

about kids. We bring these kids into the world. It's our duty to ensure that they live free and they live prosperous lives, or at least have the chance to do so.

That's our duty. Yeah. And wonderful, Trevor,

uh, I was just gonna ask you, uh, what, what do you think about the relationships now with the Governor General, uh, in Australia and, and I suppose in commonwealth countries where, where there seems to be this, uh, uh, willingness to put these, uh, lefties in as governor generals, that, that have got no real, uh, conservative values.

Uh, the military used to report through the. The, the Governor General, and now I, I, I see that it seems to just fall into the lap of, of Prime Ministers. I mean, where does all this fit in with Royal family and all that background?

Well, you know, back in when Whitlam was turfed out because John Kerr was actually, whether you agree with his decision or not, he was acting as a governor.

General should have, Whitlam was gone outside the Constitution and Kerr sacked him. Ever since that time, the Australian left has been on the war path against the Office of Governor General. And your gov current Governor General is a leftist part, excellence chosen by Albanese to rubber stamp anything he wants to do.

There's no thought that she is really an independent servant of the Crown, the Crown's re uh, representative from Australia, she's Albanese puppet. So that's a very important constitutional thing that has been taken away. You know, New Zealand used to have re, we used to have recourse to the, uh, privy Council in London.

You could take a court case to London. Well. They got rid of that and now we've got this left wing Supreme Court in New Zealand that is worse than useless on, on constitutional matters. And the same kind of thing has been happening in Australia. We've gotta understand the left, the hardcore left in Australia has been on the march to take Australia down since the 1960s really intensely.

And the conservatives, um, you've had some great conservative leaders, but you've had some very wimpy ones too, who have gone along with this far too much, far too much. I don't think Menzies would've gone along with what's happening today. I don't think John Howard would've either. But you haven't had a lot of inspiring ones since unfortunately.

So, um, but this is the time. New leaders have gotta come forward. People gotta stand up. I, I think we can still save ourselves. I think we can still win this, but only if we actually recognize what's at stake here. If every Australian realized that albanese a communist who wants to wreck your economy, wreck alliances, wreck race relations, flood the country with immigrants and bring in a socialist Australia, he would get 10% of the votes.

But unfortunately, most people still think they're voting for Bob Hawke and, and they're not gonna, you know, it's still very iffy. We gotta get the information out there, but we gotta be very courageous as you guys are. You know, you, you guys take a lot of flack. You tell 'em the truth 'cause you believe in it.

Yeah. But we, we need more people like this. You know, courage, courage costs. There's family, family things that suffer. There's, there's threats, there's all sorts of things. But we gotta, we are all gonna be held accountable for what we do one day or what we don't do. That's it. And, uh, you know, that's, that's

where we've gotta stand.

You know, you can see it clearly that a great author once wrote about, uh, a hundred years ago, that there is a great want a want of men who will not be bought or sold, and men who will stand as true to their conscience as the needle is to the pole. And we need that now more than ever. Mm-hmm. That now more than ever.

But the, the, the impediments to that happening as so fraught with peril because of the division that even exists within the people who want the freedoms you're talking about.

Well, that's right. I know that in the United States there's a lot of disunity in the freedom movement here. Um, Trump brought a lot of people together, but that's sort of fraying a little bit right now, but.

What do we do? You know, we, we have the whole history of human freedom and civilization has not been even, you know, from Magna car to the great revolution of 1688. There's breakthroughs and then you get, uh, you know, the, your freedoms get taken away and then people get angry and eventually there's another breakthrough and you rise up again.

And, and, and we are in that stage now. But what I'm trying to warn Australians obvious here is you'll elect Albanese again and you're gonna see thing second term. Albanese will be way worse than first term Albanese. 'cause his goal in the second term is to lock everything down so that his faction of the a LP, not just the a LP, but that his communist faction of the A LP will never lose power again.

So we, we, that is a message. If enough Australians here, it should be enough to make sure he doesn't get elected. The first thing you do if you're drowning in your bath, you take the darn plug out of the bath, you turn the tap off, and you take the plug out. We're gonna turn the tap off to stop this socialism taking us down.

But, you know, and then we gotta work. We gotta, we gotta understand that this is a lifetime struggle. That the struggle of liberty is a lifetime one. You know, new Zealanders Australia's have had a darn cushy life for a long time, really compared to most of the world. That breeds a little bit of complacency and a little bit of laziness.

And now we gotta understand we haven't been keeping, we haven't been paying attention enough. Our kids are gonna suffer for it. And if we are decent parents, we gotta, we gotta reverse that. We.

Trevor, what do you think about the notion that these generals are weak as piss? Uh, uh, I mean, in America, you, you would have, if, if, if the gen some of these generals thought that their, uh, their, their sovereignty and their nation was under attack from within, they would speak up.

I mean, we, we've got, we've got a Holly but generals here in Australia who were just in the food chain. Yeah. Look,

and this is, this is the thing. This really is a disappointing thing. So when Obama got into power, who, who is a complete Marxist, he purged 200 generals, admirals, you know, high ranking officer from the ranks and put in Princeton sociology graduates, all these woke generals like Millie.

To, to make sure there was never a co against him. My, my late friend, general Admiral Ace Lyons, former head of the Pacific Fleet, said when Obama was doing this and gutting the military and doing the horrible things he was doing to it, if the four chiefs of staff, the joint chiefs of staff, the head of the Marines, Navy Air Force Army had gone to Obama and said, you carry this on, we are all putting in our resignations today.

That would've destroyed him.

Mm-hmm.

Every Australian general should be standing up on the street corners saying, you are leading us into the arms of China, Mr. Albanese. Yeah. You are gonna destroy this country. They're sworn to defend this country. Well, that doesn't just mean with guns, that means putting their voice.

Risking their pensions, risking their careers, because Australia's future stands in doubt. And if we allow this man to come back into power, Australian troops are gonna have to face possible, you know, possible military action in the future because of the cowardice of the generals who could do something.

So I, I really agree with your point on that very, very strongly.

We're also in a situation too, where clearly the freedom movements have been calculatedly infiltrated by, uh, communists to divert the, the cause of freedom. That that's clear because that's why we're seeing so much division.

Hmm. Well, agitators are getting in their malicious types.

Absolutely. That, that's, we all gotta be very discerning about who we ally with and, and what we do. Look, if they're telling you to get violent, if they're telling you to, to break laws and do this kind of thing, um, you're probably looking at an agitator there. Yeah. You know, and, and this is what happened when, when the New Zealand protest is all, um, covid all assembled in, in, uh, Wellington and the parliament grounds.

It's all peaceful. And then out of nowhere, all these people come in and they'd never seen before and started throwing bricks at the cops. And so then the cops come in and break it up and, you know, and discredit everything. We saw this with January the sixth in the United States. Peaceful protest.

Provocateurs led people into the building. Provocateurs attacked the police. The police started tear gassing people, and it turned into a disaster. Well, of course. Left and enemies of Australia are gonna try and get inside the freedom movement. Of course they are, they're trained agitators. Mm-hmm. They know how to divide people.

So we must be very discerning and we must be very logical and we must be very disciplined and focused. Mm-hmm. But we, we mustn't give up hope. We mustn't be cowards here. We, we gotta understand. We, we are free today because when the time came, our fathers and grandfathers and great-grandfathers were willing to pick up guns and put on uniforms and go away for five or six years overseas.

And while they were doing that, your grandmas and your aunties and whatever, were working on farms for 14 hours a day working in shipyards and hospitals, keeping the kids in school, staying up till two o'clock in the morning, writing letters to their boyfriends and husbands overseas. We don't get to enjoy freedom without sacrificing.

Why are we the only generation that should be free and never have to sacrifice? Never have to miss the footy game, never have to spend a bit of money, never have to put some time and commitment into what we are doing.

I thought years ago, uh, when we first started in all of this, and the photo behind John clearly shows a huge number of everyday Australians who were fed up.

They could see something going wrong, uh, apathy and, and, uh, a sense of, oh, it's all calming down now, has sort of deleted the numbers dramatically. Uh, people are still simmering below the surface. And those who slept through Covid, through the Covid mandate era and, and the tyranny that was brought about there will probably wake up when Central Bank digital currency comes in or when, uh, digital ID comes in and all these other methods that they're gonna use to control our economy.

Um, so we're gonna see a growing number of people and that the more people you get in one spot, the more you'll draw agitators. But I, I had a, a vision myself back when we were down in Canberra. If everybody just turned up quietly, no placards, no flags, no paraphernalia, just all wearing the same color.

Shirt or whatever, be it a white shirt or a brown, not a brown shirt, but a, you know, whatever orange shirt and just turn up and say nothing, and just be present. I mean, I, I had this feeling that the silence would be deafening.

Well, look, you know, the Chinese Communist Party almost foul two or three years ago with the white paper protests in China.

They just stood there with a sheet of white paper, right? That was a symbol of, of, of freedom. And I, I forgot the story about it, but that, that almost toppled the Chinese government almost toppled, toppled the Chinese Communist Party. So I agree with you. You know, just standing up, showing up is a very important thing.

You're not screaming, you're not yelling, you're not throwing things around, throwing tomatoes, whatever. You don't do that. You stand up and make yourself known. That is a very scary thing to politicians and see, you know, we, we, we just gotta look now, what is the most important thing we can do in the next three weeks to give us some space to take all the things back that need to be taken back.

I, I tell you straight, if Albanese is elected, it's gonna be of a hell of a lot harder to turn things around than if his opposition is elected. And I'm not saying that because I support the liberals or whatever I'm saying that 'cause if you have a communist prime minister on a second term, he's gonna do things that are gonna be very, make it very, very hard to ever get rid of them.

Just flooding the country with a, with several million more immigrants is gonna, is gonna pretty much seal all the deal in three more years to brainwash your kids too.

Geez. And you know, this has happened, everybody, because of our apathy, our collective apathy and ignorance. Um, that's the truth of it.

We've had it too good for too long.

Yeah.

John, we've often said that Covid was the kick in the butt. The country needed to wake up. Um, I don't think we've seen anything yet. And, and if we don't wake up to that fact sooner rather than later, we are in great peril. There's no doubt about it. And we're gonna need God more than ever.

That that brings me to another point. Now, I know we're gonna let you go, Trevor, but excuse me. Separation of church and state. Um, we're seeing that that barrier dissolved, completely dissolved. I mean, the, the church is marching in lockstep with the, with the globalists. And we saw that in the man when the mandates were on.

Uh, it was a few brave pastors that stood up and said, you're not shutting my church down. I met with, um, but no, but no higher

level ones with it. None. This was just low level, none level, nothing at higher level at all.

And that really concerns me, that there needs separation between church and state is imperative.

I was on stage in Phoenix, Arizona with Charlie Kirk, and that was a Oh yeah. Um, very interesting. I mean, that guy's got a mind, like a steel trap. Um, and you don't go into an argument with Charlie Kirk unless you've done your research. There's no doubt about that. Oh, many of his debates, I, I know

I know

him a little bit.

He, he, he has exposed the left in a way that's, uh, so clearly visible, especially in the universities around America. Um, yeah. And, and even he, uh, doesn't see the, the benefit of separating church and state, which really concerns me.

Yeah. Yeah. And that's, you find that's quite common in America, you know, 'cause America's a much more Christian country, well than, than most of the others are in the western world.

And you know, the, most of the founding fathers are very Christian. The Constitution is really derived from the Bible. You know, it is pretty clear links there. But look, yeah, absolutely. Look, when you get the state and the church as one, that's not Christian, that's not Jewish, that's nothing. That is just another tool of government.

You know, the, the separation of church and state that they talked about in the constitution was basically, 'cause they saw what the, the state churches of Europe had done to the people who just basically collaborated with the princes and the kings to suppress the people. They wanted to have a direct relationship with God.

Um. The only role of the state was to protect their rights. And they'd never wanted a state church. Look, if you want real Christianity, you're gonna get it from the home churches, the small churches, the independent pastors. That's where it's gonna come from. And I think we do need spiritual revivals generally around the West, but that's not gonna come from the bishops.

That's not gonna come from the, from the head of the, the Church of England or the Presbyterians or whatever. That's gonna come from the grassroots Christians, the grassroots home churches, small churches, independent, independent churches, et cetera. And I think, uh, one thing that's gratified me as the struggle has gone on the last few years, a lot of my friends who once would've declared themselves atheists or agnostics, are now trying to get a spiritual orientation.

They've seen that the battle that we are in. A spiritual battle, a battle between good and evil. You can't fix this through politics alone. There's gotta be a spiritual awakening in here. And I'm not telling you where to go or what church to go to, but I'm saying the more people that get that spiritual foundation, the more we can stand up for what's right, the more chance we have, uh, of miracles happening in our favor, you know, of things going our way.

'cause I, I don't think we are done by any stretch of the imagination, but know the truth and the truth. Sell she free. You know, we need to know the truth about what we're facing and not evade the truth. Just, just facing up to the truth is an act of faith. It is saying that you. Understand there's something more important out there, that good and evil are real, and though you are willing to stand by good, that takes courage, that takes faith and that pleases God.

Absolutely. My wife and I set up an organization called Church Without Walls about 15 years ago, and we've been running 12 step recovery programs and helping people to restore their relationships with each other. Uh, during that protest behind John, uh, there were hundreds of people there wanting to be baptized and I've baptized 350 people in the last couple of years and I've seen atheists come to me and beg me to pray with them.

I've had atheists come to me and say, I dunno what it is, but I can't go to sleep at night unless I hear the, your prayer at the end of your program. Uh, there is a shift, but it has to be shifted away from corporatized religion and we're setting up a, a home church network around Australia. We, we've just come back from launching our recovery program in the us.

And it looks like the Recovery Road program's gonna be printed in Japanese and run in Japan. So that cool. That's the focus of what my wife and I are doing, and what John and I do with Club Grubby is try to give people hope, not a false sense of hope. And that's why, you know, we get criticized a lot because I pray at the end, but if you don't like it, stick your fingers in your ears because one day you're gonna be praying because there's no atheist in the foxholes.

Exactly. I, I spent six weeks in United Airlines in Denver on secondment listening to cockpit voice recordings of people dying in aircraft crashes, trying to work out how the breakdown of communication led to the incident. And every single voice recording, I listen to Trevor, God was mentioned in every single one of them.

And we've gotta face up to the fact in this country, this is a battle between good and evil. You know where the evil is? It's in, on that book, on your shelf behind you, comrade Prime Minister. You wanna show? Yeah. Yeah. That's it. That's the face of evil. That's what we are looking at now. We either get busy living or we get busy dying.

Mm-hmm.

And, and that's where we're at. And, and, uh, I'm so glad you brought faith into this because it's an ongoing battle in this country. But I'll tell you what, more and more people are starting to see the relevance of a relationship with Jesus Christ. And if I do nothing in this whole freedom Rampage that we're on, but bring people to Christ, that's all I want to do.

Because in that, you find strength, you find faith, you find courage, compassion, humility, and that's what wins the day, Trevor.

Absolutely. Look, look, faith and courage go together. Yep. You know, faith, if look when your, when your grandfathers were, were sitting in landing barges or ready to go to war in the Pacific or New Guinea or whatever, when they were sitting ready for battle, they weren't talking about cricket or girls, you know.

They, they, there was a lot of praying going on in those, in those barges. A lot of praying going on in those planes because when you're faced with death, you, you start to think about your mortality and your place in the universe, don't you? And you know, when you're going into battle, you need that faith to give you the courage.

If you've got faith in God, faith in your officer, and faith in your comrades, you'll be the bravest soldier that can be bravest, soldier out there. And

you don't even have to hold a gun.

No, you don't. In fact, that I hope to win this without people holding guns. You know, truth is truth. Truth is powerful.

But it's courage. It's courage to tell the truth. If those military officers, those generals who probably face machine guns who've probably been in real battles. If they had the real courage of the convictions, they'd be standing up and telling the people about this government today, right now. And it's amazing.

You know, you'll get people who will fight battles and fight battles, but you try and get, you know, charge machine guns uphill, but try and get 'em to go to a school board meeting and, and talk about what they're doing to the kids.

Yeah.

You know, courage is manifested in many ways, but it's faith and courage that's gonna get us through this.

We, if we don't have that, we, we, uh, we, we don't have courage. We, we are not gonna get through this, but we, we have, we have that now. We've got, we've got the blueprint. We know what a free Australia looks like. We have, we have spiritual guidelines. We know what is right, what is wrong? We just have to darn well do it.

You know what, uh, Peter Dutton, I hope somebody shows you this because right now we need you. To grow some testicles. We need you to grow some strength and a backbone and to stand up against the factions in your party and do what's right for the people of Australia. Jared Renick's leading the way at the moment in that, in those stakes, Senator Jared Renick, who we interviewed last night, is showing the way the statesmanship, which is gonna help this country restore its roots.

We don't need wishy-washy opposition, we need strength in opposition.

Mm-hmm.

And Russell Broadband

another one. Russell Broadband. We need our, our party to, to put this communist revolution down in this country.

Yeah. This is the thing, when things get bad, you find leaders coming from places you hadn't expected.

You know, we might not be saved by existing leaders, but we are gonna have new leaders coming up who really do stand, encourage for what's needed. And we, we need it in spades right now, and I'm glad I. And I've heard the names of you mentioning, I'm glad people are standing up who recognize how urgent this darn well is.

This isn't just another election. This isn't just another, you know, oh, she'll be right if it's, you know, if we have three more years of this guy. No, we are, we are facing some pretty heavy stuff if we, if we blow this. And, and people need to understand that people need to make the right decision for themselves and their kids.

And that's gonna take a little bit of bravery, a little bit of discernment.

You don't comply your

way outta tyranny. No, you don't. You don't at all. And, uh, now no Australian should be able to look you in the eye and say, I don't believe ter could ever happen here. You know, if you've lived through Covid, you know darn well that it can happen here.

And it has happened here.

Time to wake up Australia. Um, it's all, where do we

find the book, Trevor? Uh, yeah. Just, just go to, it's not available bookshops. Yeah, just go to Amazon. Uh, you know, comrade Prime Minister Anthony Albanese, he's 40 year alliance with Australian Communism. But just look up comrade Prime Minister on Amazon.

You'll find it easy enough. It's selling pretty darn well, I gotta say. But I, I just want, oh yeah, I want lots and lots of Australians to read this. However, you know, even if we win this election, if Albanese is defeated, these people won't go away. So this is a whole, it's not just about Albanese, it's the network around Albanese that will bring the next one forward.

The Tanex or, or whatever. Or, or, or the Penny Wongs. 'cause they're waiting in the wings. If Albanese goes, they have, they have spears, they have other people. Have you thought about making this into a movie? I have actually, yes, I have. And I've, I've, yeah. If, uh, if I got, if I got somebody who is willing to, to put the investment in and so whatever, I think it would make a great documentary.

I think people would just go crazy over what, what's in here really? Do

what, what sort of money are you looking at to mount something like that?

Look, I, I, I don't know. You know, like I, I've made documentaries usually in the quarter of a million, quarter of a million. Um, you could make something pretty good for a quarter of a million to a half a million us.

So, so, you know, you're looking quarter to a half a million Australian. Well then depends what kind of marketing budget you want, what kind of, what kind of production values you want. Um. Really, I think marketing would be

relatively easy with the networks that exist in Australia now. So you might not need that bigger marketing budget, but you wanna make a good looking project.

Project. I've, I've made two full length documentaries with great production values. Uh, one of them was seen 3 million times on Amazon Prime. Um, you know, so one was called Enemies Within the Church. One was called Enemies Within, made a lot of smaller ones as well. But I, I think it would be, this would lend itself to a very good documentary that would shock a heck of a lot of Australians.
