2025-05-04 Graham and John talk about the washout from the election...

Sunday, 4th of May Club Gruy, uh, election Hangover, Johnny.

Yeah. Election hangover. It's. There wouldn't have been enough alcohol, uh, in Australia to consume last night. Would there after that result,

man.

Oh man.

Bit of a shocker, wasn't it?

Dreadful. Absolutely dreadful. But I think in fairness, I think we had a gut feeling that was going to be the case.

Mm-hmm.

Um, it seemed to be where everything was pointing. Um, Joel Jamal had called it six months ago, hadn't he?

He did. He did indeed. And, um. It's, uh, this whole thing's pretty fickle, but, uh, I must admit it was a, it was a bigger fall than I thought it would be. Mm mm mm So, um, where do we go with it, mate?

Where are we standing at the moment from what you are seeing?

Well, I think people would be pretty despondent today. Uh, I think, uh.

It's, it's, it's a shocker, really. Uh, and I can understand people being really disillusioned. I mean, the economy's bugger, uh, people can't afford to eat.

Mm-hmm.

Uh, they're, they're sleeping under bridges as we saw last week. What are they're having, uh, having their last, um, you know, their goods removed and thrown in the bin.

I mean, this is, this is the Australia under Albanese in 2025, and it's an absolute shock to me that people have endorsed him for another three years. But I, I think that just goes to show just how weak a country we've become. Uh, and, and people just love, seem to love communism.

Yeah, look true. And, and I've been thinking today how I don't think it's productive to have compulsory voting.

Mm. Uh, because, you know, I watched some interviews on the street, uh, some Vox Oli going on, um, especially with a lot of youth. Yeah. Um, who are you gonna vote for? Oh, I dunno. I might go the greens. Oh, you gonna vote for liberal? Uh, no. I think I'll vote for Albanese. Why? Because Dutton's bald, um, you know, stuff like that.

I mean. We're forcing a lot of people who've got no interest and no idea and no education to vote in something that they have no idea about. And I'm sure a lot of that, I mean, people are just gonna go, oh, we'll stick with labor, you know, we'll go with the greens. 'cause they're all about conservation.

Nobody knows. No, nobody understands. And, um, you know, but what have, what have we got, um, what have we ended up with three more years? Of, uh, at least three more years of labor. And some are saying that it is such a devastating loss for the liberal party that they'll probably win the next one as well because the liberal party aren't gonna bounce back.

And to be honest, look, it's just my opinion, John, but I think the liberal party's gone. I think it's finished.

Yeah. Well, I, I, George Christensen wrote a good piece, uh, today. Uh, and we're gonna have him on the show, um, next week. Uh, let's hope. But, uh. I think what he says is right. I think the liberal party, uh, you know, they, they, they went about destroying themselves, uh, from within, uh, they didn't wanna win.

Uh, they threw it away. Um, they were in front, uh, they were saying all the right things. And then Duttons had the, uh, had the skates pulled from under him. And, uh, and here we are, uh, I mean those that know Peter Dutton, uh, and I know a few people that know him, so, so that he is. Uh, uh, a very decent guy and, and I think he would've made a, a good fist of it had he, had he been given an opportunity.

But, uh, look, I think the problem is hoodie, the, the wakes and the, and the moderates and the, uh, and the people controlled by the left, the Michael FOAs faction in the, uh, liberal party, in my opinion, are tearing it apart. Uh, and that's why people like John Ruddick, uh, Ross Cameron. Just to name a couple, um, you know, of obviously Matt Zuli.

I mean, these are all people that were, uh, you know, hardcore liberals. I mean, they're out and, and they're not alone. I mean, the mum and dad vote as the people that, uh, Jared re look at. Jared Rennick, another one. So it's formed a bit.

It is, yeah. And there's, uh, you've gotta look at what's left inside the liberal party.

There's nothing near other than Alexander in South Australia. Hmm. There's nothing there. I don't see anything there to build on. Hmm. You know, and it's gonna take him so long to build on that. I mean, look, you know, there are a lot of people, I've been getting messages all day, and you probably have to, from fairly influential people, uh, people like Adrian McCrae for example.

Uh, we've been chatting a bit and he's saying, look, this is a great result because Australia needs to have this kick in the butt in order to wake itself up. And the sooner we bring it on, the better. And I. I tend to agree. There's a lot of people saying that Joel Jamal saying that, and a lot of others as well in NAU are saying that.

And even some of the senators who are struggling to hang onto their seats at the moment are saying it's like we have to go down this path. Mm, we've had it too easy in this country for too long, and so it's like, well, let's get it over and done with it. Bring it on. The pendulum swung one way. We've gotta wait for it to come back the other way.

And Adrian's gonna come onto the program probably next week and we'll have a chat to him as well. And Joel Jamal. Um, so look, a lot of scrutinies have been contacting me saying they were looking for irregularities and couldn't find any. And my personal belief, and I put out a, a video a few hours ago, John, and it's already had 47,000 views and 1100 comments.

And I, I dunno whether you saw it or not yet, but I just talked about, um, you know, we, we've gotta accept what we've got. What it is is what it is. Now, whether it was fraudulent or not, I think the fraudulent part of it is the way the mainstream media have been reporting on all these issues for decades. I think the mainstream media, the.

They, the complicit ones, they play the game with the, um, with the political elite. And I think they've gotta come down. I think we've gotta bring our mainstream media to its knees.

Mm-hmm. I agree. Hoodie. Look, I I don't think it, I, look, I may be wrong. Look, I, I don't think it's fraudulent at all. I, I think, uh, I.

I think they played to an audience. Uh, you know, they've, labor Party has said that they're gonna reduce, uh, the, um, hex fees by 20%. I mean, so immediately they're, they're canvassing, uh, the younger people. Yeah. They've, they, they'd be attracting all the people who are on welfare and it's a lot of people on welfare.

Uh, let's not kid ourselves. So, you know, they, they know where, they know where to find a, a vote. I mean, immigration. I mean, he, he, he, I saw a picture, look, I know this will sound racist, but Tony Burke and none of the, one of the blokes that, you know, you wouldn't, wouldn't feed. Here he was in front of his election place in, in Sydney at some party.

And I tell there was not, I mean, I'm not saying this to be racist, there was not one person standing behind him that looked as though they were from Australia. Uh, so I mean, this is the same bloke that, uh, signed up thousands of, uh, immigrants in one day and had the election. People there to tell 'em how to vote and tell them they must vote.

So once again, you know, I think, um, that was a key issue. Immigration, I mean, you know, the amount of immigrants we've got in this country now, I mean, they obviously are keen for the, for the floodgates to continue, uh, to expand, to bring all their families and everyone else here. So, I don't know.

You know, Jared Renick, uh, text from him earlier today saying he's gonna be struggling to hang on.

Um, and, uh. Malcolm Roberts is fairly confident. Joel Jamal is saying One nation polling reasonably well. Uh, thank goodness for that. Um, but, you know, let's, let's look at, um, trumpeter Patriots. Now, let's be really fair. Dham John. There's a lot of, um, there's been a lot of disruption on this side of the camp, uh, during the, during the campaign.

Some last minute stuff that happened. We've already talked about that. We'll talk about that more in depth probably later in the week. But, um, you know, Clive Palmer. I mean, every election he comes in, what, in what seems to be a last minute attempt to, to, uh, throw a, a hand grenade into the works. And I've gotta, I've gotta say, the minute I heard the name of his new party, trumpeted Patriots, I cringed.

I mean, for goodness sake, you know what, what's going on there?

Look, I've got no idea what he look, I I think it's more about Clive than anything. I mean, he, he, rod Cullerton said that he, uh, he offered him, um, uh, funds to take on his party. I mean, he was obviously very desperate at the end to, to get a party trumpet a Patriots was registered. You know, I think it would probably just, uh, uh, what he saw as the last opportunity to, to be involved in the election.

But once again, you know, I think. Um, there needs to be some cool heads here and, and, and let's have a postmortem of, of, of, you know, if he wants to get involved in things. Look, I think he's better off getting involved in taking out, uh, advertisements in the mainstream media or in regional media about, uh, the problems that are associated with mRNA vaccines because, I mean, here we are, um, we are now in a situation where Mark Butler already signing up to these international health treaties.

Um, the WHO now has got a real foot in the door in Australia. I mean, I, I, I don't know how you stop them now. Uh, I mean, you know, it's not. Beyond the realms of possibility that, uh, with, I mean the whole, the whole talk hoodie over the last month has been, oh, the next pandemic's on the way, you know, deadly diseases measles is, you know, killing thousands.

I mean, all just complete nonsense, more hype, rubbish. But once again, the fear campaigns are starting. I think it's only a matter of time before we have another one of these, uh. Uh, pandemics, lockdowns and the WHO will come in and we know that they, they can essentially lock us down. Um, they can lock us down and they can, and they can force vaccinate.

I mean, it's already in the Western Australian legislation allegedly. So, uh, it, it's definitely in the WHO's remit because we hand over the powers now to the WHO, uh, in a pandemic. Uh, so. Under labor, we're, we're, we're going to get more than we bargain for. It's not just a case of, uh, uh, you know, them tinkering around social engineering around a few, uh, uh, bits and pieces.

I mean, this is absolutely serious stuff. This is like Nazi Germany

that really is, and you, you wrote an excellent piece that, uh, you put, you tweeted yesterday and it was put on my page. It's had I think over a thousand comments as well, John. And, um, you summed it up very well. And, and the truth is. That when you think about the main British commonwealth countries, including the UK, Canada, New Zealand and Australia, they've all gone Communist.

Yeah.

They, they, the Commonwealth, uh, the British Commonwealth is now a commonwealth of communism.

Yeah.

And, uh, and we've gotta realize that now, okay, so what do we do about it? Everyone's getting angry, everyone's getting upset. Rightfully so. You're disappointed. You can't believe. What you, what you perceive to be the stupidity of the people who live in this country with you.

And it's hard to argue with that however, the judgment has been made. Now, there are some people who say that we should be, you know, that the Governor General should sack the politician, uh, should sack the government. John, what are the chances of them doing that, given that the governors and the Governor General are all elected, elected by the, uh, the political party in power?

Uh, you know, I, I think the. I think the pushback has to come from, hopefully the Senate. I'm, I'm, I'm still hopeful that, you know, there may well be some, um, numbers in, in the Senate, which, um, allow for common sense. Let's, let's hope that is the case. I mean, we've still got Alexander in there. We, we've potentially got Malcolm Roberts, uh.

It sounds like, uh, Senator Jared Rennick, a an an outside chance. But, uh, let's, let's just see where those cards fall. Hopefully they fall in, in, uh, favor of common sense. Uh, but I, I think the next big thing hoodie is these, uh, international health treaties and regulations with the WHO. And that comes up in, uh, in July, I think.

So, uh, that that's the next big thing that we've gotta fight. Uh, and, and we were able to. You stop these, uh, the misinformation Bill, I, I think we have to do the same thing around this WHO and the, uh, pandemic treaties. That, that to me is, that's, that's a bridge too far and it's the next big thing on our agenda now.

Yeah. And I think, uh, what, what are we gonna do with the next three years? Well, we have to deal with the world, the, uh, world Health Organization we do in whatever way we can. And you being the chair of the a CA, uh, you are gonna be at the spear point of, of, uh, education campaigns. I hope that's what you guys, you guys are gonna be doing.

I'm pretty sure you will. Um, but the real thing we have a chance to do now is use an extra years to prepare properly, really properly. I mean, um. There needs to be a weeding out of, uh, of some people who are, who are pushing for change, who are not doing any favors. Uh, some people just need to be starved of oxygen.

And, uh, that's the truth of the matter. But the, the thing is that there is an opportunity, and there are some very clever people in the wings at the moment who are talking about building another completely new conservative party, um, to step into opposition with a statesmanlike leader and, and then come out on the other side of this in government, which is what is desperately needed.

So, you know, I'm sure we can, there'll be some people coming together. We'll, we'll be holding some panel discussions over the next few weeks discussing that because we, yeah, look, everybody's in shock mode. We've gotta get past that. Mm-hmm. You know, these processes are what happens and the pendulum swings and it comes back the other way.

And we've gotta get it on the way back.

Well hoodie, let's not re forget. This happened in the uk. Uh. And, and is happening to this day in the uk. Not a dissimilar situation to what we're experiencing in here now. I think Nigel Farage has come out of that, uh, as a really, uh, a, a, a force to be reckoned with in conservative politics over there.

Now, he doesn't have the numbers now, but he certainly is attracting the vote and he's unifying the country. That's what we need here. I think we need to rightly, like you've just pointed out, we need to, uh, get in, get into a unity ticket. Uh, everyone basically come down off their high horse for the, uh, for the, uh, for the future of this country and, and, and get on the one page, get on the one song sheet, um, and, and put the egos aside, uh, so that we can take on these communist bastards and, uh, take this country back.

No, that's right. Now there are, there are parties that have been in this fight for 30 odd years, and we're talking about One Nation, for example, some good people in one Nation. And we, we know them, we love them, we care about them, and we know that they're doing the best they can. However, um, if they, if they unite with some of the other parties.

They could really kick some butt, but it means having to put, you know, the ego around the party to one side. And this is what all the parties have to do. Um, I really can't see, I can't see Jared Rennick, uh, getting outta politics if he loses this election. Not now that he started people first. I don't know, but my gut feeling is that's probably the one.

That's the party that's gonna form the catalyst of whatever gets built outta this, um, that rises outta the ashes of this electoral, uh, defeat. Mm. Um, and we have a golden opportunity to get together. Now, people, uh, we may get to a stage in the coming months where we see a great advantage in joining, uh, someone like, um, people first on mass.

Uh, or if it's to be one nation in one nation on mass along. As, um, as there's an influence within those parties to get them to, uh, drop their high horses and get on board with the other parties and really make something that's conservatively powerful.

Mm-hmm.

Because the liberals are stuffed and Alex Sand is wasted in the liberal party now.

He, he, he needs to get out of there, you know? Um, he needs to really consider his options and get outta there. Um, because he's, he's a talent wasted in there. He really is. He's gotta get into the lower house for a start, but the. The people I've spoken to, John are fed up with all the factions in these major parties.

Mm-hmm.

I mean, if you're gonna, if you are a, a, a left wing faction of the member of, of the left wing faction of the liberal party, get out and join labor. Mm-hmm. You want left wing, center, center, uh, left and in, right wing, uh, faction groups. In these parties. We just want, you're, you're either in conservative opposition at the moment, or conservative government and you're not the other way.

So something's gotta change.

Yeah.

The whole democratic system where you live under the whole, the whole, uh, system is completely stuffed. And part of politics is just an absolute disaster, but, you know, we've gotta, we've gotta do something. Well

look it, it tells you everything. Hoy, apparently. Christopher Pine last night on, on, uh, on one of the commentary, uh, channels, said, uh, that, that the liberal party had, uh, lurched too far to the right.

I, I dunno if that's correct. I didn't hear him say that, but somebody rang me today and told me that, I mean, what, what planet are they, uh, they on if they think they've. L too much to the right.

The left's gone so far left that if you're anywhere right of center, that you're deemed too far. Right? It's just bizarre.

It's bizarre. But Christopher Pine's a tool anyway. Let's be honest.

That's exactly right. Yeah. Yeah. Shockers,

uh,

we stuck with

blackout Bowen. He

seems that way. Uh, I looked at, um. Uh, some of the results there last night and, uh, it looked as though, uh, Matt Zuli had, uh, had, hadn't, uh, even got past the green.

So, um, uh, I mean, yet, yet to see with preferences that was just, uh, a very early count. Uh. But, uh, yeah, I mean, considering that, uh, the polling was suggesting that he was ahead in that, uh, in that electorate, uh, there, there's been a massive turnaround there, or, or the poll was, uh, was just another media beat up.

Yeah, well, some commentators saying to me that, uh, also Craig Kelly looks like he's down for the count.

Yeah.

Which is tragic. That's a tragic loss. 'cause he's an Aussie fighter as Craig Kelly like him or love him. Um, he, he's always spoken common sense on our program and, um, he's a real fighter and, and, uh, whatever Craig decides to do next is gonna be very interesting as a lot of the, the pundits.

I wonder what sort of cushy job Dutton will get. Perhaps he'll join Schmo on the Orca project. Wow.

Yeah. Well, you know. I, I had to laugh last night when they were talking about it. I mean, they, they were talking duing up and, and, and saying, you know, what a great contributor he'd been to public life. I mean, I mean, let's just, let's just, you know, analyze that for 30 seconds.

I mean, these people have had a privileged life. I don't care what anyone bloody says, you know, I, I, I mean, if you spoke to Russell Broadband and asked him that question, he, I mean, he would, he would tell you that, you know, he, he, uh, he was very lucky to be, uh, uh, uh, appointed. So many times to the seat of Monash.

And it was an absolute honor. But I mean, they, they're, they're well paid. I mean, when you, when you, when you look at the, uh, the wages in comparison to, uh, the general population, they, they receive very good superannuation. They, they get very good, um, allowances and, and, and perks in, in office. Uh, so, and, and, and generally after they.

Retire, uh, or, or, or move on. They're looked after in the private sector, uh, very well. So, I mean, let's not, let's not get the violin out for Dutton and say that the Paul bastard's doing it tough. Uh, I mean, they gotta be joking. Um, you know, I, I think of people like David TCIs that was a paramedic for 45 years.

Didn't even get a send off, didn't even get a. Phone call from any of the management at New South Wales Ambulance to say thanks for your 45 year service. Seeing, uh, the worst of the worst in helping people in their most, uh, critical time over 45 years. Yeah. Not even. Uh, I mean, so yeah, I'm sorry. Uh, that, that frustrates me a great deal when I hear them talk about, uh, you know, the, the service of.

O of, of these people, uh, that have been thrown out by their electorates, uh, uh, you know, they should be counting themselves. Very lucky that they, they had the opportunity to, to represent the Australian people. And, uh, uh, you know, in the case of somebody like, uh, Russell Broadband do something very, very positive and, uh, uh, and legacy leaving, um, at the end of it, uh, not, not too many of them can say that hoodie.

And interesting to see what Russell's gonna do. I'm sure he'll give us an interview in the dust settles. Um, spoke. We spoke, both of us. Spoke with Tanya Dan last night. Uh, she's going off to have a week's well deserved sleep, I think is what she's saying. What's her future? Well, she's an amazing lady. She's very intuitive and, um, who knows where it's gonna go for her.

Uh, at the moment she doesn't have a job because Russell's out. But, uh, that won't last for too long. And then we have, uh, the likes of Sue Ellen Wrightson. With trumpet of Patriots, where does she stand now? What's gonna happen with her? Where will this all lead? There's another really good politically savvy player who got caught up in all the hype of the Trump mania that, uh, seemed to grip, grip Clive at the time.

Um, and, and Babbitt. What do we know about Babbitt? Mm,

yeah. Well, I suppose all these, uh. These questions will be raised and answered in the next, uh, few weeks when all the dust settles. But, um, yeah, there's definitely some very good people that have, uh, uh, been, you know, left, left, uh, out in the wilderness. I mean, Tanya Danoff, Dr.

Julie Sladen, I mean, you know, these are people that have fought, uh, uh, day and night, uh, for people with vaccine injuries. Um, and, and numerous other. Um, uh, um, issues in, in the community and I mean, what worries me more, uh, than anything hoodie is that these people could now be voiceless. I, I'm just not sure, um, you know, in the parliament that un under those that are elected except for maybe Alex Antic and, um, Malcolm Roberts, that, uh, is there anyone left there beyond those two that is going to, uh, you know, be a champion for these people?

Pauline Hansen? Um. It'll be interesting to see how Lee Hansen goes as well.

Mm-hmm.

You mentioned the name Ralph Babbitt. I've gotta be honest, I'm singularly unimpressed with Ralph Babbitt. I found him incredibly unimpressive and, uh, in, we've had a couple of meetings with him and it's been very lackluster.

Uh, to be honest with you, I don't, I don't think, uh, to be honest, I don't think his heart's in the job. Mm. I think he'd rather be selling real estate, but, uh, that's just my opinion. I'm, I'm entitled to that as much as anyone is. So, if you're a Babbitt fan and you wanna have a go at me over that, then fill your boots.

I mean, that's my own personal experience. I was less than impressed on the several times that I met with him. Um, and, uh, but he's surrounded by good people. He's got some great people working in his office. Um, and you know, what's gonna happen with them? What's gonna happen with him? I dunno, there's, there's just so much stuff up in the air at the moment.

Now what we've gotta do as Australians is look forward to the next three years as an opportunity to do something really strategically, well planned. We've gotta ride out. Whatever storm comes, we dunno what's coming. It may be worse than we think. It might be much better than we think, but the thing is, our countrymen have voted and this is what they've come up with.

And we can waste a whole lot of time. Um, you know, self-flagellating and carrying on and pointing fingers at people and getting upset. But it is what it is. You, what's left on the table for you. What can you do? Get involved, get educated. You know, those people who got together to volunteer for the, the minor parties around the country.

Don't lose those links. Start building on them. Start forming groups where you can really make some change. And, um. And a whole bunch of stuff needs to be done. And, and eventually there needs to be a, a, um, uh, a, uh, constitutional convention in this country to either restore what we've got or, or weed out what doesn't work in it, that something's gotta be done because it hasn't served us, uh, for some time because it's been corrupted so much by labor.

So all the issues we're dealing with in this country, John stem from the Labor Party.

They all come from the Labor Party, and now we've got Elma fa as a Prime Minister for the next three or maybe even six years, haven't forbid. Oh

dear. Yep. It's a sad, sad, sad ending to, um, to where we thought we might've been going. But anyway, that's, that's where we're at.

That's where we're at. We'll know more in the in by the end of next week, and, uh, we'll have some interviews lined up for you.

In the meantime you live in Australia. Uh, it's a good place to be at the moment. There's a lot of people talking about where else in the world can you immigrate to. El Salvador is pretty good from what I.

Salvador is good. We're gonna try and get Trevor Loudon back on. So we've got Trevor Loudon, uh, more than likely. I spoke to him the other day in New York, called him up and, uh, he's very keen to come back on with us, especially now that the result's in Yeah. Um, you've, you've lined up George Christensen. Uh, we're still trying to get Bob Catter.

It'd be great to get you on Bob to come on. And, uh, Joel Jamal will give a, will give a fairly comprehensive update at the end of the week. I'm sure he is promised. He'll come on and do that. So. Um, excuse me, you may not have a voice in parliament, but whenever we can, uh, control our throats, Johnny, we will, um, we will be the voice for these people who watch us, eh?

Mm,

definitely. And, and, uh, if we can, we'll try and, uh, see if we can tee up Senator Ron Johnston. Um, again, from the us I think that'd be a, a, a great interview to find out where Trump is in relation, an RF K in relation to, uh, a, a lot of these, uh. Uh, hopes on the vaccines, et cetera. Um,

yeah,

we have, we haven't seen a lot there and I think we need to start asking some questions.

Absolutely. And if we're gonna play the party political game in this country for another three or six years, then let's get a really good conservative party, uh, going And Jared Renick's got the age on his side. He is definitely got a good following. And he's got the, now, he's got the runs on the board.

He's got the tenacity. And we need statesmen again. We haven't had one for decades, Johnny. No. We need statesmen.

No, and I was glad to see Barnaby Joyce gave him a wrap too, uh, during the coverage, uh, said that, uh, you know, he, he was certainly, uh, uh, had a great following and, uh, and, and their campaign was, uh, well put together.

So.

Barnaby hasn't, uh, he's, he's made a few, uh, gaffes along the way, but, uh, lately he's been, uh, doing and saying some of the right things. So he's, um, he's in my electorate, or I mean his electorate I should say. And, um, and yeah, so I'm gonna probably make an effort to reach out to him and. Coming. I'll say, Hey, remember me?

I was a, I was a fellow that called you a grab at Canberra outside the press club. I think that'll get his attention.

Oh,

oh dear. Anyway, Johnny, what else? Can we talk about? Anything?

Oh, I think they've probably heard enough from us. That'll, uh, that's enough prattling on. Um, yeah. Well obviously have some great interviews in the coming, uh, couple of weeks, uh, analyzing what's going on and where to from here.

That's right. We all have to rethink. Now, you can get your knickers in a twist and, and, uh, say what a load of rubbish. And, uh, this is all wrong. It's all fraud and all that. You can, and you're entitled to believe that. I don't blame you. There's a lot of stuff that's wrong in the city of, uh, of, of Australia.

There really is, and it's gotta be fixed. Mm. But we can either go down that road and, and just sit there, ping on and gazing at our navels, or we can look for opportunities in the next three years to rebuild and really come back as a force. And that's, I reckon, the only thing we can do. Or we can just, we ought to get busy living John, or we get busy dying.

Yep. So the ball's in our court, Australia, and, uh, let's close with a prayer.
