2025-06-06 Graham and John talk about the state of the nation...

Ah, we under me arm and the twinkle in me eye. I'll be off the gada in the morning. It's been a while since I did a Jo.

It. It has been a while. Yeah. It's

been a while since you've done a hd.

Yeah. Or an elbow or anything else.

Yeah. Do you remember that time Johnny? When the budget was brought down in Canberra and we were down there and we did that budget special.

And you were cmo. You remember when you were cmo? And we had all the guys from the a, a and Roland Crystal and everybody in the house watching us do this thing completely ad hoc, no

script.

And it was classic. We're all in Fitz laughing. I mean, I've gotta find that and replay that. That was classic Johnny Lauder.

We had a good, it was, it was so good. Sc me. Remember you had those, um, false teeth.

Don't mind us everybody. It's Thursday, the 5th of June and we are feeling pretty cheery because there's some really good news coming out and, uh, you know, there's a lot to be said for, for staying diligent, sticking to your target and keeping the pressure on. Uh, Johnny Lati some great news just in the last couple of hours has come out, uh, regarding, uh, fair work, Australia and Queensland Police.

Yeah. Yeah. Really good news. Uh, I, I'm, I'm, I'm really hopeful that this'll, uh, mean, you know, an avalanche of, uh, of other police around Australia, not just in Queensland, uh, returning to work. I, I mean, I, I'd love nothing more than, uh. To see Justin Poor and, and, and all his colleagues in New Wales and every other state, uh, be returned because they've done nothing wrong, hoodie.

And, uh, I mean, that couldn't be more, um, elevated or highlighted or, uh, shown to be true than, than the government's, uh, approach to, uh, changes. Of, of the COVID-19 vaccination recommendations in the middle of the night on June 3rd, which said that, uh, uh, nobody under 18 should have one because that cohort of the pandemic, uh, were, were demonstrated to be, uh, at, at minimal risk and at more risk from the vaccine.

Yeah. Tells

you everything. Yeah. Look, it does, uh, that, that's been a massive, uh, revelation through the week. Um, and these findings by Fair Work Australia in regards to Queensland Police. Now with, with all of that information that what happened on the 3rd of June with those, those revelations in the, um, in the vaccine, in the, um, inoculation handbook.

The vaccination handbook.

Hmm.

Um, and we've got some celebrities coming out now, in particular Chris Smith radio host Chris Smith, um, mate, who has done some amazing stuff. Uh, totally honest, upfront. Uh, we're gonna play, play a, a little audio clip of what happened on his show. I think it was yesterday, wasn't it?

Yeah, it was. He really let fly Johnny. Um, the truth is coming out now. The reason we are doing an update tonight, we did have a scheduled interview. We were going to interview a doctor. I won't say what field. I won't say what gender. I won't say where they are. Other than they're in Australia. Um, but this doctor was coming on to talk to us about stuff that was highly relevant to what's happening around COVID, vaccinations, autism, other things like that.

Mm-hmm. Um, now because this doctor and a cohort of people that they're working with are doing amazing work for the vaccine injured Johnny, why are we talking undercover? I mean, this is just disgraceful you and I decided as we were about to go to air with this person, this doctor, that it was not in the best interest of their patients to go ahead with the interview.

Yeah. Because a PR, uh, are still expected to be coming down on people like this who are doing the work, John, that our health bureaucrats should be organizing to be done by our health system, which is not a health system. Mm mm Now I'm, I'm trying to be, uh, I'm trying to be very careful here because I don't wanna reveal too much, but we are still in a par of state in Australia where a PA, uh, the reprehensible organization that it is, is still got, it's still got its octopus tentacles reaching out into society.

And, uh, and for anyone who says, well, that doctor should speak out anyway. No, no, no, no, no. What's the point of having good doctors like that who are working behind the scenes? Deregistered so they can't help the people. We need them to help because the government and the bureaucrats weren't allow it to happen.

We can't do that.

And that doctor was prepared to talk. Uh, uh, uh, it was purely hoodie and, and my decision that we, uh, discontinued the, uh. The interview and, you know, we're not prepared to put young lives at risk. Uh, this person was essentially working with a lot of young children and, uh, I, I, I think it would've been a great, uh, tragedy to put that at risk.

So, uh, that's gotta be first and foremost, uh, their story will come out. Uh, we can maybe maneuver around it in other ways. Uh, we'll come up with something. Uh, maybe we need to look at, at a, uh, a system where we black the screen out and hide their voices. I, I don't know. We'll have to do something, but, um,

yeah, look, the, the truth of the matter is, John, everyone will know what that doctor is gonna say.

Yeah.

Uh, backing up everything that we've had, hundreds of health professionals backing up over the last four years on our program. Um, but I wanna highlight the fact that we decided not to, it would've been a massive scoop. To have this doctor on. But there are more important things in, uh, getting a following.

Uh, this is about protecting, uh, people who are vulnerable at the moment. Not only the patients of these doctors, but the doctors themselves who need to continue doing the vital work that they're doing. And I can tell you it's very impressive what we heard off here. So, uh, that being, that, that's where we'll leave that.

Um, but we've got, uh, look, all this stuff happening with Magna Ky. Uh, that's generating a lot of information, a lot of, uh, a lot of conversation. Um, you know, and then we've got the Burnett Institute have come out and said, oh, you know, you're 14% less likely to be hospitalized if you get a flu shot and a, a, a COVID booster at the same time.

Not because there's a chemical, uh, magic that happens when the two come together, John. But while you're at the doctors, you might as well get 'em both. I mean, this is. This is a pathetic now that was published in the Australian Medical Journal. Now, if that's the kind of rubbish that these people are publishing based on maybe mathematical mod modeling, it's possible that it could happen.

That, I mean, if this is a standard of medical journalism in Australia, we are in a bad place.

Well, what do I, you know, I, I'll, I'll go one step further and say the, the incentivization has to be taken out of the system. Uh, medicine has to be based on what's good for you. Um, um, and, uh, that, that's, that's it.

It should not be based on whether, I mean, I've been told, I don't know how true this is. I mean, I'm only going off what I've been told that, that, that, uh, shingles vaccine is a \$750 vaccine. \$750. Now, uh, what are the GPs getting out of this? What's the figure going back to the, uh, to, to, to the medical practice?

Uh, I, I've been told, uh, reliably that just putting up a poster, um, you know, gets a \$2,000 a bonus from the federal government in relation to the, uh, the vaccination stuff. So you are, you are joking, aren't you? Oh, no, that's joy. You must be joking. Unfortunately

not hoodie.

No,

I'm not this dealing with, stop calling me Shirley.

Remember that line out of flying high? Look, um, we, we are, we are this country. We are so far behind the eight ball and the rest of the world. Our stupid bureaucrats and politicians are still pushing this jab on people, even though the evidence is falling out of the sky into their laps. Yeah, Johnny, we had Paul Merrick and Angus GL two of the finest.

Critical care oncology specialists in the world, in Canberra, in that building behind you for two days sitting there waiting to talk to politicians to brief them on what they know. Mm-hmm. The best in their field. Paul Merrick, the best critical care specialist in the world bar, none acknowledged by doctors all over the world that have trained under it.

And Professor Angl, professor of oncology at St. George's Teaching Hospital in London. There they were, John. But he also an

immunologist, also an immunologist and a virologist, uh, Angus,

Angus dele and pathology background as well. There they were for the Sarah Hanson Youngs and the, and the, and the, what's the other bird's name?

The Walters Bird. Who, what's the, oh, some, some nut job, some nut job, and all the other politicians. Mark Butler, you could have gone and had a personal briefing from two of the best in the world. Never but you so far up yourself, mate, you couldn't be bothered. And all the people look at all those people behind John and I, all those people.

Um, you know, you know, they use Paul Merrick's work, uh, as, as entry, um, to, uh, anesthetics in, in Victoria, um, maybe in other states as well. But his work is actually used in exam papers. Uh, I mean, that's how revered this guy is. This guy is one of the most revered, intensive care specialists in the world. If not the, uh, he's sorry.

We, we spent, we spent some private time with both those guys. Could you meet a couple of nicer blokes? No. You know, we spent time in New Zealand with 'em. You, I think you were involved when they were out here in Australia, though. I, I couldn't get down. But these, these guys are willing to give so much. They know so much.

Michelle and I had dinner, we were cooking dinner for 'em every night in New Zealand for a week. And I can tell you that what they were sharing at the dinner table was gobsmacking. I wish I could have recorded it. They, these guys have worked out how to fix cancer. They've worked it out, but they can't get it out there.

They have the knowledge to fix cancer. I'm not saying cure because the minute you say the word cure, you get everybody. But that, that's what's going on. It's just absolutely absurd. And there they were in that building behind you, ready to talk to the politicians who would listen. They could have had a full briefing.

Now I watched, I watched a presentation that, uh, Jared Renick did 2022, where he chipped, uh, Sarah Hanson Young. And, um, and, uh, that waters bird from greens, 'cause they were laughing and mocking the vaccine, injured, you know, and making light of it. He ate them alive with the data and they, they told him to stop going on with a load of rubbish.

They glazed over. They wouldn't have a clue. Sarah Hanson Young wouldn't know if her jeans were on fire. John, no,

she wouldn't have a clue. And, and then there can, we remember that time when she was in Senate estimates quizzing the Navy on how they waste money. And she talked about that program, border force or whatever it was.

Oh yeah.

Wow. And, uh, she said, how come you, how come you're using our ships and everything to film this stuff for television and you're not spending the, the money we're giving you wisely? And they said, no, we're not involved in that. That's like a channel nine production. They just, it's a set, you know,

she wasn't interested in Brad Haard. Uh. Giving out the ICU at Campbelltown to home and away, eh, she wasn't asking. Oh, that's right.

Yeah, yeah. She wasn't. Uh, these people are irrelevant. They're absolutely irrelevant, John. But anyhow, they're there and we have to deal with 'em for the next three years. So, um, so great news out of, uh, Queensland, it's on the front page of the Courier Mail, or it's in the first couple of pages of the Courier Mail.

It's big news.

Well, hopefully the incoming, um, uh, commissioner in New South Wales, whoever that may be, uh, can strike a blow in this regard and get rid of this nonsense. This 180 1D that has been completely misunderstood, mis completely misapplied, uh, and, and call all these, uh, uh, frontline heroes like Justin Paul, uh, Natalie Valo, et cetera.

Back to work. Yeah. Uh, immediately with compensation. I mean, it's been an absolute disgrace. Um, get them back on the front line. Uh, we're, we're short of police, uh, we're short of emergency services. Listen, just do the right thing. I mean, all your own government information is, is essentially, uh, uh, demanding that you do this now.

I mean, it's completely ridiculous that you're not.

Well, John, heaps of police in New South Wales. We've got 40 plus paramedics in Queensland in the same boat as yourself. Still not back at work. Yeah, desperate to go back to work. Uh, a lot of 'em are thinking, you know, why would we wanna work for that organization again?

But, you know, they, we need these people back in there. Uh, we've got 40 plus to 50 firefighters in Victoria still fighting, and they're in the Fair Work Commission. And who are they fighting? John, not Fire and Rescue Victoria, who are happy to have them back from what we are being told the union. Marshall, a flat battery man holler from Marshall.

He is fighting gang. You can't help but wonder why. Well, we do know. We can guess, can't we? Yeah. Because these guys have formed an alliance called the Australian Firefighters Alliance. They're another union membership. Numbers in the, in the, uh, union of Firefighters in Victoria is falling, going down. Peter Marshall is losing confidence.

Of his members. And he doesn't want these guys back in because they represented jolt to his little system, his little kingdom that he's built up. Peter Marshall, you're a grub. You don't fight your own men in the Fair Work Commission. That's a grubby act. Anyhow,

what can we say? Not much he can say about that, that, that, that's as bad as it gets.

Now we're gonna show, we're gonna play this little clip from, uh, Chris Smith in a minute, but Qantas, uh, John, um. Qantas we're told reliably from within that they want to do a great reset. They wanna reset their image. Now I have it from reliable sources inside Qantas that the heavy maintenance base in Tamarine in Melbourne, which is basically a storage hanger for uh, Jetstar.

He's been completely reopened. Revamped, and they're putting 30 engineers in there and they're actively recruiting for engineers to do the heavy maintenance that they've been getting done overseas back in Australia. Now that, that was set up by Alan Joyce, he got rid of all of that. We had the best, I've been in that facility.

There's a big jet engine test cell there. Um, I've been there when air buses have been getting a full D check where they stripped them down to the rivets and what a facility they had. Everything going from upholstery shops. Uh, through to instrument makers, airframe, fitters, electronics, all the talent was there.

There was a big training organization there where they were training, um, apprentices. And this, that was built by TAA in the old days. And, uh, Australian Airlines when I was there. And I can tell you it was as it was second to none. Now they're, they're reinstating it and hopefully this is a turnaround because nothing will get you, uh, a rebuild image better.

Vanessa Hudson then restoring what Qantas used to be. And this is a major step forward. So I want to congratulate you for that. I'm hoping this is as a result of, uh, a new, uh, chairman of the board. Because the last one, Lee Clifford, he's gone. Good rings to him. Um, and I'm hoping that that's gonna happen.

But there are some things happening. Vanessa Hudson inside a Qantas that are very, very damaging. And they're disturbing and they send her in your HR department and your IR department, industrial and human relations, and your legal team because they have been victimizing pilots and flight attendants and engineers on sick leave.

Hmm. Fighting terminal illness to get well enough to come back to work. And some of those have been fired indiscriminately while others are being cherrypicked and giving given leave without pay. John. Hmm. So, in other words, let's say we're both Qantas pilots and I'm, I'm a, a guy that doesn't, uh, that doesn't get on well with everybody and you are.

You decided not to get vaccinated because you are chronically ill with something and you are fighting cancer, right? And your oncology team has said, no, no, don't, don't do anything to damage your immune system. Let's just get you fixed and then you can come back to work after we get you fixed. So you contact the company and you say to them, uh, I'm, I can't get vaccinated now, but at the minute I get the all clear on my cancer and I can return to work, I will get vaccinated then so I can come back to work.

And the company, the chief pilot says to you, uh, Johnny. Alright, well, so we'll put you on leave without pay until that's done. Is that okay? Because you've used all your sick leave and you, how long do

you need,

eh? How long do you need? How long do you need? What can we do now? I, I used to work, the Qantas I used to work for before this Joyce regime were like that.

It was, how long do you need? I. It's okay, don't worry. Leave it to us. I've seen them do welfare really well, so they say, yeah, Johnny, you've always been a team player. We love you. Uh, so we'll do that for you. Then I ring 'em up and I say to the chief pilot, good day, Dick.

I won't say anymore. Um, good day, Dick. Uh, listen, I'm fighting cancer at the moment. The oncologist reckons I've got a fair chance in six months of getting back to work. Uh, what I'll do is, uh, I can't get the vaccine by the deadline, but I'll get it when I come back, when I'm ready to come back to work. So we're all squared away because I don't have jeopardize my chances.

And Dick says, no mate, I'm sorry. No, no, no. The rules require that we terminate your employment based on gross misconduct. If

we do that for you, Woody, we gotta do it for everyone.

That's right. So then, then that said, pilot says. Hang on a second, Dick. Um, if you, if you give me a termination letter based on gross misconduct, I won't get a job in aviation anywhere in the world.

Oh, I'm sorry. But they're the rules. Mm. That's what's been going on in Qantas, the so-called good guys are getting, it's okay, mate. Don't worry about it. We'll keep you on leave without pay, but anybody who's. Who hasn't been towing the company line on some issues? No way in the

world.

Where's the union been for them?

Johnny? Where's, where has unions? The Australian International Pilots Association. Where have you guys been for these fellas? Nowhere to be seen. Nowhere to be seen. Ah, now we know that guys have been challenged on their sick bed in hospital. To provide documents for the HR Department of Qantas to do their job.

Yeah. Which is ostensibly to destroy these human beings because HR stands for Human Remains department. And there have been, I am reliably told people in management within Qantas who've been issuing these orders to terminate pilots and cabin crew who have personally written to senior management saying.

We think this is immoral. We think this is wrong. We dunno that we can do this any longer. Now, Vanessa Hudson, um, I love Qantas. Australia loves Qantas, and I want you to reset the, the image of Australia's Qantas. I would love to see you do that, but you're being Pennywise and pound foolish because if you did the right thing.

Like, look at the \$120 million that those, those baggage handlers are still waiting for from compensation. Vanessa, why are you delaying that? You're gonna have to pay it anyway. What are you waiting for? That they're all gonna die. See, if you are doing that, then you are following the worst piece of industrial relations and legal advice that you could possibly follow if you want to reset the image of Qantas, because you've got departments in Qantas that are actively working to destroy your image.

And people like us are gonna make it public. We're gonna make it public. Vanessa. So look, I hear you're a pretty fair snoozer. Um, I hear that you're very approachable. I'm asking you Vanessa Hudson, to come on this program

and give Qantas a fair go. Tell us what you are really gonna do to fix the ills of Qantas, and I would make some suggestions to you.

I would sack your HR department. I would sack your industrial relations department and I'd give you a legal firm. Another good look at because they're, they're people who are undermining your reputation. Yep. In the back room while you are out the front trying to rebuild it. It's counterproductive, Vanessa.

So. Well, and the other thing is too, I, I wouldn't be letting anyone tell you to buy an airplane that's never flown one, uh, because these airplanes you're buying, they're lemons.

They are John. They, they, they can't, they're eng they're having engine problems with these new air buses. There's

two. I was, uh, in fact, it's funny you say that hoodie I was speaking to, um, a very senior, uh, manager from an, uh, an overseas airline, uh, in the last, uh, week.

And they told me they've got a number of these two twenties, uh, with the Pratt and Whitney geared engines and they're continually having engine failures. Yep. Uh, now this is a real concern and, and apparently because of the, the, uh. The, the, the differences between the two planes because they've tried to basically mix and match a bombardier with a, with an Airbus.

It's, it's not, uh, it's not that simple to fly. Um, so it's creating a few issues and, and, and coupled with all these other things I'm hearing like you've had to buy a whole heap of seven three sevens off Singapore Airlines, because you cannot fly these a three twenties into Christchurch. Um. Because of weight.

Well, who

makes these dumb decisions? Bean counters, Johnny Bean counters and, and sadly, the, uh, I believe personally, the app echelon of Qantas Flight Operations Management are just puppets.

Mm.

Uh, there was a time when chief pilots and operations managers had teeth. You know, they, they, uh, they're adminis, they're administering the, the license.

The airline has to operate with the, or with the, uh, authorities, Casa and Air Services Australia and the like. Um, but these guys had just become little Yes men. Mm-hmm. Mm-hmm. You know, I remember, I remember back in the day where a chief pilot was someone you looked up to.

Yep.

You know, uh, I go back to my days in Bush, pilot Airways in Cairns when I was flying to DC three, we had a chief pilot by the name of Cole Shed, who's just turned a hundred in a retirement village.

He was a man we loved and respected, you know, in, in, in aviation. And, and Foxy would, Foxy would back me up on this. Foxy was the chief pilot in, in Tiger. And they loved him. They all loved him. They respected him because he did his job. He wasn't a corporate board crawler like some of these blokes have become now and they seem to hang around.

The other thing in Qantas, John, let me tell you, this is what happens in Qantas. If you want a management job in flight operations. You become the president of the Union first. Now, there was the one president of the Union recently, uh, moved on. A guy called Nathan Safe. He was the first officer who became president of the Australian International Pilots Association, and he was in negotiations arguing with Qantas Flight Operations management for better salary and conditions for pilots.

You know what he's doing now? He's on the other side of the table at these discussions 'cause he's now got a cushy job in management in Qantas. Wow.

A great many of Qantas's chief pilots were former presidents of the pilots union, John.

Yeah.

Can it be any more corrupt than that? And they, and they wonder like guys like me, I wasn't a member of the, of the, uh, international Pilots Association. For, uh, 15, 16 years, nearly 20 years before I resigned. Um, 'cause they want 1% of your salary and they weren't worth it.

They were just fighting over car park spaces in, in Sydney. They were, they were doing nothing. They were doing nothing. People with real grievances. People who were being hammered by the human resources department in Qantas we're getting no protection from the union at all. At all. So

that was demonstrated in every.

Workplace during COVID, the unions went to water. What'd you do? Jared Harvey's from the Health Services Union. What did you do, Jared? What did you do to protect all those medical professionals in New South Wales? Uh, from being sacked, what did you do? Did you do anything?

Uh, look, you know, the, the, the A SU Australian Services Union, they represent a lot of airline workers, interesting organization. Um, and lo and behold, one of their employees, a 21-year-old girl, has worked in their office at the A SU is now elected the youngest elected senator in Australia, a 21-year-old girl that worked for the Australian Service Union.

Uh, I'm not doubting her ability or her, you know, um, and none of that. But what do we really need? 21 year olds running the country now, John.

I mean, I mean the mind boggles. Anyway, let's not get upset because it's been a, it's been a pretty good week, has been raving about the, uh, the, the joint effort we did with, um, with, uh, Jason and Nicola yesterday. Mate, that is going off. People are loving that. I think there's gonna be a lot more happening in that space.

They're real good guys too. Oh, great guys. And, um, you know, they, they're, uh, their news service, um, the daily Australian. Is, uh, is a really good quality product and they're, they're pumping out good news and a lot of stuff from America. 'cause Jason's got a real, um, a real, uh, link up with all of that. And, uh, you know, with everything going on in the world, we need to get all this good information out to as many people as possible.

We're not in the brink of a war. It's, I mean, I mean, look what Ukraine did the other day when they, um, when they did that audacious strike on, on the Russian Air Force. I mean. Mate, \$300 drones bringing down a nuclear bomber. Mm-hmm. I mean, the world's changed, hasn't it?

Yeah. It's a different world. No doubt about it.

Um,

and Donald Trump comes out today and says he was talking to Vladimir Putin, and, and Vlad says he's gonna strike back at Ukraine. I mean, who does that? Who does? Who says that? I mean, I, I don't know. I dunno. I mean. We, we've said it before, Ukraine, Russia, um, Israel, Palestine, all these things are vexatious issues, but what we're all losing track of is all the innocent people caught in the middle.

That's the problem. Yeah. It dare not mention, say anything against Israel, anywhere.

Mm-hmm.

Um, or anything in defense of the innocent Palestinians who are being slaughtered over there because you'll be shut down. Mm-hmm. So while we're all playing politics about who's right and who's wrong, who's in the middle, who's in the middle, imagine all those people behind you and I in these photographs, John, all sitting there wondering if a, if, if an Israeli Defense Force bomb is gonna fall on them, or a Russian missile is gonna hit them, or,

well, at the moment, what the person in the middle is?

Greta Thunberg on a boat.

Tell me more.

What's she sailing in there on Somebo? Where's she sailing into? Into Gaza. Oh,

really?

Yeah. So something

is she gonna land on the beach at, at, uh, Gaza, you know, with, uh, like Joan of Arc.

I, well, maybe she's bringing a few solar panels to help everyone. She's

sailing in there on a boat. Well, I, you know, I tell you what, having seen her in action, um, I'd be terrified if I was BB Netanyahu.

Hey, you don't wanna be fronting up with her, Bebe, I tell you what. Oh dear. Uh, and look, I'm, I'm beyond caring whether people like what I say or not. Uh, but I've gotta tell you that I think it's reprehensible that tens of thousands of innocent people, innocent, like not everyone in Gaza is a terrorist for goodness sake.

I mean, if that passes your standard of a moral compass, and Charlie Kirk wouldn't like me saying this 'cause he's very pro-Israel. And then, I'm sorry, I'm, I'm really sorry. Look, I'm sorry for what happened on October 7th. I'm sorry for the innocence again. The people who were caught up in that, and I'm sorry for the innocence caught, caught up in this latest defensive as well.

I mean, what was it, 35 innocent people gunned down, uh, the other day in Garza that were waiting at a, at a, at a, at a food distribution hub to get some relief. I mean, it's just. It almost,

it's almost like that, uh, we, we need an independent, uh, um, army to go in there and just, and just, you know, sort the terrorists out.

Um, you're not,

you're not talking blue helmets. Say, Johnny, you're not talking United Nations

blue helmets. Hey, okay, helmets. That's what I reckon. Give the tin fall hats on.

Uh, fair. The unit. Remember when the UN used to do that? They used to. Mm-hmm. They went into Rwanda and look what happened. They, they just, they couldn't do anything.

They were toothless tigers. They sat there watching people being hacked to death. Mm-hmm.

Yeah. Well, look, you just can't allow, uh, all these people to be, uh, murdered, um, on our watch. It's, it's, it's a bad look.

And I'm wondering, I'm wondering too, Johnny, the, the mentality of the, of, uh, the, the, uh, Ukrainian government.

On the eve of having peace talks in Turkey with Russia. Mm, they unleash, uh, a drone attack that wipes out half the strategic bomber force in Russia, deep inside Russian territory, and then not expect Russia to react. I mean, do you want peace or do you not want peace? So, once again, the, the complexities of who's right and wrong and all of that, it doesn't matter.

It's the millions of people caught in the middle. There are, there are hundreds of thousands of families in Ukraine and in Russia who are grieving the loss of their sons and daughters at the battlefield, hundreds of thousands. It just, and we just, we just think, oh, that's on the other side of the world.

That doesn't bother us. You know what I mean? It's just unbelievable.

I mean, it's not dissimilar to what's going on with the, with the jabs hoodie. I mean, you know, there's hundreds of thousands of people that are getting turbo cancers, cardiac issues, all these illnesses, and you know, they don't even understand why they're sick.

I spoke to a lady today whose mother, brother and sister have all been vaccinated and they've all got cancer. Yeah. Yeah. We can't deny it anymore. We can't deny it anymore. We have given evidence in the Senate. John,

You know, they were, they were doing their bucket list before they, they died. And, um. You know, you would get probably one or two of those a month.

Mm. And you'd see the odd 9-year-old with no hair, obviously from chemo and, um, but now it's gone through the roof. It has absolutely gone through the roof. Mm. Now, and they're finding cancers who gets cancer in the heart. I know. Well, I heard of one of those today. Uh, a 4-year-old, uh, got a 4-year-old child who got cancer of the kidney.

Uh, coincidentally the mother was vaccinated just prior to the child's birth.

So, Johnny, um, it's a mess, but let's, let's have a listen. Okay. We'll have a listen to what Chris Smith had to say. Eh.

Indicated earlier this week, and I have indicated on other platforms of media. My avid promotion of COVID jabs during the pandemic was wrong. I took the words of eminent immunologist as gospel and compelled people to believe what health officials were telling us to take all the jabs.

Of course, it was the former Queensland Chief Health Officer, Jeanette Young, who first sounded the alarm about what was going on in Australia about anyone under 40, taking the jabs. Remember that she was asked the question directly in a press conference in June, 2021. Yep.

No, I do not want under forties to get AstraZeneca because they are at increased risk of getting the, the rare, it is rare, but they're at increased risk of getting that rare clotting syndrome. Who, if they got COVID, probably wouldn't die.

The headline reads, healthy Infants, children and adolescents aged under 18 years are not recommended to receive COVID-19 vaccine.

COVID-19 vaccine is not recommended for healthy infants, children or adolescents who do not have medical conditions that increase their risk of severe illness. This is because the risk of severe illness was extremely low in this cohort. Over the course of the pandemic and benefits of vaccination are not considered to outweigh the potential harms, no word on the harms, and no detail given, dated.

June 3rd, 2025. Now let me point out precisely what these potential harms are, given the fact that Jeanette Young was onto this back in June, 2021. The Health Department does not in this new recommendation, explain what the harms are. As Jeanette Young indicated, there was clear evidence of blood clotting in young people who took the jab during the pandemic.

But did the Federal Health Department or the Morrison government for that fact echo those warnings at the time? No. No way, because that would fly in the face of everything we were ordered to do. They wanted the public to be frightened and scared about catching COVID-19, not about having dangerous levels of blood clotting, clotting, or other cardiac diseases, which we've also seen in various studies have inflicted young people.

In their adolescent years, which all major studies since the pandemic have detected and shown to be more prevalent than what big pharma assured governments worldwide. That New Zealand study, mainstream study of 99 million cases worldwide, showed that there were far more observed injuries created from COVID vaccines than what was expected.

It's only taken health officials here four years to admit their error and recommend that under eighteens avoid taking COVID jabs. Four years. As I said earlier this week, we were con during COVID in so many ways and the fact that so many of the current band of politicians urged children to take the jabs at the time should tell you all you need to know about their sincerity or lack of.

It is the reason why you won't hear any of them today. Step forward to inform the public of this new recommendation, and neither will the compliant media.
